The President of the University presented to the Board a letter from former Regent Samuel Lewison expressing appreciation of the letter from the Regents in connection with his resignation from the Board.

Voted to refer to the Comptroller for investigation and report the matter of public liability and insurance on University owned motor vehicles.

Voted to direct the President of the University to advise Mr. Henry A. Scandrett, President, and Mr. Joseph J. Oslie, Assistant General Passenger Agent, of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad Company, of the inability of the University to use the Appreciation Day Band Fund for reimbursing Mr. Oslie for losses sustained by him in connection with the trip South of the band during 1930 under opinion received from the Deputy Attorney General, dated May 2, 1931, filed supplement to the minutes, page 781, which opinion rules that voluntary trust funds cannot be diverted to another use without the consent of the donors.

Voted to authorize the collection of a fee of \$50 for inspection by the University of private secondary schools of the state.

Action was postponed on the proposed fee increase in the College of Engineering and Architecture and the School of Chemistry.

Voted to approve a laboratory fee of \$2 for Physical Education Course 79 to cover the cost of purchasing the cadavers which are necessary for the women students in the study of anatomy.

Voted to adhere to the previously expressed policy of not granting free tuition to any group or class of students in connection with request of the Minnesota Department of the American Legion for remission of tuition and matriculation fees to World War orphans who are taking higher collegiate training.

Voted to authorize the President of the University and the Comptroller to make necessary adjustments to Pioneer Hall rates approved in the minutes of the Board on March 11, 1931.

Voted to amend minutes of April 14, 1931 to provide that the Hill House, a house in Pioneer Hall, be designated as the James J. Hill House.

The Comptroller reported a small fire on the first floor of Dexter Hall, one of the Men's Dormitories at the University Farm, April 25, 1931 at 9 o'clock. Settlement of claim with the insurance company for approximately \$206 was approved.

Voted to authorize execution of request to the City of Minneapolis for permit to maintain and use steam heating pipes in Beacon and Harvard Streets Southeast and a water main in Beacon Street Southeast.

Voted to authorize preparation of plans and specifications by the Department of Buildings and Grounds for a Superintendent's residence at Grand Rapids, estimated cost \$7,500.

Professor Mann, University Architect, presented plans and specifications for the new Dentistry building and discussed with the Board the location of the building.

Voted to request the Dean of the Department of Agriculture to recommend sites for an Agronomy Crop Field House on the Farm Campus, and an office and laboratory building at the Fruit Breeding Farm at Zumbra Heights, a sewage disposal plant at the West Central School and Station, Morris, Minnesota, and a dairy barn at the North Central School and Station, Grand Rapids, Minnesota.
