## Head's Letter

Summer 2009 has brought with it several transitions. On July 1, University of Minnesota Academic Health Center (AHC) Senior Vice President Frank Cerra, MD, assumed the role of Medical School dean, and Mark Paller, MD, MS, AHC assistant vice president for research, was appointed to the newly created role of Medical School executive vice dean. In addition, the Duluth Family Medicine Residency joined our family of administered or affiliated residencies, now totaling eight programs.

On June 23, I met with some of our retired faculty to reminisce about their experiences in the department, report new initiatives in which we're engaged, and discuss funding for the Founders' Chair. These retirees have worked tirelessly to

create the strong foundation and support that we currently enjoy.

I'm sorry to report that Lynn Carmichael, MD, one of the founding fathers of family medicine, died on June 19. He began the first family medicine residency at the University of Miami in the 1960s and helped establish the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine. He once wrote, "I had been raised with the idea that diseases existed and that our job was to treat diseases. But we don't treat diseases; we take care of people. The meaning of 'family' in family medicine is not that the family is the unit of care as much as it is the process of care ... the goal of the physician should be to do whatever is necessary to enhance individuals'

abilities to heal themselves. There is tremendous gratification and satisfaction that can come from this kind of medical practice. That is more important than the salary, benefits, and prestige of being a doctor, and it is much more sustaining." I'm proud that today we continue to fulfill Dr. Carmichael's vision.

## Faculty and Students Receive MAFP Awards

The Minnesota Academy of Family Physicians (MAFP) Spring Refresher 2009 awardees included Ray Christensen, MD, President's Award; Ruth Westra, DO, MPH, Teacher of the Year; and Nicholas Vidor and Marie Lange, Medical Student Award for Contributions to Family Medicine.

### Ray Christensen, MD, President's Award

Christensen, Medical School assistant dean for rural health, was honored for his significant contributions to the MAFP, including his service on the board and as a past president. He was also recognized for being an outstanding preceptor and a founding partner of the Gateway Clinic in Moose Lake; champion of primary care on the Governor's Health Reform Task Force; leader within the Minnesota Medical Association; and founder of the Minnesota Department of Health Office of Rural Health and Primary Care.

### Ruth Westra, DO, MPH, Teacher of the Year

Westra was recognized not only for her part in guiding the students who planned and launched the HOPE clinic and her role as chair of the department's Duluth campus, but also for excellence in teaching and her compassion and concern for medical students. One nominator said, "I know of no other clinician who has given more of herself to train the next generation of physicians."

### Nicholas Vidor and Marie Lange Medical Student Award for Contributions to Family Medicine

Breaking the tradition of giving an award to one fourth-year medical student, the MAFP presented the 2009 student award to two second-year medical students. Nicholas Vidor and Marie Lange received the award "for their sacrifices and inter-professional service in establishing the student-run HOPE clinic." Located at a drop-in center for the homeless, the HOPE clinic opened its doors fall 2008 to serve the underserved and uninsured.

## Legends and Leaders

On Friday, June 5, 2009, 150 people gathered at the University of Minnesota - Duluth campus for the dedication of the new Medical School - Duluth campus Legends and Leaders Wall of Honor. The 40-year milestone memorialized the 1969 legislation that started the school, and the event honored the deans, charter faculty, philanthropists, and community leaders who supported its mission. Honorees included Department of Family Medicine and Community Health - Duluth campus faculty Jim Boulger, PhD, and adjunct faculty Arne Vainio, MD, as well as William Jacott, MD, former department head and associate professor emeritus.

# Resident and Fellow Commencement

On Wednesday, June 10, 2009, the department celebrated its 37th annual resident and fellow commencement at the McNamara Alumni Center on the University of Minnesota – East Bank campus. Forty residents graduated, along with one fellow in behavioral medicine, one fellow in hospice and palliative medicine, and one fellow in human sexuality.

**Kirby Clark, MD**, St. John’s Hospital Family Medicine Residency, received the 2009 Faculty Teacher of the Year Award; and, University of Minnesota Medical Center, Fairview, Smiley’s Family Medicine Residency preceptor **Deanna Sellers, ACNP**, received the 2009 Adjunct Faculty Teacher of the Year Award.

The Leonard P. Burke, MD, Memorial Award was presented to **Samuel Asante-Buabeng, MD**, for his work educating Ghanaian immigrants about health promotion and disease prevention. Asante-Buabeng, a graduate of the Methodist Hospital Family Medicine Residency, created a series of health education talks and newsletter articles for the Ghanaian community. Topics included cardiac health, diabetes, health promotion, and tobacco cessation. Asante-Buabeng also spoke in local schools and at youth events, encouraging young Ghanaians to consider careers in health care.



**Erin Westfall, DO**, and **Nathania Hammel, DO**, graduates of the Mankato Family Medicine Residency, received the Excellence in Research Award. Westfall and Hammel conducted research on postpartum depression screening at the ISJ-EastRidge Clinic in three phases.

In phase one, Westfall said, “We looked at how we diagnosed [postpartum depression] before and how many cases there were.” In phase two, Westfall and Hammel implemented clinic-wide use of the Edinburgh Postnatal Depression Scale for all postpartum visits and well-child visits in the first three months postpartum. Phase three included examination of how often the diagnosis of postpartum depression was made during the year the screening tool was in place. Westfall and Hammel are currently in the final stages of data analysis.

## Torkelson Studies Tibetan Medicine

On June 6, 2009, Carolyn Torkelson, MD, MS, returned from three weeks in India studying Tibetan medicine. Torkelson traveled with a group from the University of Minnesota Center for Spirituality and Healing. They attended class at Men-Tsee-Khang, the medical school for Tibetan medicine, and had an audience with the Oracle and Karmapa, in line to be the next Dalai Lama.

Torkelson had this to say of her trip: "Tibetans are an intellectual, hard working, dedicated, compassionate group of people who want to share their knowledge of medicine and peaceful liberation with the world. Although Tibetan medicine is grounded in Buddhism, [Men-Tsee-Khang faculty] encouraged us to stay within our religious traditions." Torkelson believes this ancient healing practice can be translated into western medicine for prevention benefit.

## The Aging Game

The Aging Game, an age-awareness role-playing exercise led by Jim Pacala, MD, MS, was offered for the last time as a requirement for University of Minnesota medical students on April 15, 2009.

### What Is the Aging Game?

Medical students dress up like older patients and use a variety of props to simulate disabilities: fogged goggles for cataracts, extra socks for leg edema, arm slings and neck and leg braces to impair movement, etc.

Once outfitted with their disabilities, students are placed in a simulated community at the Hennepin County Medical Center that includes a bus stop,

grocery store, restaurant, and nursing home environment. Volunteers from Centennial High School play insensitive workers, helping medical students see the psychological toll everyday life can have on the elderly.



About 2,500 medical students have participated in the Aging Game workshop over the past 16 years. Many have commented that it is one of the most memorable experiences they had in medical school. We hope to find a place for it in the curriculum in the future.

In June 2009, **Walter Bockting, PhD**, began a two-year term as president of the World Professional Association for Transgender Health.

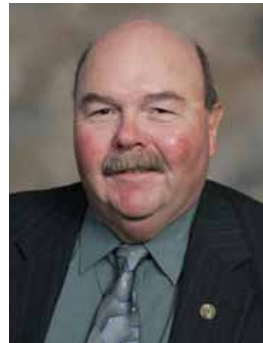
