Harlan S. Hansen, Professor, Curriculum & Instruction

Professor Hansen joined the faculty of the College of Education as an assistant professor of Elementary Education in 1968, gaining promotion to full professor in 1975. He was one of the first recipients of the College of Education Distinguished Teaching Award in 1981. Today, Professor Hansen is being especially honored as a 1984 recipient of the all-University Horace T. Morse-Amoco Foundation Award for his outstanding contributions to undergraduate education.

Distinguished Teaching Awards

Robert L. Jackson, Professor, Curriculum & Instruction

Professor Jackson began his career in the College of Education as an Instructor at University High School. He became an assistant professor of Elementary Education in 1965, gaining promotion to full professor in 1970. His students define him as "caring," a "motivator" and, "willing to go out of his way" to meet their needs. Today, the faculty and students of the College of Education are pleased to present him with this award in recognition of his commitment to excellence in teaching.

Richard Weinberg, Professor, Educational Psychology/School Psychology

Professor Weinberg joined the faculty of the College of Education in 1970 as an assistant professor of School Psychology. He quickly moved through the ranks, gaining promotion to full professor in 1977. His excellent performance as a scholar and as a teacher is being recognized today by the faculty and students of the College of Education who are pleased to present him this award for his commitment to excellence in teaching.
