The Minnesota Student Association has two main branches, the executive and the legislative. The Student Body President, the Executive Committee and the Cabinet compose the executive branch, the Assembly and the Senate the legislative branch.

The principal body of the Minnesota Student Association is the student Assembly composed of the representatives of campus organizations which have forty or more members. The Assembly meets at least once a quarter to debate and legislate on issues of major campus interest. Presently more than 120 delegates compose the Assembly.

The student Senate is a smaller group made up of students, staff and faculty representatives which meets several times a month to handle the day-to-day business of Minnesota Student Association.

The Cabinet will be made up of the appointed heads of standing committees of the Minnesota Student Association which carry out the many program functions of student government in athletics, civil service, education, finance, intercollegiates, international relations, legislative affairs, public relations, orientation, rules, student services and human rights.
