WHEREAS, The commingling of all eligible funds would eliminate this duplication of functions, would make it possible to maintain equivalent proportions of bonds to stocks held, to standardize accounting principles, and to distribute the same rate of return to all participating funds, and

WHEREAS, A study has been made which indicates that all endowment funds administered by the Regents of the University of Minnesota that do not specifically restrict investment media, or prohibit commingling are eligible for commingling in the Group Investment Fund, and

WHEREAS, A study has been made to select the securities not presently included that are comparable in quality, yield and relative value to the securities held in the Group Investment Fund, which study has been approved by the Investment Committee,

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved by the Regents, That all endowment funds administered by the Regents of the University of Minnesota that do not specifically restrict investment media or prohibit commingling are eligible for commingling in the Group Investment Fund, and
