To: Student Organizations and Their Faculty Advisers
From: Student Activities Bureau
Subject: Student Organization Roster

This Student Organization Roster prepared by the Student Activities Bureau has been annotated for your use. It defines the structures and functions of all student organizations on the Minneapolis and St. Paul campuses of the University of Minnesota and lists those students who may be contacted concerning their group. The data contained in the Roster was compiled from information submitted by the student organizations which is kept on file in the Student Activities Bureau, 114 TSMa. The data includes the purpose of each organization, its membership, its meeting time, and its officers.
