The President reported to the Board that he had accepted the State Department assignment for a study of the activities of foreign country personnel exchanges now under State Department supervision but previously carried on by the State Department and ICA and reported that the major part of his time during the month of January would be taken on this assignment.

The Business Vice President reported that under the will of the late Professor Emeritus Harlow C. Richardson the University was the residuary legatee of the estate estimated at some \$47,000 for the following purposes:

"The income from the fund shall be expended to provide a scholarship or scholarships, depending upon the income available, within the Institute of Technology for worthy and needy students who have not only demonstrated interest but appear to be capable of creditable work in the humanities. A five year course with electives in the humanities is suggested but not required."

Vice President Middlebrook and Comptroller Lunden discussed with the Board the report of the State Public Examiner on the affairs of the University covering the three-year period ending June 30, 1952 pointing out (1) the general content of the report and the extent of the examination, and (2) special comments of the Examiners in relation to the (a) hospital, and (b) accounting methods and procedures, statement of the University Field Auditor filed supplement to the minutes, page 9005.

The President discussed briefly the constitutional amendment involving the diversion of the iron ore tax from the permanent University Fund to current uses and suggested detailed discussion of the statement filed supplement to the minutes at the January meeting of the Board.

Voted to add to the application for Federal Housing Loan approved by the Board at its meeting on November 19, 1955 an item of \$224,000 for the construction of dormitory accommodations for 56 women students at the University Duluth Branch.

Voted on recommendation of the Honors Committee to authorize naming of the Cedar Creek Forest Laboratory as the Fleishmann Laboratory, providing such naming was acceptable to the Fleishmann Foundation.

The President having discussed the formation and objectives of the Midwestern Universities Research Association, the willingness of the Atomic Energy Commission to establish a high energy nuclear machine and the desire of the Association for a site, voted to authorize the officers of the University to make available approximately 500 acres at Rosemount, provided the Association was interested in this site.

The President and Vice President Willey having discussed the recently reported action of the Air Force to discontinue the ROTC unit at the Duluth Branch, voted to authorize the Provost and the Academic Vice President to confer with the Assistant Secretary of the Air with a view to the retention of the unit.

The President discussed with the Board in a preliminary manner the considerations underlying the proposed transfer of the Department of Physics from the College of Science, Literature, and the Arts to the Institute of Technology.

All members of the Board of Regents and their spouses were invited to attend the Seventeenth Annual Alumni Dinner of the Institute of Technology in the Junior Ballroom of Coffman Memorial Union on Friday evening, December 9, 1955, at 6:30 o'clock. Dean Athelstan F. Spilhaus who had just returned from France where he represented the United States on the UNESCO Executive Committee was the principal speaker.

The President presented for the information of the Regents and the record a Certificate of Appreciation from Rear Admiral E. P. Forrestel, U. S. Navy Commandant, Ninth Naval District, which was accepted by Professor

Francis M. Boddy, Chairman of the Senate Committee on ROTC, in recognition of the public-spirited policy with respect to Naval reservists at the University of Minnesota, filed supplement to the minutes, page 9006.

The President reported that he had received from Miss Vivian Weedon, Curriculum Consultant of the National Safety Council the following letter of November 8, 1955 commending the safety program of the University of Minnesota:

Dear President Morrill:

The Transactions of the Second National Conference on Campus Safety, held at the University of Minnesota this spring, came off the press so near our big conference that I am not sure we sent you a copy. It may be that one was sent you routinely but there are some other matters I should like to have your attention called to. It may be that you are so close to the program at the University of Minnesota that you do not realize what an outstanding program you have.

Although the comparison is quite unfair, I am enclosing a copy of the Transactions of the First National Conference on Safety which was held at my undergraduate Alma Mater, the University of Illinois. Original plans had not encompassed putting together any report of this meeting so the notes were actually gathered together very hurriedly and many speeches left out. I do believe, however, that the comparison of the two volumes gives some idea of the difference in magnitude and more particularly in scope.

I have followed the development of campus safety for the past few years and have found it to be a most interesting one. On some campuses the man in charge of safety is little more than a glorified custodian. In other cases "safety" was used as a word but in truth all that is being referred to is traffic safety and a very limited concept of traffic safety at that. In other campuses the main concern is with employees.

The University of Minnesota, in my opinion, is pioneering in a concern for safety which encompasses the entire campus and its activities and does not neglect the students and their education.

I know full well that Vice President Willey, Dr. Boynton, and her wonderful staff would be the first to admit that the University of Minnesota program is just starting and they still have a great distance to go before they will be anything like satisfied. My point is that they see the whole picture and even though they are only in the sketching stage they are giving attention to its entire scope.

You and the entire University of Minnesota are to be congratulated on this development which I am sure is going to be an important one not only in the colleges and universities of the country but in the safety of the entire nation.

Raymond S. Wolf, Information Specialist in Radio on the St. Paul Campus, received the National Safety Council's Public Interest award for services in developing a farm safety radio program on KUOM. The award was made in Chicago on November 26, 1955.

Lester E. Hanson, Professor of Animal Husbandry, Institute of Agriculture, received a \$1000 award for outstanding research work in animal science for 1955. The award was made on November 26, 1955 by the Society of Animal Production for the American Feed Manufacturers Association's nutrition council.

The President reported approval of a one-year extension of the appointment of Frank J. Roth, Jr., as instructor on a non-regular basis in the Department of Bacteriology and Immunology, Medical School, covering the year 1956-57. Such special tenure arrangement is in conformity with the rules governing academic tenure as approved by the Board of Regents.

The President reported that he had received from Dr. A. A. Dowell, Director and Assistant Dean of the College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Home Economics of the Institute of Agriculture, the following resolution concerning faculty coverage under OASI (Federal Old Age and Survivors Insurance) :

WHEREAS, The strength of our University is determined to a large extent by morale of its faculty and by quality of men and women who can be attracted to and retained on its faculty, and

WHEREAS, Financial security, present and future, contributes in an important measure to faculty morale and to the ability of the University to attract and retain superior staff members, and

WHEREAS, The bringing of the tenure staff members under the benefits of OASI (Social Security) contributes appreciably to their present and future financial security; therefore

Be It Resolved, That the faculty of the College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Home Economics take this opportunity to express its sincere appreciation to the Regents, President James L. Morrill, and other members of the University administrative staff for the great and unselfish effort they expended in making it possible for the tenure staff of the University to obtain OASI coverage.
