

> ACADEMIC COSTUME

Academic gowns date back to the 14th century, when they served two functions of nearly equal importance: to indicate the academic rank of the wearer and to keep the scholar warm in the drafty stone halls of academia.

The markings, cut, and colors of the modern-day academic costume—cap, gown, and sometimes hood—indicate the academic degree, the field of study, and the institution that granted the degree. At commencement ceremonies those who already have a doctoral degree wear hoods. Degree candidates wear the gowns appropriate for the degrees they are about to receive, and new doctorates are hooded on stage.

Bachelor's degree gowns are black and untrimmed. A tassel hanging from the mortar board worn on the head is color-coded by college at the University of Minnesota. The College of Liberal Arts tassel is white. Honors graduates wear a medallion adorned with a maroon and gold ribbon.

Master's degree gowns, black and untrimmed, have pointed sleeves. Doctoral gowns in the United States traditionally have been black with velvet front facings and crossbars on the sleeves but in recent years a number of universities have adopted gowns of distinctive school colors.

The Minnesota hood, which may be worn by anyone with a doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota, is black with maroon chevron on gold. Each institution has its own pattern of colors on the hood, worn around the neck and down the back of the gown. The length and shape of the hood identify the most advanced degree the wearer has earned, and the velvet edging shows the field: blue for doctor of philosophy, light blue for doctor of education, and pink for doctor of musical arts.

> THE MACE

The University of Minnesota mace was carried for the first time in 1961 by Regents Professor of Physics Alfred O.C. Nier at the inauguration of President O. Meredith Wilson. Art professor Philip Morton designed the mace: a crystal sphere four inches in diameter surmounted by the North Star, symbol of the state of Minnesota, on a solid aluminum handle set with the University regents seal.

The University of Minnesota, ranked among the nation's top public universities, reflects the State of Minnesota's strong and enduring commitment to education. It is nearly unique among universities in the United States in its three defining characteristics:

- It is an international research university.
- It is a public land-grant institution with a strong tradition of education and public service.
- Its largest campus—the Twin Cities campus—is located in a vibrant metropolitan area including not one, but two great cities: Minneapolis and St. Paul.

The University is the primary center in Minnesota (and much of the Upper Midwest) for education and research in the liberal arts and sciences, health sciences, law, education, engineering, agriculture, and natural resources. The Twin Cities campus comprises 19 colleges and offers a full range of academic and professional degrees. A comprehensive campus in Duluth offers undergraduate and graduate programs. The Morris campus offers a four-year liberal arts program. Crookston offers associate and baccalaureate degrees in technical, career-oriented programs. The Rochester campus provides graduate and undergraduate degrees, with a special focus on health sciences and biotechnology. Through the Minnesota Extension Service, the University is present in each of Minnesota's 87 counties.

When the University was founded as a preparatory school in 1851, Minnesota had been a territory for just

two years, and statehood was still seven years away. The school was built on little more than the pioneers' faith in education. In its early years, the University struggled financially; during the Civil War, it was forced to close. It reopened in 1867, thanks to the energetic leadership of Governor John S. Pillsbury, who came to be known as the "Father of the University." Mathematics Professor William Watts Folwell became the University's first president in 1869. Robert Bruininks is the University's 15th president.

Two students received bachelor of arts degrees at the first commencement in June 1873. Since then, the University has granted nearly 600,000 degrees.

University alumni include eight Nobel Prize winners, 15 of Minnesota's 39 governors, a former chief justice of the United States Supreme Court, two former U.S. vice presidents, the heads of Fortune 500 companies, pioneers in medicine, civil rights leaders, top journalists, distinguished teachers and scholars, performing artists, and countless other men and women who have achieved distinction in every field.

Alumni, their families, and friends are always welcome at the University. We invite you to visit campus regularly to enjoy the many educational, cultural, and entertainment opportunities that are open to the public—including performances by students in CLA's vibrant arts programs. THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

With some 17,000 undergraduate and graduate students, the College of Liberal Arts (CLA) prepares more students than any other college at the University of Minnesota—in fact, more than any other college in the State of Minnesota, public or private.

Students are taught by approximately 550 permanent faculty members—teachers and researchers of international stature—and they can chose from more than 60 majors or design their own cross-disciplinary program.

Most CLA students complete their undergraduate education in the college. Others complete their basic liberal arts coursework in CLA, then transfer to another unit of the University. The college offers strong pre-professional programs with close ties to the University's health sciences and other professional schools.

Since the University's earliest days, the liberal arts have been its essence and academic core.

This is because, as William Watts Folwell, first president of this land-grant University, put it, they "enrich and emancipate communities." They prepare thoughtful citizens by posing difficult questions about the nature and meaning of our lives, and by addressing some of the most important issues that confront our nation and the world.

Examples are easy to find. We need to understand history, culture, religion, and language to appreciate and navigate the shifting ground of diplomacy and politics; leaders who lack that understanding affect war and peace around the world. We need to understand economics to survive in the current climate; economics without ethics

has led to a worldwide recession. Justice and equality, belief and truth, the beauty of the written word, a work of art, a musical passage—these equip us to create a meaningful life, a life worth living.

Liberal arts graduates can challenge accepted paradigms, create bold new ideas or artistic works, view issues from multiple perspectives. They can develop hypotheses and collect data, reason soundly about complex questions, and, above all, communicate clearly and ethically.

By choosing a liberal arts education they have prepared themselves for a life-long, self-motivated voyage of discovery. They know there are no pat answers to be found in the back of the book—but are prepared to create, critique, synthesize, and defend their own independent thinking. They can know themselves from the standpoint of other times, people, and cultures, which makes them less egocentric—and more able to live in a world where people must get along together.



MICHAEL DENNIS BROWNE

POET AND ENGLISH PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Keynote Speaker



His work includes eight books of poetry, and numerous librettos including *To Be Certain of the Dawn*, a Holocaust memorial oratorio with music by Stephen Paulus, which was recorded by the Minnesota Orchestra and nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. Browne's poems have appeared in *The New Yorker, The American Poetry*


Review, and numerous other journals and anthologies.

Among his most valuable contributions to the liberal arts is the respect and inspiration he provided students over his 40 years of teaching in CLA's Department of English. It takes some guts to write poetry—to offer your most private and profound thoughts in what may be the most challenging of all language arts. But Browne knows how to make the process both safe and productive.

"It's a question of empathy," he says, "knowing what it might be like to be [the students]...and part of the art is really listening to what they're saying and what they're unable to say, and picking up on that. There's a majority of people who, if they feel that they're being listened to, can really open up with that kind of attention."

Former student Nell Kromhout put it this way: "Michael nurtures the inner inquisitive mind in his students by a continuous yet gentle challenge of our comfort levels as poets and as people."

Indeed, Browne has won virtually every University



of Minnesota teaching award, including the Morse-Alumni Award for Outstanding Contributions to Undergraduate Education, and the Award for Outstanding Contributions to Graduate and Professional Education—the University's highest awards for teaching.

His contributions to the community have been equally transformative. In the early 1970s, Browne, along with book store owner Marly Rusoff and poets Robert Bly, Patricia Hampl, Jim

Moore, and Phoebe Hanson formed a "poet's club;" they invited Garrison Keillor to emcee a fundraiser for what became The Loft Literary Center—which today is the nation's largest independent literary center.

Browne was born into a musical family (his dad was a Catholic church organist and choirmaster) on Walton-on-Thames in Surrey, England, received his B.A. in languages (French and Swedish) from Hull University, and went on to attend Oxford. He came to the U.S. as a graduate student to study poetry at the University of Iowa, where he received his M.A. in literature.

During his Iowa years he sometimes vacationed in a northerly direction, and fell in love with Minnesota's north woods. This explains how it came to be that in 1971 he wound up teaching at the U of M, where he remained as a faculty member and for some years as director of the University's Creative Writing Program, until his retirement a few months ago. Browne offers this history to explain his accent, which he calls "Anglo-Sotan."

KIRSTEN FISCHER

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, HISTORY

Horace T. Morse – University of Minnesota Alumni Association Award for Outstanding Contributions to Undergraduate Education

Was the U.S. really founded as a Christian nation, or did the Constitution's framers intend to separate church and state? What are the Supreme Court decisions regarding state-mandated school prayer? Time after time, students enroll in Kirsten Fischer's history courses to learn and discuss these "hot button" issues. Yet teaching these issues is no easy undertaking. Fischer notes,

I always take some deep breaths before walking into the lecture hall to present another controversial subject from the culture wars. I must give an

informative and fair account of the relevant circumstances.... Day after day we have vigorously analytical discussions about emotionally fraught topics. This is easier said than done in large classrooms of unlike-minded students, and it's the most important work of my teaching career.

By analyzing and discussing primary documents, Fischer pushes her students to think about why and how we come to know certain things. She encourages her students to neither dismiss the arguments that are presented, nor to accept them at face value. Students quickly learn that history often reveals a complex and ambiguous record.

"At every turn, people in the past contributed to or contested developments as they occurred," Fischer says. "Taking these various positions seriously helps us see that American history has not been linear or predictable, but deeply controversial and as open-ended as our future



now seems to us."

Fischer's teaching is fueled by her research. Her first book, Suspect Relations: Sex, Race, and Resistance in Colonial North Carolina, explores how intimate relationships among ordinary people contributed to the development of race as an ideology and practice in early America. Her current project, Pantheism Comes to America: Elibu Palmer's Radical Religion in the Early Republic, draws awareness to a much-neglected figure in American history.

Fischer's commitment to

undergraduate education goes above and beyond her time spent in front of a classroom. With her assistance, the University was able to restart the History Club. Fischer also started the annual Undergraduate Studies Celebration in order to recognize student achievements. Additionally, Fischer regularly offers seminars geared towards high school teachers. These seminars help teachers better prepare their students for skills they will need in college.

Students and colleagues speak volumes about Fischer's accomplishments as an educator. Says one colleague, "Fischer's exemplary dedication and talent as a teacher and adviser, along with her strong educational leadership skills, make her a unique asset to the department and the University. She creates transformative learning experiences that her students carry with them beyond their undergraduate years."

KURT KIPFMUELLER

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, GEOGRAPHY

Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award

Most students can attest to the simple reality that in large lectures it is easy to come into class and for the next hour or so, sit quietly in anonymity. However, one student fondly remembers geography professor Kurt Kipfmueller's introduction to the age of the Earth:

Kurt brought in a 100m transect measuring tape. He had a student hold one end and called that the Big Bang, then he ran up and down the giant lecture hall stopping to describe significant eras along the transect. He circled the entire room and comically kept pulling out

the tape to get the last few centimeters, representing human existence. He kept the huge classroom awake, amused, and most importantly, engaged in the material.

Kipfmueller recognizes that most of the several hundred students that enroll in Biogeography of the Global Garden each semester initially have no interest in sciences beyond fulfilling their liberal education lab requirement. Yet he believes that it is imperative for students to acquire a basic understanding of how their personal decisions impact the natural world. With humor and a sharp mind, Kipfmueller finds ways to motivate students, ensure their presence at lectures, and capture their attention by integrating course content with current events and issues.

A colleague points out that because of Kipfmueller's exceptional teaching, many students elect to continue taking science courses, and let him know that his teaching was instrumental in awakening an interest in the subject



matter. According to a former teaching assistant, "His interest in biogeography is boundless to the point of being unavoidably infectious."

Kipfmueller arrived in Minnesota in 2003 by way of the University of Arizona, where his studies in dendrochronology—the science of tree-ring analysis—led to his studies in geography and dendroecology, in which he applies his work to research on climate change and the reconstruction of historic eco-systems.

Kipfmueller is as at home in the U's dendroecology laboratory as he is in the landscapes from which many of his tree core samples have been culled.

"Every summer since I moved here," says Kipfmueller, "I've been up in the Boundary Waters collecting core samples from trees to reconstruct climate."

Plainly evident along the length of the bores, the tree rings tell a story of place, time, and climate that not only recall past ecological events, but hint at what the future may hold for the forests of North America. Kipfmueller's passion for his research and sharing it with his students shines through in all of his teaching evaluations, which are consistently outstanding at all academic levels. And his philosophy of teaching is simple:

Teaching does not just take place in the traditional classroom confines; it transpires in small group meetings in my lab, in the field, or as informal conversations after I've completed a lecture. It is very special for me when I witness their emerging passions and 'eureka' moments that make teaching in any forum a truly rewarding experience.

KEITH MAYES

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, AFRICAN AMERICAN AND AFRICAN STUDIES

Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award

As a professor of African American studies, Keith Mayes encourages discussions that have immediate relevance and profound impacts on all students. One student notes, "By relating the material to today, Professor Mayes challenges students to understand how we promote or challenge issues involving race and racism. He openly embraces ideas students have about different topics, promoting classroom discussions so that we learn from one another. He also shines light on many issues without being narrow-minded or condescending."

Specializing in black holidays, the Black Power movement, and civil rights, Mayes's passion for African American history extends beyond the classroom. His book Kwanzaa: Black Power and the Making of the African-American Holiday Tradition is the first scholarly work of its kind that explores not only the holiday's origins, but also its greater cultural significance in American calendar politics. His next publication will address legal issues in the Civil Rights movement in the 20th century.

Great teaching involves more than just having mastery in the subject matter. According to Mayes, the mechanism and methods of delivery are equally as



important. "Enthusiasm, varying degrees of voice pitches and inflections, moving about the room, and making sustained eye-contact are the key parts in making history lectures interesting and engaging," he says. "I learned that the more expressive and engaging you are, the more engrossed students will be in your lecture."

Students' consistent praise serves as evidence of Mayes's outstanding and dynamic teaching methods. A former student recalls the great enthusiasm Mayes brought to every lecture:

My most vivid memories of

Professor Mayes are of him running up and down the aisles of Blegen auditorium when his passion for the course work catches up with him and he feels the need to bound across the room to hear every question and elucidate every point.

Professor Mayes's passion and insight both in and out of the classroom make him much deserving of the Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award. His career has been called "a testament to the best of what it means to be an outstanding educator." Through his teaching style and mentoring, Mayes is motivating his students to reach their potential, and beyond.

LIBERAL ARTS DEGREES

The College of Liberal Arts offers five bachelor's degrees—bachelor of arts (B.A.), bachelor of individualized studies (B.I.S.), bachelor of fine arts (B.F.A.), bachelor of music (B.M.), and bachelor of science (B.S.). The bachelor's degrees have many requirements in common.

DEGREE CANDIDATES

College of Liberal Arts degree candidates may graduate with Latin Honors, Distinction, or both. These citations are provisional and do not become official until all requirements for the award are fulfilled.

LATIN HONORS DESIGNATIONS - Students graduating from the College of Liberal Arts through the University Honors Program have taken part in a rigorous course of study, research, scholarship, or other creative work in the major, culminating in an Honors thesis representing independent work done under the direction of a faculty supervisor or mentor. Students graduating cum laude (with honor) have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.50 for the last 60 graded credits at UMTC. Magna cum laude (with great honor) awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.66 and summa cum laude (with highest honor) awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.75 in the final 60 graded credits at UMTC.

DISTINCTION DESIGNATIONS - Students earn graduation "with Distinction" or "with High Distinction" based on cumulative grade point average at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities with at least 60 graded credits completed at UMTC. Students graduating "with Distinction" must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher in UMTC coursework at the time of graduation; students graduating "with High Distinction" must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher in UMTC coursework at the time of graduation.
