**MINUTES**

May 26, 1922

A meeting of the Building and Grounds Committee of the Board of Regents was held in the Minnesota Union, Friday, May 26, 1922, at twelve o'clock.

Present: Regent Partridge, chairman; Regents Coffman, Snyder, and Sommers.

A committee representing the Marines, enlisted from Minnesota, asked for a suitable site on the University campus for a monument in memory of Marines who died in the late world war.

Voted to recommend that the monument be accepted with thanks and that a suitable site for the monument be selected on the University campus but that no monument be placed upon the campus knoll.

The consulting architect presented the matter of the location of the proposed new Electrical Engineering building.

Voted that the consulting architect prepare sketches of an Electrical Engineering building to be located directly west and across the street from the Main Engineering building; and the committee recommended that the block bounded by Church, Beacon, Union and Arlington Streets be reserved for an enlargement of the Athletic Field.

Voted that the present Music building be used for the Department of Journalism and student publications.

Voted to adjourn.
