Voted to approve the following procedure:

ACQUISITION OF LAND

- I. The procedure shall in all respects be in accord with the provisions in Chapter 117, Minnesota Statutes, 1953, on Eminent Domain as amended.
- II. The need of land for University purposes shall be determined by the Board of Regents by appropriate resolution.
- III. The Real Estate Department shall:
 - (1) Secure plats of property to be acquired showing shape and size of parcels.
 - (2) Secure title abstracts or Torrens titles of all parcels together with legal opinions thereon.
 - (3) Prepare reports on title, names of occupants, tenants, leases, mortgages, liens, or improvements recently made that might be basis of liens, estate ownership, heirs, guardianship, etc.
 - (4) Secure an appraisal of the parcels involved:
- IV. The University Attorney shall:
 - (1) File the proper petition and lis pendens with the court.

- (2) Serve notice on property owners involved.
- (3) Conduct hearings before the Court and Commissioners.
- V. If the awards of Commissioners are satisfactory to the University and to the owners, payment of the award shall be made and possession shall be taken as promptly as possible, but in all cases the University shall give the owner the right to remain in possession as long as possible insofar as is consistent with the best interests of the University.
- VI. If the Commissioners' award is unsatisfactory either to the University or to the owner, and an appeal is taken, the Chairman of the Board of Regents, the President of the University, and the Business Vice President may and are authorized to negotiate a satisfactory price.

The Business Vice President reported that with the approval of the Chairman of the Board and the President of the University a compromise figure of \$110,000 had been negotiated with the Baltimore Realty Company, which compromise figure was approved by the Board. (The Commissioners awarded \$120,000 for the property, and the University appealed the award.)

The Business Vice President having reported that he had reached an agreement with the State Public Examiner, voted to approve the following procedure relative to losses of University funds discovered by the University:

- I. University staff members and members of the office of the State Public Examiner will cooperate to the end of determining losses and so far as possible placing responsibility.
- II. There shall be full and free current interchange of information in regard to all special investigations.
- III. Upon completion of an investigation the Business Vice President after consultation with University staff members involved will report such losses to the Board together with a recommendation of prosecution or nonprosecution.
- IV. Upon disposition of a case by the Board of Regents, the Business Vice President shall advise the State Public Examiner by letter of the details of the case and of the decision of the Board with respect to prosecution or nonprosecution, with a copy to the Attorney General.
- V. In cases which in the judgment of the University staff members involved the University may on its own initiate prose-

cution, it is understood that the State Public Examiner will be advised.

- VI. In cases of this character discovered and reported to the State Public Examiner and the Attorney General by the University, the release of any publicity shall be the responsibility of the University.

The Business Vice President reported that the Federal District Court had dismissed the University of Minnesota as a defendant in the cases of Geraldine B. Thompson vs. C. Walton Lillehei, Richard Varco, Herbert Warden, Earl Schultz, Joseph Buckley, James Matthews, and University of Minnesota, and Dan F. Thompson vs. C. Walton Lillehei, Richard Varco, Herbert Warden, Earl Schultz, Joseph Buckley, James Matthews, and University of Minnesota.

The Chairman of the Board reported that on the afternoon of February 7 he had presided at a meeting with Regents Howard, Lawson, Malkerson, Neumeier, and Mr. Norman Wendt who was complaining concerning the activities of the University Department of Concerts and Lectures, and advised that further meetings would be held and a report made later to the Board.

Voted to authorize an agreement with the Minnesota Nurserymen's Research Corporation, a non-profit corporation of Minnesota nurserymen, under which the corporation would collect royalties on new University varieties of ornamentals and possibly other products and make such royalties available to the University for the support of research.

The President presented from various organizations letters, filed supplement to the minutes, page 9895, in support of new and expanded animal diagnostic facilities.

The President having discussed in detail with the Board Governor Freeman's recommendation for a transfer of the teachers colleges to the Regents of the University of Minnesota, the consensus of opinion was that the University should not participate in support of

or in opposition to the proposed transfer but should await developments on the proposal.

Voted to approve the following recommendations of the Honors Committee:

1. The designation of the structure which links Owre Hall to the University Hospital Buildings as the Mayo Memorial and the auditorium in the building as the Mayo Memorial Auditorium.

In Minnesota facilities for diagnosis and research on animal and poultry diseases at the St. Paul Campus of the University of Minnesota are very inadequate. They are much below the standards of neighboring institutions such as Iowa and Wisconsin.

Because of our need for these facilities we urge that you support the request for adequate Research and Diagnostic Laboratories for our state.

We believe that these units cannot properly be constructed for less than \$600,000 a unit, a total of \$1,200,000.

These improvements will also facilitate teaching in the School of Veterinary Medicine and will be reflected in better future graduates.

Voted on recommendation of the President to approve the re-enactment of the action taken by the Regents on March 11, 1955 in support of the Minnesota Academy of Sciences, as follows:

The President having reported to the Board introduction of a bill in the Legislature for support for the Minnesota Academy of Sciences, voted to indicate preference of an appropriation to the Academy, but with the understanding that the University will accept custody provided that is the decision of the Legislature.

Voted to grant prior approval for the acceptance of bids for the Addition to the Veterinary Science Building on the St. Paul Campus provided that the bids are within the funds available and with the understanding that the bids received will be reported to the Board in the March meeting.

1. Composition.

The University Senate shall be composed of (a) elected representatives of the faculties of the various institutes, colleges, schools of collegiate rank, and the Mayo Foundation, and (b) the members of the University Administrative Committee and the Faculty Consultative Committee, who shall serve ex officio as regular members of the Senate. Each member of the Senate shall represent the faculty and the University as a whole, as well as his own unit.

2. Senate Constitution, Article III, Section 4, Part (a), should be amended by adding after the last sentence thereof the following sentence:

The provisions hereof shall not apply to the election of the representatives of the Mayo Foundation.

3. Senate Constitution, Article III, Section 4, Part (b), should be amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:

The provisions hereof shall not apply to the election of the representatives of the Mayo Foundation.

4. Senate Constitution, Article III, should be amended by adding thereto a new Section 4, Part (c), to read as follows:

(c). The Mayo Foundation shall be entitled to four elected representatives. Three of them shall be elected by faculty members who are professors or associate professors, and one by faculty members who are assistant professors (including research associates) and instructors (including research fellows). Each group shall elect as its representatives persons belonging to it. All representatives shall be elected by secret ballot.

5. The designation of what is now Senate Constitution, Article III, Section 4, Part (c) should be changed to (d);

there should be stricken therefrom the following language "under the provisions of Article I, Section 5, of the By-Laws"; and a period substituted for the comma immediately preceding the part to be stricken.

6. The designation of what is now Senate Constitution, Article III, Section 4, Part (d), should be changed to "(e)."
