All that part of Section Nineteen (19), Township Twenty-Nine (29), Range Twenty-three (23) in Hennepin County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows: Commencing 200 feet West of the Northeast corner of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of  $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ), thence South 792.5 feet, thence on a curve to the left having a radius of 374.85 feet, a cord distance of 382.1 feet to the East line of the North Seven-eighths of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of  $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ), thence South to the Southeast corner thereof, thence West to a point 30 feet East from the Southwest corner thereof, thence North to North line, thence East to point of beginning, except Como Avenue, containing 12.40 acres more or less, including any part of any street or alley adjacent to said premises vacated or to be vacated.

Voted to authorize the purchase of any portion of the land covered by the foregoing condemnation resolution provided the purchase price has the approval of the Chairman of the Board, the President, and the Business Vice President.

WHEREAS, There is an urgent need for additional dwelling units for the housing of servicemen, veterans and their families in the City of Minneapolis of Minneapolis, Minnesota and

WHEREAS, It is possible to secure some dwelling facilities from the Federal Public Housing Authority pursuant to the provisions of Title V of the Lanham Act (Public Law 849, 76th Congress as amended, particularly by the amendment embodied in Public Law 292, 79th Congress, 1st Sess.) ; and

WHEREAS, The Regents of the University of Minnesota of Minneapolis, Minnesota, and the Federal Public Housing Authority desire to enter into an Agreement with respect to the utilization of the aforesaid facilities,

*Be It Resolved* by the Regents of the University of Minnesota of the City of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as follows :

SECTION 1. That the President of the Regents of the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota shall enter into an Agreement for the provision of two hundred family dwelling units substantially in the form of FPHA 1481 (a copy of which is on file in the office of the Secretary and has been reviewed by this body and found satisfactory in all respects).

SECTION 2. That the President of the Regents of the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota is hereby authorized and directed to execute in quintuplicate the Agreement covering the transfer of said facilities, in the form referred to in Section 1 hereof, and the Secretary of said body, shall impress the corporate seal of the University thereon and to attest the same and said officers are hereby authorized to comply with the requirements of such contract including the submission of an appropriate Project Development Program and Project Management Plan which is satisfactory to the Federal Public Housing Authority, and take such other action as may be necessary to provide and operate said housing facilities for families of servicemen, for veterans and their families pursuant to the provisions of Title V of the Lanham Act (Public Law 849, 76th Congress as amended, particularly by the

amendment embodied in Public Law 292, 79th Congress 1st Sess.).

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its passage.

1. The University of Minnesota Alumnae Club does hereby establish the University of Minnesota Alumnae Club Educational Foundation.
2. That the said "Alumnae Club" respectfully requests of the Regents of the University of Minnesota that gifts made by it under the name of the University of Minnesota Alumnae Club Educational Foundation be accepted by the Regents of the University of Minnesota, in trust, subject to the following conditions:



- a. The principal sums of said trusts shall remain intact to be invested and reinvested by the Regents of the University of Minnesota in the same manner as are other funds of similar kind administered by said Regents of the University of Minnesota.
- b. The income from said trusts made hereunder shall be used for scholarships, loans, and other student aid purposes in such manner as shall seem wise and expedient upon recommendations by the Dean of Students and the Director of Loans and Scholarships of the University of Minnesota.
- c. That the authorized representative or representatives of the donor herein may submit names of proposed beneficiaries hereof and suggest methods of relief and the Dean and Director shall give careful consideration thereto.
- d. That trusts established by the "Foundation" may be designated under names of those contributing, such as individuals, classes or local groups or designated for certain purposes.
- e. The Regents of the University of Minnesota may from time to time, under changing conditions, vary the uses of the trusts established by the "Foundation," provided the same be used for educational purposes.
- f. That in administering the trusts established by the "Foundation" preference shall be given to female students entering the undergraduate classification.

WHEREAS, the surviving members of the Class of 1905 desire from time to time in meeting assembled to review the purposes for which the fund is used and to recommend to the Board additions to or changes in the purposes.

*Now, therefore, be it resolved* by the Regents of the University of Minnesota that a fund be established under the custody of the Regents of the University of Minnesota to be known as the *Class of 1905 Memorial Fund* into which contributions shall be received and invested and reinvested by the Regents with the understanding that the income or principal shall be used for the general welfare

of the students of the University of Minnesota and with the further understanding that the members of the Class of 1905 in meeting assembled shall have the right to specify the uses to which the principal of or income from the fund are to be applied.
