It has long been understood that all appearances by members of the University staff before committees of the State Legislature on matters that pertain to the University's legislative programs and requests will be channeled through the Office of the President. Only in this way can confusions, possible overlapping of responsibilities and unnecessary duplications be avoided, and common under-

standings with respect to University relationships to the Legislature be assured.

There are occasions when members of the University staff are requested or wish on their own initiative to appear before state legislative committees on matters other than those involving the University's legislative program. Such appearances would be as individuals, although admittedly it is sometimes difficult to distinguish the activity of a staff member as such from his activity as an individual citizen. In this connection, it is always a responsibility of a staff member appearing before a legislative committee to make clear at the outset the status of his appearance, either as a University staff member or as an individual citizen.

In the interests of useful understanding, but without any intention to circumscribe the activities of staff members as private citizens, it is requested that whenever staff members are asked to appear before a state legislative committee, or take initiative themselves looking toward such appearance, on matters that are not part of the University's own legislative program, they inform the Office of the President and the appropriate dean or administrative officer.

It is further requested, as likewise contributing to common understanding, that whenever members of the staff are invited or named to serve on committees or commissions appointed by the Governor or the Legislature, they likewise inform the Office of the President and the appropriate dean or administrative officer.

Re: Appropriation to Complete and Equip New Building
For the Minnesota School of Mines and Metallurgy

WHEREAS, The Iron Mining Industry of Minnesota has for some fifty years produced the major tonnage of iron ore required to support the Steel Industry of the United States, and

WHEREAS, The Iron Mining Industry of Minnesota has in recent years engaged more and more in the beneficiation of low grade wash ores and the so-called "intermediate ores," which branch of the industry has expanded to require the employment of hundreds of trained Metallurgists, Mining Engineers and Geologists, with the result that in 1956 some 33% of Minnesota's shipments of iron ore were in the form of concentrates from about 60 beneficiation plants, and

WHEREAS, The long range future of the Iron Mining Industry of Minnesota rests heavily on the utilization of taconite, of which billions of tons are known to exist, and for the treatment of which two large taconite plants have already been erected at a cost of some half billion dollars, with other and possibly larger taconite plants in prospects, and

WHEREAS, The Iron Mining Industry has been and will continue to be of tremendous economic value to the State of Minnesota and its citizens by furnishing employment to thousands of its people for a long period of years, and will continue to support dozens of prosperous communities in Minnesota, together with associated railroad and lake shipping facilities, and

WHEREAS, The State of Minnesota and its University derives a goodly portion of its tax income from the Mining Industry and associated industries and they are both, therefore, vitally interested in maintaining and sustaining the Mining Industry for many years to come, and

WHEREAS, The University of Minnesota has for over fifty years maintained a School of Mines and Metallurgy on the University campus, whose facilities and curricula now require to be modernized

in order to keep abreast of present and future developments in the mining field, and

WHEREAS, In 1955 the Board of Regents of the University requested of the 1955 Legislature an appropriation of \$1,000,000 for a new School of Mines building, and \$200,000 for remodelling the old Mines building for use of the School of Pharmacy, and which requests were reduced by the 1955 Legislature to a total of \$1,000,000 for both purposes, so that an adequate building could not be built for the funds appropriated.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, That it is our opinion that the Mining Industry is of such vital importance to the State of Minnesota and its citizens as to justify and warrant a first class School of Mines for the training of Mining Engineers, Metallurgists and Geologists to serve the Mining Industry, and

Be It Further Resolved, That in view of the increasing cost of building construction, and in order to assure an adequate building, properly equipped, we respectfully urge the President of the University, the Board of Regents and the 1957 Legislature to provide the necessary funds to complete the School of Mines building and to properly equip the same. We understand that this will require a new appropriation of approximately \$200,000 in addition to the initial appropriation previously provided, and
