THE SERIES VS. VILLANOVA: Minnesota unofficially leads the series with Villanova 2-1 (the two wins in 1994 and 1997 have been vacated by NCAA action). All three meetings between the two teams have been on neutral courts (one was at the Target Center in Minneapolis in 1997). The first meeting between the two teams was in 1963 when the Wildcats prevailed 77-73 in the championship of the Holiday Festival Tournament in New York City. The two NCAA vacated wins (they are not forfeits) were at the 1994 Great Alaska Shootout (85-64) and in the BCA Classic in 1997 (68-55).

LAST TIME VS. VILLANOVA (Nov. 14, 1997): The last time the two teams met (unofficially) was in the season opener for both teams in 1997 in the Black Coaches Association Classic at the Target Center in Minneapolis. Minnesota jumped out to an early 39-16 lead and never looked back, winning 68-55 in front of 12,121 fans. The Maroon and Gold had four players in double figures with Sam Jacobson leading the way with 13 points. Kevin Clark added 12, Miles Tarver had 11 points and 10 rebounds and Quincy Lewis tallied 10 points. Minnesota forced 20 turnovers and had 12 steals, holding Villanova to 23 percent shooting in the first half. The last official game vs. Villanova was on Dec. 30, 1963 in the finals of the Holiday Festival Tournament in Madison Square Garden. Villanova prevailed 77-73 in front of 14,894 fans. Minnesota was led by Lou Hudson, who tallied 26 points. Bill Davis scored 12 points and had nine rebounds and Archie Clark tallied 11 points. Villanova won the game at the line, outscoring Minnesota 17 to nine at the charity stripe.

THE COACHES: Golden Gopher Head Coach Dan Monson is in his second season in Gold Country with a career record of 81-46 (.640), including a 29-29 (.500) mark in his first two seasons at the University of Minnesota. Monson guided Gonzaga to the 1999 NCAA Elite Eight and spent a total of 11 seasons at the school as an assistant, associate head and head coach before coming to Minnesota. Villanova Head Coach Steve Lappas is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Wildcats. He has a coaching record of 174-109 (.615) at Villanova entering Wednesday's game. His all-time record in 13 seasons is 230-171 (.573). Lappas is a 1977 graduate of the City College of New York.

### ON THIS DATE... March 14, 1982

In an NCAA first round game in Indianapolis, Ind., Minnesota defeated Tennessee-Chattanooga 62-61 to advance to the "Sweet 16." The Golden Gophers were led by Trent Tucker, who tallied 20 points. Randy Breuer added 17 points and nine rebounds, while Daryl Mitchell scored 16 points. Minnesota hit 12-of-19 free throws compared to 5-of-7 for Chattanooga. Both teams shot over 50 percent from the field (56 percent for Chattanooga, 51 for Minnesota).

MINNESOTA'S LAST GAME: Minnesota had its worst defensive performance of the year, giving up 91 points in a 91-77 loss to Purdue in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament last Thursday. Purdue shot a scorching 64 percent from the field and 64 percent from three-point range. The Boilermakers held Minnesota to 39 percent shooting in both categories.

THE WILDCATS' LAST GAME: Villanova enters the NIT after narrowly missing the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats were eliminated from the Big East Tournament in the second round by eventual champion Boston College, 93-79. Villanova shot 48 percent from the field, but was held to five three-pointers, while BC hit 10 treys in an equal number of attempts (24). Boston College also forced 19 turnovers and outscored Villanova 28-12 in points off turnovers. Ricky Wright led Villanova with 21 points.

COMMON OPPONENTS: Minnesota and Villanova have had two common opponents this year. Minnesota defeated Georgia 77-74 at Williams Arena on Nov. 19, 2000. Villanova dropped a 91-80 decision at Georgia on Dec. 28, 2000. Minnesota was beaten 76-60 by Georgetown in the championship of the Hawaii-Pacific Holiday Classic on Nov. 26, 2000. Villanova upset Georgetown on the road, 59-56, on Feb. 12, 2001.

### MINNESOTA VS. THE BIG EAST:

Minnesota is 23-22 all-time vs. teams from the Big East Conference. That mark rises to 14-8 for games played at Williams Arena. The last Big East team to visit Williams Arena was Seton Hall in 1998. The Pirates suffered a 77-70 setback at the hands of the Golden Gophers. The last Big East team to win a game at Williams Arena was Notre Dame on Dec. 1, 1969, when the Irish prevailed 84-75 (prior to formation of the Big East). Minnesota lost its only meeting with a Big East team this year, 76-60, to Georgetown.

MINNESOTA IN THE NIT: Minnesota has an 18-4 (unofficial due to NCAA vacated games) record in NIT postseason games, including a 9-2 mark for games in Minneapolis and a 6-2 mark at Williams Arena. The Golden Gophers have made it to three NIT championship games, winning two of them. Minnesota lost in its first appearance in the championship game, 58-55 to Virginia as future NBA players 7-2 Randy Breuer and 7-4 Ralph Sampson squared off. Hall of Famer Kevin McHale was the captain and leading scorer and rebounder of that Minnesota team. In 1993, Voshon Lenard's MVP performance led Minnesota to a 62-61 win over Georgetown. Minnesota won it all again in 1998 when Kevin Clark scored 30 points and 28 points in the two games at the

"Garden" to garner MVP honors as Minnesota beat Penn State 79-72 in an All-Big Ten final.

FANS COME OUT FOR NIT: Minnesota fans have an excellent track record for attendance at NIT games over the years. The biggest crowd for an NIT game at Williams Arena was in 1980 when 15,586 showed up for a game with Mississippi. In 1998, Minnesota had crowds of 8,058 vs. Colorado State, 14,045 vs. UAB and 11,842 vs. Marquette as they ran the table. In 1993, Williams Arena was unavailable due to renovation so the team played two games at the Target Center. They drew 11,944 for the Florida game and followed that with 18,254 vs. Oklahoma. In the final game in Minneapolis that year they attracted a sell-out crowd of 15,393 to the Met Center in Bloomington.

A LIVING LEGEND: The broadcasting career of Ray Christensen is approaching the end. Christensen's voice is synonymous with Minnesota football and basketball games. He is stepping down this year following the basketball season after 50 years as a broadcaster for the U of M. Christensen started broadcasting Golden Gopher football in 1950 and has broadcast 511 football games over that span. He began calling Gopher basketball games in 1956 and has broadcast 1,308 games heading into the NIT. Christensen was awarded the Chris Schenkle Award last fall, as the outstanding local broadcaster in the nation.

BOMBS AWAY: The Golden Gophers have been forced to run a spread offense and live and die by the three-pointers since the season-ending injuries to Michael Bauer and John-Blair Bickerstaff in the front court. The high-risk offense utilizes as many as four guards, but limits second chance opportunities.

Fortunately, Minnesota is a good three-point shooting team. They are first in the Big Ten in three-point field goal percentage. The Golden Gophers have cashed in at a .382 rate. On defense, Minnesota is ranked second, holding teams to a .326 clip. Minnesota has three players in the top 12 in three-point shooting in Shane Schilling (.413/6th), Terrance Simmons (.393/11th) and Kevin Burleson (.391/12th). Simmons is fifth in the Big Ten in three-pointers made per game at 1.97. Villanova is shooting 33 percent from three-point range and have held its opponents to a 33 percent mark.

FLEMING EXPLODES FOR 31 POINTS AT BIG TEN TOURNEY: Junior guard Kerwin Fleming had a career game vs. Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament when he tallied 31 points, 22 in the first half. The Chicago native fell two points short of the Big Ten Tournament scoring record of 33 points held by Brian Cardinal of Purdue. Fleming hit 5-of-10 three-pointers and 10of-15 free throws. His 31 points was the most by any player in the tournament this year. It also marks the third player on the Minnesota roster this season to score 30 or more points in a game. Dusty Rychart scored 30 or more twice in Hawaii (Hawaii-Pacific, TCU), while Simmons scored 30 or more twice as well (Michigan State, Michigan).

ROLLING DOUBLES: Dustry Rychart tallied his fifth double-double this year vs. Purdue with 11 points and 11 rebounds. He has 13 in his career.

### TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK:

Minnesota is also among the league leaders in turnover margin this season. The Golden Gophers are third in that category (all games) with a +1.90 turnover margin in 29 games. Minnesota is averaging 13.9 turnovers per game compared to 18.6 per game for Villanova.

SIMMONS VS. THE MICHIGAN

SCHOOLS: Senior guard Terrance Simmons has had an unbelievable year vs. the two Michigan schools. He had a hand in 44 of Minnesota's 83 points in last Saturday's game against Michigan State, scoring a career-high 34 points and handing out five assists. Simmons' seven three-point field goals set a single-game school record, and led a team effort from behind the arc which also produced a school record for three-pointers made in a game (16). The 34-point effort ties Simmons for 17th-best single-game performance in school history - with, among others, teammate Dusty Rychart. Rychart scored 34 points earlier this season against Hawaii Pacific. Simmons followed that with a 30point performance against Michigan, hitting 10-of-15 shots, including 5-of-6 treys.

### AT THE "BARN":

Minnesota has a 127-29 record (.814) at Williams Arena over the past nine years. Minnesota is 11-5 this season at Williams Arena, including a perfect 8-0 record vs. nonconference opponents. Minnesota's record vs. nonconference opponents at Williams Arena. The past five seasons, Minnesota is 36-3 (.923) vs. nonconference opponents at the "Barn." Note: these numbers contain some games that are unofficial due to NCAA vacated games).

Minnesota has already set a new school season record with its 229 three-point field goals, heading into today's game with Villanova. The previous record was the 134 made in the 1992-93 season. The Golden Gophers have attempted 601 three-point field goals this season, which ties a school record for that category set in 1994-95.

TRAVARUS TIME: With the loss of John-Blair Bickerstaff for the remainder of the season, junior college transfer Travarus Bennett has gotten an opportunity for additional minutes in the season's final weeks. Bennett showed promise for filling Bickerstaff's shoes at Northwestern, producing team game-highs of 16 points and 11 rebounds in a personal season-high 31 minutes. Heading into the Big Ten Tournament, Bennett was averaging 10.3 (62) points and 7.0 (42) rebounds per game in the six games since Bickerstaff went down with his injury. Bennett was held scoreless with two rebounds vs. Purdue in 23 minutes. He needs to be a more of a contributor in the front court for Minnesota to have success.

Minnesota enters the NIT with only seven scholarship players healthy enough to play (Simmons, Schilling, Wildenborg, Rychart, Fleming, Bennett and Burleson).

YOUNG GUNS: The Big Ten has historically been known as a league of veteran coaches with long tenures. Over the past five years that has changed. The average age of the head coaches in the Big Ten is now 44-years-old. There are four coaches in their 30s (Alford,

Ellerbe, Self, Soderberg), five in their 40s (Monson who just turned forty, Carmody, Izzo, Davis and Dunn). There is one coach in his 50s (O'Brien) and one in his 60s (Keady). The young coaches have already had a big influence in the style of play in the league. The average length of tenure of the head coaches is currently 4.5 years. If you take out the dean of Big Ten coaches, Gene Keady, and his 21 years at Purdue and you have an average tenure of 2.8 years. There have been six new coaches added in the past two seasons.

SLOW STARTS: Minnesota trailed at halftime in nine of its 16 Big Ten games this season. They were 11-2 when leading at the half. The losses to Wisconsin and Illinois (home) were the first losses of the year when the team led at half.

TOUGH IN TIGHT GAMES: The Golden Gophers are 7-1 this season in games decided between 1-5 points. Last season, the Golden Gophers were 3-3 in games with margins between 1-5 points.

### HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS:

Minnesota is 13-3 this season when they have won or tied the first 5:00 of the second half.

### BACKCOURT PLAY IS KEY:

Minnesota is 4-3 this season when both its starting guards score in double figures, 11-5 when one of the starting guards score in double figures, and 2-5 when neither backcourt starter hits double digits.

IN AND OUT: Dusty Rychart has had a difficult stretch the past four games where his shots just seem to rim in and go out. He went 4-for-14 vs. Michigan, 3-for-11 vs. Wisconsin, 5-13 vs. Indiana and 4-12 against Illinois. Over the final four games of the regular season he shot just 32 percent (16-50). He hit 5-of-10 shots vs. Purdue, but again had money shots rim in and out. He leads the team in shooting at 51 percent and has been getting good shots, but has been a little unlucky of late.

SECOND HALF SPURTS: A trend of second-half spurts by Minnesota has been a staple of most of the Golden Gophers' Big Ten games this season:

opponents 382-324 in the last 5:00 of regulation and overtime, and have scored the same amount or more than their opponents in that time frame in 21 of 29 games.

BALANCED SCORING: Minnesota's four leading scorers this season, junior forward Dusty Rychart, senior guard Terrance Simmons, senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff and freshman forward Michael Bauer – the latter two of whom are out for the rest of the season – are averaging between 14.5 (Rychart) and 10.9 (Bickerstaff) points per game. Since 1950, Minnesota has never had four players average in double figures within five points per game of each other at the conclusion of a season.

THE GRADUATES: Minnesota has two players on its roster, senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff and senior guard Terrance Simmons, who have already completed coursework on their bachelor's degrees. Both players have obtained their undergraduate degrees in speech communications. Bickerstaff is working on coursework for a sports management certificate and Simmons is finishing a minor in applied economics.

### BICKERSTAFF LOST FOR THE

SEASON: Senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff's Golden Gopher career ended abruptly after the team captain suffered a broken leg with 17:21 remaining in the first half of the game at Northwestern on Tues., Feb. 6. Entering his final game, Bickerstaff was the only Big Ten player who was in the top 25 in the conference in

Redshirt freshman Michael Bauer, who missed the majority of last season due to injury and was granted a medical redshirt, will be sidelined for the remainder of the 2000-01 season after suffering a broken left forearm in the second half of Minnesota's loss to Purdue on Jan. 27. Bauer underwent surgery to repair the damage, which included the insertion of plates and screws into the arm.





### **TIME-OUT POLICIES**

- A TV/Media timeout shall be called when the clock has been stopped by rule. Under no circumstances shall the clock be stopped or play be interrupted for a TV time out.
- Media time outs will be called on the first dead ball after the 16, 12, 8 & 4 minute mark in each half.
- The first time out called by either team in the game shall become a full time out. This does not eliminate a media time out.
- In addition, each team is entitled to four time outs of 30 seconds in length and one full time out. Each team may carry over three 30 second time outs to the second half.
- During a 30 second time out the first horn will sound at 20 seconds the second horn will be sounded at the end of the time out and play should resume immediately.
- During a 30 second time out players must remain on the court.
- Each team is entitled to one additional 30 second time out during each extra period-unused 30 second time outs from the half may be used at any time. The first time out called in any extra period becomes a full time out.
- The length of a media time out shall be 135 seconds the first horn sounding at 120 seconds and the second horn sounding at the completion of the time out 15 seconds later.
- Substitutions may not occur after the first horn has been sounded until at least one live-ball period has occurred and the ball becomes dead.
