#### 1986 Minnesota Softball Outlook

(VERSATILE PITCHERS BACKBONE OF GOPHER SQUAD) -- A common problem for softball and baseball coaches is what to do with their pitchers when they aren't on the mound, but Gopher Coach Linda Wells has a different concern. She must decide which positions to utlize her three pitchers at when they're not hurling a game.

The pitching staff features three versatile performers who will be the back-bone of this year's team. Senior <u>Judy Oliverius</u> of Spring Lake Park, Minn., and juniors <u>Barb Drake</u> of St. Paul and <u>Carla Cray</u> of Chester, Ia. Oliverius will be at first or second base when not on the mound, but is also a possibility in the outfield, according to Wells. Drake will catch for Oliverius when she is not pitching, or could be used as a designated hitter, outfielder, or at second base. Cray will get the first nod at shortstop when she is not pitching.

Those three players should always be in the lineup along with returning Big Ten batting champion and Gopher MVP in 1985 Ann Flis. Flis will be utilized primarily at first base, designated hitter, or if needed, at third base.

For the Gophers to improve on last year's 25-24 overall record and 8-12 Big Ten finish, Wells says Drake, Oliverius, Cray and Flis must have "average or better seasons". But, how quickly her five sophomores can contribute may hold the key to the 1986 year.

"We are fortunate to have a few outstanding players, but there's also an unknown quantity in the five sophomores on the team, and they could be a substantial difference in the season," says Wells. Those sophomores include outfielders Jackie Savis, Kelly Darrow and Stacy Hohertz, shortstop Deb Lange and designated hitter Deb Lewis.

Last year, the Gophers were third in the Big Ten in batting (.239) but were ranked fifth in fielding and pitching. One problem on the mound was Cray being plagued by illness and injury, but she is healthy this year. "Offensively we are strong," says Wells. "Our infield defense should be improved, and our sophomores will be the key in the outfield."

Still, consistency is a key factor in the Big Ten single round-robin schedule which features a four game series against each of the six league opponents. Last year, the Gophers were rained out of the series against Michigan State, and then faced NCAA qualifiers Northwestern and Indiana, posting only one victory in those eight games (vs. NU). Minnesota was quickly 1-8, but finished 8-12 after taking three of four vs. Ohio State, and splitting against second place Michigan and Iowa.

The Gophers tied with Michigan State for fifth, but both teams were hindered by missing their head-to-head series. Minnesota placed second in the league in 1984 (14-8) and third in 1983 (13-9), the first year of the round-robin schedule.

LOSSES FROM '85 --Missing from last years lineup will be two starters. Third base/outfielder Danne Leininger was second in batting (.344) and led the team in runs (27), tied with Flis for RBI's (18), and had the teams' best slugging pct. (.475). Second baseman Nancy Jungkans was third at the plate (.243) and led the team in sacrifices (7).

Also gone is first base/designated hitter Anne Keirstead who batted .207 appearing in 41 of 49 games, and outfielder  $\underline{\text{Diane Portner}}$  who had a .978 fielding pct. and hit .184.

THE BATTERY ALSO HAS BATS -- Three upperclassmen will handle the pitching duties again this season. "Our pitchers are solid," says Wells. "Judy (Oliverius) looks strong, Drake is a capable pitcher, and Cray is much improved in the rise and drop."

Oliverius was the mainstay of last year's pitching staff, starting more than half the Gophers games (26 of 49), hurling almost half the innings pitched (168 2/3), and setting a new season record for complete games with 22. She posted a 14-12 mark for the season, and a 1.08 ERA, while holding opposing batters to a .153 combined average on the season. Oliverius also is a capable hitter, averaging .299 as a sophomore, although she hit just .195 last year.

Drake completed 12 of the 16 games she started and had a 1.13 ERA and 9-8 overall record in 118.0 innings pitched. She is a strong hitter, having won the batting title at the ASA major fast-pitch nationals last summer (.570 during tournament play). Drake missed the first 10 games of last season, but batted second team NCAA All-American, Gopher MVP, and batting leader (.326 average).

Coach Wells will be hoping to utilize more of <u>Cray</u> this year to relieve Oliverius and Drake. Cray completed just four games last year, appearing in 11 and posted a 2-4 record while pitching 52.0 innings. At the plate Cray hit .263 in the Big Ten last season and batted .255 overall as a freshman.

At <u>catcher</u>, Wells plans to pair Drake with Oliverius and have senior <u>Kim Katzenmeyer</u> of Fergus Falls, Minn. catch Drake. Katzenmeyer hit .261 in the Big Ten last year and will captain this year's team. Other possibilities behind the plate are junior <u>Mary Stallman</u> of Columbia Heights, Minn., junior transfer from Minneapolis Community <u>College Amy Iverson</u>, and sophomore <u>Deb Lewis</u> of Richfield, Minn.

AROUND THE HORN -- The infield features several favorites at various positions, but Wells will be instituting many lineups to best utilize her personnel depending on who is pitching, and who is contributing at that point in the season.

At <u>first base</u>, Wells has utilized several players in the past, but look for <u>Flis</u> to get the most time there. Flis proved herself at the plate last year, leading the conference with a .406 batting average and earning recognition on the NCAA Midwest Regional team and first team all-Big Ten. She also set a new Minnesota season record with a .503 on-base percentage. Wells will also continue to use Flis as a designated hitter, with freshman <u>Tonya Meredith</u> of Aurora, Colo. or Oliverius filling in at first. Meredith may also be used as a designated hitter.

At <u>second base</u>, Wells plans to move over senior <u>Jeana Cullen</u> from shortstop. Cullen has been one of the teams' top defensive players the past several years and is third in career assists. Reserves at second will be freshman Sally Dighton of Boone, Ia., or Oliverius.

Cray will get the first nod at shortstop, but sophomore <u>Deb Lange</u> of LaCrescent, Minn. will also play there. Lange started 13 games and appeared in 20 last year.

At third base, Wells will look to freshman <u>Kathy Casull</u> to fill in for the loss of starter Leininger. Another contender is sophomore Lewis who saw considerable playing time as a rookie, appearing in 42 games and starting 30. Wells also plans to use Lewis as a designated hitter.

#### Minnesota Softball Outlook -3-3-3-3-

IN THE OUTFIELD -- Three sophomores will be relied upon to handle most of the outfield duties, as they did the second half of last season. At right field, Wells pre-season favorite is sophomore <u>Jackie Savis</u> of St. Louis, Mo. who finished fifth on the team in batting last season (.222) and started in 25 of 49 games, including 11 of the last 13.

In center field, Wells will utilize <u>Kelly Darrow</u> of Inver Grove, Hts., Minn. Darrow started in 29 games as a rookie in left field and finished the season batting .198. In left field, <u>Stacy Hohertz</u> of Minnetonka, Minn. will be looked to. She earned a regular assignment in center field midway through last year, starting 15 of the last 16 games. Lange will also shoulder some of the outfield duties.

Reserves in the outfield could include Cullen, Katzenmeyer, Lange, Oliverius or Stallman, according to Wells.

THE BIG TEN -- Wells expects defending champion Northwestern to be strong again, behind the arm of NCAA record-holding pitcher Lisa Ishikawa. She also expects second place Michigan and third place Indiana to field good teams. "It's really difficult to predict how we will finish," says Wells. "If we can get performance out of our young people we will be okay. I'm starting three sophomores and one freshman, and we will need them to bring their bats around and play solid defense."

THE SCHEDULE -- Minnesota will play Nebraska prior to the annual Roadrunner Invitational in Las Cruces, N.M. March 6-8. At the end of the month, the Gophers will play Texas A&M and compete in the Houston Classic March 27-29. The Big Ten single round-robin schedule will begin at home with a four game series against Iowa April 4-5.

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA SOFTBALL Head Coach Linda Wells

The University of Minnesota now boasts an internationally recognized softball coach in Linda Wells, who enters her 13th season with the Gophers this year. Wells was selected as the assistant coach to the 1985 U.S. national team which took the gold medal at the South Pacific Classic in Melbourne, Australia in March of 1985.

This will be Wells' 12th season as head softball coach (she spent one year as an assistant) and she has compiled a .610 winning percentage. Wells surpassed the 250 career wins mark in 1985, and her career record stands at 255-163-1. In 1984, she coached Minnesota to a second place Big Ten finish, the best since the conference began recognizing a champion in 1981.

Wells is probably Minnesota's most versatile coach; besides her softball career, she has also coached the Gopher basketball and volleyball teams. In five years at the helm of the volleyball team, she had a 246-95-5 record, (.718 pct.) and led the team to a seventh place finish at the 1981 AIAW national championships. Her contribution to the Minnesota volleyball program was recognized in October of 1985 when she was one of the first inductees into the Golden Spikers Minnesota Volleyball Hall of Fame.

As versatile an athlete as she is a coach, Wells graduated in 1972 from Southeast Missouri State University, where she played five varsity sports: softball, volleyball, basketball, field hockey, and tennis. She also played amateur league softball and field hockey, and signed on with the Chicago Ravens when the women's professional softball league was organized. She later moved to the St. Louis Hummers in her native Missouri, where she was a player and player-coach until the league folded in 1978.

In 1978, Coach Wells' Gopher softball team earned a third place finish in the Women's College World Series. She has coached such outstanding players as 1979 Pan American selections Shelly Medernach and Judy Knight, former pros Vicky Swanson and Mary Owen (1978 Rookie of the Year in the proleague), and two-time All-American Gretchen Larson.

Softball is a year-round activity for Wells; in the summer, she is the player-coach of the American Softball Association (ASA) Class AA Twin Cities Sport Print "Blizzards" (formerly sponsored by Outbound Travel). In 1985, the Blizzards won the region and finished 7th at the ASA national championships. Outbound Travel finished ninth in the nation in 1984, and 17th in 1983. She is an active supporter of fast-pitch softball in area schools, parks and clubs.

Wells is an advisor to the YWCA's sport committee, teaches physical education at the University of Minnesota, and conducts softball camps and clinics through the Wells Sports Corporation. She earned a master's degree in exercise physiology from the University of Minnesota in 1984. Originally from Pacific, Mo. outside St. Louis, Wells has been involved with the women's athletic program at the University since 1972-73.

#### Assistant Coach Charlene Sennewald

Charlene Sennewald enters her ninth year as the Golden Gophers' assistant coach. Last season, Sennewald took on additional responsibility, garnering her first collegiate head coaching experience during the Gophers' first few games while head coach Linda Wells was serving as head coach to the U.S. national team.

Originally from St. Louis, Missouri, Sennewald received her B.A. degree in physical education from the University of Missouri in 1975. At Missouri, she was a four-year letter-winner in softball, basketball, and field hockey, and captained both the softball and field hockey teams her senior year.

Following graduation, Sennewald coached high school softball and basketball at Ft. Zumwalt Senior High in O'Fallon, Missouri, and led her team to the conference championship in 1976. From 1977 through 1979, she played for the St. Louis Hummers professional softball team, where she was a teammate of Coach Wells. Sennewald has continued to play ASA softball in the summer. In 1975, her St. Louis-based team took third place at the ASA national fast-pitch tournament, and she also played on Minneapolis-based teams which placed seventh in 1985 and 17th in 1983.

In 1980, Sennewald earned a master's degree in physical education from the University of Minnesota. In addition to her duties with the Gophers, she is a coach during the summer at the Linda Wells softball camp. From 1977 to 1985 she also served as the head coach of the Minnesota varsity reserve squad until the team was disbanded prior to the 1985 season.

#### Assistant Coach and Manager Julie Zieminski

Julie Zieminski enters her second season as a coach/manager of the Gopher softball team. She joined the staff last year after a successful career with the Gophers from 1980-1984 as a player, and completed her degree in physical education from the university.

During her four years on the team, Zieminski was a stalwart performer in center field and at the plate and earned spots on several Minnesota career records lists. She had one of her best seasons batting as co-captain of the Gophers her senior year, hitting .256 and raising her career average eight points, to finish at .233.

In summer ASA class AA fast-pitch competition, Zieminski was player/coach of the Twin City Jammers, which placed 7th at the women's major fast-pitch nationals last year. She has also played for the Minneapolis-based Outbound Travel squad, which finished ninth at the ASA national tournament in 1984, and was 17th in national competition in 1983.

Zieminski played her high school softball at Tartan High in Oakdale, Minnesota. There, she earned all-conference and team MVP honors, while serving as team captain. Zieminski was also all-conference, captain and MVP of the tennis team and was captain of the basketball team.
