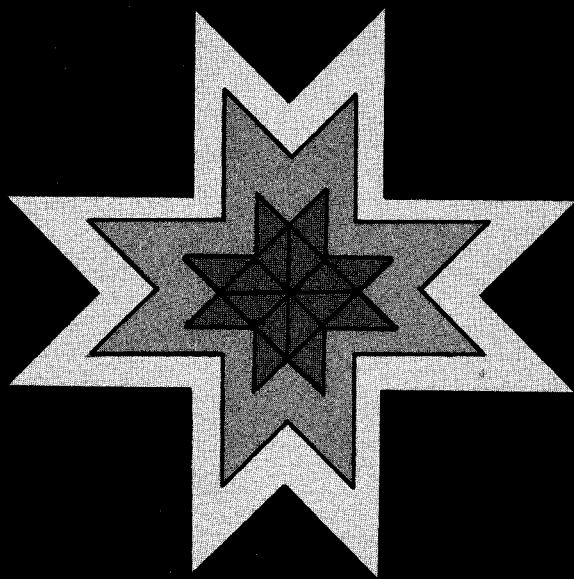

Community Services
University Hospitals

The Community Services Program is designed to bring the University Health Sciences staff and other resources to health care agencies throughout the state. The service is usually provided in the community, and the goal is to establish on-going relationships between health care agencies and the University. Although service is brought to the community, staff from the community may spend time at University Hospitals to gain experience in specialty areas such as rehabilitation, coronary care, intensive care, housekeeping and maintenance, and with various methods of health care delivery.

The most important component of the Community Services Program is flexibility. The program is designed to provide any type of assistance within the capabilities of the Health Sciences Center. Some examples of the types of service available are:

Inservice programs for health agency staff

Seminars for medical staff

Organizational review and staff development

Specialty area work experience

Inservice resources pool --

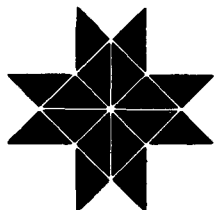
