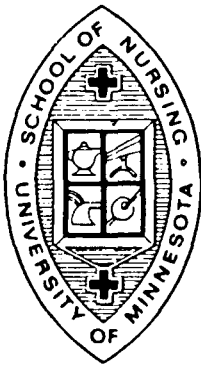



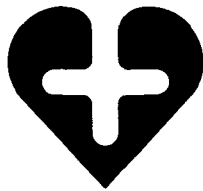

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE IN THE SCHOOL OF NURSING

Graduation with distinction is based on a School of Nursing GPA of 3.75. It is computed on all coursework taken after enrollment in the School of Nursing.

SIGMA THETA TAU is the International Honor Society of Nursing. Criteria for membership include:

- cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above;
- demonstrated leadership potential;
- creativity;
- potential of contribution to the profession of nursing; and
- recommendation by at least two nursing faculty.

HONORS PROGRAM

To graduate with honors students participate in the School of Nursing Honors Program and complete the following graduation requirements:

- honors coursework;
- honors opportunities; and
- honors research, including an honors project or thesis.

When students meet the requirements above, level of honors is determined by earning a grade of A in:

- 50% of courses for cum laude;
- 66% of courses for magna cum laude; and
- 75% of courses for summa cum laude.

This symbol of the University of Minnesota School of Nursing has been used since September of 1913. The antique lamp represents the metaphysical sciences; the telescope, the physical sciences; the plow, the industrial arts; and the artist's palette represents the fine arts. These are the four dimensions of a Baccalaureate education. Above and below are the crosses of St. George, which have stood for unselfish service for centuries. We are proud of this heritage.
