Ellie Peden, Tennis Coach, has put together one of the best home schedules ever for tennis this fall and is excited about her new talent this year. The golf team, recently returning from their pre-season trip to Scotland is comprised of many new faces. The University of Minnesota Golf Invitational has already been played with the Gophers finishing second only to last year's national champion, Texas A & M. In the fall softball season, we will host only one home event on October 3 and 4. Eight teams will be vying for championship honors with the finals being played at the new Bierman softball facility. You are all invited to attend. Field Hockey, under the direction of our new coach Cindy Ripsin, has just returned from a five game road trip on the East Coast in which they competed against the likes of Temple University and the University of Maryland. They have experienced the best and will continue to go against teams such as Northwestern and Cal-Long Beach. The sports of swimming and diving, gymnastics, and track and field will open up later this fall, but will play the majority of the season in the winter. More about them later.

As you can see, the department is already in full operation. We do have several new people with us and hope that you will take the time to come by and meet them. Marty Duda will be the acting Sports Information Director for this year and Susan Hallman, as the new receptionist, has recently joined our staff.

#### SPORTS INFORMATION

The University of Minnesota women's basketball team will be hosting the People's Republic of China National Team Thursday, November 5 in an exhibition game at 7:30 p.m. in Williams Arena.

The China team will visit Minnesota for the second contest of their seven-game, 13-day tour of the United States. China will play the Gophers after meeting William Penn (IA) November 4. After leaving Minneapolis, they will play Rutgers November 7, Jackson State (MS) November 10, Mississippi College November 11, Wayland Baptist (TX) November 13, and Texas November 14.

A 12-player squad is expected to arrive at the University of Minnesota Thursday afternoon of the game before departing for Newark, NJ on Friday.

Tickets for the international exhibition will be available at the Bierman ticket office beginning October 1. Advance sale tickets will be available at \$5.00 for adult reserved seating. Advance sale reduced rate tickets will be available at \$4.00 student reserved and \$3.00 general admission. Tickets will be available at the gate (\$5.00 adults and reserved - \$4.00 general admission) the night of the exhibition game.

The University of Minnesota women's, basketball team returns eight letter-winners from last year's 28-7 team that won the Big 10 Tournament and finished second at the AIAW Region 6 Championship.

Track & Field: Cathie Toomey held many race records while competing during 1974-78 for the Gophers. She has continued with victories as she toured Europe this summer competing. In the Oslo Games in Norway, she placed 3rd in 5000 meters; in Holland 5th in 1500 meters and took a first place in 3000 meters in London at the British Women's National Championships. Also this year, Cathie had the fastest time in the United States for 1500 meters. Currently she lives in Eugene, Oregon as she trains for the 1984 Olympics.

Volleyball: Patti Hagemeyer, 1980 Athlete of the Year for Women's Athletics, graduated with a degree in Physical Education. She now resides in Pullman, Washington where she accepted a coaching graduate assistantship and is working on her masters degree in Administration. Patti is coaching the Women's Reserve Volleyball Team at Washington State University.

Field Hockey: Cindy Ripin, a letter winner in field hockey, basketball and softball between 1974-78 graduated with a Physical Education degree. She continued her graduate studies at Northeast Missouri State and received her masters degree in Biomechanics. Currently, Cindy leads the Gopher Field Hockey Team as head coach of the 1981 squad.

Swimming: Cindy McCollum, 1980 graduate with a BA in Psychology, spent the last 5 months traveling in Europe. Her tour included London, Sweden, Norway, Italy and Spain. Cindy is currently working as a Psychiatric Technician at Fairview Hospital in Minneapolis and says her trip was a wonderful experience.

TENNIS: Pat Allar played Gopher tennis from 1971 to 1975 and graduated from the University of Minnesota with a BS degree in Physical Education. Currently, Pat, her husband Ron and children, Courtney and Aaron live in Eden Praire. Pat is now a USPTA tennis pro working at Tonka Racquet Club and is also in her 5th year as girls varsity tennis coach at Saint Louis Park High School.

Basketball: After captaining the 1978 Gopher Basketball Team, Rachel Gaugert completed her BA degree in social work from the University. She worked for the Minneapolis Grain Exchange for one year as an assistant supervisor and decided to continue in the grain business. Currently, Rachel works for the Bunge Grain Company as a grain merchandiser. Rachel buys grain for the State of Minnesota.

Softball: Mary Owen, a 1980 graduate in Life Sciences from the College of Education was just chosen All-American from the American Softball Association Fast-Pitch National Tournament. One of fifteen players, Mary just competed in Japan for the first Tri-National Softball Championship. The United States team competed against Japan and the People's Republic of China in the Tournament and also competed in various friendship games. The U.S. Team has a record of 10-0 and received a gold medal.

Gymnastics: Leah Fuji Moto Hanson competed for the Gophers from 1973-1977. After graduating with a BA degree in Psychology, she attended William Mitchell College of Law and graduated this Spring. She will set up her law practice in the Twin Cities area. was married August 22, 1981 to Dr. Mark Hanson, a surgery resident at Hennepin County Medical Center.

Cross Country: Maggie Munro is in her second year at the University of Minnesota Law School, where she is studying criminal law and receiving straight "A's". She is still running and competing in many local 10K races. This October she will be busy as race director for the "Gold Rush" 5 mile run, sponsored by the Women's Athletic Department (October 25). She plans to run her first marathon in October in St. Paul and claims she would just like "to finish."

Golf: Nancy Stevens Evertz, 1975-76 golf team captain, is now manager for Accounting Control and Analysis at Burlington Northern in the Twin Cities. A 1976 Business graduate of the Univsity, she is a mother of a 6-month old boy, Nicholas Edward. Nancy, her husband Don and Nicholas do enjoy weekend trips to her parents cabin in Brainerd, MN.

# FALL IN REVIEW:

FIELD HOCKEY: The Gopher Field Hockey team, under first-year Head Coach Cindy Ripsin, escaped a rugged schedule against the likes of numerous rated foes with a 7-14 mark. Carolyn Kerby led the Gophers in scoring with 16 of the teams 28 goals.

CROSS COUNTRY: The Gopher Cross Country Team placed 10th at the AIAW National Championships, November 21, in Pocatello, Idaho. Although plagued by injuries the last half of the season, Mike Lawless' club provided the depth necessary for its finest national showing. Sue Alm, a sophomore from Bloomington, and Stacy Bant, a freshman from Racine, Wisconsin, paced the Gophers at the nationals with 39th and 42nd places respectively.

VOLLEYBALL: The Gopher volleyball team turned in a 7th place finish at the AIAW National Championships in Tallahassee, Florida - highest finish for a Gopher team since the softball team placed 3rd in the 1978 World Series. Minnesota provided the biggest tourney upsets, topping No. 3 seed Utah State and No. 6 seed California-Berkeley in pool play. The Gophers then went on to defeat Big Ten Champions, University of Michigan, for seventh place. In addition 5-foot-8 junior Jill Halsted earned All-American honors, the first Minnesota player in the nine year history of the sport. The Gophers ended the season with a 37-19 record.


## STAFF SPOTLIGHT:

Basketball finished 3rd in the highly competitive Big Ten, set attendance records for women in the Big Ten, and set a new single game scoring record (for men and women at Minnesota) with a ll5-88 win over Purdue. 
