

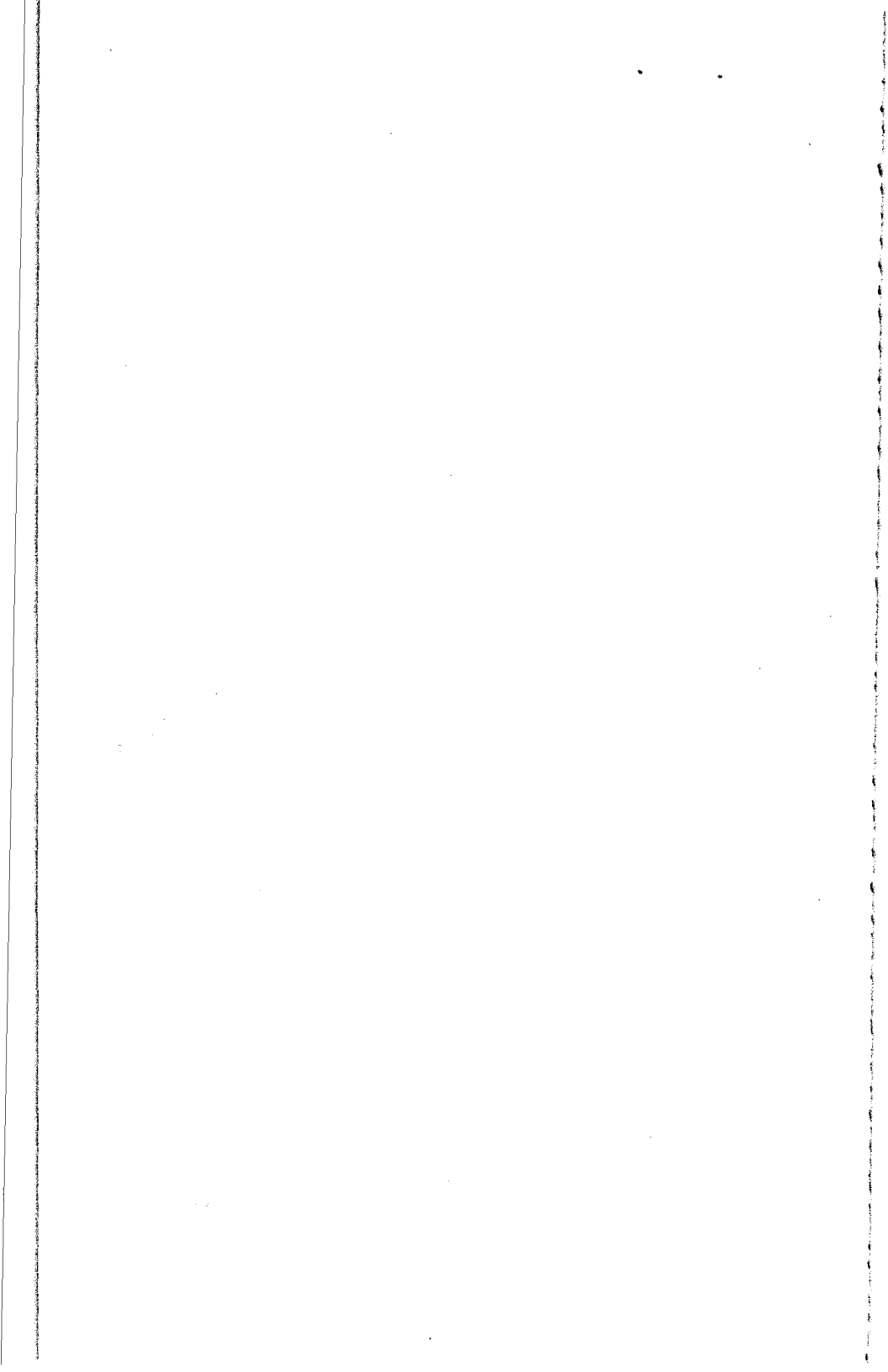

ROBERT J. KELLER

Dr. Robert J. Keller, Professor of Educational Administration and Higher Education and former Dean of the College of Education, will retire from the College of Education faculty in February of 1982. Dr. Keller's distinguished career at the University spans 35 years. He served as Dean of the College from 1964 to 1970, developing a new organizational structure for the faculty and attracting outstanding new faculty to the College. His achievements and awards include the Order of Civil Merit and the Dong Maek Medal for distinguished service to higher education, awarded by the Republic of Korea (1973), the Centennial Award for Outstanding Achievement from Winona State College (1961), and honorary membership in the North Central Association (1979). Dr. Keller served as Vice President (1968-69) and President (1969-70) of the American Association for Higher Education and as President of the Minnesota Association of Colleges (1952-53). Dr. Keller received the B.E. degree from Winona State Teachers College in 1937 and received the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Minnesota in 1940 and 1947.
