MINUTES

September 7, 1944

A meeting of the Labor Committee of the Board of Regents was held in the Regents' Room on Thursday, September 7, 1944, at 2:30 o'clock.

Present: Regent Lawson, presiding; Regents Olson, Novak, and Quinlivan.

Mr. Claude Skeldon, Business Manager, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local Union 292, appeared to present a proposal which would provide that electricians on both the regular payroll at an annual rate and on the miscellaneous payroll at an hourly rate would be laid off, in the event of work reduction, on the basis of a single seniority list, disregarding the difference in status as between employees on the regular and miscellaneous payrolls.

Mr. Gene Larson, Secretary-Treasurer, and Mr. W. L. Sinnott, Business Agent, appeared in behalf of the Milk Drivers and Dairy Employees Union, Local 471, to present a proposed new schedule of rates for the classes 9111, Creamery Attendant, and 9405, Creamery Man.

Mr. W. T. Middlebrook, Business Vice President, appeared before the committee to discuss the extension of the procedure for handling grievances adopted January 18, 1944.

Voted not to change the present Civil Service Policy of recognizing differences in status as between employees on the regular payroll and employees on the miscellaneous payroll.

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Voted not to change the present Civil Service Policy of recognizing differences in status as between employees on the regular payroll and employees on the miscellaneous payroll.

Voted to refer the proposal of the Milk Drivers and Dairy Employees Union, Local 471, A.F. of L., to the Civil Service Committee for its study and recommendations.

Voted to recommend that the procedure for handling grievances adopted by the Board January 18, 1944 be extended to about May 1, 1945.

Voted to adjourn.

WHEREAS, said Offer has been duly read in open meeting, fully considered in accordance with all pertinent rules of procedure and

legal requirements, and made a part of the Owner's public records; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable and in the public interest that said Offer be accepted:

Now therefore, be it resolved by the Regents of the University of Minnesota that the said Offer, a true and correct copy of which, including the Terms and Conditions, is hereto attached, be and the same hereby is accepted without reservation or qualification.

Voted to approve the following recommendations of the Civil Service Committee and the President:

- a. Establishment of the new class of Publicity Consultant, Class 5048, AIV \$5000 normal.

The establishment of this class is recommended in conformity with the request of the Mayo Memorial Committee. Under the class, the Committee plans to employ a part-time consultant for 36% time.

- b. Establishment of a class of Assistant to the Director of Civil Service Personnel, Class 1343.

The purpose of this new class is to provide an appropriate classification for the present incumbent, whose salary is AIV \$2680.

The specifications of the class are as follows:

Definition of Class

Under the Director to assist in the administration of the office of Civil Service Personnel.

Duties by example

To conduct follow-up interviews with employees; to make investigations for the purpose of evaluating positions with regard to duties; responsibilities, and departmental organizations; to assist in making special reports and investigations regarding wages, hours, and working conditions, job evaluations and grievances; to supervise clerical help; to perform related duties.

Qualifications

University graduation with training or its equivalent in experience in personnel practice, tact, and supervisory ability.

Voted to rescind, effective September 8, 1944, the following amendment as set forth in the minutes of September 10, 1943, provided for military voting representatives on the Union Board of Governors:

Number Three—For the duration of the war, the membership of the Union Board of Governors shall be enlarged to include one representative from each major unit of the military training groups stationed at the University of Minnesota.

The method of selection and the term of office of these representatives shall be determined by the commanding officers of the army and navy training programs.

The members selected in this manner shall constitute the only military representatives, and military students shall, therefore, not participate in the selection of the civilian student members to the Board nor shall they be eligible for election to the Board at civilian student elections.

All parts of the constitution which are inconsistent with the spirit of this amendment shall be considered modified.

Voted to authorize the purchase of an electron microscope, estimated cost \$12,500, the cost to be distributed to the several research funds as designated by the Dean of the Graduate School.

Voted to amend action of June 17, 1939, to provide for an increase in the University Theatre revolving fund from \$25 to \$75.

Avenue and east of Oak Street except the westerly one-half of the blocks on the east side of Oak Street from Essex Street Southeast to University Avenue Southeast, shall be designated as 'A Residence District' and 'A Multiple Dwelling District' in said 'Tentative Zoning Ordinance' and that said district shall not be open hereafter to additional uses as either 'A Commercial District,' 'A Light Industrial District' or 'A Heavy Industrial District' save and excepting only as such uses now exist in said territory; and

"Resolved, further, that said westerly one-half of the blocks on the east side of Oak Street between Essex Street Southeast and University Avenue Southeast shall be designated as 'A Commercial District.'"

The Board of Regents having before it request from Public Building Service Employees Union Local 113 that the procedure for the handling of grievances approved by the Board on January 18, 1944 for a nine months' experimental period be extended for one year commencing October 18, 1944, and having in mind that the annual meeting of the Board will be held on the second Friday in May, 1945, at which time the Board, as then constituted, will organize and elect officers for a period of two years, directed the Secretary to advise Public Building Service Employees Union Local 113 that the Board is willing to extend the procedure for the handling of grievances until the second Friday in May, 1945.
