#### RESOLUTION

Approving and Providing for Execution of Indenture Dated October 1, 1957, Between the *Regents and the Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis* and Providing for Creation and Issuance of a Bond Issue Known as the Regents of the University of Minnesota St. Paul Apartment and Minneapolis Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1957

WHEREAS, The Regents of the University of Minnesota, a Minnesota public corporation, proposes to create an issue of bonds to be issued pursuant to an indenture to be entered into between this corporation and Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis, as Trustee;

WHEREAS, There has been presented to this meeting, marked Exhibit A for identification and ordered filed with the records of the corporation, a copy of a proposed indenture dated as of October 1, 1957, between this corporation and Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis, as Trustee, providing for the creation and issue of bonds to be known as the Regents of the University of Minnesota St. Paul Apartment and Minneapolis Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1957 (hereinafter called the "Bonds") limited to the aggregate principal amount of \$2,803,000;

WHEREAS, This corporation proposes to sell the Bonds at public sale and it has entered into a Loan Agreement with the United States of America through the Housing and Home Finance Administrator, dated as of March 1, 1958, as modified by waiver dated July 8, 1958, whereby the United States of America has agreed to submit its bid for the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, There has been presented to this meeting, marked Exhibit B for identification and ordered filed with the records of the corporation, a form of notice of sale of the Bonds providing for the reception of bids up to 10:00 A.M. on January 14, 1959;

*Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved* By the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota that:

1. The form, terms and provisions of the indenture presented to this meeting and of the bonds as set forth in said indenture are hereby approved and the President is hereby authorized and directed to execute, in the name and on behalf of this corporation and under its corporate seal attested by the Secretary or an Assistant Secretary, in such number of counterparts as the President deems proper, an indenture in substantially the same form presented to this meeting, containing substantially the same terms and provisions thereof, with such changes and additions thereto as shall be approved by the President (including any changes in the interest rate of the Bonds necessitated by the acceptance of bids for Bonds specifying interest costs other, but less, than two and seven-eighths per cent (2 $\frac{7}{8}$ %) per annum), the execution thereof being conclusive evidence of such approval, and to acknowledge the same and to deliver the same to Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis.

2. This corporation create an issue of bonds to be known as the Regents of the University of Minnesota St. Paul Apartment and Minneapolis Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1957, to be issued under and pursuant to the indenture authorized by paragraph numbered 1 of this resolution in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,803,000, which issue of bonds shall contain the provisions, terms and conditions as are set forth in said indenture.

3. The act of the Vice President, Business Administration, in causing a notice of sale of the Bonds in the form presented to this meeting to be published in The Bond Buyer is hereby in all respects ratified, confirmed and approved, and said Vice President, Business Administration, is hereby authorized and empowered to prepare and distribute an official notice of sale and statement of essential facts for the Bonds containing the information set forth in the form of notice of sale presented to this meeting plus the maturity and redemption schedules of the Bonds, together with such other information as he shall deem appropriate.

4. The President and each Vice President are hereby authorized and empowered to open and review the bids received and to accept or reject bids in the name and on behalf of this corporation.

5. After acceptance of a bid or bids, the President is hereby authorized and directed to execute from time to time in the name and on behalf of this corporation and under its corporate seal attested by the Secretary, Regents of the University of Minnesota St. Paul Apartment and Minneapolis Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1957 in an aggregate principal amount not in excess of \$2,803,000, with such Bonds in coupon form, if any, having annexed thereto appropriate interest coupons bearing the facsimile signature of the Treasurer, and to deliver such Bonds to Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis, as Trustee under said indenture, for authentication and delivery pursuant to the provisions of Article Two of said indenture upon the written order of this corporation signed by the President, a Vice President, the Secretary or the Treasurer.

6. The "net revenues derived from the operation of the Project" and the "excess income derived from the operation of all other dormitories and apartments" (as said terms are defined in said indenture) are hereby pledged and appropriated to the payment of the Bonds to the extent and in the manner set forth in said indenture and the Bonds.

7. The officers of this corporation are hereby authorized and directed to execute such certificates, documents and other papers, to do such things and to take such action as they, or any of them, shall deem necessary or proper to enable this corporation to perform and comply with the terms, provisions and obligations of this corporation under said Loan Agreement, said indenture and the Bonds.

WHEREAS, The Regents of the University of Minnesota proposes to issue \$2,803,000 principal amount of its St. Paul Apartment and Minneapolis Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1957 (hereinafter called the "Bonds") to be secured by a pledge, among other things, of the net revenues of 16 new apartment buildings to be situated on the St. Paul Campus of the University of Minnesota to provide housing and appurtenant facilities for approximately 120 student families, and the net revenues of a new dormitory, with lounge wing, to be situated on the Minneapolis Campus of the University of Minnesota, to provide housing and appurtenant facilities for approximately 564 men students, including ten supervisors and a house director, including additions

to existing Pioneer dining hall (said buildings and facilities being hereafter called the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, In connection with the issuance of the Bonds, the University has agreed to adopt certain parietal rules, rental rates and charges for the use of the Project facilities as may be necessary to (1) assure maximum occupancy and use of said facilities and (2) provide the debt service on the Bonds, the required reserve therefor and the Building Maintenance and Equipment Reserve;

*Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved* That the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota hereby establishes and covenants to enforce so long as any of the bonds are outstanding or unpaid, the following parietal rules and regulations that will assure maximum occupancy and use of the facilities and services afforded by the Project:

1. In the event more space or facilities should become available for dormitory, housing or dining purposes than are required by students applying for such space or facilities, the officers of the University are hereby directed to give preference and priority to the use of the Project, resulting to the extent practicable in the occupancy and use of all the space and services of the Project, even if such preference results in the non-use of all or a part of any other similar space or facilities available at the St. Paul or Minneapolis campuses, respectively, of the University which may be suitable or useable for dormitory, housing or dining purposes.

2. To the extent any surplus space or facilities shall ever become available in the Project while any of the Bonds remain outstanding and unpaid, it shall be the duty of the officers of the University to enforce a rule requiring occupancy and use, to the extent practicable, of the Project by students attending the schools of the University situated at the St. Paul and the Minneapolis campuses, respectively, and this provision shall be considered as a rule of guidance of said officers.

3. The officers of the University are hereby directed to utilize and to cause the utilization of the Project in such manner that it will yield the maximum revenues of which it is reasonably capable, to the end that the Bonds may be adequately serviced.

4. The initial rental rates to be charged for the Project on the St. Paul Campus, designated Unit (a), shall be not less than the following:

*Married Students' Apartments*

2 bedroom units	\$75.00 per month
1 bedroom units	\$70.00 per month

The initial board and room rates to be charged for the Project on the Minneapolis Campus, designated Unit (b), shall be not less than the following:

*Men's Dormitory*

\$705 per regular term for room and board

5. These rules and regulations shall be amended from time to time to meet changing conditions in order better to assure the fulfillment of this pledge.

6. These rules and regulations shall be subordinate to the parietal rules heretofore adopted in connection with the issuance of St. Paul Apartment and Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1956 and Minneapolis Dormitory Revenue Bonds of 1956 by the Regents of the University of Minnesota, insofar as there may be any conflict between them.

The Business Vice President having reported for the information of the Board relative to the sale of the Eustis West River Road property, voted to set the final date for accepting sealed bids on January 15, 1959, at which time bids will be opened for acceptance or rejection by the Business Vice President on behalf of the University.

The Business Vice President and Associate Dean Theodore H. Fenske of the Institute of Agriculture reviewed the Board's action of May 9, 1958, authorizing the Administration to proceed with appropriate steps to implement the establishment of a Southwest Agricultural Experiment Station, pursuant to Minnesota 1957 Extra Session Laws. Also, Dean Fenske reported relative to the study, progress, and conclusions reached relating thereto. Accordingly, and on recommendation of President Morrill and Deans Macy and Fenske, voted to authorize the Business Vice President to (a) purchase the following described parcels of real estate: the Roger Frank 200-acre farm in the County of Redwood, described as follows:

SE $\frac{1}{4}$  and SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 17, Township 109 North, Range 37 West of the Fifth Principal Meridian,

at the maximum price of \$300 per acre; and, the William Behrends 40 acres lying on the east side of the Roger Frank farm in Redwood County, described as follows:

W $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and W $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 16, Township 109 North, Range 37 West of the Fifth Principal Meridian,

at the maximum price of \$325 per acre; and (b) draw upon the State Auditor for the full statutory amount of \$80,000, pursuant to the said 1957 laws for the purchases and for establishing the Southwest Agricultural Experiment Station.

The Regents requested the staff committee under the chairmanship of Associate Dean Fenske to proceed with the studies requested in the report of the Legislative Interim Commission on Agricultural Schools.

The President reported receipt of a copy of the Legislative Research Committee's report on the State Organization Service and indicated the University will be prepared to speak on this report during the hearings if called upon to do so.

The President reported for the information of the Board the information he had received from the Commissioner of Administration on the Governor's "preliminary" 1959-61 biennial appropriation recommendations to the Legislature for general maintenance, specials, and hospitals.

The Business Vice President reported the recommendation of the University to the Legislative Building Commission for changes in the Commission's recommendations, letter filed supplement to the minutes, page 11,447.

The Business Vice President having reported for the information of the Board relative to a defalcation in the Center for Continuation Study, correspondence filed supplement to the minutes, page 11,448, voted to authorize the filing of a complaint.

The President having reported for the information of the Board receipt of an inquiry from Mr. R. C. Malmquist, Chief, Minneapolis Fire Department, relative to

the construction of a new fire department station to replace the one located on the corner of Oak Street and University Avenue S. E., filed supplement to the minutes, page 11,449, voted to approve the letter of the President in response, filed supplement to the minutes, page 11,450.

The President reported for the information of the Board receipt of a letter from Mr. Harry Zinsmaster, President, Zinsmaster Bread Company, Duluth, Minnesota, relative to the purchase of baked goods by the University and his answer thereto.

The Business Vice President reported for the information of the Board receipt of a letter from Mr. David Y. Morris, Business Representative of the University of Minnesota Employees Union Local 450, filed supplement to the minutes, page 11,451, advising the University of the Union's appointment of Mr. Joseph Robbie, Attorney at Law, Minneapolis, as the representative of the Union to serve on an arbitration panel and requesting the University to do the same, looking to the end that the Union's labor complaint shall be resolved as provided under the law.

The Academic Vice President reported for the information of the Board correspondence from Mr. Howard L. McLeod, Bemidji, Minnesota, University of Minnesota R.O.T.C. graduate, requesting assistance in effecting a change in the laws pertaining to disability retirement pay. The Vice President stated that such printed material as was available bearing on the subject matter was transmitted to Mr. McLeod for his use. It was the consensus of the Board that no further action by the Board would be appropriate.

The President reported for the information of the Board relative to a proposal by a group of interested individuals to establish a medical school in the City of St. Paul.

President Morrill indicated to the Board his expectation to suggest to the Regents at the February meeting a possible pattern of faculty relationship to the Regents' procedure for selection of his successor.

Regent Howard commented briefly on the Purdue University meeting of the Association of Governing Boards of Land-Grant and State Universities.

On recommendation of the President, the Regents voted to accept the invitation of the Board of Directors of the Campus Club, extended by Mr. Wenberg, Club President, to the Regents and their spouses to be guests of the Club at dinner Thursday, February 12, at 6:30 p.m.

Regent Karl G. Neumeier having expressed his intention of not standing for re-election and having expressed the pleasantness of his association with the Board, voted to express to Regent Neumeier the appreciation of the University and the Board of Regents for his faithful and constructive service.

The President having reported for the information of the Board, voted to authorize issuance of a Special Citation to the Variety Club of the Northwest, copy filed supplement to the minutes, page 11,452.

Voted on recommendation of the Business Vice President and the President to approve authorization for the architects, C. H. Johnston Company of St. Paul, to proceed with plans for the remodeling of Millard Hall, Phase III.
