The Board hereby expresses its great regard for the long services of Dr. Gillette as a teacher in the University of Minnesota. He was, moreover, one of its honored alumni. He was one of the first physicians to devote himself to the specialty which he so long represented. Most of the orthopedic surgeons of this part of the country were his pupils. He did a great service for the crippled and unfortunate of the Northwest. Especially will he be remembered as the founder and director of the State Hospital for the Crippled and Deformed at Phalen Park."

That the Director of University Extension is hereby authorized to pay members of the University faculty from the funds of the General Extension Division the regular fees and traveling expenses for delivering extension lectures throughout the state, said fees to be added to regular monthly pay checks.

The report of the Public Examiner for the year ending June 30, 1920, was received and placed on file. A special report by the Comptroller concerning items referred to in the Public Examiner's report was also received.

Voted to approve the amendment to Article 3 and 13 of the constitution of the University Senate as follows:

#### Article 3

The University Senate is composed of the President, the Deans, all Professors, (including acting professors), Associate Professors, the University Librarian, and any other members of the University Faculty holding executive positions carrying, by authority of the Board of Regents, the rank of Professor or Associate Professor. The Senate shall also have authority to add from time to time to its roster such other members of the Faculty of the University or its administrative officers as the Senate upon report of the Committee on Business and Rules, with or without its recommendation, may elect. The Presidents Emeriti, Professors Emeriti, and Professors who devote less than half time to the work of the University are entitled to participate in the discussions of the Senate, but not to vote. A Membership Committee shall decide each year upon the official roster of the Senate. The Registrar is the Clerk of the

Senate and Custodian of its records, authorized to participate in discussions, but without vote.

### Article 13

The Senate shall have the power to enact statutes, for the government of the students in those relations with the University which affect the University as a whole. Questions of jurisdiction as between the Senate and a College Faculty, shall be determined by the President.

Voted to refer the question of the purchase of students' instruments by the University to the President and the Comptroller.

Voted to accept with thanks the gift of ethnic materials from John W. Dye to the Department of Anthropology.

Voted to approve the payment of institutional membership dues for 1920-21 in the American Council on Education in the sum of \$500.
