The President reported for the information of the Board copy of Colonel A. W. Chilton's inspection report on the University of Minnesota Army Specialized Training Program, received from Major General Danielson of the Seventh Service Command, filed supplement to the minutes, page 3349.

Captain Louis C. Rolontz, on behalf of the Army Air Forces Training Command, presented to the University a certificate of service for the University's contribution

through the Meteorology program to the War Training Program of the Army Air Forces.

Voted to approve the following resolution:

The Regents of the University of Minnesota through formal action hereby express their deep appreciation of the invaluable assistance rendered by Colonel Kai Eduard Rasmussen, C.A.C., U.S.A.; Commandant, Military Intelligence School, Savage, Minnesota, in the planning and execution of the Army Specialized Training Program: Japan and the Southwest Pacific, at the University of Minnesota. Thoughtful consideration and a generous spirit have characterized his wholehearted sharing of expert knowledge, teaching materials, and enthusiasm with the University faculty. In his cordial association with the effort to develop a successful program, Colonel Rasmussen has won our admiration and regard for himself and for the Service of which he is a distinguished member.

Voted to grant permission to Professor T. L. Joseph, Acting Administrative Assistant, Mines and Metallurgy, to serve on the War Metallurgy Committee of the National Research Council.

The Business Vice President reported for the information of the Board receipt of assignment of the following Canadian Patent applications:

The Business Vice President presented for the information of the Board opinion of the Attorney General, filed supplement to the minutes, page 3360, relative to the demand of the War Food Administration for reports and assessments on milk, cream, and by-products produced by the University and used by the University.

The Business Vice President reported for the information of the Board opinion of the Attorney General concerning the availability, as a deficiency appropriation, of funds provided for the University Hospitals under the Laws of 1943, Chapter 655, Section 3, filed supplement to the minutes, page 3361.

Voted to authorize the Business Vice President of the University to extend periods of employment of members of the Civil Service staff beyond the June 30 following attainment of age 70, provided the replacement cannot be reasonably effected and provided further that the employee involved is physically capable to continue his duties.

The Business Vice President having presented the findings of Mr. Ward Lucas as Impartial Investigator appointed by the Governor to study and make recommendations relating to specified employee grievances under the provisions of the resolution of the Board of January 18, 1944, the Board took the following actions:

**1. Lillian Finrud—University Case No. 15.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 8):

"1. Lillian Finrud, as Acting Head Cook, be paid the minimum wage of Head Cook of \$1,665 in cash per year (See University Civil Service, Part III, 3, D), retroactive to that date which a reasonable man would conclude, in the face of the several absences of Mrs. Westrem was the beginning of her satisfactory performance of the duties of Head Cook.

"Mrs. Finrud should receive the wage of Head Cook while she acted in that capacity, which can now be definitely stated as no longer of a temporary (day-to-day or week-to-



week) basis. Whether it was temporary or permanent would be difficult for anyone to determine prior to October 22, 1943."

Voted to approve this recommendation retroactive to October 22, 1943.

2. **Esther V. Lundberg—University Case No. 37.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (page 10) :

"1. No further action be taken by the Board of Regents.

2. Mrs. Lundberg be commended for her present proficiency as (Pastry) Cook, and for her attitude of excellent team-work."

Voted to approve this recommendation.

3. **Caroline Hansrud and Ida Bucher—University Case No. 34.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 13) :

"1. No further action be taken by the Board of Regents on the first part of the grievance, in which the positions of elevator operator were involved.

2. The Board of Regents immediately supply sufficient temporary help, and have fatigue and efficiency tests made as soon as the rearrangement of equipment and routine is working smoothly, looking toward the possibility of providing permanent help.

3. The Board commend Mrs. Bucher and Miss Hansrud for their many years of faithful and apparently cheerful service in an occupation that cannot be otherwise than irksome."

Voted to approve this recommendation.

4. **Frank Krueger—University Case No. 52.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 15) :

"1. Give Mr. Krueger a chance to resign, or put him on probation if he is retained.

2. Continue the present wages of the present three mechanics (if Mr. Krueger remains), subject to routine changes outside of the present grievance."

Voted to approve this recommendation, and to instruct the Superintendent of the Hospitals to request Mr. Krueger's resignation, with the understanding that if Mr. Krueger does not resign he be placed on six months' probation during which period of probation he shall be dropped if he does not satisfactorily perform his duties, in the judgment of the Superintendent.

**5. Clifford Johnson—University Case No. 31.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 18) :

"It is therefore recommended that, effective July 1, 1944, the Board of Regents set the wage of Clifford Johnson at \$2,000 per year, subject to established annual increment procedure."

Voted to approve this recommendation with the understanding that Mr. Johnson's salary of \$2,080 already included in the University budget effective July 1, 1944 be not reduced.

**6. Dorothy Miller—University Case No. 39.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 21) :

1. Make the payment of \$198.75 (or whatever is correct) plus proper C.O.L.A. to Dorothy Miller, (or)
2. Take no further action on this case."

Voted to approve the second recommendation that the Regents take no further action in this case.

**7. Gus Swenson—University Case No. 23.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 24) :

1. No action be taken by the Board of Regents on the wage of Gus Swenson at time of grievance.
2. Mr. Swenson and his family be removed from the farm house in question, and that he receive reasonable cash compensation—say \$20 per month—in lieu of free rent."

Voted to approve these recommendations and to direct that Mr. Swenson be notified to move out of the house not later than September 1, 1944, with the understanding that effective on the date of his withdrawal his annual salary rate shall be \$2,120 (Base \$1,940, C.O.L.A. \$180).

**8. Lawrence Jergenson—University Case No. 33.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 26) :

1. Lawrence Jergenson be paid at the rate of \$2,180 retroactive to July 1, 1943, and up to June 30, 1944; and that effective July 1, 1944, he receive as high a rate as any herdsman on the Farm Campus.
2. He be cautioned about the activities described in the two charges above."

Voted to approve these recommendations and to instruct Dr. Boyd, Head of the Veterinary Division, to caution Mr. Jergenson about the activities described in Mr. Lucas' findings.

9. **V. E. Erlandson—University Case No. 53.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 28) :

- “1. During the year July 1, 1943 to June 30, 1944, Mr. Erlandson be paid for 6 months at the rate of the second step, \$1,602, for Assistant Farm Foreman, and for 6 months as Laborer. This would result in an additional amount of \$94.50— $(133.50-117.75) \times 6$ . The total annual wage would be \$1,507.50.
2. During the year July 1, 1944 to June 30, 1945, Mr. Erlandson be paid for 6 months at the rate of the third step, \$1,665, for Assistant Farm Foreman, and for 6 months at the rate of the third step, \$1,476, for Laborer, provided that, in both cases, the annual 1944 increment is deserved. The total annual wage would be \$1,570.50.”

Voted to approve these recommendations.

10. **Leo Wisbar—University Case No. 26.**

Mr. Lucas recommended (Page 30) :

- “1. Pay Leo Wisbar for the period from July 1, 1943 to June 30, 1944, as Assistant Steamfitter at the annual rate of \$2,220. This would amount to \$140 additional, \$2,220 ( $\frac{1}{2}$  of \$1,980) plus  $\frac{1}{2}$  of \$2,180).
2. Pay him effective July 1, 1944 as Assistant Steamfitter on the basis of half way between Maintenance Mechanic and Steamfitter.
3. Caution him against his occasional overbearing attitude and stopping work to visit.”

Voted to approve in principle these recommendations and to direct that Mr. Wisbar's annual rate effective July 1, 1943 be \$2,220.

Voted to approve the following statement relative to the recommendations of Mr. Ward Lucas, Impartial Investigator, (filed supplement to the minutes page 3362) appointed by Governor Thye to investigate and report to the Board on the matter of specific employee grievances :

At the meeting of the Board of Regents today, action was taken on the recommendations of Mr. Ward Lucas, appointed by Governor Thye to investigate and report to the Board on the matter of specific employee grievances involving wages, working conditions, interpretation of rules, and related matters. His recommendations were followed in every instance where a positive recommendation was made; and the Regents exercised their best judgment in one instance where the Investigator presented an option.

The action of the Regents today is the final step in carrying through the first group of cases handled in accordance with the

appeal procedures that were adopted last January. The history of these cases is as follows:

In June, 1943, 58 specific employee grievances were filed by Public Building Service Employees Union, Local 113 with the University Director of Civil Service Personnel. Forty of these were disposed of by him without appeal by either the Union or the University departments involved. The Union appealed to the Labor Committee of the Board of Regents the Director's decision in eighteen of the 58 cases. The Labor Committee of the Regents acted on these, and from eight of its decisions no further appeal was taken. The Union did appeal ten of the decisions, and these were the cases that went to the Impartial Investigator.

An analysis of the recommendations made by the Investigator to the Board of Regents in his report of June 21, 1944, shows that of these ten cases remaining from the original 58: in three cases the decisions of the University administration were sustained; in two cases the position of the Union was sustained; in one case an option was presented by the Investigator; in three cases the recommendations are in the nature of compromises between the original University decision and the Union's demands; and in one case the recommendation was for a pay increase that already had been approved by the Regents at their June meeting, and before the Investigator's report was filed.

The Board of Regents appreciates the care with which the report of Mr. Lucas was prepared. From it and from the foregoing analysis of the original 58 cases, it is evident to the Regents that their administrative officers and the Labor Committee of the Board have handled well the cases that were before them.

Voted to authorize the President and the Business Vice President to arrange for a survey of the University civil service plan with particular reference to salary schedules at a time appropriate in their judgment.

The Business Vice President presented to the Board letter of June 17, 1944 from Attorney General Burnquist with regard to the appointment of a special attorney for the University as counsel in labor matters, filed supplement to the minutes, page 3363.

The Business Vice President reported to the Board on the hearings held before Mr. Frank Gallagher of Waseca, impartial investigator, relative to individual grievances, civil service rule changes, hours, and wages.

Voted to approve amended application for grant of funds from the Federal Works Agency for aid in the construction of an addition to Powell Hall to provide living and instructional quarters for cadet nurses, total revised

estimate \$385,000, University cost revised estimate \$166,000, and to authorize the President of the University to accept any grant of funds for aid from the Federal Works Agency, provided the offer is in general conformity with this revised application.

Voted to authorize the preparation of plans and specifications for an addition to Comstock Hall, women's dormitory, estimated cost \$368,000.

Voted, that pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Regents of the University of Minnesota have duly determined that it is necessary to take, in fee simple absolute, for the purpose of the University of Minnesota, as a site for an addition to the present Nurses Home and as a part of the campus of said University, those certain lands situate in the City of Minneapolis, in the County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, which are hereinafter described, and hereby request the Attorney General to institute and prosecute, in the name of the State of Minnesota, or in the name of the Regents of the University of Minnesota, or both, proceedings in the district court in accordance with the statutes in such case made and provided for the taking and condemnation of said lands, in fee simple absolute, under the power of eminent domain; and it is necessary that said lands be so taken by the Regents of the University of Minnesota for the purposes hereinbefore set forth:

East 42 feet of Lot 3, Block 45, St. Anthony City Addition, Minneapolis, also known as 514 Essex Street S.E.

Voted to authorize the purchase of the following described property at 505 Washington Avenue S.E. at a price of \$7,000, funds from Regents' Reserve:

East 41 feet of West 83 feet of Lots 9 and 10, Block 19, St. Anthony City Addition.

Voted to rescind the following action of June 10, 1944:
