MINNESOTA'S PIERCE TAKES TOP HONORS IN FIRST CROSS COUNTRY

MEET OF SEASON: The University of Minnesota cross country senior ERIC PIERCE (Forest Lake, Minn.) took top honors in the first cross country meet of the season as the Golden Gophers took second place to Drake University. Drake scored 28 points to Minnesota's 29 points.

Pierce clocked a time of 25:13 to take first place, while Drake's Matt Gabrielson took second place with a time of 25:17. Minnesota's ANDREW MCKESSOCK (Owen Sound, Ontario) finished in fifth place with a time of 25:32, while teammate JOEY CORR (Redmond, Wash.) took sixth place with a time of 25:49.

Other finishers for the Golden Gophers include: senior captain MICHAEL STOICK (St. Michael, Minn.), who finished eighth with a time of 26:25; Senior NATE CLAY (Rochester Hills, Mich.), who finished ninth with a time of 26:28 and freshman Scott Utne, who finished 10th with a time of 26:33.

NEXT UP FOR THE GOLDEN GOPHERS: On Saturday, Sept. 25, the Golden Gophers will host the 1999 Roy Griak Invitational at the Les Bolstad/University of Minnesota Golf Course starting at 9 a.m. This year finds 11 of the top 30 cross country teams from last year's NCAA Championships, including UCLA, Oregon, Duke, Providence and Iowa.

The Golden Gophers took a fifth place finish last year, where junior **JEREMY POLSON** (Duluth, Minn.) was Minnesota's top finisher with a time of

25:11 to take 15th place. Providence College

grabbed the team title with 106 points. Providence also had the individual winner in Ben Noad, who clocked a time of 24:25. In the Division II and III race, South Dakota, with 80 points, edged out North Dakota with 82 points to take top honors. Individually, Central Missouri State's Vladimar Golias won the event with a winning time of 25:32. Golias, along with Ben Noad, are the only back-to-back winners in the invitational's history.

Jonah Kiptarus of Nebraska holds the course record with a time of 23:57, which was set in 1996. Wisconsin has won the team title four consecutive times from 1994-97. Iowa State runs a close second with three team titles. The Cyclones have the most individual winners with five.

GOLDEN GOPHERS FINISH 13TH IN TOP FIELD AT NCAA PREVIEW: The

15th-ranked University of Minnesota men's golf team shot its best round of the tournament

on the final day, a six-over par score of 296, to finish 13th on Tuesday at the Ping/Golfweek NCAA Preview at Grand National Lake Course in Opeilika, Ala. The event, hosted by Auburn University, is played each fall at the golf course that plays host to the following spring's NCAA Men's Golf Championships.

Senior returning All-American Martin LeMesurier led Minnesota's final standing by carding a one-under par 71 in Monday's rain-hampered round. LeMesurier shot a four-over par 76 on Tuesday morning to finish the event with a six-over par total of 222. Freshman Wilhelm Schauman posted a pair of one-over par scores of 73, sandwiched around a second-round 81, in his first collegiate event.

Northwestern ran away with the team portion of the event, claiming the title with a eight-stroke win over first-day leader Clemson. Arizona State finished third, with Georgia Tech placing fourth.

The Wildcats also claimed the top two individual finishers in the tournament. Defending NCAA individual champion Luke Donald was the medalist with a three-day total of eight-under par total of 208. Donald's teammate Jess Daley was just one stroke back at seven-under par 207. Donald and Matt Jones of Arizona State shared the best score of the final day with five-under par totals of 67.

The tournament featured 18 teams, all of which are ranked in the Golfweek preseason top 25. To qualify for the event, a team must finish in

the top 15 in the nation at the previous year's NCAA Championships, be one of two wild-card selections, or be the host school. The Golden Gophers placed 11th at the 1999 NCAA Championships.

The Golden Gophers will be back in action on Oct. 4-5 at the Windon Memorial in suburban Chicago, Ill. Minnesota is the defending team titleholder in that event.



The University of Minnesota men's cross country team took 14th place at the 1999 Roy Griak Invitational with 361 points, held at the Les Bolstad/University of Minnesota Golf Course.

Senior ERIC PIERCE (Forest Lake, Minn.) once again was the top finisher for the No. 13 Golden Gophers when he finished in 18th place with a time of 25:03, his best time of the season. Sophomore JOEY CORR (Redmond, Wash.) was the next finisher for Minnesota in 51st place with a time of 25:36.

The University of Wisconsin picked up their fifth individual Roy Griak individual team title in six years as they took top honors with 86 points. Brigham Young University took a distant second with 133 points and Northern Arizona rounded out the top three with 143 points. No. 5 Oregon took fourth place with 172 points.

Minnesota won the tournament last year, while graduated senior Adam Dooley took the individual title.

GOLDEN GOPHERS FINISH 13TH IN TOP FIELD AT NCAA PRE-

VIEW: The 15th-ranked University of Minnesota men's golf team shot its best round of the tournament on the final day, a six-over par score of 296, to finish 13th on Tuesday at the Ping/Golfweek NCAA Preview at Grand National Lake Course in Opeilika, Ala. The event, hosted by Auburn University, is played each fall at the golf course that plays host to the following spring's NCAA Men's Golf Championships.

Senior returning All-American Martin LeMesurier led Minnesota's final standing by carding a one-under par 71 in Monday's rain-hampered round. LeMesurier shot a four-over par 76 on Tuesday morning to finish the event with a six-over par total of 222. Freshman Wilhelm Schauman posted a pair of one-over par scores of 73, sandwiched around a second-round 81, in his first collegiate event.

Northwestern ran away with the team portion of the event, claiming the title with a eight-stroke win over first-day leader Clemson.

Arizona State finished third, with Georgia Tech placing fourth.

The Wildcats also claimed the top two individual finishers in the tournament. Defending NCAA individual champion Luke Donald was the medalist with a three-day total of eight-under par total of 208. Donald's teammate Jess Daley was just one stroke back at seven-under par 207. Donald and Matt Jones of Arizona State shared the best score of the final day with five-under par totals of 67.

The tournament featured 18 teams, all of which are ranked in the Golfweek preseason top 25. To qualify for the event, a team must finish in the top 15 in the nation at the previous year's NCAA Championships, be one of two wild-card selections, or be the host school. The Golden Gophers placed 11th at the 1999 NCAA Championships.



He also captured the conference crown in the discus in 1986. He was an indoor shot put All-American in both 1985 and 1986, finishing first in the NCAA championships in 1986. He was also an outdoor All-American in the shot put in 1984, '85 and '86. A member of the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team, he was also honored as co-MVP at the 1986 Big Ten Outdoor Championships.

Marion Barber lettered in football from 1977-80. He was selected as team MVP in 1978 and 1980. He is currently third on the all-time school records list in career rushing with 660 attempts, fourth with 3,094 yards and second in career rushing touchdowns with 34. He served as captain for the 1980 season. He was a member of the Golden Gopher team that played Maryland in the 1977 Hall of Fame Bowl. He went on to play professionally for the NFL's New York Jets.

Alfred "Bud" Ericksen was a swimming letterwinner from 1962-64. He was a two-time All-American in 1963 and 1964. He competed on the Big Ten and NCAA Championship 400-yard medley relay team in 1963.

Lew Kennedy was a three-time wrestling letterwinner. He was a Big Ten individual champion in 1963 at 130 pounds and in 1964 at 137 pounds. He was an All-American in 1962 and 1963, finishing fourth both years at the NCAA Championships at 130 pounds.

Trent Tucker was a four-time letterwinner as a guard under Head Basketball Coach Jim Dutcher. He was an All-American in 1982 and selected as team MVP in 1981. He helped lead the Golden Gophers to the 1982 Big Ten title and the NCAA Tournament. He is currently tied for sixth place on the all-time school records list in career steals with 153 and seventh place for a steals in a single season with 63.

Doug Woog was hockey team captain in 1965-66. He led the team in scoring in 1965 with 47 total points in 29 games for the Maroon and Gold. He was selected as the John Mariucci MVP of the 1965-66 season and was named a First-Team All-American in 1965. Following his collegiate playing years he was selected as a member of the 1967 U.S. National Team. He continued his career at Minnesota as head coach from 1985-99. In 14 years as head coach he went 389-187-40, over 66% winning average.

Pioneer Group:

Neil Croonquist lettered in golf from 1938-40. He was a member of the 1938 Big Ten title team and the 1939 NCAA 11th-place finishers. He was a co-captain in 1939.

Arnie Oss was a three-time basketball letterwinner from 1919-21 under Head Coach L. J. Cooke. He was Minnesota's first repeat All-American in basketball, receiving those honors in 1919 and 1921. He also lettered in football from 1919-21, earning All-Big Ten honors in 1919 and lettered twice in track. He was an assistant coach for football and basketball.

Alan Rice earned his wrestling letters from 1947-50. He was a Big Ten individual champion in 1949 at 136 pounds and in 1948 at 128 pounds. He won a medal in the National AAU championships.

Gordon Soltau lettered from 1946-49. He was selected to play on the 1949 East-West Shrine Game, the 1950 All-Star Game and the 1950 Hula Bowl. He also lettered in hockey in 1949.

Lifetime Achievement Group:

David Metzen began his dedication to education and athletics as a hockey player lettering from 1962-64. He served as team captain in 1963-64. He earned his undergraduate degree in elementary education, his master's degree in administration and his doctorate in educational administration all from the University of Minnesota. He is currently the superintendent for the South St. Paul Public Schools and a member of the University's Board of Regents.

Harvey O'Phelan served as a team orthopedic surgeon for the Golden Gophers for more than two decades from 1962-83 after graduating from the University of Minnesota Medical School. He received his honorary letter in 1983. He became the associate clinical professor of orthopedic surgery at the U of M Medical School in 1955. He is a member of the American Board of Orthopedic Surgeons and the American Academy of Sports Medicine. He also served as team orthopedic surgeon for numerous U.S.A. Olympic and World Championship squads, along with a number of professional teams.

The purpose of the annual Hall of Fame event is to honor achievements and preserve the tradition of those athletes, coaches and athletic staff members who have contributed in an outstanding and positive way to the University of Minnesota Men's Athletics Program.

Sophomore **JOEY CORR** (Redmond, Wash.) clocked a time of 25:52.73 to take 13th, while freshman **WILL MCCOMB** (Port Elgin, Ontario) (25:54.35) and sophomore **ANDREW MCKESSOCK** (Owen Sound, Ontario) (26:02.38) finished 14th and 17th, respectively to round out the top five for the Golden Gophers.

Wisconsin's Matt Downin captured the individual title for the second year in a row with a time of 24:57.20, while Michigan's John Schoenfelder took runner-up honors with a time of 25:06.11.

With their top 14 finish, Pierce, Polson, Corr and McComb earn second-team All-Big Ten status. The All-Big Ten team consists of the top 15 finishers, first through seventh are on the first team and eight through 14 make up the second team.

Minnesota will travel to Champaign, Ill., to take part in the 1999 NCAA District V Championships on Saturday, Nov. 13.







GOLDEN GOPHER MEN'S GYMNAS-TICS TEAM FINISHES FIFTH AT THE WINDY CITY: The University of

Minnesota men's gymnastics team finished in

fifth place with a score of 219.325 at the Windy City 2000 Saturday night in Chicago, Ill. Ohio State University won the seven-team event with a score of 225.725. Leading the way for the Golden Gophers were sophomore Justin Conner and freshman Clay Strother. Conner was Minnesota's highest finisher in the all-around in seventh place with a score of 55.000.

Conner also finished tied for third on the vault with a score of 9.450 and finished third on the parallel bars with a score of 9.575. Strother, in his first collegiate competition, finished ninth in the all-around with a score of 54.200. Strother earned second-place honors on the floor exercise with a score of 9.800 and was fifth on the pommel horse with a score of 9.350. For the Golden Gophers, it was their highest finish at the Windy City since 1995 when they also finished fifth.

THE OTHER CONNER: Justin Conner (Dallas, Texas), brother of senior Golden Gopher gymnast Chad Conner (Dallas, Texas), turned in an outstanding performance at the Windy City 2000 on Saturday night. His seventh-place finish in the all-around with a score of 55.000, was Minnesota's highest finisher and set a career-high mark for the sophomore. He also set career-high marks on the floor exercise (9.350), the vault (9.450) and the parallel bars (9.575).

THE FRESHMEN: Joining the fray this season for the Golden Gophers are

four talented freshmen, two of which made an immediate impact on the starting line up in Saturday's Windy City 2000. Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas), a fifth-place finisher in 1999's Junior Nationals, posted an all-around score of 54.200 in his first collegiate competition. He scored a 9.800 on his floor exercise routine, good for second place. He also added a 9.350 on the pommel horse which was good for fifth place. Tim Koehler (North Bergen, N.J.) turned in a promising performance, finishing 17th in the all-around.

HAS IT BEEN THAT LONG?: Minnesota's last home dual meet victory came almost three years ago. On Feb. 8, 1997, the Golden Gophers defeated the Michigan State Spartans and the Michigan Wolverines with a team score of 222.10 in a tri-dual meet. Current seniors Lindsey Fang (Allentown, Pa.) and Chad Conner are the only remaining Gophers who were a part of that team. Fang scored a 54.55 in the all-around to earn third-place honors.

NEXT WEEK: The Golden Gophers open up their home regular season schedule with a visit from the Illinois Fighting Illini. The Illini finished third in last week's Windy City 2000 with a score of 223.450.







LAST WEEK'S MEET: The University of Minnesota men's gymnastics team fell to the fourth-ranked Iowa Hawkeyes Saturday afternoon by a score of 223.15-221.325. The team score of 221.325 was a team season-

high for the Golden Gophers but was not enough to defeat the Hawkeyes. With Iowa leading the meet by only .7 heading into the final rotation, Minnesota missed five of six routines on the horizontal bar.

Sophomore Justin Conner was the lone Golden Gopher to hit his horizontal bar routine with a score of 9.4, good for fourth place in the event. Connor also scored a team season-high in the all-around with a score of 55.25, to earn second-place honors and was part of a four-way tie for first place on the vault with a score of 9.4. Minnesota took first place honors in three out of the six events.

Freshman Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas) had two solid routines on the floor exercise and parallel bars earning first-place honors in both. He scored a career-high 9.85 on the floor exercise, bettering his previous career high by .05. The 9.85 score by Strother is the second-highest score ever recorded on the floor exercise in Golden Gopher history.

Senior Lindsey Fang (Allentown, Pa.) also scored a career-high 9.8 on his pommel horse routine to better his previous career high of 9.600 which he scored in 1998 against Illinois-Chicago. Senior Ryan Winterbourne (Anaheim, Calif.) earned third-place honors with a season-high 9.35 on the still rings.

A SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT: The Golden Gopher men's gymnastics team has made a significant improvement from where it was last year at this time. Through its first three meets last season (Windy City, at Iowa, vs. Ohio State) the average team score was 210.967. Through the first three meets this season (Windy City, vs. Illinois, vs.

lowa), Minnesota's average team score is 220.325. In thier last meet with Iowa, the Golden Gophers set four team season high scores on the pommel horse, still rings, vault and parallel bars.

THE FABULOUS CONNER BOYS: The brother combination of Chad and Justin Conner (Dallas, Texas) have been one of the key reasons for the the Golden Gophers improvement so far this season. In last Saturday's meet with Iowa, Justin bettered his career-high in the allaround with a score of 55.25 setting personal season highs on the pommel horse (9.3), still rings (9.1) and horizontal bar (9.4) in the process. Chad, on the other hand, set a personal season high on the pommel horse as well (9.575), good for third place in the event.

THE FRESHMEN: Joining the fray this season for the Golden Gophers are four talented freshmen, two of which have made an immediate impact on the starting line up. Clay Strother posted an all-around score of 54.200 in his first collegiate competition. He continued his impressive start last week against Iowa as he scored a 9.85 on his floor exercise routine, good for first place. That score was the second highest score ever recorded by a Golden Gopher on the floor exercise. He also had a 9.65 on his parallel bars routine, good for first place. Freshman Tim Koehler (North Bergen, N.J.) has turned in a couple of promising performances in his first three competitions.

NEXT WEEK: The Golden Gophers make the Michigan road trip as they take on defending national champion Michigan on Friday night at 7 p.m. (ET) and then travel to East Lansing to take on the Michigan State Spartans Saturday night at 7 p.m. (ET).

The Golden Gophers received event wins from Massura, who won both the 200 backstroke with a time of 1:45.91 and the 100 backstroke with a time of 48.08. Dornelas also won two events for Minnesota. He placed first in the 100 freestyle with a winning time of 44.95 and in the

Gophers set team season highs on the pommel horse, vault, parallel bars and horizontal bar,

while also setting a team season-high score against Michigan/Penn State. The team score of 223.425 was the Golden Gophers' highest team score since March 7, 1998 when they scored a 224.100 against

Illinois-Chicago. That was also their last dual meet win.

LAST WEEK: The Golden Gopher men's gymnastics team made the weekend swing through Michigan last weekend and came away with some outstanding performances. In the triangular meet with defending nation-

al champion Michigan and Penn State on Friday night, the Golden Gophers scored a season-high team score of 223.425.

Freshman Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas) and seniors Lindsey Fang and Chad Conner turned in outstanding performances to lead the Maroon and Gold. Strother scored an amazing 9.95 on his floor exercise routine to earn first-place honors in that event. His score is a Minnesota school record and is the highest score on the floor exercise in the nation this year. Fang scored a 9.825 on the pommel horse, setting a new career-high in the process. He tied with the 1999 NCAA pommel horse champion, Penn State's Brandon Stefaniak, for first place honors in the event. Conner scored a 9.900 on his parallel bars routine tying school record and setting a new career high. Minnesota earned first place honors in three of the six events on the night.

Against Michigan State Saturday night, the Golden Gophers fell by a score of 227.55-222.9. Leading the way for the Golden Gophers was freshman Clay Strother. Fresh off of setting a school record with a 9.95 on the floor exercise Friday night, Strother scored a 9.775 to earn second-place honors in that event Saturday night. Senior Lindsey Fang bettered his career high of 9.825 that he set Friday night with a score of 9.875, good for second place.

A SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT: Through Minnesota's first five meets last season the average team score was 212.475. Through the first five meets this season, Minnesota's average team score is 221.460. In last weekend's meets at Michigan and Michigan State, the Golden



LAST WEEK: Freshman Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas) and Justin Conner (Dallas, Texas) both competed at the 2000 Winter Cup in Las Vegas, Nev. Strother scored

a 49.500 to qualify for the second day of competition. He scored a 9.300 in his pommel horse routine which was the fifth-highest scored recorded in the qualifying round. Former Golden Gopher great and current volunteer assistant coach John Roethlisberger scored a 53.850 and tied for fifth place in the qualifying round. He came back in the second day to score a 53.875 to finish fifth overall. Conner scored a 48.900 and did not qualify for the second day of competition.

A SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT: The Golden Gopher men's gymnastics team has made a significant improvement from where it was last year at this time. Through its first five meets last season the average team score was 212.475. Through the first five meets this season, Minnesotaís average team score is 221.460. In last weekend's meets at Michigan and Michigan State, the Golden Gophers set team-season highs on the pommel horse, vault, parallel bars and horizontal bar while also setting a team season high score against Michigan/Penn State. The team score of 223.425 was the Golden Gophers highest team score since March 7, 1998 when they scored a 224.100 against Illinois-Chicago. That was also their last dual meet win.



He recorded a 9.95 on the pommel horse which broke the existing school record held by three gymnasts. He currently boasts an NCAA average score of 9.575.

NEXT WEEK: The Golden Gophers will return to action on March 4 against Illinois-Chicago at the Sports Pavilion at 1 p.m.

LAST WEEK: The University of Minnesota men's gymnastics team competed in a four-team event Saturday in Columbus, Ohio. Ohio State recorded the top score with

a 230.725, followed by Iowa in second with 228.700, Brigham Young University in third with 226.375 and Minnesota with a 221.075.

Freshman Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas) set a new school record with a 9.95 on the pommel horse which tied for first place in the meet. It is the second school record that Strother has set this season as he set the school record for the floor exercise with a 9.95 against Michigan/Penn State. He also added a 9.525 on the floor exercise. Senior Lindsay Fang (Allentown, Penn.) was the next highest finisher on the horse with a 9.750. Fang also topped all Golden Gophers with a 9.650 on the parallel bars. Sophomore Justin Conner (Dallas, Texas) scored a 9.550 on the vault to lead Minnesota. He placed fifth in the all-around with a 54.500.

A SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT: The Golden Gopher men's gymnastics team has made a significant improvement from where it was last year at this time. Through its first six meets last season the average team score was 212.970. Through the first six meets this season, Minnesota's average team score is 221.396. They have surpassed season-highs from last year in five of the six events and have also passed the season team-high score of 221.85, which they achieved in the last meet of the season against Illinois-Chicago, on two separate occasions. Last year, the team only passed the 220-point mark once, while this season, the team has passed that mark in five of its first six competitions.

NO. 10 MINNESOTA HEADS TO

2000 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS: The 10th-ranked University of Minnesota men's swimming and diving team will compete in the 2000 Big Ten Championships, held in Ann Arbor, Mich., on Feb. 24 through Feb. 26. The Golden Gophers head to the Big Ten Championships with an undefeated record. They cruised through the Big Ten dual season with a 4-0 record with wins over Northwestern, Iowa, Wisconsin and Purdue and the regular season, going 8-0, with wins over North Carolina, Nebraska, Pacific and taking the title in their own invitational over Utah, Air Force, Iowa State, Pittsburgh and Iowa.

Last year, the Golden Gophers placed second behind Penn State with 588 points. Minnesota clinched four relay titles and had a fifth relay disqualified in the first day of competition, which prevented the Golden Gophers from sweeping the relay events. The 400 medley relay team of ALEX MASSURA (Belo Horizonte, Brazil), Oscar Godoi, Martin Zielinski and John Cahoy placed first with a pool record time of 3:14.31. In the second day of competition, the 200 medley relay team of Martin Zielinski. Oscar Godoi, John Cahoy and RICARDO DORNELAS (Belo Horizonte, Brazil) placed first by breaking its previous Big Ten record set the year before with a time of 1:27.58.

Dornelas won the 50 freestyle with a time of 19.79, just three-hundredths of a second off the school record time in the event. Brandon

Schindler placed thrid with a time of 20.02 and Luis Lopez placed fifth with a time of 20.30.

Zielinski captured the 100 butterfly title with a time of 47.17. DAN CROASTON (Champlin, Minn.) won Minesota's first Big Ten diving title since 1996 when he won the three-meter diving with 581.20 points. Alex Massura won the 100 backstroke with a time of 47.62. During the preliminaries in that event, Massura broke his own school record in the event when he swam a time of 47.24. He was named Co-Big Ten Swimmer of the Year.

This year, the Golden Gophers are looking to take home their third Big Ten title of the '90s and leading the way is Massura, who has 13 first-place finishes on the year. Croaston, who has been consistent for the U, has taken nine first-place finishes between the one-meter and the three-meter diving competitions. Dornelas, who set freshman records in the 50 free, as part of the 400 medley and the 400 free relay, also looks to make a splash.

The Big Ten Championships will start with the preliminaries on Thursday, Feb. 24 at noon and conclude Saturday evening.



has excelled in the two events in which he competes, the pommel horse and parallel bars. In his last four meets on the

pommel horse. Fang has averaged a 9.813 and in the process scored a 9.875 which tied the second highest score ever recorded on the horse by a Minnesota gymnast. He is currently tied for fifth in the nation on the apparatus. In the last three meets on the parallel bars, Fang is averaging 9.483 including a 9.650 in last week's meet with Ohio State.

MOLDING THE CLAY: Freshman Clay Strother is leaving his mark on the Golden Gopher program in just his first season at Minnesota. The freshman is tearing up the mat on the floor exercise, his favorite event. Besides scoring the record-setting 9.95 in the meet with Michigan/Penn State, he has also tied the third and fourth highest marks in Golden Gopher history. He is averaging an amazing 9.830 through the first five competitions of the season. Strother currently occupies the top spot in the nation on the floor exercise. But he is not just a specialist on the floor exercise. Just last week in the four-team meet with Ohio State, BYU and Iowa, Strother added another school record to his list of record breaking performances. He recorded a 9.95 on the pommel horse which broke the existing school record held by three gymnasts. He currently boasts an NCAA average score of 9.575.

NEXT WEEK: The Golden Gophers will return to action on March 4 against Illinois-Chicago at the Sports Pavilion at 1 p.m.

TWO WEEKS AGO: The University of Minnesota men's gymnastics team competed in a four-team event Saturday in Columbus. Ohio. Ohio State recorded the top score with

a 230.725, followed by Iowa in second with 228.700, Brigham Young University in third with 226.375 and Minnesota with a 221.075.

Freshman Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas) set a new school record with a 9.95 on the pommel horse which tied for first place in the meet. It is the second school record that Strother has set this season as he set the school record for the floor exercise with a 9.95 against Michigan/Penn State. He also added a 9.525 on the floor exercise. Senior Lindsay Fang (Allentown, Penn.) was the next highest finisher on the horse with a 9.750. Fang also topped all Golden Gophers with a 9.650 on the parallel bars. Sophomore Justin Conner (Dallas, Texas) scored a 9.550 on the vault to lead Minnesota. He placed fifth in the all-around with a 54.500.

A SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT: The Golden Gopher men's gymnastics team has made a significant improvement from where it was last year at this time. Through its first six meets last season the average team score was 212.970. Through the first six meets this season, Minnesota's average team score is 221.396. They have surpassed season-highs from last year in five of the six events and have also passed the season team-high score of 221.85, which they achieved in the last meet of the season against Illinois-Chicago, on two separate occasions. Last year, the team only passed the 220-point mark once, while this season, the team has passed that mark in five of its first six competitions.



GOLFERS COMPETE IN LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL: The University of Minnesota golf team will compete in the Las Vegas Invitational this Friday-Sunday, at the

Desert Inn Country Club in Las Vegas, Nev. The field includes 14 teams that have earned a spot in the latest MasterCard Collegiate Golf Rankings, including four of the nation's top five teams and 11 of the top 25.

Lemesurier finishes eighth in puerto rico classic:

Senior All-American Martin LeMesurier shot a final round of 74 last Tuesday morning to finish in a tie for eighth place individually out of 75 golfers in the Puerto Rico Classic at the Rio Mar Country Club in Rio Mar, Puerto Rico. The 15-team tournament was hosted by Purdue University.

LeMesurier, who posted two consecutive rounds of two-under par 70 to begin the event, finished seven shots behind medalist and defending NCAA Champion Luke Donald of Northwestern.

Georgia Tech captured the team title by four strokes over Northwestern. Minnesota finished 15th place as a team, 48 strokes behind the Yellowjackets. LAST WEEK: The University of Minnesota men's gymnastics earned its first dual meet win of the season defeating Illinois-Chicago by a score of 226.175-217.700 on Saturday afternoon at the Sports

Pavilion. It was the team's first dual meet win since March 7, 1998 when the Golden Gophers defeated Illinois-Chicago by a score of 224.100-220.800. The team score of 226.175 is the highest score recorded by Minnesota since the team scored 227.45 to finish fourth at the 1997 Big Ten Championships that were held at the Sports Pavilion. The Golden Gophers had first-place finishers in each event, and as a team, set team-season highs on the floor exercise (38.000), pommel horse (39.425) and still rings (37.050).

Freshman Clay Strother (Jasper, Texas) turned in another excellent performance earning first-place honors on the floor exercise (9.900), pommel horse (9.925) and all-around (56.675). Senior Lindsay Fang (Allentown, Pa.) was second on the pommel horse with a 9.900. Junior Bob Goss (Kenosha, Wis.) scored season highs on the pommel horse (9.750), vault (9.575) and parallel bars (9.550).

POUNDING THE POMMEL HORSE: The Golden Gopher's pommel horse performers have been nailing their routines as of late. Currently, Minnesota is tied for third in the nation on the horse with an NCAA two-score average of 38.625. The Maroon and Gold is led by freshman Clay Strother, who is tied for third in the nation (9.862) and Lindsay Fang, who is fifth in the nation with an average of 9.850. In last week's meet with Illinois-Chicago, Minnesota scored a near-perfect score of 39.425 to set a season high in the event. Overall this season,

the Golden Gophers are averaging 38.050 in seven meets on the pommel horse.

Besides scoring the record-setting 9.95 in the meet with Michigan/Penn State, he has also tied the second, third and fourth highest marks in Golden Gopher history on the floor exercise. He is averaging an amazing 9.796 through the first seven competitions of the season. Strother currently occupies the top spot in the nation on the floor exercise. But he is not just a specialist on the floor exercise as seen in last week's meet with Illinois-Chicago. He tied the second highest Minnesota mark ever recorded on the floor exercise (9.900), scored a 9.925 on the pommel horse to earn first-place honors en route to scoring a 56.675 in the all-around which was an personal season-high and also a team-high score for the year.


