That certain parcel of land belonging to the State of Minnesota beginning at a point four hundred forty (440) feet west and one hundred (100) feet north of the quarter section corner common to sections thirty-five (35) and thirty-six (36) of township one hundred twenty-five (125) north, range forty-two (42) west of the fifth principal meridian and running south one hundred (100) feet; thence East six hundred seventy (670) feet; thence North five hundred sixty (560) feet, to the right of way of trunk highway No. twenty-eight (28); thence Southwesterly along said right of way to the point of beginning, and containing about five acres, for an equal area of land belonging to the Summit

Cemetery Association of Morris, located as follows: Beginning at a point two hundred thirty (230) feet east of the quarter section corner common to sections thirty-five (35) and thirty-six (36) of township one hundred twenty-five (125) north, range forty-two (42) west of the fifth principal meridian, and running east four hundred thirty (430) feet; thence South four hundred ninety-five (495) feet; thence West four hundred thirty (430) feet, then four hundred ninety-five (495) feet to the place of beginning.

Voted to approve the policy of advertising the short courses of the General Extension Division in specialized or professional publications at the discretion of the Director.

Voted to approve the recommendation of the President for an extension of Northrop field and the removal of a portion of the brick wall now surrounding the athletic field, in accordance with the plan filed supplement to the minutes, page 411.

Voted that the rate for room and board in the men's dormitories, beginning with the year 1925-26, be the same as heretofore (\$360 for the school year) for double rooms but that it be raised to \$390 for single rooms.

Representatives of the Minneapolis Real Estate Board appeared to protest against the proposed amendment to Chapter 128, Laws of 1915.

Voted to confirm the former action of the Board of Regents in favor of the proposed amendment.
