GENERAL

Union List Migration Update

The following information provides a summary of OCLC's plans for migration of MULS and other OCLC-based union lists of serials as well as a "frequently asked questions" section to assist with your planning.

Migration Summary

Plans are going forward for migration of OCLC Union Listing from the Passport for Union List interface to the Connexion browser, which will be enhanced to support local holdings maintenance. The planned date for the migration is Feb. 19, 2006. As part of the migration, OCLC is converting the format of existing Local Data Records (LDRs) to the MARC 21 Format for Holdings Data (MFHD). The translated MFHD holdings, which will be called Local Holdings Records (LHRs), will look much like their LDR predecessors, but LHRs will become more detailed as library staff begin to enter holding information in MFHD in February.

Due to the complexity of these changes, local holdings maintenance in MFHD will become available through the Connexion browser **after** LDR maintenance in Passport for Union Listing ends. OCLC's current plans call for users of WorldCat Resource Sharing and FirstSearch to begin to see the MFHD-based holdings in mid-January. OCLC anticipates a possible gap of a few days between the end of Passport for Union Listing and the beginning of MARC-formatted LHR maintenance through the Connexion browser.

The MINITEX/MULS unit will soon announce a schedule of webinars and other training opportunities to help you prepare for the Feb. 19 migration.

The following table summarizes the changes that will occur as a result of the Union List migration and the aspects that will remain the same.

Amazon.com is New Fulfillment Partner in the Open WorldCat Program

Amazon.com has joined Baker & Taylor as a fulfillment partner within the Open WorldCat program to facilitate the online purchase of books identified through WorldCat. Now, Web searchers who reach WorldCat from popular search engines or other Web resources may use a book buying link to purchase books through Amazon.com, in addition to the initial pilot partner, Baker & Taylor. This component of the Open WorldCat program not only connects Web searchers with the materials they need; it also delivers a financial benefit to all libraries that participate in the program. Each time a Web searcher purchases a book through Open WorldCat, a portion of the proceeds supports the ongoing development of Open WorldCat for the benefit of all participating libraries.

Web searchers reach the Open WorldCat interface from search results in Web search engines or popular Web resources. Users may link directly to Amazon.com from Find in a Library for some items. When a direct link is not available, users will have the option of linking to the Amazon.com site to search for similar items.

WebDewey/Abridged WebDewey November 2005 Quarterly Update

WebDewey and Abridged WebDewey are updated quarterly. Both services contain the latest version of the schedules, tables, Manual, and Relative Index entries from their respective enhanced DDC databases. The hierarchical displays in WebDewey and Abridged WebDewey feature updated main class and division captions (e.g., 700 Arts & recreation; 790 Sports, games & entertainment).

WebDewey is a web-based version of the enhanced DDC 22 database. This Nov. 2005 release includes:

- all updates to Dewey Decimal Classification, Edition 22, through Sept. 2005 (corrections, new developments, new built numbers, and additional electronic index terms)
- thousands of Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) that have been statistically mapped to Dewey numbers from records in WorldCat (the OCLC Online Union Catalog) and intellectually mapped by DDC editors (through LCSH Weekly List no. 2, 2005)
- thousands of Relative index terms and built numbers not available in print
- links from mapped LCSH to the LCSH authority records
- selected mappings from Medical Subject Headings (MeSH)

Abridged WebDewey is a web-based version of the enhanced Abridged 14 database. This Nov. 2005 release includes:

- all content from Abridged Edition 14, through Sept. 2005
- LCSH that have been intellectually mapped to Dewey headings by DDC editors, including mappings to Abridged Edition 13 numbers from the OCLC publication, Subject Headings for Children
- links from mapped LCSH to the LCSH authority records

- mappings between abridged Dewey numbers and the 2005 update to the 18th edition of H.W. Wilson's Sears List of Subject Headings

Attention Connexion Browser Users!

OCLC plans to end Connexion browser support for Internet Explorer versions 5.0 and 5.01 on Feb. 19, 2006. At that time, Connexion browser users, including CatExpress and WebDewey users, will no longer be able to log on using IE 5.0 and IE 5.01. In preparation for this, all users accessing OCLC Connexion browser with IE 5.0 or IE 5.01 will receive the following message as part of the logon screen.

"You are currently accessing OCLC Connexion browser with an older version of Internet Explorer. OCLC plans to end Connexion browser support for Internet Explorer versions 5.0 and 5.01 on February 19, 2006. At that time, Connexion browser users, including CatExpress and WebDewey users, will no longer be able to log on using IE 5.0 and IE 5.01.

For maximum functionality within OCLC Connexion browser, upgrade to Internet Explorer 6.0. After February 19, 2006, Connexion browser will continue to support Internet Explorer 5.5 and above, as well as Netscape 7, Netscape 8, Firefox and Mozilla. Please upgrade your browser as soon as possible."

FirstSearch Reference Guide

You may have noticed that November's OCLC Mailing had an extra attachment called "Customizing FirstSearch for Your Users." This reference guide has been updated to match the current view of the FirstSearch administrative module. This guide describes several key FirstSearch customization options libraries can use to help their users more easily connect with library resources and

How Do I Add My Library's Catalog to FirstSearch?

OCLC's Customer Service team has compiled the Top 10 Questions Asked about FirstSearch. These are the questions most frequently asked by users of OCLC's FirstSearch service. Below is one of the top 10 questions, along with the answer. In future *Mailings*, we will address each one of the top 10.

Question: How do I add my library's catalog to FirstSearch?

Answer: (The following solution can be found in the Help for the FirstSearch administrative module.)

You can add links to your library's catalog from the FirstSearch service by entering URLs for your catalog on the Web Library Catalogs screen in the FirstSearch administrative module. If you do, the links appear in FirstSearch records so users can click on the links to use your catalog and determine an item's availability and location.

If you use this feature, the links appear regardless of whether FirstSearch indicates that your library owns the item described in the FirstSearch record; that is, whether or not your library's OCLC symbol is attached to the record.

When a user clicks a link and goes to your catalog, FirstSearch adds a heading and a **Return** button above the screen, so the user can return to FirstSearch easily. To use this feature, you must supply at least one of the four URLs requested below.

Procedure

NetLibrary Announces Three New Subject Sets

NetLibrary three new subject sets available are:

- NetLibrary Subject Sets for Public Libraries
- NetLibrary Subject Sets for Academic Libraries
- NetLibrary eBook Subject Sets for K-12

All three subject sets are priced as a one-time cost. The public and academic library subject sets are prepackaged by subject area; the K-12 library sets are prepackaged by topic and grade range. The sets are available for unique library purchase; group purchases are not available. While there will be some overlap in titles between the public and academic library subject sets and the Shared Collections offered by MINITEX, the subject sets offer content ownership and a wider selection of content and publishers. There are no duplicate titles between the nine K-12 sets.

The sets include full OCLC MARC records for each title to load into your online catalog. All libraries ordering the subject sets will receive the standard MINITEX discount. Public and academic libraries placing orders that total more than \$6,000 will receive an added discount.
