### **Pledges for Points for MINNESOTA!**

The Rotary Clubs of Minnesota are helping to make the points scored by University of Minnesota's football team and women's volleyball team work double duty. Not only will the Golden Gophers be earning points for victories on the field, they also will help the Rotarians earn funds to contribute to the University's athletic scholarship funds and special community projects.

Members of the Wayzata Rotary have taken the lead to establish the state-wide Buck-a-Point campaign that involves individuals pledging to contribute a specific amount of money for every point scored by the Gopher football team during the regular 1989 season or pledge to make a contribution for every ace scored by the women's volleyball team during the 1989 Big Ten season. Seventy-five percent of the money raised will be given to both the women's and men's athletic programs at the University of Minnesota. The remaining 25% will be used by the participating Rotary Clubs for community projects in their area.

Because the Department of Men's Intercollegiate Athletics and the Department of Women's Intercollegiate Athletics are separate departments at the University of Minnesota, their sharing the proceeds from a fund raising campaign is unique. Typically the athletic departments have to work separately to raise the much needed dollars to fund the increasingly expensive athletic programs. The Buck-a-Point campaign allows individuals to make contributions by pledging dollars based on either program and have that donation shared between the two athletic departments.

The exceptional history of the Rotary makes the outlook for this campaign very promising and a campaign goal of \$5 million has been set. The football team has scored an average of 170 points a season over the past 10 years and the women's volleyball team recorded 163 aces in 1988. The Rotary and the athletic departments are hoping that many Minnesotans will participate in this fun and unique fund raiser and pledge 10¢ or more a point. Donors may make a pledge either against the points scored this year or they may make a pledge against the points scored by the Gophers over the past ten years and, because they will know what the average points are, make their donation when they pledge. Either way, it's a great way to support the Golden Gophers and Minnesota community projects.

## NELSEN SHINES AT JUNIOR OLYMPIC SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Freshman recruit, Paul Nelsen (Lincoln, NE), etched his name into the record books by claiming four events at the U.S. Swimming Junior Olympic Championships held August 8-12 at the University of Texas Swim Center in Austin, TX.

A 1989 graduate of Southeast High School in Lincoln, NE, Nelsen became the first male in the history of the competition to win four individual events in one Junior Olympics.

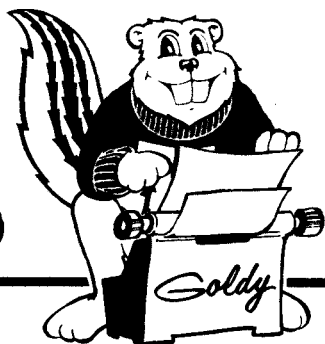
Nelsen set new Junior Olympic records en route to winning the 100 meter breaststroke with a clocking of 1:04.85 and then the 400 meter individual medley with a time of 4:29.66. He continued his winning ways by also touching first in the 200 meter breaststroke in 2:22.08 and the 200 meter individual medley with a time of 2:06.56.

At Southeast High School, Nelsen claimed Nebraska state championships in the 200 individual medley and the 100 backstroke, on his way to earning All-America honors.

"Paul obviously established himself as one of the finest swimmers in the country," said University of Minnesota head coach Dennis Dale, whose Golden Gophers finished third in the Big Ten and 11th at the NCAA Championships last season. "He is the best incoming freshman that we've ever recruited and will make an outstanding addition to our team."

Another incoming freshman, Chris Carlisle (Arlington, TX), also placed in the competition. He finished fourth in the 200 meter backstroke with a clocking of 2:08.22.

The U.S. Swimming Junior Olympics is a proving ground for many up and coming swimmers. Of the 44 swimmers on the 1988 U.S. Olympic Swimming Team, 43 had competed in the Junior Olympics at least once during their careers.

## GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM WINS OPENER IN AUSTRALIA

Junior Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) tallied 20 points to lead the University of Minnesota basketball team to a 105-79 victory over Broad Meadow in Melbourne, Australia on Tuesday.

Seniors Willie Burton (Detroit, MI) and Jim Shikenjanski (Rockton, IL) with 17 points apiece, and junior Mario Green (Freeport, Bahamas) with 14 points, joined Bond in double figures. Burton paced the team with 10 rebounds in the contest, while sophomore Bob Martin (Apple Valley, MN) added eight boards.

The contest took place just hours after the Gophers arrived in Melbourne from their long flight. After holding a slim 53-46 advantage at the half, the Gophers exploded in the second half to outscore Broad Meadow 52-33 in the last half to finish with the 26-point victory.

"It's tough on anyone to step off a plane after 22 hours and play a game," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins. "But I was pleased with our performance, especially in the second half."

The Golden Gophers will play the Melbourne Giants on Wednesday in their second game of the trip.

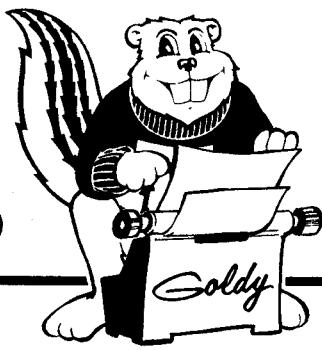

## ANDERSON NAMED ASSISTANT MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING COACH

The University of Minnesota men's athletic department has announced the hiring of David Anderson as assistant swimming and diving coach, pending final approval by the Board of Regents.

Anderson comes to Minnesota after spending the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, where he primarily coached the Cornhuskers' distance freestylers and individual medley swimmers. The Cornhuskers finished 10th in the final team standings at the NCAA Championships in both 1988 and 1989.

While in Lincoln, Anderson also assisted with the Nebraska Aquatics USS Team and implemented a blood lactate testing program. He has coached a number of U.S. Olympic Trials qualifiers, U.S. Open finalists, Senior and Junior National finalists, Big Eight Conference champions, and National Junior Olympic champions and finalists.

Anderson, who earned his Bachelor's degree in political science from Hartwick College (NY) in 1985 and his Master's degree in exercise physiology from the University of Nebraska this past summer, spent two years as head girl's swimming and diving coach at Perkiomen Valley High School in Collegeville, PA before heading to Nebraska. He also was aquatics director of Perkiomen Valley High School's summer swim program and head USS coach while there.

"We're very happy to have David join our staff," said University of Minnesota Head Coach Dennis Dale, whose Golden Gophers finished 11th at the NCAA Championships last season. "He brings to the University a wealth of talent and experience, along with a scientific approach to the sport."

## **GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM TOPS BALLARAT 99-80 IN AUSTRALIA**

With four players in double figures, the Golden Gopher basketball team scored a 99-80 victory over the Ballarat Miners in Ballarat, Australia on Thursday.

Ballarat had just won the Victorian Basketball Association crown, the equivalent to the NBA crown in the United States, this past season. The Miners upset the Melbourne Tigers, led by former Seton Hall star Andrew Gaze, in the final.

Seniors Richard Coffey (Aurora, NC) and Jim Shikenjanski (Rockton, IL) tallied 18 points to lead the Golden Gophers, who are now 2-0 on their trip. Fellow seniors Willie Burton (Detroit, MI) and Melvin Newbern (Toledo, OH) were also in double figures with 17 and 11 points respectively. Coffey added a game-high 16 rebounds in the contest, while junior Mario Green (Freeport, Bahamas) chipped in a game-high seven assists.

The Golden Gophers will continue their seven-game trip when they play at Bendigo on Friday.

## GOLDEN GOPHER CAGERS WIN THIRD STRAIGHT

Minnesota's touring Golden Gopher basketball team scored its third straight triumph "Down Under" when they defeated Bendigo, Australia, 115-91 last night.

Coach Clem Haskins saw his team trail by as much as 11 points in the early-going before they made a run at the four-minute mark and moved into a 51-51 halftime deadlock. After that it was all Minnesota.

The host Bendigo contingent boasted the game's top scorer, D.J. Johnson who finished the night with 38 points. David Flint added 25 for the losers.

"It really was a team effort on our part," Haskins said after using all 10 of his cagers for the third straight game. "We fell behind early but came back very well in spite of the fact that we were playing in front of a standing room only crowd that was very vocal in support of the Bendigo team. At the end it boiled down to our wanting the game more than they did."

Now the travel-weary Golden Gophers will take a few days off before returning to action on Monday when they face the Illawarra Hawks in Wollongong, Australia in the fourth game of their seven-game Australia/New Zealand tour.

With the victory, Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gophers raised their record to a spotless 5-0 on this seven game trip to Australia and New Zealand.

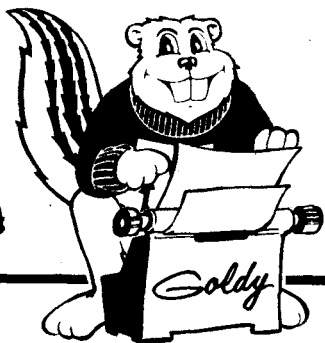

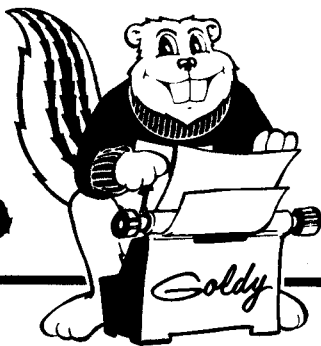

## GOLDEN GOPHERS DON PADS

After three days of non-contact workouts, the University of Minnesota Golden Gopher football team dons pads on Wednesday, and Coach John Gutekunst will begin preparing his charges for the 1989 season in earnest.

Thus far Minnesota has been running through its early workouts in shorts and t-shirts, but it has been doing so two and three times daily. And that strenuous pattern is expected to continue now that the Golden Gophers are in pads and hitting.

Oddly enough, Minnesota saw its first casualty of the season on the first day of drills when Kenneth Sebree, a second-year defensive back out of Detroit, suffered a separated shoulder in a passing drill when he hit the turf after intercepting a pass. Also on the defensive side of things, the pads and the initial hitting may be somewhat of a mental test for senior All-America linebacking candidate Jon Leverenz who suffered a knee injury in last year's season opener, had surgery and has spent the entire year away from contact work. All eyes will be on him this week.

The week's temp should reach a peak on Saturday when Gutekunst is expected to put his charges through its initial scrimmage of fall camp. It should give him an opportunity to make his first real evaluation of the fall.

Thompson was among those featured on a national television show Sunday where his status as a 1989 All-America selection was designated and he also was tabbed as one of the top three choices in the nation for this year's Heisman Trophy.

## GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM DEFEATS NEW ZEALAND 94-75 TO COMPLETE UNBEATEN TRIP

Senior Willie Burton (Detroit, MI) and junior Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) each scored 18 points, while senior Richard Coffey (Aurora, NC) came off the bench to record 11 points and 18 rebounds, as the Golden Gopher basketball team completed a seven-game sweep of their Australian/New Zealand tour by registering a 94-75 victory over the New Zealand National Team in Whangarei last Friday.

New Zealand jumped out to a 23-14 lead in the first-half, but the Gophers bounced back to take a 32-31 lead on two free throws by Bond with 4:11 remaining. Behind their pressing man-to-man defense, the Golden Gophers put their running game in high gear and cruised the rest of the way to the 19-point victory.

"We have had Purdue and UNLV over here the last three years, but Minnesota displays a certain amount of class that no other team has exhibited," said New Zealand Head Coach Keith Mair, whose club lost to the Golden Gophers for the third time in as many days. "From the head coach, right down through the traveling party, everyone was outstanding. Their players really play hard and they get after you. 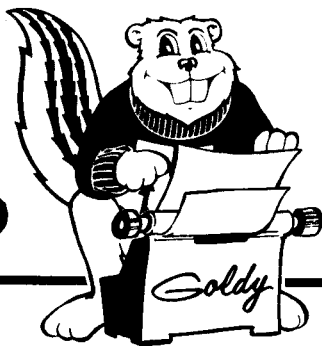

## **ROY GRIAK, Head Cross Country/Track & Field Coach**

The registered "dean" of Big Ten coaches, Roy Griak is entering his 27th season at the helm of the Golden Gopher cross country and track and field programs.

Griak has assembled an impressive coaching resume at all levels of the sport during his illustrious career. After taking over the reins of the program at the University of Minnesota in 1963, he promptly led the Golden Gophers to the 1964 Big Ten cross country title, the school's first in the sport since 1914. Under his guidance, the program achieved a rare double in 1968, winning conference championships in both cross country and track and field. The cross country squad that season went on to place fourth at the NCAA Championships. In 1969, the cross country team made it two in a row by wrapping up another conference title.

Griak's cross country team's have recorded an impressive dual meet record of 157-36, a .813 winning percentage. In addition to three Big Ten titles, his squads have produced three second-place, and six third-place finishes in league meets. Overall, he has coached a total of 31 cross country and track and field All-Americans during his tenure, including two NCAA champions, Ron Backes (Shot Put, 1986 NCAA Indoor) and Garry Bjorklund (Six Mile Run, 1971 NCAA Outdoor). His athletes have collected 43 Big Ten Conference individual titles as well.

On the international level, Griak has made his mark as well. He was head manager of the U.S. track and field squad at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, and assistant manager for the 1972 and 1980 Olympic teams. In 1987, he managed the U.S. team that competed at the World Championships in Rome, Italy. In addition, he was the head coach for the U.S. squad at the 1975 Pan American Games.

Before taking over the reins of the Golden Gopher program, Griak worked his winning magic as head cross country and track and field coach at St. Louis Park High from 1953-63. While there, his Orioles won state titles in 1955 and 1961, as well as five district and four regional crowns. Before that, he posted an overall dual meet record of 137-26, a .779 winning percentage, as head coach at Nicollet and Mankato high schools.

A letterwinner in both cross country and track and field during his collegiate running career for the Gophers, Griak earned his Bachelor's degree in Education from the U of M in 1949, adding his Master's degree in 1950. Born in Butte, Montana, his family moved to Duluth when he was a youngster, where he charted an outstanding prep career in cross country, football, basketball, and track and field for Morgan Park High School.

## 1989 CROSS COUNTRY OUTLOOK

Probably the best way to describe the 1989 edition of the Golden Gopher cross country team is that Head Coach Roy Griak's harrers will be long on talent, but short on experience this fall.

The Gophers chalked up an outstanding season a year ago, finishing fifth at the always-tough Big Ten Conference Championships and just missing the fourth-place spot by a mere point in the process. Graduation took its toll, however, with five of the top seven runners gone. On top of that, Chris Harder, the squad's number one or two runner all of last season, will redshirt the 1989 season.

"We have a lot of shoes to fill that's for sure," Griak said. "Todd Beetcher was in our top seven throughout last season, so we will certainly look for another fine season from him, along with some of our other returnees. Hopefully some of the new guys will also step to the forefront this season."

Beetcher finished 54th at the Big Ten Championships a year ago with a time of 26:55 over the 8000 meter course. Fellow seniors, Dan Hebl and Jeff Svedahl, turned in outstanding track seasons last year, and will look for that success on the oval to carry over to the grass this fall. Sophomores Sean Fitzgerald and Tony Laskowski also turned in outstanding seasons on the track last year and should contribute heavily to the Gophers' cause this fall.

Griak has brought in an outstanding group of freshmen with one national champion and a pair of prep state champions leading the way. Craig Collier from Bellevue, WA won the TAC 17-18 age group 5000 meter title last year, Doug Milkowski from Stevens Point, WI captured the Wisconsin State Class A cross country crown last fall, and Mark Narveson from Mankato, MN collected top honors in the 1600 meter run at the Minnesota State Class AA Track & Field Championships last spring. Chris Berg from Minneapolis, MN, Scott DeLong from Aurora, CO and Dan Fumo from Elm Grove, WI also come equipped with outstanding credentials.

"On paper they look like they will be able to contribute," Griak said. "But it's always a tough adjustment when you go from 5000 meters up to 8000 and 10,000 meter races. They'll get an opportunity to prove themselves right away this fall."

The Golden Gophers will once again run against many of the nation's finest this season, with the season opener slated for September 16 against Big Ten rival Iowa and Stanford from the Pac 10 Conference in a triangular at the U of M Golf Course. The Big Ten Championships will be held on October 28 in Madison, WI.

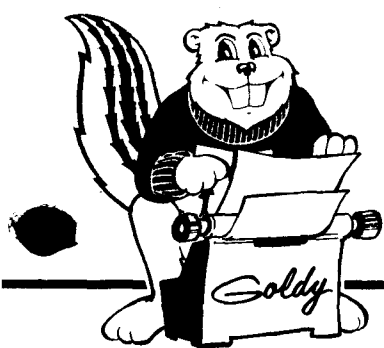

## MINNESOTA TO OPEN SEASON AT IOWA STATE SATURDAY

Minnesota kicks off the 1989 football season on Saturday when invading Ames, IA, for a 1:00 p.m. non-conference assignment against Iowa State University of the Big Eight Conference.

While it will be the opener for Coach John Gutekunst's Golden Gophers, it will be the second outing of the current campaign for the host Cyclones who belted Ohio University 28-3 last weekend.

Iowa State and Minnesota have met 22 times in previous years, and the Golden Gophers will take a 19-2-1 edge in the series into Saturday's game. These two teams have not met since 1924, however, when they deadlocked 7-7. And that contest was in Minneapolis.

Playing the opener on the road worries Coach Gutekunst, and the fact that Iowa State has a game under its belt to iron out the wrinkles also is of major concern. But they are two factors which make the host contingent the favorite.

Minnesota hopes to counter with an offense built around All-American Darrell Thompson, a senior tailback who has accounted for 3,379 yards in three years as a Golden Gopher, a U of M career rushing record.

Thompson will team with quarterback Scott Schaffner, fullback Pat Cummings and flanker Cris Gaiters in the backfield against Iowa State, and they hope to muster enough offense to give Minnesota the edge.

Pat Tinglehoff will open at split end and Shane Strain at tight end while the offensive line will include Chris Thome at center, J.J. Lennon and Mark Drabczak at the guards and Dan Liimatta and Jon Melander at the tackles.

Defensively Gutekunst figures the key may be up front where he'll open with Eddie Miles and Skeeter Akre at the ends and Bob Coughlin and Mike Sunvold at the tackles.

But there's also concern in the deep secondary where newcomers at the corners, Fred Foggie and Derek Fisher, hold the key. Sean Lumpkin at free safety and Doug Evans at strong safety are familiar faces.

In between the defensive line and the secondary, Minnesota may be as good as any team in the Big Ten with Jon Leverenz, Mac Stephens and Ron Goetz manning the linebacking spots.

Assigned the kicking chores in the Iowa State opener will be Brent Berglund who accounted for 51 points on 10 field goals and 21-of-21 PAT's last season. Brent Herbel again will handle the punting assignment.

Following Saturday's road assignment, Minnesota will come home to entertain Nebraska, another Big Eight Conference member, at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 23.

## HOCKEY GOPHERS LOSE 1ST TWO GAMES IN EUROPE

MINNEAPOLIS, MN---The U. of Minnesota hockey Gophers, in Europe for a five-game exhibition swing, lost their first two games against teams from the Division A Swiss League.

Minnesota lost Thursday 3-1 to SC Bern, and 7-6 the next night to ERC Schwenningen. Both games were played at Bern, Switzerland.

Action continues for Minnesota Tuesday when the Gophers meet ERC again, this time on the opponents home ice in Schwenningen, West Germany.

Minnesota completes its tour with games Friday and Saturday in a tournament at Lansgenthal, Switzerland. Minnesota meets host Langenthal Friday, and either Olten or Zurcher SC, both Swiss entries, Saturday. The Gophers return to the Twiss Cities Sunday.

Junior wing Ken Gernander (Coleraine Greenway) scored two goals in UM's second game last week while senior wing and co-captain Peter Hankinson (Edina) scored a goal in each of the first two games.

Sophomore goalie Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk Greenway) was in the Minnesota nets each night and, according to head coach Doug Woog, played very well. Stolp stopped three breakaway attempts by SC Bern in the first game, and made 29 saves in the second outing.

"Cosidering we were just starting out, I believe our players did a fine job against two very good hockey teams," Woog said after Friday's game. "Bern was a quick, fast team while Schwenningen was more physical."

Minnsota opens official practice Monday, Sept. 25, the first day of classes for the fall quarter. The Gophers begin season play Oct. 7 in the Hall of Game game against Northern Michigan at Eveleth. Following the annual Alumni game the next Saturday, Minnesota opens defense of its 1988-89 WCHA championship at Mariucci Arena Oct. 20-21 against the U. of Minnesota-Duluth.

## WILSON, GATES COMPLETE TEAM USA SUMMER SEASON

Minneapolis, MN---University of Minnesota baseball players Dan Wilson, a junior catcher, and Brent Gates, a sophomore shortstop, recently completed a 44-game summer season with the U. S. Senior National Team.

Gates, from Grandville, MI, ended the campaign as the leading hitter on Team USA with a .353 batting average. Gates was 41 for 116 at the plate with 13 of his hits, including six home runs, going for extra bases. He drove in 26 runs while appearing in 37 games.

Gates, named to the 1989 NCAA Freshman All-America Team by *Baseball America*, opened the season as a reserve at SS, 2B & DH. After winning the starting berth at SS on July 30, Gates finished the season on a tear.

He was the only Team USA player to hit better than .300 (.350, 7 for 20) at the Intercontinental Cup Tournament in Puerto Rico. He also was the only USA player to hit safely in all six tournament games.

USA only posted a 1-5 record at the Cup Tournament, and that came when Wilson smacked a 9th inning bases loaded triple to provide his team with a 9-7 victory over Italy.

Wilson, from Barrington, IL, caught 30 of his team's games and ended 3rd in hitting with a .325 (37 of 114) average. He topped his teammates with 33 runs batted in, and 17 of his 37 hits were for extra bases, including eight home runs.

Tem USA ended the summer season with a 27-17 record.

## BATTERED GOLDEN GOPHERS TO INVADE NORTHWESTERN

With two of its most dependable mainstays on the shelf, Minnesota's Golden Gophers head for Northwestern on Saturday to take on the Wildcats in a 1:05 p.m. Big Ten Conference football assignment.

Coach John Gutekunst's charges will take an overall record of 3-1 and a Big Ten log of 1-0 into Evanston after whipping Purdue at home 35-15 last weekend, but they aren't expected to take their top offensive player and their top defensive player along with them.

Darrell Thompson, Minnesota's All-America tailback, left the Purdue game with six minutes remaining in the first quarter. Jon Leverenz, its' premier linebacker, departed with three minutes left in the first half. Neither player returned to the game, and both were diagnosed as having suffered sprained right knees. Early indications were that both players would be on the shelf for at least one game.....and that one is at Northwestern Saturday.

Marcus Evans will get the starting nod in Thompson's

place. He filled in admirably against Purdue, rushing 32 times for 102 yards and a touchdown.....the first 100-yard game and the first TD of his collegiate career. Joel Staats filled in for Leverenz against the Boilermakers (he started last year when Leverenz was injured) and he will get the call Saturday against the Wildcats. He had two tackles and a pass interception in just over a quarter of play last Saturday.

Minnesota and Northwestern have met 70 times in football over the years, and the Golden Gophers will take an edge of 42-23-5 into Saturday's shootout at Evanston.....Minnesota's first conference road assignment of the current campaign. A year ago the Wildcats and Golden Gophers battled to a 28-28 tie in a U of M Homecoming extravaganza at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome after Minnesota had jumped off to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter on the strength of three Thompson touchdowns.

Northwestern last won in the series 31-28 in 1984. Minnesota had reeled off three straight

triumphs over the Wildcats before last year's draw. And that makes Gutekunst 2-0-1 against Northwestern.

Gutekunst, shrugging off the probable absence of Thompson and Leverenz, figures Saturday's confrontation will be a tough one for his University of Minnesota football contingent. "Coach Francis Peay is doing another excellent job down there," Gutekunst says. "He has put together a tremendously explosive offense that gets a lot of yards and scores a lot of points. Through the non-conference portion of the season, Northwestern had the leading offense, the leading rusher, the total offense leader and the leading receiver in our league. That has to tell you something."

But Gutekunst is also high on his own club. "After our game against Purdue, I hope nobody ever says our people don't have heart," he proclaimed. "They lose two of their key teammates, and they just come back tougher than ever. That shows a little character." He hopes that character will be enough to win Saturday at Northwestern.

## ICERS IN INTRASQUAD. ALUM GAMES FRI-SAT.

Minneapolis, MN---Minnesota's hockey Gophers play two more exhibition contests this weekend continuing preparations for the season-opening series at home Oct. 20-21 against Minnesota-Duluth.

This weekend finds the Gophers Friday hosting a second intrasquad game at Mariucci Arena, and Saturday facing off against a UM alumni team also on home ice. No admission will be charged to the public at either event, but donations going directly to the Gopher hockey program will be accepted. Both games have a 7:00 p.m. start time.

The Alumni outing features some great names out of the past who will once again skate on Mariucci Arena ice. Included are two members of the 1980 U.S. Olympic championship team, wing Phil Verchota and defenseman Billy Baker.

Several other notables returning include Kevin Hartzel, Steve Griffith, Wally Chapman, Steve Orth, Jeff Larson and Tim Harrer, among others.

Last Saturday Minnesota traveled north to Eveleth to meet Northern Michigan at the annual Hall of Fame Game. The Gophers, led by a pair of goals from junior wing Grant Bischoff, held on to record a 6-5 victory.

Both head coaches, Minnesota's Doug Woog and Northern's Rick Comley, held several veteran players out of the game. Both coaches referred to minor injuries and a desire to spend more time looking at younger talent as their main reasons for not fielding full veteran squads.

Coach Woog, who again viewed the game from the stands and allowed his assistants Bill Butters and Jack Blatherwick to handle the bench coaching, said he was generally pleased with the overall play of the Gophers Saturday.

"There were really two contrasting styles of play in Saturday's game," Woog said Monday. "I believe our men made some very good passing plays and that the offensive portion of our game was quite good.

"It was evident, however, that several defensive areas of our system have not been worked on that much to date. Beginning today, however, our entire squad will practice together for the first time this fall, and defense will be stressed from the start.

"We, the coaching staff, decided that most of our veteran players had nothing to prove, and secondly had spent so much time skating this summer and early fall that they would welcome some time off. Our veterans have only been skating twice a week on a voluntary basis.

Woog praised the efforts of both teams at Eveleth Saturday saying, "That was certainly one of the most entertaining Hall of Fame Games that fans have seen in several years."

Four of Minnesota's incoming freshmen crop played Saturday, including goalie Tom Newman, defenseman Eric Means, and forwards Bill Klatt and John Brill. Redshirt freshman defenseman Travis Richards, same as the newcomers, also acquitted himself well, according to Woog.

"At this point in time I have to believe that all our rookies appear ready to help us as the 1989-90 season moves along," Woog added.

One newcomer was missing, defenseman Doug Zmolek. Zmolek is recovering from a knee injury suffered in an earlier practice, but is expected to be ready for full-time duty when the Gophers open regular season play in two weeks.

During a teleconference last week among WCHA head coaches, an informal poll was conducted and the coaches picked Minnesota and Northern Michigan as co-favorites to win this year's WCHA championship. Woog, of course, would not pick his Gopher team to repeat for an unprecedented third consecutive crown, said he didn't know how to separate Northern Michigan, Denver and Wisconsin as his favorite, but that each school would be in the race until the end.

## **CROSS COUNTRY TEAM FINISHES FOURTH AT MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL; CENTRAL COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS THIS WEEKEND**

Led by junior Keith Eidman's (Roseville, MN) 10th-place individual finish, the Golden Gopher cross country team turned in their finest performance of the season en route to finishing fourth at last Saturday's Minnesota Invitational held at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course.

The Golden Gophers tallied 122 points in the competition. Iowa State, ranked No. 1 in the most recent national poll, certainly lived up to their billing, taking team honors with a perfect score of 15. No. 14 Penn State finished second with 61 points, while Colorado State ended up one point in front of the Golden Gophers at 121.

Iowa State senior, John Nuttall, claimed the individual crown with a clocking of 24:21 over the 8000 meter course. Sophomore Jonah Koech in 24:33, junior Andrew Hollens in 24:45, senior Darrell Smith in 24:48 and junior Roland Pauwels in 24:53 completed the 1-5 sweep for the powerful Cyclones. Eidman continued his outstanding running - he has led the Gophers in all three meets in '89 - finishing 10th with a time of 25:17.

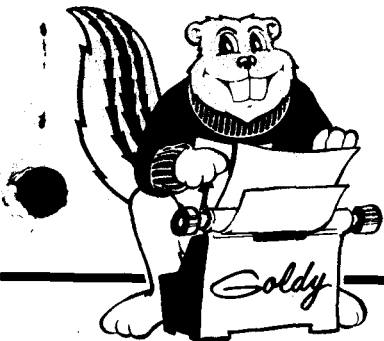

## GOLDEN GOPHERS HOST BUCKEYES IN TV GAME

Minnesota returns to the Hubert. H. Humphrey Metrodome Saturday after two weeks on the road to play host to Ohio State University in a 2:30 p.m. Big Ten Conference TV game of the week assignment.

The Invading Buckeyes, sporting a two-game league win streak after knocking off Purdue 21-3 last weekend, are 4-2 on the season and 2-1 in the Big Ten.....a record identical to that of Coach John Gutekunst's Golden Gophers.

The difference is Ohio State is on a roll, Minnesota is still licking its wounds after losing last weekend at Indiana 28-18.....AND the Bucks own a win over those Hoosiers who snapped the Golden Gophers two-game win-string last weekend.

"It will be a tough assignment for us," Gutekunst admitted when looking ahead to Saturday's game against OSU. "They have a typical Ohio State line.....big and strong. And they have excellent backs, people like Carlos Snow and Scottie Graham.."

Gutekunst also knows Minnesota must straighten things out after its disheart-

ening loss at Indiana. "We have a lot of work to do in ALL areas," he said, "before we will be ready to play a team like Ohio State."

The "straightening" would include such departments as its kicking game which did not get the total job done at Indiana. The same holds true for penalties where Minnesota was whistled 10 times for a total of 62 critical, costly yards.

A disappointed Gutekunst said of the setback, "We did not execute our kicking game well enough, and we missed some opportunities. But we fought hard, and we made something happen when we had to. The loss may have left a terrible taste in our mouths, but we have nothing to be ashamed of."

But Gutekunst is well aware of the fact that Minnesota must improve in order to stay in contention in the Big Ten race. "We can survive, we can't win if we continue making mistakes like we did against Indiana," he said, "and we certainly can't make them this week against Ohio State."

The Buckeyes and the Golden Gophers have met a total of 32 times in football

over the years and OSU will bring a 26-6 advantage into Saturday afternoon's contest. The Buckeyes won a year ago 13-6 in the Metrodome, and they boast a 12-4 record in Minneapolis.

Minnesota's most recent win over the Buckeyes was by a 35-31 margin in 1981 in Memorial Stadium. Ohio State has won seven straight over the Golden Gophers, and the Buckeyes have never lost in the Metrodome.

Although it didn't get its deserved attention, Minnesota's All-America tailback, Darrell Thompson, rushed for 117 yards in 28 carries at Indiana, and it was the 18th time that he has gone over the 100-yard mark.

Also overlooked in last week's loss was the defensive performance of defensive tackle Mike Sunvold who had 12 solo tackles and two assists for 14 hits. Ron Goetz is another Golden Gopher deserving praise for his 11 tackles (two for losses of four yards) and a pass broken up.

Good News: Linebacker Jon Leverenz could be back after missing two games and tailback Marcus Evans Should return following last week's absence.

## ICERS LOSE 2, TRAVEL TO NORTH DAKOTA

Minneapolis, MN---Two WCHA hockey teams meet this weekend while sharing an unaccustomed position....that of looking up at the rest of the teams in the standings.

Minnesota's hockey Gophers travel to North Dakota for league games Friday and Saturday. Both the Gophers and Sioux, following their respective opening weekend of WCHA play, sport 0-2-0 records.

Friday's 7 p.m. contest will be brought to the Twin Cities live by KITN-TV, Ch. 29, and WAYL-980 AM radio. Saturday's game will be carried as a delayed broadcast by WAYL.

In the period dating back to 1979, Minnesota and North Dakota have each won four WCHA championships, including the last two in a row by Minnesota. Thus, the unfamiliar feelings of looking up at the rest of the league.

Last weekend saw Minnesota swept in a season-opening home series for the first time since November, 1973, when Wisconsin turned the trick, 3-2 and 8-2.

Friday and Saturday the honors went to league-leading Minnesota-Duluth. The Bulldogs, now 4-0-0, won by scores of 9-6 and 4-2. It was one of the most impressive displays of speed skating put on by a UM-D team in many a year at Mariucci Arena.

For the Gophers, inexperience was evident from start to finish. A prime example of work ahead for this UM team was shown Saturday when the Gophers were only able to convert one of 10 power plays.

Last weekend also marked the first time UM-D swept a series here since January 6-7, 1984. The Bulldogs took those games 6-1 and 5-4 en route to their first ever WCHA championship.

Sophomore center/wing **Ken Gernander** was one of the few keys of the Gopher attack. Gernander scored almost identical power play goals 45 seconds apart in the third period Friday narrowing UM-Duluth's lead to 8-6. But the Bulldog's **Dennis Vaske** got the final goal of the game minutes later to seal his team's victory.

Gernander came back to score one of UM's two goals Saturday. This one also came on the power play, but was too little too late. His score was at 18:44 of the third period Saturday.

Sophomore defenseman **Tom Pederson** was another Gopher player who stood out on the weekend. Pederson scored Minnesota's only other goal Saturday while firing a team high eight shots on goal.

On Friday, senior center **Scott Bloom** matched the two-goal output of Gernander, while senior **Peter Hankinson** and sophomore **Cory Laylin** got the other UM goals.

### WOOG ON THE GOPHERS

"We expect to see pretty much the same players skating at North Dakota that played for us last weekend," head coach **Doug Woog** said Monday. "I do know one thing for certain, however, that in order to win in this league we have to impress upon our players that they take care of their defensive responsibilities.

"It has been our aim at Minnesota to not allow our opponents more than three goals. We didn't meet that last weekend.

"With as much youth as we have at the blueline, we simply have to help them out more both offensively as well as defensively. I believe our players did better in that area Saturday, but we were sorely lacking here Friday.

"As for our goalies, right now we expect to see both sophomore **Jeff Stolp** and freshman **Tom Newman** rotate again this weekend. We just don't know at this time who will play which night."

North Dakota lost its opening league encounters at Northern Michigan last weekend. The Sioux dropped the games by scores of 5-4 and 3-2.

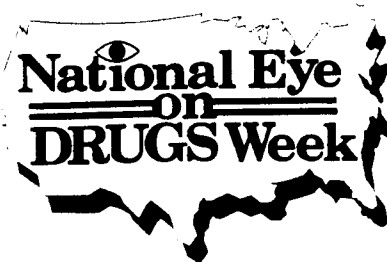

## **Football Coaches Support Fight Against Drugs**

The football coaching profession this fall will dramatize its concern for America's problem with drug and alcohol abuse during "National Eye on Drugs Week" October 21-29, 1989.

During that period, hundreds of college coaches and their players will step on the playing field and delay the beginning of football games for one minute to emphasize their support of the nation's fight against drugs.

Each participating head coach, in a recorded announcement to be played over the stadium's public address system, will encourage parents to become involved in the fight against drugs and to protect their children by learning to identify signs of early drug use.

The Board of Trustees of the American Football Coaches Association has endorsed the "National Eye on Drugs Week" and the trustees are hopeful that AFCA members will participate in the project.

The "National Eye on Drugs Week" coincides with another project of national scope: The "National Red Ribbon Campaign" sponsored by the National Federation of Parents. President George Bush serves as the honorary chairman of the campaign. All Americans are being asked to wear a red ribbon to signify their commitment to a drug-free America.

Football coaches will be wearing a red ribbon at their designated game to symbolize their support of the campaign and the fight against drugs.

Larry Smith, head football coach at the University of Southern California, came up with the idea of designating a specific period of time during the football season which would allow coaches to effectively emphasize the anti-drug and alcohol message.

"Because the drug problem in America is at epidemic proportions, we coaches must do everything we can to help Americans deal with this problem," Smith says. "If we don't turn this problem around very quickly, what kind of country will we give to our children?"

According to figures provided by drug consultant Dave Hannah of Athletes for A Strong America, the nation has millions of chemically addicted citizens. Last year, Americans consumed more than \$100 billion worth of illegal drugs, making it the No. 1 industry in America. More than 500,000 teenagers attempted suicide and most were drug related.

More than 65 percent of our crime can be traced to drugs, according to experts. The primary spread of AIDS in America is through I.V. drug users. One of the primary reasons of divorce, child abuse and battered women is drug and alcohol abuse.

"One reason for the growing plague in America is that drug use is so difficult to detect," says Hannah, who is coordinating the project. "And with drugs like crack, a person can get hooked in a matter of days. The responsibility must start in the home." Hannah continues, "Parents must be committed to spending time with their children. They must talk about drugs and alcohol and the impact on their lives. It is critical that parents know how to identify drug use in the earliest stages so they can get help for their children before their body chemistry is permanently altered. Mood altering drugs will show up in behavioral changes and the eyes."

The signs of drug use will be outlined in editorial copy which will be printed in football game programs during "National Eye on Drugs Week."

"We want every parent in America to understand how to identify drug and alcohol abuse so they can help their children stay drug free or get them help immediately," says Larry Smith.

Swimming - 14th

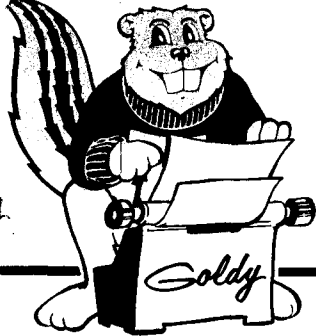
Tennis - 25th

## **CUMMINGS, HERBEL & STAATS HONORED ON DISTRICT 5 ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM**

Seniors Pat Cummings and Brent Herbel, along with sophomore Joel Staats, have been named to the CoSIDA GTE District 5 All-Academic Football Team.

Cummings, Herbel and Staats will now move on to the national ballot. The CoSIDA GTE Academic All-America Team will be announced on December 14.

The starting fullback for the Golden Gophers during the '89 season, Cummings, Madison, WI, served as mainly a blocking back for fellow senior Darrell Thompson, who finished his career as the school's all-time rushing leader. He carried the ball eight times for 26 yards and also caught eight passes for 71 yards, en route to collecting his third letter. Off the field, he has registered an outstanding 3.34 cumulative GPA in the University of Minnesota's prestigious Carlson School of Management and is a Williams Scholar.

From Grafton, ND, Herbel was the Golden Gophers' regular punter for the past four seasons. He punted a school record 212 times for 8,204 yards, for a fine average of 38.7 during his career. A second-team All-Big Ten choice last season, he is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and was honored on the District 5 All-Academic team a year ago. A biology/pre-med major with a 3.26 GPA, the Williams Scholar also was a Honda-Scholar Athlete Award winner and is a candidate for an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.

When Jon Leverenz went down with a serious knee injury in the '88 season opener, Staats, from Winona, MN, stepped to the forefront at linebacker and played brilliantly. He finished third on the team with 81 tackles, including 49 solo's. He continued to shine during the '89 campaign, finishing third on the team with 71 tackles, including two interceptions, to help lead the Golden Gopher defensive unit. In the classroom, he has charted a sparkling 4.00 GPA and expects to be admitted to the Carlson School of Management in the fall of 1990.

"We are very proud of them," said Brian Berube, academic counselor for the Golden Gopher football squad. "They are fine young men who could be emulated for the prowess they have displayed both on the football field and in the classroom."

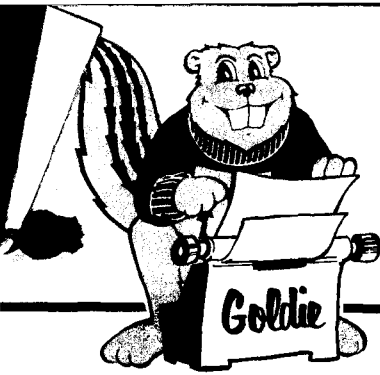
## **GOLDEN GOPHER SWIMMING & DIVING TEAMS HONORED FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

Arriel McDonald, a 6-2, 170-pound point guard who will play his senior year of high school basketball at Athens Drive in Raleigh, NC, has signed a national letter of intent with the University of Minnesota.

McDonald, before moving to Raleigh, was a standout at Homewood-Flossmoor High School in Flossmoor, IL. As a junior there, McDonald averaged 17.1 points, 6.0 assists and 3.0 steals for a game.

He shot 60% from the field and 77% from the free throw line enroute to all-conference, All-Chicago Area, Nike All-Star and Five Star honor teams. He also was named his team's most valuable player.

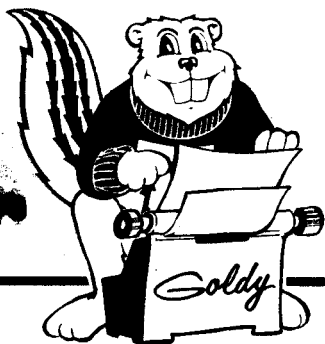
Rated among the top 70 prep players in the nation this year, McDonald was described by a national scouting service as "A shooting point guard who can score from the three-point range. He plays smart and knows his job."

Coach Clem Haskins of the Golden Gophers regards him as a fine point-guard prospect. "Arriel is the type of player who can contribute greatly to the continued building of our program," Haskins said. "He can score, and he has excellent quickness and speed. We regard him as a jewel of a young man."

"We have good basketball in this area, and we felt going into the season that we'd be contenders for the state championship. He brings excitement to the game, and the fans in Minnesota will love him."

McDonald was the only prep cager to sign with the Golden Gophers during the early signing period as outlined by the NCAA. Coach Haskins has indicated, however, that Minnesota still hopes to sign at least two more players next spring.

## FOOTBALL SEASON TICKET SALE OPENS

The 1989 Golden Gopher Football season ticket sale will open Monday, April 24, and current season ticket holders will have until Friday, May 19, to renew their priorities.

Prices are unchanged from 1988, so the six-game package will be sold for \$96.00. Season ticket holders will realize a saving on the Nebraska game, since tickets for that game will be sold for \$20.00 on a single game basis. Tickets for other games will be \$16.00 each.

The Economy Plan season ticket option also remains available at \$66.00. Seating for Economy Plan patrons is currently section 100, but the area is expandable if demand warrants it.

According to Ticket Manager Ken Buell, the sale opening is about three weeks later than usual. "The successes of the hockey and basketball teams meant a lot of post season action for both, and since we were already heavily involved with the WCHA and NCAA hockey tournaments, it seemed appropriate to let things settle a bit before starting the football sale. It was a nice problem to have, and we appreciate everyone's patience while we get caught up."

On July 1, the season ticket phase of the sale ends and the single game ticket sale begins. "We have a great home game schedule - the kind we like to sell," said Buell, "It's not very often that we can offer the likes of Nebraska, Ohio State, and Michigan in one season. We're also exploring the possibility of creating a couple of single game packages, and we will have more information available when that sale opens."

There will be some restrictions on the sale of tickets for the Nebraska game and for the Iowa game in Iowa City. During the month of July, sales for both games will be restricted to Minnesota residents and limited to four tickets per customer. If tickets still are available for Nebraska on August 1, all restrictions for that game will be lifted. Sales for the Iowa game, however, will remain limited until the entire allotment is sold.

The purpose of the restriction is to protect the interests of Golden Gopher fans and to make sure that as many fans as possible have a chance to order tickets for these very popular games.

Buell is optimistic about the coming season. "We hope the success and the spirit of the past winter will carry right into the fall. We're looking forward to a great season, both on the field and at the gate."

## GOLDEN GOPHERS TO GO ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Like the popular musical recording Star, Willie Nelson, Coach John Gutekunst and his Golden Gopher football team are "On The Road Again" this week when invading Indiana for a Big Ten Conference assignment Saturday at 1 p.m. (EDT).

Minnesota made its first conference road trip of the 1989 campaign a successful one last weekend when posting a 20-18 victory at Northwestern in a game that was topsy-turvy from start to finish and not decided until the final seconds.

That win, Minnesota's first Big Ten road victory since October 10th of 1987 when it also triumphed at Northwestern (45-33), enabled the Golden Gophers to up their overall season record to 4-1 and to remain perfect in league play at 2-0.

And that unblemished record enables Gutekunst's contingent, which finished last in the Big Ten a year ago, to head for Indiana on Saturday perched on top of the current standings in a tie for the lead with Illinois and Michigan.

Not many Big Ten fans figure Minnesota will stay in that lofty spot very long, and not many

figure the Golden Gophers have much of a chance Saturday down in Bloomington where they face the 3-2 and 1-1 Hoosiers. But Gutekunst hasn't thrown in the towel, and he has plenty of faith in his club, especially after the way they passed their most recent gut check this past weekend at Northwestern.

"It would have been very easy to fold up in that one," Gutekunst admitted. "But knowing they were playing without Darrell Thompson and Jon Leverenz, and knowing more went to the sidelines with injuries during the game, they hung in there. And they came back. They made the play when they had to, and I'm very proud of them."

So what is the situation this week? The bruises and hurts suffered by such people as tailback Marcus Evans and quarterback Scott Schaffner who missed "some" playing time at Northwestern are not expected to keep anyone out of the lineup at Indiana.

However, the depth chart still does not show either Thompson or Leverenz. In fact Leverenz still is in that "doubtful" category and is not expected to be

ready to face the Hoosiers. Thompson apparently is making better progress and is "probable."

Regardless of who is physically able or not able to play, the task of winning at Indiana is a difficult one. The most-recent Golden Gopher victory in Bloomington was in 1985 when Minnesota triumphed 22-7.

In all, there have been 50 games played in the series between these two schools, and although Minnesota will take an edge of 30-17-3 into Saturday's game, Indiana has won the last two meetings (33-13 at Indiana a year ago), and Minnesota is only 3-10-2 in Bloomington.

Gutekunst and his Golden Gophers know the challenge they face. "As always, Indiana has excellent skill players," he says. "Anthony Thompson at running back and Dave Schnell at quarterback are really great players. Everyone knew coming into the season that they had a lot of defensive people to replace, and it now is obvious they have done that very well. We must play better at Indiana than we did at Northwestern if we hope to win."

## STAATS GAINS HONDA-SCHOLAR ATHLETE AWARD

Joel Staats, sophomore linebacker from Winona, MN, has been selected as the ABC-TV and Honda Scholar-Athlete of the week, and he will be featured on television at halftime of this week's Big Ten Conference game between Michigan and Iowa at Iowa.

## CAGERS OPEN PRE-SEASON DRILLS

Coach Clem Haskins whistled the start of practice for the University of Minnesota basketball team this week in preparation for the 1989-90 season opener against the Brazil National team at Williams Arena on Saturday, November 18.

Now in his fourth year as coach of the Golden Gophers, Haskins enters the year on a note of "guarded optimism" after his club posted a 19-12 record a year ago and gained the NCAA post-season tournament's Sweet Sixteen.

Nine lettermen return from that squad, and Haskins will start building his current edition from that solid foundation. Minnesota also has a redshirt in camp, a non-lettering holdover and three new freshmen. Haskins hopes it will be enough.

All-America candidate Willie Burton heads the list of returnees. He scored 557 points a year ago and goes into his final campaign with 1,184 and ranked 13th on the U of M's all-time scoring list.

But Burton has lots of company. Up front there's Richard Coffey, Jim Shikenjanski, Walter Bond, Rob Metcalf and Bob Martin. In the back court are Melvin Newbern, Kevin Lynch, Mario Green, Connell Lewis and Robert Graves.

Those are the familiar faces. Haskins now throws in newcomers Arriel McDonald, Nate Tubbs and Ernest Nzigamasabo, and he hopes those yearlings are able to contribute early.

Haskins will run his charges through strenuous workouts early.....sometimes twice a day. And he'll take them off campus for a couple of intra-squad scrimmages. It's all part of getting ready for that rapidly-approaching season opener.

After the exhibition clash with the Brazil contingent, Minnesota will tip off regulation play at Cincinnati on November 25. Then the Golden Gophers host Chicago State in the "official" home opener on Tuesday, November 28.

In all Minnesota will make 16 appearances in Williams Arena this year including nine starts against opponents from the Big Ten Conference.

## ICERS OPEN SEASON VS. UM-D FRI-SAT AT MARIUCCI

Minneapolis, MN---For the fifth consecutive year, head coach Doug Woog will be behind the bench as his U. of Minnesota hockey Gophers open their 1989-90 season with home games Friday and Saturday against the Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs.

Minnesota, two-time defending Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) champions, will attempt this season to do what no WCHA team has ever accomplished.....win a third consecutive crown. With seven regulars gone from last year's team which posted a 27-6-2 league mark and was 34-11-3 overall, it's probably asking too much to expect this year's team to repeat.

Missing from last year are three senior defensemen, and four juniors (a goalie, a defenseman and the team's two top scoring forwards). These seven made up the heart of the last four UM teams which reached the NCAA championship tournament each year. Last spring provided the biggest heartbreaker, however, when the Gophers lost 4-3 in overtime to Harvard in the national title game at the Saint Paul Civic Center.

Woog's first four teams have provided him with the most wins in the nation by any NCAA Division I school, 137. His record to date stands at 137-48-4, a winning percentage of .735. The wins have brought Minnesota, as mentioned, two WCHA titles, plus two second place finishes, and four consecutive trips to the NCAA championship tournament.

"What's happened in the past is nice. But that's just it.....it's in the past and means nothing when looking at the coming season," coach Woog offered today. "I hope all our players and staff members can gain mostly from the hockey traditions established by our school down through several decades. In that sense what happened in the past begins to really mean something."

What happens this weekend could give both Woog, his team and Gopher hockey fans a pretty good indication of what they can expect this year. Playing Minnesota-Duluth is always a monumental task for Gopher teams. It became even more so last weekend when the Bulldogs took sole possession of first place in the WCHA by startling Denver with a home sweep, 4-3 and 5-2.

Last season is a prime example of what this series means to UM-Duluth. Even though the 1988-89 Gopher team won the league championship by a record 14 points, the best they could do against the Bulldogs was gain a split of four games.

## BIG CROWDS EXPECTED

Big crowds, according to ticket director Ken Buell, are expected both nights at Mariucci Arena. Buell said Monday that about 500 tickets, including general admission and partially obstructed reserve seats, remained for the Friday and Saturday 7 p.m. faceoffs.

## GOPHERS ON THE RADIO, TV

Minnesota hockey will again be carried by three major Twins Cities outlets. WAYL-980 AM radio will broadcast all but two regular season games this season. Several Saturday games, however, will be broadcast on a delayed status because of station conflicts. Doug McLeod, considered the "Voice of Gopher Hockey," and former Gopher All-American Tom Vannelli will again be the broadcast team.

Veteran TV sportscaster Robb Leer takes over the play-by-play chores for KSTP-1500 AM radio this season. He will be joined for 14 home game broadcasts by Doug Johnson, publisher of Let's Play Hockey.

Another veteran team returns to KITN-TV, Channel 29, when Frank Mazzocco and Wally Shaver begin their first telecasts of the season Friday and Saturday. KITN will televise 15 regular season games, 11 of them from Mariucci Arena.

will be seen later in the season. "With so many new players being moved into our lineup, the early season games could see a lot of movement among the front lines and defensive pairings," Woog said Monday.

One area is pretty well settled with two players vieing for duty. That is in goal where sophomore Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk, Greenway) and freshman Tom Newman (Blaine) will probably both play this weekend. They have already shared most of the pre-season action and provided the Gophers with generally consistant play. A decision as to which one will open the season Friday will not be made until later this week.

On defense, assistant coach Bill Butters said Monday he has seven quality players who will probably see most of the action. This area has to be considered a critical spot for Minnesota as four seasoned veterans are gone from the Blueline corps either via graduation or pro signing.

Heading up the very young crew on defense is senior co-captain Lance Pitlick (New Hope, Cooper), junior Luke Johnson (Brooklyn Park, Osseo), and sophomore Tom Pederson (Bloomington, Jefferson). Pitlick is off three years of regular duty while Pederson earned his spurs last winter finishing 1988-89 as one of UM's standouts. Johnson saw more duty last season than his first two years.

Players who are literally cutting their college hockey teeth on defense this weekend will be redshirt sophomore Sean Fabian (St. Paul, Hill-Murray), and freshmen Travis Richards (Crystal, Armstrong), also a redshirt, Eric Means and Doug Zmolek (both from Rochester, John Marshall).

Means and Zmolek are coming off leg hurts which have slowed their progress in camp. Richards is the younger brother of Todd Richards who led UM at the blueline the past four years.

Up front finds two lines that could be together, if all goes well, far into the season. One unit includes junior Jason Miller (Bloomington, Kennedy) centering sophomore Cory Laylin (St. Cloud Apollo) and junior Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids). An all-senior line features Dean Williamson (Edina) between Brett Stot (Brooklyn Park, Osseo) and co-captain Peter Hankinson (Edina).

A third line this weekend could feature senior Jon Anderson (White Bear Lake) centering sophomore Larry Olimb (Warroad) and Ken Gernander (Coleraine, Greenway). A fourth line is expected to be split among senior Sott Bloom (Burnsville) and freshman Trent Klatt (Osseo) at center, with juniors Jake Enebak (Northfield), Ben Hankinson (Edina), Lance Werness (Burnsville) and Nick Gerebi (Roseville, Hill-Murray) expecting to split up the wing positions.

Like the man once said, however, nothing is certain. The 1989-90 Gopher lineup could seen more changes during the season than one usually expects. Injuries, illness and departures by freshmen to play on U.S. National teams could play major roles in Gopher fortunes this season.

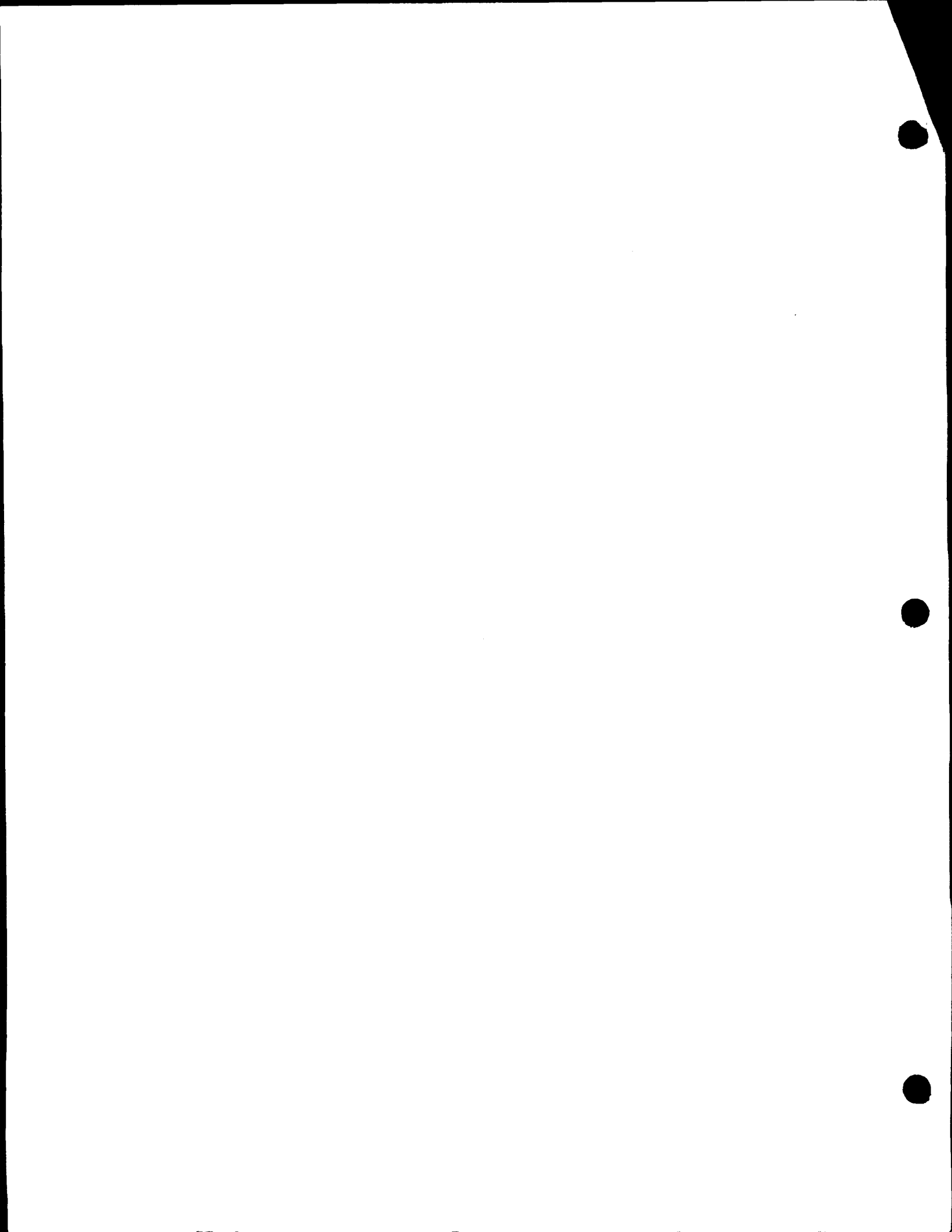

"We're taking a veteran team this weekend," Harvey said. "Based on what some of these guys did over the summer, I'd like to think that we can finish in the top three or four teams down there."

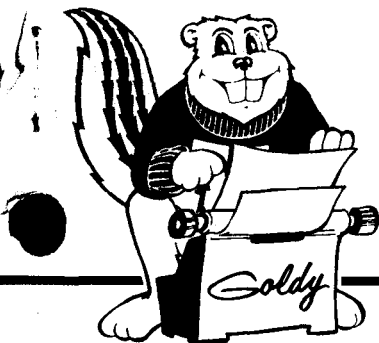

Minnesota and Nebraska first met in 1900 when the Gophers prevailed in a game at Lincoln, 20-12. Overall, the schools have faced off 49 times on the gridiron with Minnesota owning a 29-18 margin in the win column. There have been two series ties. In fact, the last time Minnesota came out on top against one of Nebraska's nationally ranked powers was back in 1960 when UM prevailed 26-14 in Lincoln. Beginning in 1963, Nebraska has reeled off 12 consecutive series victories. Thus, prior to the fall of '63, Minnesota led this series 29-6-2. UM's longest series win streak reached 10 games from 1940 through 1949. Included in that span were lopsided UM wins of 54-0, 39-0 and 61-7 during the WWII years of 1943-44-45.

## GOLDEN GOPHERS TO HOST CORNHUSKERS SATURDAY

Minnesota's Golden Gophers will shoot for their second straight triumph on Saturday when they play host to the Cornhuskers of Nebraska at 7:00 p.m. in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in Minneapolis.

Invading Nebraska, ranked fourth in the nation, will put a 2-0 mark on the line in Saturday's non-conference assignment after polishing off Utah by a 42-30 margin last weekend.

The Golden Gophers, meanwhile, were winning their opener 30-20 at Iowa State this past weekend. "We tried to make it difficult, Coach John Gutekunst admitted, "but it's a win."

And the fourth-year head man relished that fact.....if only for a moment.....before turning his thoughts to this week's opponent and the challenge that Saturday's game presents.

"We know that this year's Nebraska team is another great one," Gutekunst said. "They are among the nation's top-ranked teams, but they always are. They simply are a traditional college football power with outstanding athletes and players. This year is no exception."

Gutekunst was Minnesota's defensive coordinator when the Golden Gophers suffered a 38-7 loss at Nebraska in 1984. That was the last time that these two teams met.

The Cornhuskers have, in fact, posted 12 consecutive victories over the University of Minnesota. The last triumph for the Golden Gophers was a 26-14 verdict in 1960.....and that was the last year that Minnesota won a national championship. Overall there have been 49 meetings between the two teams and, despite Nebraska's current streak, the Golden Gophers lead 29-18-2.

All of which means that Saturday night's clash in the Metrodome will have a lot on the line. Minnesota will be aiming to knock off a nationally ranked team. It will be trying to snap a 12-game series losing streak and in the process it will be hoping to keep its own 1989 record unblemished.

To do so, Minnesota will need to show a great deal of improvement over last week. "We're delighted to win our opener, and on the road," Gutekunst said, "but we obviously did not play a perfect game. There were a lot of negatives."

In that category, Gutekunst pointed to the 13 penalties whistled on his Golden Gophers as an area where Minnesota must improve this week. He also was displeased with the Golden Gopher kicking game, and he listed such items as poor kick coverage, a blocked punt and a missed extra point as deficiencies that must be overcome.

On the plus side would have to be the 106-yard game turned in by All-America tailback and Heisman Trophy candidate Darrell Thompson. It was the 16th time in his U of M career that Thompson has gone over 100 yards. He also scored twice which means he has tied the U of M touchdown record of 35 set by Marion Barber (1977-1980) and needs one more rushing TD to equal Barber's U of M record of 33.

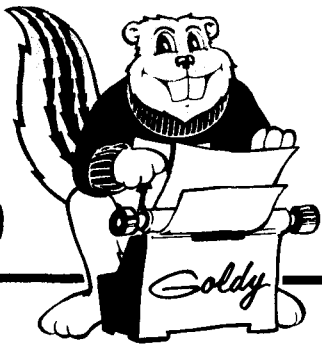

## GOLDEN GOPHERS HOPE TO REBOUND AGAINST INDIANA STATE

Minnesota's Golden Gopher football team hopes to rebound Saturday when it plays host to Indiana State at 7:00 p.m. in a non-conference assignment at the Hubert. H. Humphrey Metrodome.

Coach John Gutekunst's charges, after opening the 1989 campaign with a 30-20 win at Iowa State, fell 48-0 to Nebraska, another Big Eight Conference member, at home in the Dome this past weekend.

Thus the Golden Gophers will take a 1-1 overall record into Saturday's first meeting ever with Indiana State. The invading Sycamores, members of the Gateway Conference, bring a 2-2 mark into that confrontation.

Minnesota was totally outmanned in its most recent confrontation and hopes it can correct things this time out of the blocks. "To say that I was disappointed in our performance against Nebraska would be somewhat of an understatement," Gutekunst proclaimed. "Between our difficulties on offense and with our kicking game, we just did not give ourselves a chance to see if we could play with Nebraska."

But now the Golden Gophers must turn that poor performance around and get back on the winning track against the invading Sycamores. "We simply self destructed last week," Gutekunst said. "We've got to eliminate those mistakes against Indiana State."

In the category of mistakes, Minnesota was charged with 12 infractions against Nebraska. It also had 13 in the opener at Iowa State. That's 25 penalties in two games, a number which Gutekunst knows the Golden Gophers must reduce dramatically if they hope to have a winning season.

On top of that, Minnesota did not have a turnover in the opener and was plus five in that department. It threw three interceptions against Nebraska and had only one Cornhusker fumble recovery to its credit for a minus two rating.

Chances of the Golden Gophers rebounding Saturday night might depend upon how much improvement the offensive line makes in one week, or how much Minnesota is able to improve its kicking game.....the latter an area which has not pleased Gutekunst in either of its first two outings.

Although no dramatic changes are expected in Minnesota's starting lineup for the Sycamore contest, a couple of changes might take place with the second unit.....offensively at tailback where Al Settembrino suffered a sprained knee and is out indefinitely and defensively at tackle where Arthur Layton hurt his shoulder.

Darrell Thompson, Minnesota's All-America tailback, still needs one more touchdown rushing to match the school record of 33 held by Marion Barber (1977-80). Thompson already has deadlocked Barber's total standard of 35 TD's, and one more also will break that mark.

Jon Leverenz, who missed all of last season after injuring a knee against Washington State in the '88 opener, has returned to a familiar position on top of Minnesota's defensive statistics. Leverenz has 13 tackles in the opener and added 13 more against the Cornhuskers.....so he'll go into Saturday's game against Indiana State with a team high 26, and two of them have ben for minus yardage.

## **GOLDEN GOPHER TENNIS TEAM TO OPEN SEASON AT NOTRE DAME INVITATIONAL THIS WEEKEND**

The defending Big Ten Conference champion Golden Gopher tennis team will make their 1989-90 season debut this weekend at the Notre Dame Invitational. The competition in South Bend, IN will run Friday thru Sunday. A look at the Golden Gophers follows:

### **1989-90 Outlook - "Looking To Repeat"**

Providing an encore to last year's magical season that climaxed with the Big Ten Championship and a post-season NCAA Tournament berth will be a difficult task indeed for the Golden Gophers this season.

But with six returning letterwinners being joined by a talented cast of newcomers, Head Coach David Geatz's squad would appear to have more than enough ammunition to make a serious run at the league crown once again this season.

Much of the starting lineup returns intact for the Golden Gophers. The most notable subtractions are Duke Uihlein, who played at the top singles slot for the Gophers last season in addition to forming one of the country's most potent doubles combinations with brother Brian Uihlein (Lake Forest, IL), who will be a sophomore this season, and Mathias Olsson, who finished his career in Gold Country with 100 wins in singles play and was an outstanding doubles player as well.

Senior Rafer Leach (Lexington, KY) held down the No. 2 singles slot for most of last season and would appear to be the logical choice to move up to the No. 1 position. He recorded an overall mark of 28-25, including a stunning three-set victory over Michigan's Dan Goldberg, ranked No. 3 in the country at the time, to propel the Gophers to the league crown. He is also an outstanding doubles performer.

After battling injury problems throughout last season, senior David Massart (Milwaukee, WI) came back in time for the Big Ten Tournament to play No. 3 singles and record a clutch win in the Gophers 5-3 quarterfinal victory over Iowa. In addition to appearing regularly in the national doubles rankings with his brother Duke, Brian Uihlein registered an overall 28-19 record in singles action as a rookie, playing mainly at the No. 3 or No. 4 position.

A team void of any individual stars, the Golden Gophers thrived all season long a year ago with their great team balance. In dual meet action, the team registered an impressive 61-25 record (.709 winning percentage) at the No. 4, 5 and 6 singles slots combined, including an 8-1 record at the Big Ten Tournament alone. Junior Kevin Werwie (Sheboygan, WI), playing mainly at the No. 4 or 5 spot, and senior Jason Hall (Prior Lake, MN), at No. 5 or 6, both went 3-0 at the Big Ten Tournament to key the squad's title run. Werwie finished with a 30-13 season record, while Hall ended up 24-15. Sophomore Philippe LeBlanc (St. Bruno, Quebec, Canada) solidified the lineup, going 13-4 in singles action, and playing a huge role at the No. 3 doubles slot at the league tourney.

Roger Anderson (New Hope, MN), who won two Minnesota state high school doubles and a singles championship during a brilliant career at Blue Earth High School, was redshirted a year ago and will look to crack the lineup this season. Junior Anthony Cruz (Medinah, IL), who was forced to the sidelines a year ago with a shoulder injury, will also be a big factor for the Golden Gophers in 1989-90. He has a 45-37 overall career

singles record after two seasons at the U of M. Transfer Dean Hluschko (Minneapolis, MN), a sophomore, will also look to make his mark this season.

A highly-regarded freshman class comes to Gold Country loaded with impressive credentials and will look to make an impact immediately. Grant Julian (Voorhees, NJ), Rick Naumoff (Columbus, OH), Andy Paley (Milwaukee, WI), Dominic Rodriquez (Albuquerque, NM) and Jamie Schramm (Mountainside, NJ) all have the potential to crack the Golden Gopher lineup.

Judging by the talent that Geatz has in the fold, the battle for spots in the lineup should be an interesting one indeed. That bodes well for the team's fortunes as they begin defense of the Big Ten crown that they have every intention of keeping in Gold Country.

**DAVID GEATZ**  
**University of Minnesota**  
**Head Men's Tennis Coach**

Winning the Big Ten Conference title last spring in his first season at the helm of the Golden Gophers was especially sweet for David Geatz. In his six seasons (1982-88) as head coach at the University of New Mexico, the Lobos finished in the runner-up slot of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) four times.

Recognized as one of the finest young coaches on the collegiate tennis scene, Geatz brought the New Mexico program into national prominence during his tenure there, when the Lobos made several appearances in the national polls. In 1983, he was honored as the WAC Coach-of-the-Year and in 1985, was named the NCAA Southwest Region Coach-of-the-Year. While at New Mexico, he was also one of only five coaches in the country to be a member of the NCAA Tennis Rules Committee.

A native of Grand Forks, ND, Geatz was one of the finest players in the history of tennis in North Dakota. A three-time North Dakota High School state singles champion, he finished his prep career with a sparkling 103-0 record. Honored as the North Dakota High School Athlete-of-the-Year as a junior, he also claimed three straight state open singles titles as well.

As a freshman at New Mexico State University, Geatz was a runner-up in the Missouri Valley Conference in doubles, and the league's singles champion the following year. He then transferred to the University of New Mexico, where he was a two-time qualifier for the NCAA Championships in singles. He also claimed the WAC title in doubles as a junior. He continued to play competitively in Europe as a professional, reaching the finals 10 times and winning eight tournaments in all.

A 1980 graduate of the University of New Mexico with a Bachelor of University Studies degree, Geatz served as an assistant coach at his alma mater in 1979 and 1980. He then worked as tennis director and head tennis pro at Sierra Vista West Tennis & Swim Club in Albuquerque, NM, before taking over the reins of the Lobos program in 1982.

In 1985, Geatz received his Master's Degree in Sports Administration from New Mexico and he is presently nearing completion of his dissertation in New Mexico's Doctorate Program in Sports Administration.

## GOLDEN GOPHERS TO HOST PURDUE IN HOMECOMING GAME

Minnesota will play host to Purdue University at 1:30 p.m. in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome on Saturday in the Golden Gopher's Big Ten Conference opener and 1989 Homecoming football game.

It will be the first of four afternoon assignments in the Metrodome for the U of M this season, and it marks the first time since 1982 that the Golden Gophers have played anything but evening games at home.

Coach John Gutekunst's contingent will take its non-conference and overall record of 2-1 into Saturday's shootout after whipping Indiana State 34-14 at home last weekend. Earlier the Golden Gophers had beaten Iowa State 30-20 but lost to Nebraska 48-0.

Invading Purdue, meanwhile, fell 40-7 last weekend at home to cross-state rival Notre Dame. In the process, Coach Fred Akers saw his club's record dip to 1-2. The Boilermakers won their opener 27-10 over Miami of Ohio but then fell 38-9 at Washington two weeks ago.

A year ago Purdue downed Minnesota 14-10 in West Lafayette. In all, 47 games have been played in a series dating back to 1894, and the Golden Gophers will take a 25-19-3 edge into Saturday's assignment.

As far as Coach Gutekunst is concerned, and he reminded his players of the fact, the Big Ten season is what it is all about. "The exhibition season is over," he proclaimed. "We are 2-1, and now we start our conference season."

He knows that it will take a better effort on the part of his Golden Gophers if they hope to win Saturday or finish as winners in the Big Ten Conference race in 1989. He knows Minnesota will have to play better.

"We aren't happy with some phases of our game," he admitted, "especially on defense. We were very disappointed in some of our defensive coverage against Indiana State, and we will have to improve that part of our game if we are going to be the kind of defense team we need to be in order to succeed in the Big Ten."

Gutekunst was especially concerned about his defense giving up the long-gainer, the big play. And he continued to express concern over untimely penalties that proved costly and the turnovers (3 interceptions).

On the credit side of the ledger, Minnesota's fourth-year coach was happy about the fact that the Golden Gophers were able to hammer out 345 yards on the ground on 62 rushing attempts WITHOUT a fumble.

Gutekunst had special praise for his All-America tailback, senior Darrell Thompson, who had an All-America kind of night. Thompson carried 37 times for 231 yards (there were NO losses charged to Thompson!), both career highs.

In addition, Thompson registered three touchdowns rushing. Those scores gave him 38 total career touchdowns and 35 rushing touchdowns.....both U of M records. The old standards had been set by Marion Barber (1977-1980).

It was the fifth time in Thompson's four-year career at Minnesota that he had scored three or more times in one game. It also was the third time he had gone over the 200-yard mark, and it was the 17th time he had gone over the 100-yard standard.

But that was last week, and in non-conference play. Now, as Gutekunst has stressed. It's Purdue, and it's the Big Ten. And Saturday.....in the afternoon....it will be Homecoming for the Golden Gophers.

In Homecoming games of record at Minnesota, the Golden Gophers are 42-24-4 over the years. Last fall Minnesota had to settle for a 28-28 tie with Northwestern in the Homecoming game. The Golden Gophers and the Boilermakers have played four Homecoming games at Minnesota, and the record is even at 2-2.

The last time Minnesota and Purdue met in a Homecoming game in Minneapolis the Boilermakers scored a stunning 13-7 upset win at Memorial Stadium. The year? It was 1949, and that UM squad is holding its 40th year reunion in the Twin Cities this weekend.

## **OUTSTANDING FIELD SET FOR SATURDAY'S MINNESOTA CROSS COUNTRY INVITATIONAL**

A star-studded field headlined by Iowa State, ranked No. 1 on the pre-season Track & Field Coaches Association national poll, will compete in Saturday's Minnesota Cross Country Invitational at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course.

The 8000 meter race is scheduled to get underway at 11:00 a.m., with the women's 5000 meter Division I race (Division II & III at 10:30 a.m.) to follow at 11:45 a.m.

**Teams:** In addition to Iowa State and the host Golden Gophers, No. 9 Penn State, Texas A & M, Colorado State, Drake, North Dakota, North Dakota State, Midland Lutheran (NE), South Dakota, South Dakota State, St. Cloud State and UM-Duluth are scheduled to compete.

**Last Year:** Wisconsin, led by the 1-2 finish of Chris Borsa (24:41) and Scott Fry (24:47), claimed the team title at the '88 Minnesota Invitational with an outstanding score of 22 points. Penn State finished second with 103 points, followed by Iowa State (126), Kansas (147), Virginia Tech (159), Minnesota (166), UW-Oshkosh (177), South Dakota State (239), Colorado State (271), UW-Eau Claire (295), Augustana (319), UW-LaCrosse (332), North Dakota State (399), St. Cloud State (407), North Dakota (476), Midland Lutheran (535) and UW-Stout (614).

**Meet & Course Records:** Nebraska's Jean Verster set the meet record of 24:35 in '86, while Tim Hacker from Wisconsin holds the course record of 24:05.3 set at the '81 Big Ten Conference Championships.

**Cyclones & Nittany Lions Expected To Battle It Out:** If Saturday's race holds true to form, No. 1 Iowa State and No. 9 Penn State should wage a good fight for the team crown. The Cyclones return eight letterman, including three All-Americans, from the '88 team that captured the Big Eight Championship and finished sixth at the NCAA Championships. Senior Darrell Smith, the '88 Big Eight runner-up, placed 22nd at last year's national meet, senior John Nuttall, fourth in the Big Eight a year ago, was the runner-up in the 5000 meters at the '89 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships, and junior Roland Pauwels, sixth at the league meet last fall, earned All-American status in the mile at the '89 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. The Cyclones have won a total of six Big Eight cross country titles this decade.

**Golden Gophers:** Head Coach Roy Griak's young Golden Gophers have shown an abundance of potential thus far this fall, improving with each and every race. Without a doubt, Saturday's competition will present them with their biggest test of the season to date.

She leads a talented Wildcat squad that is No. 1 in the women's pre-season national poll.

## **LEBLANC WINS NOTRE DAME FALL CLASSIC TENNIS TITLE**

Sophomore Philippe LeBlanc (St. Bruno, Quebec, Canada) captured the "B" singles title at the Notre Dame Fall Classic held Friday thru Sunday as the defending Big Ten Conference champion Golden Gopher tennis team opened their 1989-90 season.

After dropping the first set in Sunday's final against Ron Rosas of Notre Dame, LeBlanc stormed back to take a 3-6, 7-5, 6-3 three-set victory. He won five matches en route to the title. As a rookie a year ago, he charted an overall singles record of 13-4.

Senior Jason Hall (Prior Lake, MN) and freshman Rick Naumoff (Columbus, OH) advanced to the semifinals of the "B" doubles bracket, before falling 4-6, 6-4, 6-4 to John Tolmie and Jon Cardie from Harvard.

**ICERS OPEN SAT. @ EVELETH. PLAY INTRASQUAD THURS.**

Minneapolis, MN---Minnesota's two-time defending WCHA champion hockey team opens its 1989-90 season in the Hall of Fame Game Saturday at Eveleth.

The Gophers meet North Michigan in an exhibition game Saturday. Last season Northern finished runner-up to Minnesota in the regular season standings, before going on to win the WCHA playoff title at the Saint Paul Civic Center.

Minnesota not only goes into this season minus seven regulars who were instrumental the last four years in leading Gopher teams to the most victories (137) of any NCAA Division I school, but additional players are also out of Saturday's contest.

Missing from head coach Doug Woog's fifth Gopher edition are senior defensemen Todd Richards, David Espe and Brett Nelson. Also departed are four underclassmen who opted for professional contracts. The latter group consists of goalie Robb Stauber (Los Angeles), defenseman Randy Skarda (St. Louis), plus forwards David Snuggerud (Buffalo) and Tom Chorske (Montreal).

Four expected regulars this season are also temporarily out of action, including senior co-captains Peter Hankinson and Lance Pitlick (bruised legs), junior center Jason Miller (mononucleosis), and freshman standout on defense Doug Zmolek (knee). This foursome, plus a few other players, are not expected to play at Eveleth Saturday.

Coach Woog actually began this season back in August by taking 27 players on a five-game exhibition swing through Switzerland and West Germany. Although the Gophers won only once, the trip, according to Woog, was a complete success.

"I looked at the trip as a way of getting a jump on the coming season as well as one to help broaden the knowledge and background of our student-athletes," Woog says today.

"In addition, the trip helped bring our players closer together, particularly the newer members of this year's squad. Yes, a 1-4 record doesn't sound great, but we learned a lot about all members of our team. Overall they played very well against top flight teams on their home ice."

At one point prior to the trip, however, Woog was almost prevented from joining his players. Woog became ill while coaching junior players at Lake Placid, NY, and returned home to the Twin Cities.

Tests revealed damage to a heart valve, but no heart attack was apparent. Woog was given medication and became a spectator watching all five games from the stands. He assigned his assistant coaches to handle bench duties.

With all that behind him, Woog opened informal practice last week at Mariucci Arena and begins formal practice this Wednesday. Players who skated extensively last summer worked out briefly on their own Tuesday and Thursday. The remainder of the squad, including newcomers, went through teaching sessions Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Woog places his full squad on public display for the first time this Thursday with an intrasquad game in Mariucci Arena at 7 p.m. Although no admission is charged, donations to the Gopher hockey program at the U. of Minnesota will be accepted.

Woog said Sunday he will take 20 players to Eveleth, but declined to give any line or defensive combinations. He did state, however, that goalies Jeff Stolp, a sophomore, and freshman Tom Newman will probably split the game in the Gopher nets.

Woog added when asked about facing Northern Michigan Saturday, "Our players will get a major challenge right off the bat facing probably the premium goal tender in the WCHA, Billy Pye. Pye had a great season last year and will be primed to lead his team to its first WCHA championship this year."

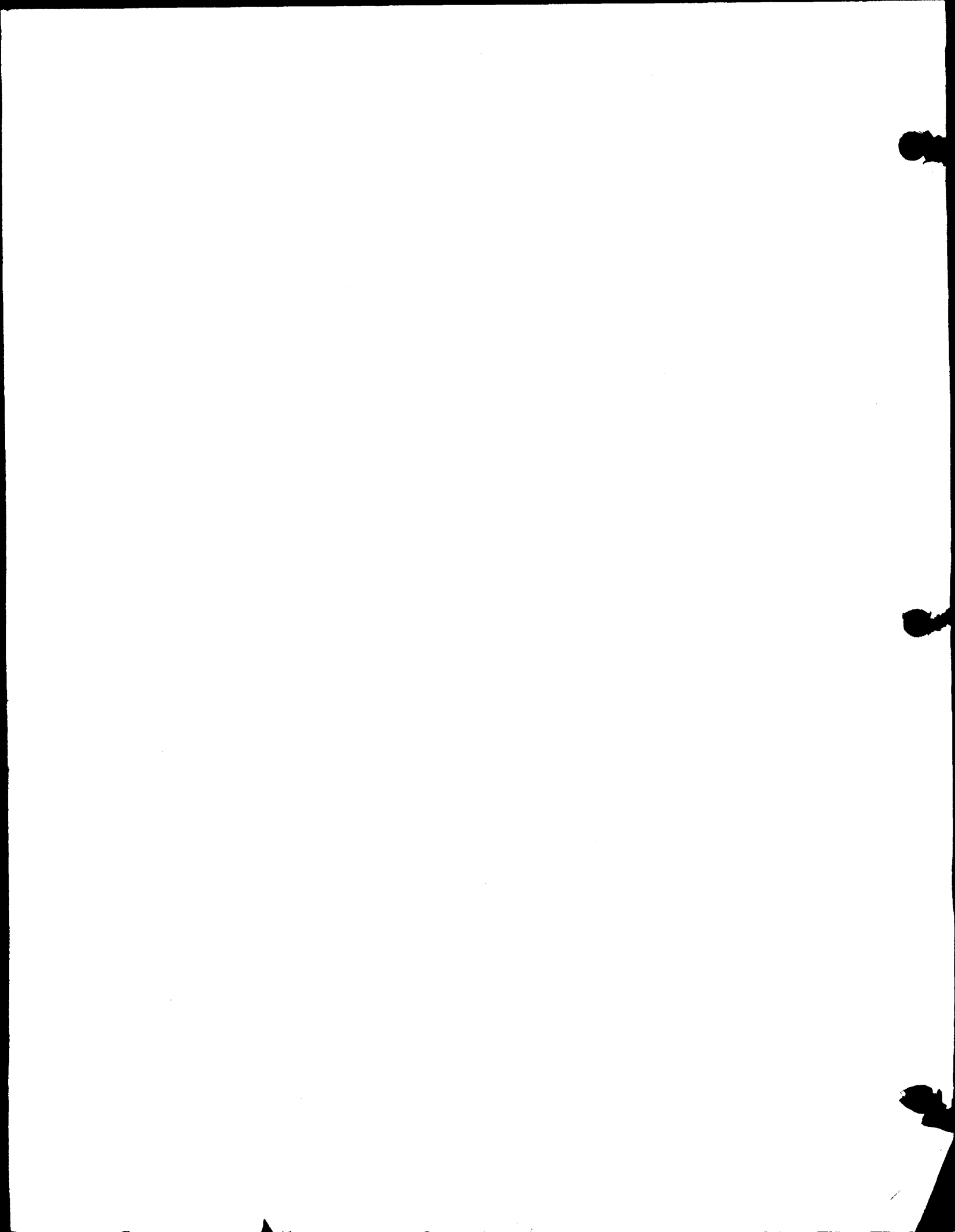

## GOLDEN GOPHERS HOPE TO REBOUND WHEN HOSTING WISCONSIN

Minnesota's Golden Gophers hope to snap a two-game losing streak Saturday when playing host to Wisconsin in a 1:30 p.m. Big Ten Conference football assignment at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in the annual duel for Paul Bunyan's Axe.

Coach John Gutekunst's contingent will put an overall record of 4-3 and a conference mark of 2-2 on the line after falling 41-37 to Ohio State this past weekend. The invading Badgers, meanwhile, will enter Saturday's contest with a 2-5 overall record and a Big Ten log of 1-3 after dropping a 32-9 decision to Illinois last Saturday.

While those records might make Minnesota a favorite, the Gophers won't be taking Wisconsin lightly, and Coach Gutekunst knows that the Golden Gophers will be in for a battle, especially after last weekend's disheartening setback. "The Wisconsin game will be a difficult one for us," Gutekunst stated, knowing how tough it will be to get his contingent to erase the memory of last weekend's devastating loss. "But we're just going to have to come back."

A quick analysis of last Saturday's game, one that saw Minnesota explode to a

31-0 lead only to be outscored 41-6 in the final 35-minutes of play, shows that once again the Golden Gophers found a way to self destruct and let a victory get away.

"We had them down," Gutekunst admitted, "but we just couldn't put them away. I was proud of the emotion our people put into the game, and I was pleased with the way we came back time after time. But in the end we just couldn't get the job done. We didn't block, we didn't tackle and we didn't show defensive discipline we need in order to win."

And now winning becomes more difficult. Physically, the Golden Gophers suffered more bruises, and while the extent of those injuries won't be known for a few days, it could cause Gutekunst some concern. More important, however, is the emotional state of his club and how they will prepare themselves for Wisconsin.

"We had a good week of practice getting ready for Ohio State," he pointed out, "and we were well prepared." Now the question seems to be whether those bruised and battered Golden Gophers can bounce back and prepare themselves again.

Despite the outcome, there were some bright spots in

the OSU game. For example, the Buckeyes had five turnovers, and the opportunistic UM contingent scored on all five of those opportunities. In addition, Minnesota's kicking game was a plus....Brent Herbel getting the job done in the punting department and Brent Berglund converting three pressure-packed field goal attempts. On top of that the Golden Gophers racked up 203 yards rushing thanks to 123 from Darrell Thompson. It was Thompson's second straight 100-yard game and the 19th time in his career that he has topped the century mark.

Defensively Minnesota might not want to single out any performer for exploits after allowing the Buckeyes to get 435 yards in total offense, but defensive back Sean Lumpkin does deserve a pat-on-the-back for recovering two fumbles....and rambling 85 yards for a TD on one of those occasions.

All of which sets the stage for Saturday's battle. In the nation's oldest continuing rivalry, Minnesota and Wisconsin have met 98 times and the Golden Gophers will take a 53-37-8 edge into Saturday's game. The Badgers won in Madison 14-7 a year ago, and they are 16-34-3 in Minneapolis.

## ICERS GAIN 1ST POINTS, AT WISCONSIN FOR 2

Minneapolis, MN---Minnesota's hockey Gophers gained their first points of the season off a win and a tie at North Dakota last weekend, but have little time to savor their first positive scores of the year.

This Friday and Saturday finds the Gophers playing at undefeated Wisconsin. The Badgers, 5-0-0 overall and 4-0-0 in the WCHA, are one of the early favorites to make a solid run at this year's league title.

Minnesota (1-2-1, 1-2-1) moved up to fourth place in the league standings by riding the 4-goal outburst of junior wing Ken Gernander Friday, plus the goal tending of freshman Tom Newman and a late score from sophomore Larry Olimb Saturday at North Dakota.

Even though Gernander scored UM's first four goals Friday, each one only moved the Gophers from one-goal deficits. Finally, senior Jon Anderson gave Minnesota its first lead at 5-4 midway through the final period.

North Dakota rallied for another tie with its last goal at 11:34 before Gopher senior co-captain Lance Pitlick scored the game-winner unassisted with less than three minutes remaining.

The Gophers went about things differently Saturday gaining leads of 2-0 and 3-1 before the home team struck. North Dakota, trailing 2-3 after one period, scored once in the second period and another in the third for a 4-3 margin. But Olimb came through with his tying goal at 7:54 of the final stanza following a furious attack by the Sioux which Newman withstood.

Gernander's scoring flurry shows him with seven goals and one assist in just four games this season. And five of his goals have come on the power play.

"It was really exciting to see (Ken) Gernander score that way on the road," head coach Doug Woog said Monday. "We have always known that Gernander was one of our better shooters, but has been somewhat overshadowed by other players the past two years.

"Another difference for Kenny is that he hasn't been used that much on the power play before. You can rest assured he will be out there in the future."

Gernander was the only Gopher to come up with more than one goal on the weekend. But senior co-captain Peter Hankinson pitched in with three assists and is now second to Gernander in scoring with six points (1-5).

Other goal scorers for Minnesota last weekend included singles from senior Brett Strot, junior Grant Bischoff and sophomore Cory Laylin. Junior defenseman Tom Pederson and senior center Dean Williamson each added two assists on the weekend.

Playing in Dane County Coliseum is, of course, another matter. Although Woog's teams own a 4-4 record there, this year is definitely another matter. The Badgers are, like Minnesota the last three years, off to a great start. Last weekend Wisconsin swept a series at Denver winning 6-5 and 4-2.

## **GOPHER TENNIS TEAM TO HOST NINTH ANNUAL ICE VOLLEYS TENNIS SHOWCASE**

The defending Big Ten champion Golden Gopher tennis team will host the ninth annual Ice Volleys University of Minnesota Tennis Showcase this Saturday and Sunday at the 494-Crosstown Racquet, Swim and Health Club in Eden Prairie.

**Outstanding Field:** With three of the four competing teams appearing on the pre-season national poll, area fans will once again have the opportunity to view some of the nation's finest collegiate tennis players in the tournament. USC is ranked 11th, Kentucky 14th and the Golden Gophers 25th heading into the competition, with Arizona State, also a traditional national power out of the rugged Pac-10 Conference, completing the four-team field.

**Arizona State:** With five returning starters and the addition of several talented newcomers, Sun Devil Head Coach Lou Belken feels that his squad has the potential to be a Top 10 team nationally by season's end. Junior Brian Gyetko, a member of the Canadian Davis Cup Team in '89, along with U.S. Amateur doubles champions Dave Lomicky and Joel Finnigan, both juniors, headline the returnees. Brad Williams, a transfer from the University of Arkansas, and Jeff Prudhome, Arizona State Junior College champion a year ago at Scottsdale JC, are the top newcomers.

**Kentucky:** The Wildcats, ranked eighth in the final national poll in '89 and sixth in '88, hope to head into the 1990's with a school record fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Championships. Head Coach Dennis Emery, beginning his eighth season at the helm of the program, will have to replace three All-Americans in Rich Benson, Adam Malik and Mario Rincon from last year's squad that registered a 20-9 record and fell 5-2 to TCU in their first match at the NCAA Tournament. Juniors Ian Skidmore and Sammy Stinnett, along with sophomores John Yancey, Andy Potter and Scott Hulse, will lead the Wildcats this season. Three talented freshmen - John Venison, Steve Mather and Phil Whitesell - will look to contribute immediately for the Wildcats this season.

**USC:** The Trojans, who recorded an overall record of 17-13 last season and fell 5-1 to eventual runner-up Georgia at the NCAA Championships, have been referred to as the "United Nations" of the collegiate tennis scene. The team, under the direction of 11-year Head Coach Dick Leach, features players from six different nations (Canada, Hungary, Honduras, Switzerland, Zimbabwe and the United States). Four returning veterans, along with seven gifted newcomers, will try to make up for the loss of five lettermen off last year's squad. Junior All-American Byron Black, from Harare, Zimbabwe, played at No. 1 singles and doubles for the Trojans last season. He was one half of USC's NCAA champion doubles team (along with Eric Amend). Sophomore Donny Isaak, from Carroll, IA, played No. 4 singles last season, and sophomore Kent Seton, from Beverly Hills, CA, returns after holding down the No. 6 singles slot. Martin Dionne, from Rimouski, Quebec, Canada, is at the forefront of an outstanding rookie class for the Trojans.

**Minnesota:** Seven letterwinners return from last year's squad that finished 21-9, won the Big Ten title, and lost 5-1 to the University of San Diego in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Seniors Jason Hall (Prior Lake, MN) and David Massart Milwaukee, WI, juniors Anthony Cruz (Medinah, IL) and Kevin Werwie (Sheboygan, WI), and sophomores Brian Uihlein (Lake Forest, IL), Philippe LeBlanc (St. Bruno, Quebec, Canada) and Dean Hlushko (Arden Hills, MN, transfer from UM-Duluth) have all played well thus far this fall for Head Coach David Geatz's squad. A highly-regarded freshmen class, led by Grant Julian (Voorhees, NJ), Rick Naumoff (Columbus, OH), Dominic Roderiguez (Albuquerque, NM) and Jamie Schram (Mountainside, NJ),

has been as good as advertised during the early season. The Golden Gophers will be going after their third straight Ice Volleys unofficial team championship.

**Coach Geatz:** "It should be an outstanding tournament," said Golden Gopher Head Coach David Geatz. "It'll give us the opportunity to see just where we stack up against some great teams. The fans will definitely be treated to some fantastic tennis that's for sure."

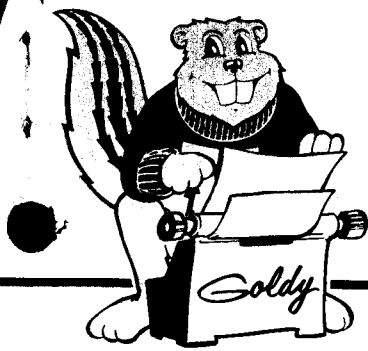

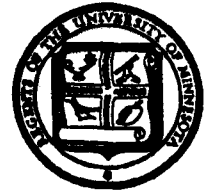

## MINNESOTA SET TO INVADE MICHIGAN STATE

Rebounding Minnesota goes back on the road this weekend to invade East Lansing, Mi, to take on the Michigan State Spartans in a Big Ten Conference football assignment Saturday at 1:00 p.m.

It will be another tough task for Coach John Gutekunst and his Golden Gophers, but they are getting used to big tasks, and they showed last weekend when coming from behind to nudge Wisconsin 24-22 that maybe they were ready to handle them.

The preceding week Minnesota had dropped a heartbreaker to Ohio State, and nobody was ready to guess how the Golden Gophers would react when hosting the Badgers the next time out of the blocks.

Gutekunst figures his charges passed the test. "We didn't make all the plays we should have," he said, "but we made some big plays when we had to. We rose to the occasion when it was necessary."

And it resulted in Minnesota upping its overall season record to 5-3 and improving its Big Ten log to 3-2. The Spartans, meanwhile,

will be risking an overall record of 4-4 on Saturday after overwhelming Indiana 51-20 last weekend. MSU is 3-2 in Big Ten play and tied with Minnesota for fourth place in the conference standings.

"It seems like every game is tough in this league," Gutekunst admitted, "but Saturday's game will be especially tough. Michigan State is a tough ball club. It is a quality football team that can be explosive offensively."

There have been only 27 meetings over the years between Minnesota and Michigan State, and the Spartans will take an overall edge of 16-11 into Saturday afternoon's Big Ten showdown. MSU has won 10 straight including the last meeting 52-23 in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in 1986.

Minnesota's most-recent win in the series came at East Lansing in 1976 when the Golden Gophers prevailed 14-10. Their record in East Lansing is four wins against nine setbacks.

Michigan State will go into the game as heavy favorites, but Gutekunst

doesn't think his contingent will throw in the towel. They would like to get victory number six and go over the .500 mark while remaining in contention for a bowl bid.

To do so the defense must tighten up a bit. "We had a good defensive effort at times against Wisconsin," Gutekunst said. "even though we missed some opportunities, and we had too many penalties again. But we showed that we can battle."

A couple of defensive heroes in the Badger bash were linebackers Joel Staats who had 18 tackles and Ron Goetz who had 11. Goetz also had a 73-yard pass interception return for a touchdown.

Offensively the big name again was All-America tailback Darrell Thompson who had 143 yards to his credit. It was the fifth time this season and 20th time during his UM career that he had gone over the century mark. He also got a TD, and that makes him the most prolific scorer in UM history with 256 points. Chip Lohmiller was the old record holder with 254. He'd like to continue that record-book assault against the Spartans Saturday.

## ICERS RETURN HOME, FACE NMU FRI-SAT

Minneapolis, MN---One of the more heavily favored teams to win this year's WCHA championship invades Mariucci Arena to face the Minnesota hockey Gophers Friday and Saturday at Mariucci Arena.

Northern Michigan, 4-4-0 overall, 3-3-0 WCHA, the defending WCHA playoff champion, offers strong scoring talent to go along with the premium goalie in the league this season, Billy Pye.

The Wildcats, however, suffered a major surprise last weekend when they dropped both ends of a road series, 3-0 and 6-5, to the Colorado College Tigers. Northern was able to remain one point ahead of Minnesota, 6 to 5, in the WCHA standings. NMU is tied with Colorado College for fourth place and the Gophers are fifth.

In its own right, Minnesota also caused some raised eyebrows when the Gophers won 5-3 at previously undefeated Wisconsin last Friday. Then, according to UM head coach Doug Woog, Minnesota actually played better the next night, but lost 4-3. The series split in Madison gives Minnesota a 2-3-1 WCHA record.

On Friday the Gophers twice held leads, 1-0 and 3-2. After Wisconsin tied the score at 3-all, Minnesota broke out with the final two goals of the game in the third period.

Senior co-captain Peter Hankinson scored an unassisted power play goal at 9:11 to break the tie before senior center Dean Williamson knocked in his second goal of the game, this one shorthanded, at 15:03 for insurance.

Grant Bischoff and Tom Pederson got the other UM scores while sophomore goalie Jeff Stolp turned away 19 Badger shots to gain his second win of the season. Minnesota outshot Wisconsin 29-22.

The shot margin Saturday night was even greater, 40-21 in UM's favor, but an outstanding job in the Badger nets by sophomore Duane Derksen spelled the difference. Derksen turned away several point blank efforts by Gopher players in running his team's record to 6-1-0 overall, 5-1-0 in the WCHA.

Minnesota had to overcome 2-0 and 3-2 deficits before seeing the Badgers gain their winning goal late in the second period. A scoreless final period followed even though Minnesota outshot Wisconsin 11-5 in the final 20 minutes.

Senior co-captain Lance Pitlick scored Minnesota's lone first period goal Saturday, with freshman wing Trent Klatt gaining his first collegiate marker in the middle stanza. Junior Ben Hankinson got the other Gopher score creating the 3-3 tie which Wisconsin finally bested. Freshman goalie Tom Newman was in the UM nets making 17 saves.

### WOOG ON THE GOPHERS

Asked if he was surprised at Northern Michigan losing twice on the road, Woog said, "To some it was a surprise, but not that much to me. From what I hear Colorado College is a much improved team. In addition, their rink is a very difficult place for visiting teams."

Commenting on the performance of his Gopher team last weekend, Woog added that "I was really more pleased with the way our people played in those games than not coming out with four points.

"We actually played better in losing Saturday than we did in Friday's win. Sometimes that's just the way things fall. You can do better one day than the next but still have little to show for it.

"The series at Wisconsin was very important to our younger players. Here we go play at the rink of an undefeated team and win the first game. That means our players found they can compete at that level. That's a most encouraging point for us."

Although he doesn't plan wholesale changes, Woog said Monday he wants to get freshman John Brill and maybe one or two other players into the lineup this weekend if possible. "I'm really not certain at this time who will play when, except to say we will in all probability continue to rotate our goal tenders," the coach closed.

According to athletic ticket manager Ken Buell, a limited number of general admission and partially obstructed reserved seats remain for the weekend series against Northern Michigan.

WAYL-980 AM radio will broadcast both games, the second on a delayed basis, while KITN-TV, Ch. 29, and KSTP-1500 AM will both broadcast Friday only.

**Eidman Shines:** Set back by numerous nuisance-type injuries throughout his career, Keith Eidman has been healthy this fall, and as a result has come to the forefront for the Golden Gophers in '89. His Top 10 finish at the Big Ten Championships was the highlight of his collegiate running career to date. He should once again be a factor at the Region 4 Championships on Saturday.

**Youth Movement:** With five freshmen running in the Big Ten Championships, the future definitely looks bright for the Golden Gophers. It was no secret that Coach Griak had a great recruiting year, but after losing six letterwinners from last year's team that finished fifth at the league meet, the feeling was that the squad would be long on talent, but short on experience, in '89. But the newcomers have been every bit as good as their prep press clippings...and then some. After Eidman, Doug Milkowski finished 19th in 25:26, Scott DeLong was 22nd in 25:28, Mark Narveson placed 26th in 25:36, and Chris Berg finished 32nd in 25:50. **Coach Griak on the Big Ten Championships:** "It was a great team effort. We really moved up as a group in the last 2000 meters and that was the difference between third and fifth. After our first time trial this season, I never thought that anything like this would be possible. With such a young team, I thought that sixth-place was a realistic goal. But the way they've improved this year has been a treat to watch. I'm just delighted."

**Coach Griak on the Region 4 Championships:** "We'll have to face the Big Ten schools once again, along with some outstanding teams from the Mid-American Conference. Notre Dame also has a fine team. It will be tougher than the Big Ten's, but I'd like to think that we can be in the hunt."

## **GOLDEN GOPHER NETTERS WIN THREE TITLES AT ICE VOLLEYS TENNIS SHOWCASE**

Senior Jason Hall (Prior Lake, MN) and freshman Rick Naumoff (Columbus, OH) in singles, and the doubles tandem of sophomore Brian Uihlein (Lake Forest, IL) and freshman Roger Anderson (New Hope, MN), won individual titles to pace the Golden Gopher tennis team at the ninth annual Ice Volleys Tennis Showcase held Saturday and Sunday at the 494-Crosstown Racquet Club in Eden Prairie.

**Naumoff Across the Board:** Having already won the No. 5 & 6 singles flight at the University of New Mexico/Mitsubishi Tennis Classic held on Oct. 13-15, Rick Naumoff won the second individual crown of his young collegiate career by winning the No. 3 singles flight Ice Volleys title. In the process, he did not lose a set, winning 6-3,7-6(3) over USC's Andras Lanyi in Saturday's semifinals, and then 7-5,6-4 over Arizona State's Dan Marting in Sunday's final.

**Close Calls:** Three Golden Gophers reached the finals of the singles competition, but were turned back. Brian Uihlein lost a hard-fought 4-6,6-1,7-6(5) decision to Arizona State's Dave Lomicky at No. 2 singles, junior Anthony Cruz (Medinah, IL) fell 7-6(5), 6-2 in the No. 6 singles final to Kentucky's Steve Mather and at No. 7 singles, freshman Dominic Roderiguez (Albuquerque, NM) dropped a 4-6,6-3,6-4 decision to Trond Faeroevik from Arizona State.

**Unofficial Team Standings:** Unranked on the pre-season national poll, Arizona State showed that they'll definitely be a force to be reckoned with during the 1989-90 season by scoring 28 points to claim the unofficial team title at the Ice Volleys Tennis Showcase. The Golden Gopher swimming & diving team won 10 of 13 events en route to a 81-32 victory over Big Ten rival Wisconsin on Friday in the Cooke Hall Pool.

**The Mayo Connection:** Sophomores Scott Hart (Rochester, MN) and Sean Quackenbush (Rochester, MN), former high school standouts at Rochester Mayo High School, have been reunited once again in Gold Country. Hart was an NCAA qualifier at Michigan last season before transferring to Minnesota this year, while Quackenbush collected All-American recognition in three events for the Golden Gophers at the '89 NCAA Championships as a rookie. The talented pair each won three events on the evening. They opened the meet in style as members of the victorious 400 medley relay unit. They were joined on that relay by fellow sophomores Scott Tripps (Seattle, WA) and Jay Fischer (Hutchinson, MN), which touched first in a time of 3:29.76. Hart also won the 200 freestyle (1:43.00) and 200 breaststroke (2:08.10), while Quackenbush took the 200 butterfly (1:52.38) and then joined freshman Steve Busse (Cincinnati, OH), sophomore Del Cerney (Staples, MN) and senior tri-captain Bill Asmus (Lakeville, MN) to take the final event of the meet, the 400 freestyle relay in a clocking of 3:10.23.

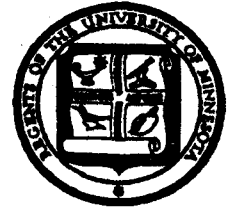

### THE LITTLE BROWN JUG

The "Little Brown Jug" was created by accident when, following the 1903 game between Michigan and Minnesota at Minnesota, a Wolverine trainer left his team's water jug behind. Once the discovery was made in Ann Arbor of the missing equipment, Coach Fielding H. Yost requested that Minnesota return the jug. However, he was told, in effect, to "come and get it." Out of this spontaneous situation was born one of the keenest collegiate football rivalries of all time.





## LITTLE BROWN JUG AT STAKE SATURDAY

When Minnesota plays host to Michigan at 11:30 a.m. in an ESPN national Big Ten TV football assignment in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome, there will be more at stake than conference standings and bowl game berths.

Since 1909, the Golden Gophers and the Wolverines have met annually for the rights to one of the nation's oldest and most treasured trophies....the Little Brown Jug, and that's something special that the winner of Saturday's contest will take home in cherished fashion.

Coach John Gutekunst's contingent will put an overall record of 5-4 and a Big Ten mark of 3-3 on the line while invading Michigan will risk its season log of 8-1 and its league-leading 6-0 standard.

Two weeks ago when Minnesota nudged Wisconsin and brought home Paul Bunyan's Axe, Gutekunst remarked that it was "The first of three" that Minnesota would be playing for and wanted the rights to this season. The second is the jug Saturday, and the third will come next week when Min-

nesota meets Iowa for ownership of Floyd of Rosedale. But first things first, and that's the Little Brown Jug, and the Golden Gophers know what a difficult assignment is in store for them on Saturday. The Wolverines came into the season tabbed as the favorite to win this year's title, and they have been ranked among the nation's top teams all season long.

"We'll be facing another excellent opponent this week," Gutekunst stated, "but I still feel that Minnesota is a good football team, and we have to look at Saturday's game against Michigan as an opportunity to prove it."

The Wolves will rank as heavy favorites, especially after they knocked off Illinois 24-10 last weekend while the Golden Gophers were stumbling at Michigan State 21-7....after leading 7-6 at halftime.

"It was a very disappointing loss," Gutekunst admitted. We did some things awfully well, and I'm proud of our people for that. But we did miss some excellent opportunities to score in the first half, and we gave up too

many big plays in the second half. That was it."

So now it is Michigan, a team that Minnesota has faced 79 times since the series started in 1892, and a team that holds a commanding edge of 53-23-3 over the Golden Gophers. Michigan won last year 22-7 in Ann Arbor, and Minnesota's most recent win was 20-17 in Ann Arbor in 1986.

The Wolverines won the last time they came to Minnesota....30-20 in the Metrodome in 1987. Michigan's record is 23-12-2 in Minneapolis. It was 16-11-1 in old Memorial Stadium (there were six games played prior to 1924), and it is 3-0 in the dome.

Darrell Thompson, Minnesota's All-America tailback, had one of his finest hours against Michigan in '87 when he rushed for 201 yards (the only player EVER to go over 200 in a single game against the Wolves) and set a Big Ten record with a 98-yard touchdown run. Thompson will go into Saturday's game with 4,715 career yards and 936 on the season....meaning he needs just 64 against Michigan to reach 1,000 for the third time in his UM career.

## ICERS GAIN 3RD PLACE IN WCHA, AT C.C. FRI-SAT.

Minneapolis, MN---On the strength of its second 3-point weekend of the season, the Minnesota hockey Gophers have moved into third place in the WCHA standings.

Minnesota, 3-3-2 both in the WCHA and overall, moved up by defeating visiting Northern Michigan 11-4 Saturday after allowing the Wildcats to forge a last minute 5-5 equalizing goal Friday forcing an overtime tie.

The Gophers head back on the road this weekend for games Friday and Saturday at fast-improving Colorado College (3-3-0). The Tigers are just one point behind Minnesota in the league standings, but have played two less WCHA games.

WAYL-980 AM radio will broadcast both games from Colorado Springs, the second on a delayed basis, with KITN-TV, Ch. 29, televising Friday's game.

Minnesota broke out with its largest goal production Saturday since defeating Colorado College 11-2 here on Jan. 30, 1988. It was freshman wing Trent Klatt from Osseo who led the way with three goals and an assist for his first collegiate hat trick.

Klatt scored Minnesota's second goal in the first period, which ended in a 3-3 tie, and then led a scoring splurge that produced five unanswered goals in the second period.

He knocked in his second goal at 7:10 of the middle period, and scored his hat goal just 18 seconds later. Klatt was voted Minnesota's "Mr. Hockey" award last year as a senior at Osseo High School.

Senior wing Scott Bloom (Burnsville) chipped in with two goals in Saturday's win, the second time this season he has had two goals in a game.

The biggest scoring output for the weekend, however, belonged to senior Gopher co-captain Peter Hankinson (Edina). Hankinson scored a goal in each game, and took over the Minnesota scoring lead by adding five assists for a 7-point weekend. Hankinson leads UM with 14 points on four goals and 10 assists in eight games.

Another star for Minnesota last weekend was freshman goalie Tom Newman (Blaine). Newman came in during the second period Friday with his team trailing 4-3. He all but closed the door on Northern Michigan's attack stopping 14 shots in 42 minutes of action.

Minnesota took a 5-4 lead in the third period on goals by Ken Gernander (Coleraine), who recorded his team-leading 8th score, and Cory Laylin (St. Cloud). Northern then forced the overtime when Scott Beattie scored on a perfectly placed screen shot from the left boards with just 51 seconds remaining in regulation play.

Although Minnesota outshot NMU 3-1 in the 5-minute overtime, goalies Newman and Northern's Billy Pye stood firm and the 5-5 tie resulted.

Newman, however, was rewarded with his first collegiate victory Saturday when his teammates enjoyed their biggest goal production in two years. In all fairness, a crippled Northern defense was missing four regulars out with knee injuries.

On Saturday Gernander came back to get his 9th goal of the season. After scoring seven times in the first three Gopher games, Gernander had been shut out the next three games eading into Friday's contest. He added two assists Saturday for a 4-point weekend.

Other Minnesota players who upped their scoring totals included Larry Olimb (Warroad) with four assists, and Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids) with a goal and two assists Saturday after sitting out Friday's game with the flu.

Although Minnesota has enjoyed a lot of success against Colorado College in recent years, the Tigers have already shown this season they are a team to be dealt with. Last weekend C.C. tied and defeated Air Force in non-conference action. The previous week, however, saw the Tigers sweep Northern Michigan at home.

It is agreed on by WCHA coaches that playing Colorado College in its home rink, the Broadmoor World Arena, is one of the toughest assignments in the league. The rink features the smallest ice surface in the WCHA. Add to that that C.C. is probably the most improved team in the league and one can easily see Minnesota faces a rugged challenge.

With third place in the standings behind Minnesota-Duluth (6-2-0) and Wisconsin (5-1-0) at stake, neither team needs to be prodded to realize this is a mighty important series.

Minnesota defeated Colorado College in all six meetings last season, including playoff games, but realizes things could be much different this time around.

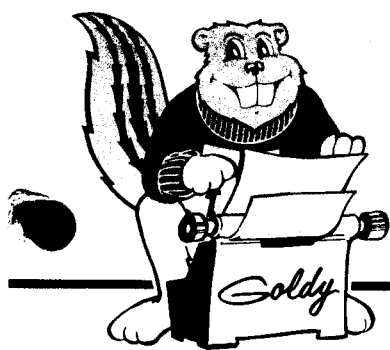

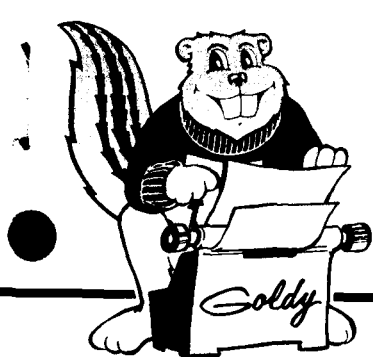

University of Minnesota Head Football Coach, John Gutekunst, has been reprimanded for his comments made yesterday regarding Big Ten officiating. The announcement was made by Athletic Director, Rick Bay, who spoke to Gutekunst personally and then filed a letter of reprimand in Gutekunst's personnel record at the Athletic Department. Bay said Gutekunst's criticism of the officials violated Regulation 3-2-D, which prohibits coaches or any conference personnel from publicly criticizing game officials. Bay acknowledged that while this was Gutekunst's first offense in this area, any further violations of this conference regulation would result in more serious penalties. Bay said that he considers the matter closed but that he has warned Gutekunst to comply with the regulation in the future and to file any complaints he may have about conference officiating through proper channels as provided for by the Big Ten office.

### Floyd of Rosedale

Back in 1935 "Floyd of Rosedale" was a national championship hog who became the object of a wager between governors of Iowa and Minnesota as to the outcome of a football game. Today Floyd's memory lingers on in the form of a 15 and one half inch high bronze statue and is still the price of every Hawkeye - Gopher grid battle. Although Minnesota and Iowa first met in football in 1891, high tension later evolved over the series leading the prospective State leaders to make a friendly wager in an attempt to ease feelings between the fans. ## HOG AT STAKE AT IOWA SATURDAY

When the University of Minnesota invades the University of Iowa at Iowa City for the 1 p.m. 1989 Big Ten Conference football season finale, a prize pig.....Floyd of Rosedale.....will be at stake and will go to the winner.

Neither the Hawkeyes nor the Golden Gophers, both 5-5 on the year, are headed for a Big Ten championship or a trip to Pasadena. Floyd, bragging rights and a pride are what remain for these two arch rivals to compete for.

The series is an old one, dating back to 1891. Since that first confrontation there have been 82 meetings between Minnesota and Iowa, and the Golden Gophers will take an overall edge of 52-28-2 into Saturday's contest.

Iowa has won four straight, however, including a 31-22 decision at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome a year ago. In addition, Minnesota's success ratio is much lower in Iowa City where it has won 22, lost 18 and tied one.

The last win for Minnesota in the series was by a 23-17 margin in Minneapolis in 1984. The most recent win at Iowa City for the Golden Gophers was in 1981 when they prevailed 12-10 on the strength of four Jim Gallery field goals.

How did these two opponents tune up for the final game of the season? Iowa triumphed at Purdue 24-0 while Minnesota fell to Michigan at home 49-15. This year they had one common non-conference, Iowa State, and both won.....Iowa by a 31-21 score and Minnesota 30-20.

In the conference, The Golden Gophers and Hawkeyes both lost to Michigan State, both beat Wisconsin, both lost to Michigan, both beat Northwestern, both lost to Ohio State and both beat Purdue. Iowa lost to Illinois but did not play Indiana. Minnesota lost to Indiana but did not play Illinois. That makes both clubs 3-4 in the standings. A toss up?

"It will be another tough game for us," Coach John Gutekunst said. "It's our third battle for a trophy (Wisconsin for Paul Bunyan's Axe and Michigan for the Little Brown Jug), and it's another one of college football's contests between two traditional rivals."

Gutekunst maintains there's even more importance attached to Saturday's meeting, however. "We want to finish over .500," he stressed, "and it will be the final game for 18 seniors on our squad. We would like to have them go out and be remembered as winners."

Topping that list of seniors is All-America tailback Darrell Thompson who has 4,396 rushing yards to his credit going into his final game after rushing for 125 yards against Michigan last weekend (he is the ONLY player to go over the century mark against the Wolves this season). That effort also gave him 1,017 yards this season and was the third time in his career at Minnesota that he topped the 1,000-yard mark as a Golden Gopher. AND he scored another touchdown against Michigan, giving him 10 on the year and 40 during his career.

Other seniors, all of whom have made significant contributions during their careers and who will make their final regular-season appearances in University of Minnesota uniforms are Dale Conant, Pat Cummings, Doug Evans, Chris Gaiters, Ron Goetz, Brent Herbel, J.J. Lennon, Jon Leverenz, Dan Liimatta, Jon Melander, Eddie Miles, David Shoemaker, Tyrone Stenzel, Mac Stephens, Shane Strain, Scott Streiff and Bob Yurick.

A year ago Minnesota finished 19-12 and made it to the Sweet Sixteen in the NCAA's post season tournament. But it lost its' season opener to Ball State by a 63-57 margin, and the Golden Gophers would like a better start this time out of the blocks.

Haskins, now in his fourth season as head coach at Minnesota, is not sure of his opening lineup, and the uncertainty is a result of the physical status of All-America candidate Willie Burton at forward.

Burton has been bothered with an ankle sprain, but he played 19 minutes against Brazil and could be in the opening lineup at Cincy. If

he isn't ready to go full time, Walter Bond probably again get the nod.

Richard Coffey again will get the call at the other forward position while Jim Shikenjanski will start at center. The guards again will be Kevin Lynch and Melvin Newbern.

Those are household names in Minnesota. They were the starters a year ago, and it is the return of those veterans that has vaulted Minnesota into many Top Twenty listings at the start of the '89-'90 campaign.

"It is nice to get that kind of recognition," Haskins admits, "but we are not a Top 20 team right now. We have the potential to be, but we need to have Burton 100% and we have to improve in a lot of areas.....including defense."

It was the Minnesota defense.....or lack of it.....that upset Haskins in the lid-lifter against Brazil. After jumping off to a commanding lead early and going ahead 59-28 at the intermission, the Golden Gophers did not get the job done on defense in the second half. And they drew Haskins' criticism for it.

"We were not as intense defensively as we need to be," Haskins said. "We have some goals that we want to accomplish, and while we are pleased with some phases of our game, we have to do a better job in others. And that includes defense."

Minnesota and Cincinnati have met twice before in basketball. The Golden Gophers won the first meeting in Williams Arena 49-46 during the 1982-83 season, and they prevailed 65-61 a year later in Cincinnati to make the series record 2-0.

Following Saturday's road contest, Coach Haskins will bring his charges home to open their Williams Arena slate in earnest by hosting Chicago State on Tuesday, Nov. 28. Then it is back on the road for a Dec. 2 assignment at Toledo.

While Haskins was disturbed about the "D" against Brazil, there were some offensive bright spots. Like four players in double figures. Shikenjanski topped the list with 14. And Minnesota won the battle of the boards 41-27. AND they had 14 assists.



## **BASKETBALL PROGRAM CONCLUDES OUTSTANDING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD**

After advancing to the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament last season, Golden Gopher head basketball coach, Clem Haskins, and his staff put the finishing touches on an exceptional early signing period last week.

The Golden Gophers signed 6-foot-9 forwards **Chad Kolander** from Owatonna (MN) High School and **Sean Pell** from Clearwater (FL) High School, 6-foot-8 forward **Randy Carter** from Central High School in Memphis, TN, and 6-foot-5 guard **Jon Laster** from Denver (CO) East High School to national letters of intent.

Kolander has averaged 13.4 points and 9.7 rebounds in 47 games over the last two seasons. He led Owatonna to the 1989 Minnesota State Class "AA" Championship when he blocked an amazing 36 shots in the three tournament games. In the process, he was named to the All-State and All-Big Nine teams for his outstanding play last season. He plans on majoring in engineering at Minnesota and chose the Golden Gophers over Iowa State and Northwestern.

"We like his potential and believe he has an outstanding chance to be an important player in our program during his career," Haskins said. "We've tried to sign the top player in the state each year and, with Kevin Lynch, Bob Martin, Ernest Nzigamasabo and now Chad Kolander, I hope that we've sent a signal to high school coaches throughout the state that we're committed to that."

Laster averaged 15 points, 6 rebounds and 5 assists a game as a junior last season en route to being honored on the second-team All-City squad in the Denver Public League. He will be in his third season as a starter for the school this season. This past summer, he averaged more than 20 points a contest for the Colorado Gold Team, an all-star team made up of the state's finest players. He chose Minnesota over Montana State, Pepperdine, Colorado State and the University of Portland.

"We feel that Jon has great potential," Haskins said. "He is an outstanding shooter and possesses good quickness. He's really going to fit in well with the guards that we have and will be a welcome addition to our backcourt."

Pell averaged 18.9 points and 9.7 rebounds a contest as a junior despite playing four games with a broken hand. A 1989-90 pre-season Street & Smith honorable mention All-America choice, he was honored as a first-team all-conference and all-county selection last season, when he led Clearwater to an overall record of 23-7, 14-0 in conference play. He scored 20 or more points in 14 games a year ago and is on a pace to become the all-time career scoring leader at the school. The 235-pounder chose the Golden Gophers over Florida State, West Virginia, Texas Tech and South Florida.

"Sean has the ability to play either the power forward position or at the post," Haskins said. "He has a great outside touch for a big man."

The final early signee, Carter averaged 23 points, 15 rebounds, and 4 blocks a game as a junior last season to lead Central to an overall record of 24-8. In addition, he played on the Tennessee AAU team that won the 15-and-under national championship a few years ago at Washington State University and then attended the NIKE camp at Princeton this past summer. The 225-pounder's final decision came down to either Memphis State or Minnesota.

"Randy is a young man who can shoot the three-pointer, as well as post-up inside," Haskins said. "We think that he'll be a very versatile player for us during his career."

"This definitely concludes our recruiting for the fall," he added. "We feel that we have four quality players in Kolander, Laster, Pell and now Carter really tops it off nicely."

## EMERGENCY SERVICES BOLSTERED AT U OF M

If you are going to have a serious medical emergency, the place to have it is at a Golden Gopher sporting event. Why? Because the U of M has one of the most comprehensive emergency medical response systems of any school in the country.

The first response capabilities of the Golden Gopher security personnel is excellent and getting better. The Golden Gophers crowd assistance and management personnel is currently being trained and certified in CPR and basic first aid skills to improve their ability to handle emergency situations.

Over 700,000 spectators are admitted to sporting events for the Men's Athletic Department in a given year. Given those kind of numbers, situations requiring emergency medical assistance are going to happen. At events where spectator size ranges from 7,000 to 50,000 people, you must have an effective way of responding to medical emergencies. The radio dispatched security personnel for these sporting events do a great job, and with more training they will only get better.

Twelve members of the staff currently are going through an eight-hour training program that culminates with certification by the American Heart Association for CPR and the American Red Cross for basic first aid. This group will be followed by another until the entire staff is certified. "If the program is successful, we intend to extend it to the entire Athletic Department and to as many of our ushering crew as possible," said Golden Gopher Ticket Director Ken Buell.

At U of M sporting events the responsibility of emergency medical response rests in the capable hands of Wally Caryl. Caryl is director of the Emergency Management Department at the U of M. He has been in charge of emergency medical service at U of M sporting events for 22 years. Caryl and his crew have been able to save several lives over the past few years, primarily heart attack victims. "By increasing our ability to respond to emergencies within the critical four minute period, we greatly enhance the patient's chances of recovery," said Caryl.

"We have been extremely pleased with the support our security team has displayed in participating in the program on their own time, and we know this will make us more effective in our emergency service," said Buell.

The security personnel for U of M sporting events is mostly volunteer and largely goes unrecognized. "The staff that contributes its time to these events is second to none, and I am really proud of them and the job they do," said Buell. They provide help with crowd control and service, and when an emergency arises they are there. So if you could pick the place where you are going to be when you need medical assistance, a Golden Gopher sporting event is a safe bet for timely emergency care.

**ICERS TAKE WCHA BREAK, HOST MAINE WED.**

Minneapolis, MN---After five straight weekends of the WCHA wars, the U. of Minnesota hockey Gophers play three non-conference games in four days.....one at home Wednesday against Maine plus road games at Boston College Friday and New Hampshire Saturday.

The Gophers are now in third place in the WCHA with a league record of 4-4-2 good for 10 points. That places UM six points behind league-leading Minnesota-Duluth (8-2-0, 16) and two behind Wisconsin (6-2-0, 12). The Gophers, however, are just two points out of seventh place as Northern Michigan and North Dakota are both at nine points (4-5-1) while Colorado College (4-4-0) and Denver (4-6-0) are just one more point back at eight.

Unlike recent years, Minnesota's games this week will not count in the WCHA standings. From 1984-85 through last season, the WCHA and the Hockey East Association (HEA), of which Maine, B.C. and New Hampshire are members, had a working agreement. All games played counted in the respective league standings.

A decision was made this season, however, to discontinue the relationship. So now all games between the two Associations simply count in the school's won-lost columns, not the league standings.

**GOPHERS SPLIT AT C.C.**

Minnesota gained two points in its series at Colorado College last weekend when junior wing Ken Gernander scored his team-leading 11th goal of the season in overtime Saturday giving the Gophers a 3-2 victory. Minnesota dropped Friday's game 7-5 after losing a 3-0 first period lead.

On Saturday, the Gophers trailed 1-0 after one period. The Peter Hankinson then got a power play goal in the middle period and Scott Bloom did the same early in the third period putting UM ahead 2-1.

Colorado College tied the game midway through the final period off freshman goalie Tom Newman before Gernander ended the contest a little more than three minutes into overtime.

Friday's contest saw Minnesota jump out to a 3-0 first period lead on goals by Tom Pederson, Jon Anderson and Grant Bischoff. The Gophers, however, went into a slump in the second period allowing C.C. to storm Newman for four consecutive goals.

Gernander and Peter Hankinson put Minnesota back in front 5-4 in the first eight minutes of the third period only to surrender three more scores to the improved Tigers. The last goal, however, went into an empty net as coach Doug Woog pulled Newman for an extra attacker in the final minute.

For the weekend, Peter Hankinson and Bloom led the Gopher scoring parade with three points apiece. Hankinson's points came on two goals and an assist while Bloom counted two assists Friday and a big goal Saturday.

Peter Hankinson continues to lead Minnesota in scoring with 17 points (6-11) through the first 10 games of the season. Gernander is next with 15 points with his team-high 11 goals. Others in double figures include Pederson (4-8=12) and Bloom (6-4=10). Bloom has appeared in just seven games, the other three have skated in all 10 outings.

Newman, as mentioned, started and completed both games at Colorado Springs running his season record to 2-3-2. His goals allowed average is at 3.65 with his save percentage improving to .864.

**LAST YEAR VS. HEA TEAMS**

Minnesota was 3-0-1 against Maine, B.C. and New Hampshire last season. The Gophers defeated Maine twice, 6-3 at home and 7-4 in a semi-final game of the NCAA Championships played at the Saint Paul Civic Center.

The Gophers played Boston College to a 4-4 tie in the Eagles' new Conte Forum last January even though Minnesota outshot B.C. 50-24. Three days later UM motored up to New Hampshire winning a 3-1 decision.

Wednesday's contest marks the 200th career game for Gopher head coach Doug Woog. His teams have provided him with 141 victories in his four plus seasons behind the UM bench. Going into this season, Minnesota's 137 wins the last four years were the most by any NCAA Div. I school in the nation.

## **GOLDEN GOPHER FOOTBALL PLAYERS EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM**

Five members of the Golden Gopher football team, the most ever in a single season in the history of the program, have been nominated for both Academic All-America and Big Ten honors.

Seniors Pat Cummings, Brent Herbel, and Dan Liimatta, along with sophomores Scott Schaffner and Joel Staats, are being considered for the honors based on their outstanding work both in the classroom and on the field. The Golden Gophers and Ball State University tied for the most nominees on the District 5 All-America ballot, from which the finalists will move on to the national ballot.

The starting fullback for the Golden Gophers throughout most of the '89 season, Cummings, from Madison, WI, has served as mainly a blocking back for fellow senior Darrell Thompson, the school's career rushing leader. Through nine contests, he had also caught seven passes for 65 yards, en route to collecting his third letter. Off the field, he has registered an outstanding 3.34 cumulative GPA in the University of Minnesota's prestigious Carlson School of Management and is a Williams Scholar.

From Grafton, ND, Herbel has been the Golden Gophers' regular punter for the past four seasons. Heading into the 10th week of the '89 season, he has punted a school record 204 times for 7,921 yards, for a fine average of 38.8. A second-team All-Big Ten choice last season, he is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and was honored on the District 5 All-Academic team a year ago. A biology/pre-med major with a 3.26 GPA, the Williams Scholar also was a Honda-Scholar Athlete Award winner and is a candidate for an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.

A three-year starter at offensive tackle, Liimatta, from Aurora, MN, has been a standout in the trenches throughout his career for the Golden Gophers. The dependable performer has not missed a start over the last three seasons. In the classroom, he has recorded a 3.26 GPA in the Carlson School of Management. He is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten choice and a Williams Scholar.

Schaffner took over the starting spot at quarterback for the final seven games of the '88 season and has been at the controls of the Golden Gopher offensive attack ever since. He completed better than 55 percent of his passes for 1,234 yards last season and through nine contests in '89, has connected on 51 percent of his throws for 1,148 yards. A threat to run at any time, he has racked up 263 more yards on the ground, and has accounted for a total of 20 touchdowns during his career thus far in Gold Country. A Williams Scholar, he has recorded a 3.53 GPA and expects to be admitted to the Carlson School of Management this spring.

When Jon Leverenz went down with a serious knee injury in the '88 season opener, Staats stepped to the forefront at linebacker and played brilliantly. He finished third on the team with 81 tackles, including 49 solo's. After nine games of the '89 campaign, he has recorded a team-leading 69 tackles, including two interceptions, to pace the Golden Gopher defensive unit. In the classroom, he has charted a sparkling 4.00 GPA and expects to be admitted to the Carlson School of Management in the fall of 1990.

"They are fine young men who really exemplify what being a student-athlete is all about," said Brian Berube, academic counselor for the Golden Gopher football squad. "All five of them are all pursuing very rigorous academic curriculums, and yet, they have excelled in the classroom, as well as on the field. It is also my understanding that at some point in time, they all plan on attending graduate school."

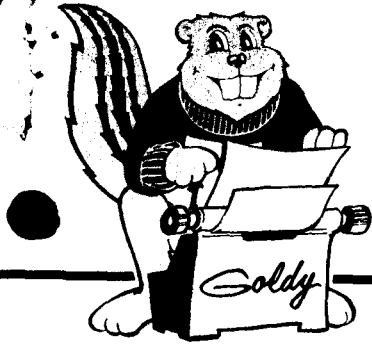

## **THOMPSON ENDS GOPHER CAREER**

The Golden Gophers enjoyed an impressive season ending victory over Iowa Saturday, but suffered a much larger loss in the departure of tailback Darrell Thompson. Thompson's final performance as a Gopher was reminiscent of the four years that he spent in Gold Country. Thompson rushed for 122 yards on 33 carries to finish the season with a total of 1,139 rushing yards. Darrell has been a model of consistency over his four year career. He gained 1240 yards as a freshman in 1986, 1229 in 1987, 947 in 1988, and this season's 1139 puts his career total at 4518, which is a University of Minnesota school record. Among his many other school records, Thompson's career touchdown mark stands at 40.



## GOLDEN GOPHERS FINISH WITH 6-5 GRID RECORD

When the University of Minnesota exploded for 30 points in the fourth quarter of the season finale at Iowa City, it clinched a 43-7 triumph for the Golden Gophers and assured Coach John Gutekunst of his third winning season in four seasons at the helm of Minnesota football.

The Golden Gophers, on the strength of that oh-so-sweet triumph over the arch-rival Hawkeyes, finished the 1989 campaign with an overall record of 6-5, a Big Ten log of 4-4 and undisputed possession of fifth place in the final conference standings.

In addition, Minnesota brought Floyd of Rosedale, the prize hog that goes to the winner of the UM-UI clash each fall, back home to Gold Country and gave Coach Gutekunst's chargers a two-out-of-three record in the trophy department this season. The Golden Gophers also own bragging rights to Paul Bunyan's axe after beating Wisconsin.....but the Wolverines kept the Little Brown Jug in Michigan.

Coach Gutekunst, after watching his Minnesota contingent carry Floyd of Rosedale off the Iowa turf,

proclaimed, "I feel great! It was a tremendous victory for us. It made us winners for the season, and it is always nice to be able to do that against a traditional rival like Iowa."

The Golden Gophers never trailed in the contest after All-America tailback Darrell Thompson tossed a 14-yard pass to Chris Gaiters for a first-quarter touchdown. It was the second pass of Thompson's illustrious career at Minnesota, his second touchdown pass and his second pass to Gaiters.

Brent Berglund added a couple of field goals in the second period before the Hawkeyes got on the board with a TD in the third. All that did was set the stage for Minnesota's fourth period explosion.

"We made things happen, and so many people contributed" Gutekunst stated as he recalled his gridders gaining seven turnovers on five pass interceptions and a pair of timely fumble recovers. Those individual heroics? Fred Foggie had two of the interceptions while Les O'Hara, Jason Brouwer and Eddie Miles chipped in with one each.....Miles' return going for a touchdown. The fumble recoveries came from David Shoemaker and Andre Davis.

The only sad part of the day was the realization that the season was over and that careers had ended for 18 seniors including Thompson who rushed for 122 yards and wound up with 1,139 on the season, 4,518 in his four years at Minnesota and owned more records than any player ever to wear the maroon and gold at an institution that is "tradition rich" after 107 years of collegiate football.

"Our seniors made a tremendous contribution to the University of Minnesota program," Gutekunst stressed. "They conducted themselves well and they exhibited tremendous leadership. They played hard at Iowa just as they played hard all season long. They have been totally unselfish. It is extremely gratifying to see them go out as winners."

But those seniors will be missed, and their departure prompts Gutekunst to look ahead. "Those people helped us turn the corner," he said. "Now we have to go forward. We've established a new administration and new leadership at the University of Minnesota, and we have plans in place for the future."

## **CUMMINGS, HERBEL & STAATS HONORED ON DISTRICT 5 ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM**

Seniors **Pat Cummings** (Madison, WI) and **Brent Herbel** (Grafton, ND), along with sophomore **Joel Staats** (Winona, MN), have been named to the CoSIDA GTE District 5 All-Academic Football Team.

Cummings, Herbel and Staats will now move on to the national ballot. The CoSIDA GTE Academic All-America Team will be announced on December 14.

The starting fullback for the Golden Gophers during the '89 season, Cummings served as mainly a blocking back for fellow senior Darrell Thompson, who finished his career as the school's all-time rushing leader. He carried the ball eight times for 26 yards and also caught eight passes for 71 yards, en route to collecting his third letter. Off the field, he has registered an outstanding 3.34 cumulative GPA in the University of Minnesota's prestigious Carlson School of Management and is a Williams Scholar.

Herbel was the Golden Gophers' regular punter for the past four seasons. He punted a school record 212 times for 8,204 yards, for a fine average of 38.7. A second-team All-Big Ten choice last season, he is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and was honored on the District 5 All-Academic team a year ago. A biology/pre-med major with a 3.26 GPA, the Williams Scholar also was a Honda-Scholar Athlete Award winner and is a candidate for an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.

When Jon Leverenz went down with a serious knee injury in the '88 season opener, Staats stepped to the forefront at linebacker and played brilliantly. He finished third on the team with 81 tackles, including 49 solo's. He continued to shine during the '89 campaign, finishing third on the team with 71 tackles, including two interceptions, to help lead the Golden Gopher defensive unit. In the classroom, he has charted a sparkling 4.00 GPA and expects to be admitted to the Carlson School of Management in the fall of 1990.

"We are very proud of them," said Brian Berube, academic counselor for the Golden Gopher football squad. "They are fine young men who could be emulated for the prowess they have displayed both on the football field and in the classroom."

## ICERS RETURN TO WCHA, HOST DENVER F-S

Minneapolis, MN---After a week off for three non-conference games, the Minnesota hockey Gophers return to the WCHA wars this weekend when the Denver University Pioneers visit Mariucci Arena for 7:05 p.m. games Friday and Saturday.

WAYL-980 AM radio and KITN-TV, Ch. 29, will cover Friday's game live while WWTC-1280 AM radio will broadcast Saturday's contest.

Minnesota did not fare overly well on two fronts by leaving the conference for three games against Hockey East Association (HEA) teams last week. For starters, Minnesota lost two of the three games.

The other front saw the Gophers drop from sole possession of third place into a tie for fifth place in the WCHA standings. And wouldn't you know it, the team Minnesota is tied with is Denver, this week's opponent.

The Gophers dropped to 5-6-2 overall but remained 4-4-2 for 10 WCHA points. Denver is 5-7-0 in the WCHA and 7-7-0 overall. The Pioneers are fresh off a home split against Northern Michigan last weekend.

Actually, the only team to gain on WCHA leaders Minnesota-Duluth (9-3-0, 18) and runner-up Wisconsin (7-3-0, 14) last weekend was North Dakota (5-5-2, 12). The Sioux took three points at home from Colorado College. The other two WCHA series resulted in splits.

Minnesota's week began at home last Wednesday when the Maine Black Bears overcame 2-0 and 3-2 Gopher leads to win 4-3 on a lone third period goal. Three different players scored for Minnesota, Tom Pederson, Cory Laylin and Grant Bischoff, but the Bears clicked on three of six power play chances to take the win.

The Gophers then headed out East for two more contests against HEA clubs. Friday saw Minnesota again build leads against Boston College. Jason Miller, returning to action after being out with illness and injuries, scored the first goal of the game for UM.

The Eagles came back with a pair of goals before Bischoff and Ken Gernander gave UM a 3-2 first period margin. After a third B.C. goal, Pederson gave the Gophers their final lead, 4-3, with a score midway through the second period. From that point on it was all Boston College.

The Eagles scored two more times in the second period and added another pair in the third, two of the four goals coming on the power play, to end with a 7-4 decision.

Minnesota finally got untracked Saturday and returned to the win column with a 4-0 victory at New Hampshire. Author of this win was sophomore goalie Jeff Stolp was seeing his first action in five games.

Stolp was in his finest form of the season making 34 saves, many of them of the spectacular variety. His teammates managed 31 shots on goal with single efforts by Gernander, Cory Laylin, and freshmen Trent Klatt and John Brill reaching the back of the net.

For the week, both Gernander and Pederson accounted for four points as each had two goals and as many assists. Gernander's totals moved him into a tie for the team scoring lead with Peter Hankinson, who totaled just two assists in the three games. Both have 19 points. Pederson is next with 16 points while Scott Bloom and Miller are the only other Gophers in double figures with 10 points each. Miller added three assists to his first goal of the season playing in only the last two games of the non-conference week

## GOLDEN GOPHERS TO PLAY AT TOLEDO SATURDAY

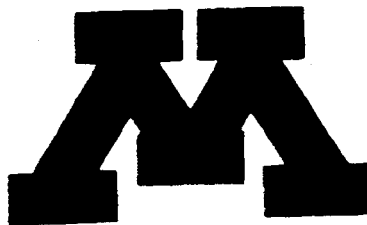

Jon Laster, 6-5 senior guard from Denver (CO) East High School, has signed a national basketball letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

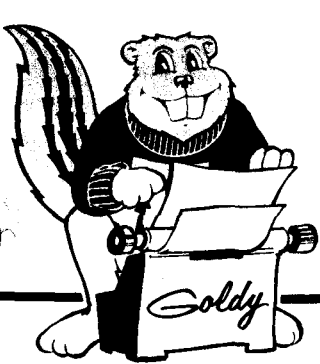
Laster joins 6-9 forward Chad Kolander from Owatonna (MN) High School as fall signees for the Golden Gophers.

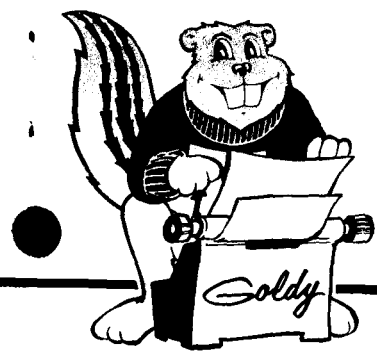

## GOLDEN GOPHERS TO HOST IOWA STATE

This week will be another challenging one for the University of Minnesota basketball team which faces two major assignments, and the first of those falls into that category of "test" quite appropriately.

It is fall-quarter exam week at the U of M, and the Golden Gophers initially will face that task with full attention. It will make for a disrupted practice week for Coach Clem Haskins, but his charges will work around it as they prepare for their next on-the-court foe.

And that will come Saturday when Minnesota plays host to the Iowa State Cyclones of the Big Eight Conference in a 7:00 p.m. non-conference confrontation at Williams Arena.

Coach Johnny Orr.....Minnesota fans will remember him from his highly-successful days at the University of Michigan.....will bring a 2-1 club to Williams Arena Saturday night. Iowa State topped Toledo 87-69 and Florida A&M 93-68 in its first two outings at home. But this past weekend the Cyclones invaded Michigan and dropped a 101-78 road decision to the Wolverines.

Minnesota and Iowa State have met 22 times in basketball over the years, and the Golden Gophers will take an edge of 14-8 in the series into Saturday's confrontation. Minnesota is 3-5 in games played at Ames, but they are 11-3 in shootouts at Minneapolis. The Golden Gophers have won nine and lost three in series games in Williams Arena.

The last meeting between these two clubs took place in Williams Arena in 1984 and the Golden Gophers prevailed 66-64. Iowa State's most recent win in the series was by an 80-78 margin at Ames in 1983.

Thus far this season the Cyclones and Golden Gophers have had only one common opponent, and they both notched victories. As indicated, ISU topped Toledo by 18 points at home while Minnesota downed that same club by 15 (85-70) at Toledo last weekend.

It was the second win of the week for Minnesota which earlier had beaten Chicago State 85-62, and according to Coach Haskins, both of those triumphs were enjoyable. "Both were great wins for us," Coach Haskins said, "especially that one at

Toledo which we hope will help show people that we can win on the road. I was pleased with our effort in both games, and we used aggressive rebounding, excellent defense and balanced scoring to get both of them."

Richard Coffey drew special praise for his defense and rebounding. He had 14 boards in the Chicago State encounter and added 13 more at Toledo. In the balanced scoring department, Minnesota had five players in double figures against Chicago State (Melvin Newbern led with 17) and four at Toledo (Willie Burton set the pace with 22).

But Haskins also was pleased with the fact that Minnesota out-rebounded Toledo by a 2-1 margin in the second half, and that Walter Bond had 15 of his 17 points in the second half at Toledo, and that Minnesota had 16 assists.

"This ballclub works very hard," Haskins emphasized, "and they are totally unselfish individually." He hopes those attributes will help the Golden Gophers when Iowa State invades Williams Arena Saturday night.

## ICERS FINALLY GAIN SWEEP, HOST MTU SAT-SUN.

Minneapolis, MN---It was a long time coming, but last weekend saw the Minnesota hockey Gophers record their first series sweep of the 1989-90 season.

Minnesota, 7-6-2 overall and 6-4-2 for a WCHA third place tie, took both games at Mariucci Arena from the Denver Pioneers, 9-8 and 5-3.

That was last week. Now Minnesota must contend with Michigan Tech's (4-12-0, 3-10-0) visit to Mariucci Arena for 1:35 p.m. games Saturday and Sunday. WAYL-980 AM and KSTP-1500 AM radio will air both games live with KITN-TV, Ch. 29, telecasting Saturday's contest.

The series with Denver offered a marked contrast in hockey between the first and second games. Friday's contest was, to say the least, a pure shootout. Minnesota poured 41 shots on the Denver goal tender while the Pioneers took aim 34 times on Gopher freshman goalie Tom Newman.

It was another freshman, however, who made the final difference Friday. With just over five minutes remaining and the score tied 8-8, defenseman Travis Richards broke in along off the left boards, faked a shot, pulled the puck around the goalie to the right side and scored the game winner off a backhand shot.

That marked the fifth lead change of the game as both teams almost scored at will. Minnesota twice owned two-goal leads at 3-1 and 7-5, but each time the Pioneers roared back to either tie or take a brief lead of their own.

Strangely enough, only one Minnesota player, sophomore wing Cory Laylin, was able to score more than one goal. Laylin counted his 6th and 7th goals of the season in the first two periods. Ken Gernander and Jason Miller each had a goal and two assists Friday.

Saturday's game was the case of Minnesota having waited the last three years for one player to bloom. And that's just what senior center Scott Bloom did by scoring his first collegiate hat trick in leading the Gophers to a 5-3 victory.

After Minnesota had fallen behind Denver 3-1 early in the second period, the rest of that portion of the game belong to the swift Burnsville product. It was Bloom who accounted for the next three goals, a "natural" hat trick. He scored one from the right corner at 13:24 on a shot that bounced in off a DU defender, scored again on a wicked screen shot from the slot at 16:53, and the last one on a fly pattern from the right side at 19:42. Each of his last two goals were unassisted.

Bloom also assisted on Minnesota's first goal of the game by Peter Hankinson to end the weekend with four points, high for the Gophers. Senior Brett Strot scored Minnesota's final goal in the third period. Bloom is now 4th in scoring among his teammates with 15 points (9-6) in 12 games. Peter Hankinson continues to lead UM with 23 points (7-16) with Gernander next (14-8=22) and defenseman Tom Pederson third (6-11=17)

Possibly the most appreciative of Bloom's scoring splurge was sophomore goalie Jeff Stolp who recorded his 4th win in the Gopher nets this season. It marked a second straight strong showing for Stolp who had sat out five straight games following a run of bad luck.

Friday's game was the 150th WCHA contest for Gopher head coach Doug Woog. Now in his fifth season behind the Gopher bench, Woog's teams have provided him with 110 wins and five ties for a winning mark of .745% in league contests. Within that healthy winning mark are WCHA championships the last two years following two second place finishes.

"There were already seven gymnasts on the squad (top seven from last summer's U.S. Championships where John finished ninth), and these five join them and will be on the team until the National Championships in June. John did a terrific job coming back from eighth after the first day and performed wonderfully. Most likely he'll now get to compete in an international competition sometime before next June."

**Caputo 18th, Zimpfer Injured:** Junior **Jay Caputo** (Longwood, FL) finished 18th overall in the competition, while senior **Dan Zimpfer** (Kent, OH) suffered a pulled pectoral muscle on Friday and was forced to the sidelines. It was not a serious injury, although he is expected to be sidelined for three-four weeks.

**See You Next Year:** The Golden Gophers will open their regular season on January 12 against Michigan State in East Lansing. The following day they will take on Michigan in Ann Arbor.

## **SIXTH-RANKED GOLDEN GOPHER WRESTLING TEAM SHUTS OUT NORTH DAKOTA; FALLS TO NO. 13 NORTHERN IOWA**

After falling 23-15 to No. 13 Northern Iowa in the dual meet season opener in Cedar Falls on Wednesday, the sixth-ranked Golden Gopher wrestling team bounced back convincingly with a 53-0 thrashing of North Dakota in the U of M Field House Saturday night.

**The Big Three:** Senior **Chuck Heise** (Mosinee, WI) at 142, junior **Marty Morgan** (Bloomington, MN) moving up to 190 and senior **Jeff Balcom** (Fairmont, MN) at heavyweight continued to lead the Golden Gophers. Heise defeated Steve Hartle from Northern Iowa 16-7 and then topped Kris Presler, an outstanding performer for North Dakota, 10-3. Morgan scored a 15-6 victory over Rich Powers from Northern Iowa and then took just 2:04 to pin Lee Werchau from North Dakota on Saturday. Balcom posted a 16-7 win over Dave Williams from Northern Iowa on Wednesday, and then came back with a 16-5 victory over North Dakota's Jair Toedter on Saturday.

**Just Wait:** It's no secret that the Golden Gophers will take their lumps during the early season, but will become a much stronger squad during the second semester. That's when junior **Dave Zuniga** (Worland, WY), a transfer from Utah State where he was an NCAA qualifier, and **Chris Short** (Inver Grove Heights, MN), a sophomore who is ranked No. 1 in the country at 190 pounds, will become eligible for the Golden Gophers.

**Heading West:** After a week away from competition because of final exams, the Golden Gophers will be westward bound, taking on Brigham Young and Portland State in Provo, UT on December 12 and then facing Boise State the next day in Boise.

**National Poll:** The Golden Gophers are ranked No. 6 in the latest Amateur Wrestling News national poll released November 28. Heise, Morgan, Short and Balcom also appeared in the individual rankings as well.

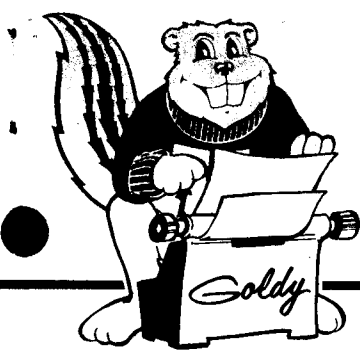

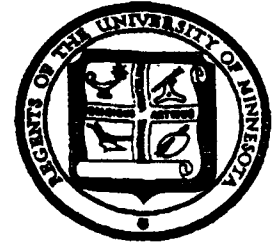

The Golden Gopher Basketball team turned in an impressive performance last Saturday against Iowa State. Five players finished in double figures with Melvin Newbern topping the list with 22. The Golden Gophers shot 72% from the field in the second half and finished the game at 57%. Minnesota out-rebounded Iowa State 41-35 with Willie Burton leading the pack with 7. Kevin Lynch led the team with 7 assists and was also good for 19 points.



## GOLDEN GOPHERS FACE TWO ROAD ASSIGNMENTS

Two extremely difficult non-conference road assignments are next in line for the University of Minnesota basketball team. After invading The University of Detroit on Wednesday, Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gophers will play at Kansas State Saturday.

Tip-off time for the mid-week shootout at Cobo Arena in Detroit is 7:30 p.m. (EST). The assignment at Kansas State in Manhattan, KA, on Saturday is scheduled for 8:00 (CST).

Neither opponent is a stranger to the University of Minnesota. Detroit and UM have met 11 times since the series got its start during the 1964-65 season, and the Golden Gophers will take a 9-2 edge into Wednesday's contest.

Oddly enough, the two Titan wins in the series have come in Minneapolis, and that means Minnesota is 5-0 in games played in Detroit.....although they have yet to play in Cobo Arena.

The last meeting between these two clubs took place a year ago when Minnesota

prevailed 93-69 in Williams Arena. The Titans tuned up for Wednesday's contest by downing Chicago State 81-70.

Then on Saturday the Golden Gophers will face a Wildcat contingent for the 15th time in a series that began during the 1936-37 campaign. A year ago these two rivals met during regular-season play and Minnesota prevailed 72-67 at Williams Arena. Then the Cats and Golden Gophers battled it out again in the opening round of the NCAA tournament at Greensboro, NC, and Haskins' charges won again, that time 86-75.

Minnesota has played in Manhattan four times, and it is 2-2 there.....but it has never performed in Kansas State's new Bramlage Coliseum which opened a year ago. The most-recent win for the Golden Gophers at Kansas State was by a 60-59 margin during the 1966-67 campaign.

Haskins' contingent came into the week with an overall record of 3-1 after stopping Iowa State 98-82 at Williams Arena last Saturday night. It gave the Golden

Gophers a three-game win string, and it was done in impressive fashion without the services of Richard Coffey who was on the sidelines with a broken nose.

Openly pleased about the win, Haskins said, "This is the first time since last March that I truly smiled after a game." And he had every right to smile as the game statistics pointed out.

Five players finished in double figures with Melvin Newbern topping the list at 22. The Golden Gophers shot 72% from the field in the second half and finished with a 57% effort. Minnesota out-rebounded Iowa State 41-35 behind Willie Burton's seven, and it had 23 "unselfish" assists as Kevin Lynch set the pace with seven.

"We were concerned about playing a game at the end of final exam week," Haskins admitted, but the way our people played shows the kind of class and character that they have." But as pleased as he was, he knew what was ahead. "A tough road trip," he predicted, and the smile turned to a frown.

## ICERS TIE FOR WCHA LEAD, GAIN WEEK'S REST

Minneapolis, MN---Minnesota's hockey Gophers surprised a lot of people recently by running their winning streak to five straight, and in the process tying Minnesota-Duluth and Wisconsin for first place in the WCHA.

The Gophers, 9-6-2 overall and 8-4-2 for 18 WCHA points, now take a midseason breather after completing half their 28-game league schedule. Coach Doug Woog ordered everyone away from Mariucci Arena ice this week as Minnesota does not play again until Dec. 22-23.

That weekend, however, provides a rematch of last year's NCAA championship game when the Harvard Crimson visits Mariucci. Last March Harvard edged Minnesota 4-3 in overtime at the Saint Paul Civic Center to win their first ever NCAA ice crown.

The WCHA race at midpoint is, to say the least, jumbled. Only five points separate the first six teams. The top clubs, as mentioned, have 18 points. Close behind, however, are Northern Michigan with 15, North Dakota at 14, and Colorado College 13. Only one WCHA series remains before the first of the year as Denver visits North Dakota this weekend.

Minnesota closed out its first half of the WCHA season by recording its second straight home series sweep. The Gophers began the weekend breaking from a 5-5 tie on third period goals by Jon Anderson and Ben Hankinson to win 7-5 Saturday afternoon.

The next afternoon saw some strange fireworks as Minnesota rallied from a 3-0 deficit to win 10-3. The rally included a school record-tying eight goals in the second period. This feat had been accomplished twice before in Gopher ice history: at Colorado College in 1947, and again at Michigan in 1979.

Peter Hankinson, Larry Olimb and Jason Miller scored in the first five minutes of the second period to equal Michigan Tech's first period output. After Ken Gernander scored his first of two goals to put Minnesota into the lead for good at 10:59 of the same period, the Gophers added four more scores in the final eight minutes.

Dean Williamson got the fifth Gopher goal before Gernander, Grant Bischoff and Scott Bloom completed the record-tying efforts. Ben Hankinson and Trent Klatt completed Minnesota's scoring with third period goals. It marked the first time in 80 games that Minnesota reached double scoring digits as nine different players recorded goals.

Bloom, who ended the weekend with six points (3G, 3A) to lead all UM scorers, tallied two goals Saturday. Jeff Stolp anchored the UM nets to win Saturday's contest, but ran into trouble in the first period Sunday. After allowing all three of Tech's opening period goals in the first 15 minutes, Stolp was pulled in favor of freshman Tom Newman who shut out the Huskies the remainder of the afternoon to gain his fourth win of the campaign.

For the weekend, Minnesota placed 103 shots on overworked MTU goalie Damien Rhodes who played brilliantly, but mostly had to try and do it all by himself.

Gopher team scoring leader Peter Hankinson tallied five points last weekend (2G, 3A) upping his season totals to 9G and 19A for 28 points. Gernander remained in second place with 25 points (16-9) with his 16 goals topping his teammates. Bloom, on a torrid scoring pace the last two weeks, jumped into third place (12-9=21).

Following Harvard's invasion of Mariucci Arena, Minnesota, after a Christmas break, travels to Orono, ME, to play in Maine's Dexter Shoe Classic tournament Dec. 29-30. Minnesota meets St. Lawrence in the first round with host Maine playing Bowling Green. Winners and losers play the next day.

## SIXTH-RANKED GOLDEN GOPHER WRESTLING TEAM HEADS WEST FOR THREE MATCHES THIS WEEK

After a week away from competition because of final exams, the Golden Gophers will be westward bound, taking on Brigham Young and Portland State in Provo, UT on Tuesday and then facing Boise State on Wednesday in Boise.

**The Scouting Report:** Boise State finished 26th and Brigham Young 39th at the 1989 NCAA Championships. The Golden Gophers were seventh in the final team standings. Portland State, meanwhile, is the defending NCAA Division II champions and head coach Marlin Grahn's squad returns a total of six individual national titlists. Leading the way is junior Dan Russell, honored as the outstanding wrestler of the tournament at the national meet last year. He is ranked No. 4 overall (all divisions) in the most recent Amateur Wrestling News' national rankings. He is the brother of Golden Gopher sophomore, Joe Russell (Portland, OR), who is presently sidelined with a knee injury.

**Last Time Out:** After falling 23-15 to No. 13 Northern Iowa in the dual meet season opener in Cedar Falls on November 29, the sixth-ranked Golden Gopher bounced back convincingly with a 53-0 thrashing of North Dakota in the U of M Field House on December 2 to even their season dual meet record at 1-1.

**The Big Three:** Senior Chuck Heise (Mosinee, WI) at 142, junior Marty Morgan (Bloomington, MN) moving up to 190 and senior Jeff Balcom (Fairmont, MN) at heavyweight continued to lead the Golden Gophers. Heise defeated Steve Hartle from Northern Iowa 16-7 and then topped Kris Presler, an outstanding performer for North Dakota, 10-3. Morgan scored a 15-6 victory over Rich Powers from Northern Iowa and then took just 2:04 to pin Lee Werchau from North Dakota on Saturday. Balcom posted a 16-7 win over Dave Williams from Northern Iowa on Wednesday, and then came back with a 16-5 victory over North Dakota's Jair Toedter on Saturday.

**Just Wait:** It's no secret that the Golden Gophers will take their lumps during the early season, but will become a much stronger squad during the second semester. That's when junior Dave Zuniga (Worland, WY), a transfer from Utah State where he was an NCAA qualifier, and Chris Short (Inver Grove Heights, MN), a sophomore who is ranked No. 1 in the country at 190 pounds, will become eligible for the Golden Gophers.

**National Poll:** The Golden Gophers are ranked No. 6 in the latest Amateur Wrestling News national poll released November 28. Heise, Morgan, Short and Balcom also appeared in the individual rankings as well.

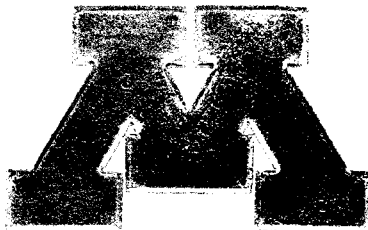

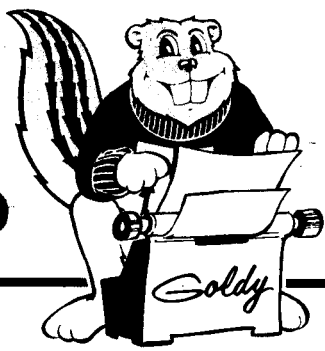

Washington has played in Williams Arena 3 times and is 2-1 on the Gopher's floor. The upcoming Washington game marks the beginning of a five game home stand for the Golden Gophers.



## GOLDEN GOPHERS PREPARE FOR 5-GAME HOME STAND

Minnesota's Golden Gophers open a five-game home stand Wednesday when hosting the University of Washington Huskies in a non-conference, inter-sectional basketball matchup at 6:30 p.m. in Williams Arena.

Then on Saturday Coach Clem Haskins' upstart cagers will entertain the Huskies of Northern Illinois University in another non-loop affair scheduled to get underway at 1:00 p.m.

The Golden Gophers are slated to host Youngstown State on December 30 and Rider College on January 3 in similar non-conference assignments before opening Big Ten play in Williams Arena on January 6 against Illinois.

It's a challenging 18-day holiday span for Minnesota, and it could serve as a gauge for Golden Gopher fans....and prognosticators....anxious to determine if the 1989-90 contingent is for real.

Minnesota comes into Wednesday's clash against Washington of the Pac Ten with a 5-1 record after chalking up two more victo-

ries on the road last week. First Minnesota won 89-61 at Detroit and then triumphed 69-68 at Kansas State.

Coach Haskins was, and had a right to be, overjoyed with those two victories which gave the Golden Gophers their third straight road triumph....their longest away-from-home win string in his four-year rein at Minnesota.

The verticts also made it five triumphs in a row for the Golden Gophers and, oddly enough, the gut-wrenching win at Kansas State was Minnesota's third victory in less than one calendar year over those same wildcats.

"We got balanced scoring in both of those road wins," Haskins pointed out, "and that really made a difference." Minnesota had four players in double figures in both contests. "We also got some good help from our bench, and while our shot selection was improved and our offensive execution better, it was the defense that really turned things our way." And now Haskins brings his cagers home. Wednesday's starters? Or Saturday's?

Melvin Newbern who had 20 at KSU and Kevin Lynch who chipped in with 14, had six rebounds and added four assists, again will open at the guard spots. Jim Shikenjanski also appears set at center.

But at forward Minnesota fans must "wait and see" what happens. Willie Burton and Walter Bond got the call in both of the road wins last week, but Richard Coffey played 24 minutes in relief at Kansas State after missing two games with a broken nose.

The Golden Gophers have had 13 previous meetings with Washington and trail 8-5 in the series. Minnesota has downed Northern Illinois two previous confrontations.

Minnesota last faced Washington during the 1964-65 season in the Los Angeles Classic and triumphed 77-76. The Golden Gophers knocked off Northern Illinois 93-74 at DeKalb last December. Washington has played in Williams Arena three times in the past and is 1-2 on the Golden Gophers' floor. Northern Illinois fell 63-57 during the 1974-75 season on its' only other visit to Minnesota.

## ICERS RETURN, HOST HARVARD F-S

Minneapolis, MN---Near the end of March of this year, the U. of Minnesota hockey Gophers were, according to some, favored to win a particular game. In fact, it was THE game. But it was not to be.

When the ice chips had settled in the Saint Paul Civic Center, the score read Harvard 4, Minnesota 3 in overtime. Harvard had won its first ever NCAA men's ice hockey championship. Minnesota was down, but far from out, for the game was already being called the finest example of skill hockey ever seen in a championship meeting.

Still, the hurt lingered until the start of this season. But Harvard and Minnesota got off to rocky starts in their respective 1989-90 campaigns. Then both began to pick up steam at about the same time. Now both are back to winning.

So what better time to renew this highly respected rivalry than during the Christmas holiday season. Which means, Harvard visits Minnesota's Mariucci Arena Friday and Saturday for non-conference clashes against Minnesota.

Game times are slated for 7:05 p.m. Friday and 3:35 p.m. Saturday. The latter game was originally scheduled for Saturday evening, but changed so the Harvard travel party would not have to fly home on Christmas Eve Day. KITN-TV, Ch. 29, will carry both games live with WAYL-980 AM going live Friday and on tape delay Saturday because of a schedule conflict.

Minnesota, after a full week off the ice due to having made the trip to Europe in early September, returned to practice Monday. The Gopher lineup this weekend, however, will be minus three regulars who are with the U.S. National Team at the World Junior Championships in Helsinki, Finland.

Sophomore goalie Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk), sophomore wing Cory Laylin (Warroad) and freshman defenseman Doug Zmolek (Rochester) left the Twin Cities today to join their teammates for the trip abroad. Harvard also has two players on the U.S. Team, including goalie Chuckie Hughes and center Ted Drury, plus one player, defenseman Kevin Sneed, who is on the Canadian Junior team. The Crimson may also be without forward Ted Donato who has been slowed by injury. Donato, as Minnesota well remembers, was named MVP of the NCAA tournament last spring.

Bill Cleary tied for the most wins by a coach in Harvard history last weekend when the Crimson defeated Dartmouth 7-2. Cleary, in his 19th season, is 315-192-22. This year's team is 4-5-1.

On the other side of the rink finds Gopher head coach Doug Woog who owns a 9-6-2 season record, and is 8-4-2 good for 18 WCHA points and a three-way tie for first place with Minnesota-Duluth and Wisconsin. Now in his 5th year behind the UM bench, Woog's record reads 146-54-6.

## HERBEL HONORED ON ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA FOOTBALL TEAM

Senior punter Brent Herbel (Grafton, ND) has been named to the first-team GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America football team.

Voted on by the College Sports Information Directors of America, the award honors student-athletes for excellence both on the field and in the classroom. Herbel joins former Golden Gophers Barry Mayer (1970, running back), Bob Stein (1968, end), Frank Brixius (1960, tackle) and Bob Hobert (1956, tackle) as winners of the prestigious award.

Herbel was the Golden Gophers' regular punter the past four seasons. He punted a school record 212 times for 8,204 yards, an average of 38.7 during his career. A second-team All-Big Ten choice in 1988, he is a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and has been honored on the District 5 All-Academic team the past two seasons. A biology/pre-med major with a 3.26 cumulative grade point average (GPA), Herbel is also a Williams Scholar at Minnesota, was a Honda-Scholar Athlete Award winner and is a candidate for an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.

"We're extremely proud of Brent," says Brian Berube, academic counselor for the Golden Gopher football squad. "He is certainly deserving of this award. It's another in a long line of accomplishments for

"Brent Herbel came to Minnesota as a place kicker and was beat out for the job by Chip Lohmiller who is now with the NFL Washington Redskins," says Minnesota head football coach John Gutekunst. "Through hard work and determination, Herbel not only became an excellent punter, but he also gave us a flawless four-year performance of holding for placements.

"Brent was always a leader by example during our off-season conditioning programs, too, just as much as he was in the classroom. He was an inspiration to everyone in our program."

Herbel's award capped off an outstanding fall season for the Golden Gophers. The cross country team, with five freshmen in their seven-man lineup, finished third at the Big Ten Championships held on October 28 in Madison, WI. In addition, head coach Roy Griak's squad landed six team members on the Academic All-Big Ten Team, more than any other school in the league.

The football squad wrapped up its third winning season in the past four years with a 6-5 mark this fall. On top of that, football placed six members on the Academic All-Big Ten Team. The total of 12 Golden Gopher student-athletes from the two sports receiving the honor was also more than any other conference school.

Minneapolis, MN---University of Minnesota head football coach John Gutekunst (GUTE-eh-kunst) and five, possibly six, members of his 1989 varsity football team are headed for all-star bowl games the next few weeks.

Gutekunst and University of Oregon head coach Rich Brooks were named coaches for the Blue squad at the annual Blue-Gray Classic, December 25, at Montgomery, AL. Brooks will coach the offense and Gutekunst the defense. Dick Biddle, defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Golden Gophers, will assist Gutekunst in coaching the Blue Team.

Two of Minnesota's senior players, wide receiver Chris Gaiters (Zanesville, OH) and defensive end Eddie Miles (Miami, FL), have been selected to play in the Blue-Gray Classic. They, too, will be with the Blue Team.

Three more seniors, possibly four, have been invited to play in the Senior Bowl at Mobile, AL, January 20. On the North Team roster will be record-setting running back Darrell Thompson (Rochester), linebacker Ron Goetz (Waconia) and offensive tackle Jon Melander (Fridley).

One more Gopher senior, linebacker Jon Leverenz (Ankeny, IA), will join his teammates if he is pronounced physically able to play by the Gopher medical staff. Leverenz was sidelined a good part of the 1989 season by a knee injury.

Thompson completed his four-year career at Minnesota as the school's all-time rushing leader. He totaled 4,518 yards, and scored 43 touchdowns and 260 points, also UM records. He rushed for more than 1,000 yards in three of his four seasons, and remains the only Big Ten player to ever gain more than 1,000 yards on the ground in his freshman and sophomore seasons.

**Quackenbush To Go Down Under:** Sophomore **Sean Quackenbush** (Rochester, MN) will compete for the U.S. National Team in an international meet against Australia once he gets back from Florida. The team is scheduled to depart for Perth on December 27, returning a week later. He is slated to swim the 100 and 200 butterfly, as well as the 200 freestyle. An honorable mention All-American who was also named Freshman-of-the-Championship at the Big Ten Meet as a rookie a year ago for the Golden Gophers, he was a finalist in the 100 meter butterfly at last summer's U.S. Long Course National Championships in Los Angeles, CA.

## **GOLDEN GOPHER WRESTLERS SWEEP THREE MATCHES ON WESTERN SWING**

After taking a week off for final exams, the 11th-ranked Golden Gopher wrestling team returned to action by sweeping three matches against western opponents last week. Minnesota won two matches on Tuesday, defeating Brigham Young 26-10 and Portland State, the defending NCAA Division II champions, 32-10. Wednesday night the Gophers traveled to Boise State, where they downed the host Broncos 30-13. The Gophers ran their dual record to 5-1 with the three wins.

**Next Up:** After taking two weeks off for the holidays, the Golden Gophers' next action will come at the Midlands Championships on December 29-30 at Evanston, IL, hosted by Northwestern University. After the New Year begins, the Gophers will compete in the Arizona State Duals at Tempe, AZ on January 3.

**The Big Three:** Gophers **Marty Morgan** (Bloomington, MN), **Chuck Heise** (Mosinee, WI), and **Jeff Balcom** (Fairmont, MN) are all ranked in the top 10 nationally, and all three continued to turn in outstanding performances on the western trip. Morgan and Balcom each recorded three wins, while Heise was 2-1, suffering his first loss of the year. Morgan, a junior and a 1989 All-America, was dominant at 177 pounds, pinning two opponents and defeating his third opponent by a score of 18-7. One of his pins was over Tony Champion of Portland State, who actually was a champion last year in winning the NCAA Division II title. Senior Balcom, runner-up at heavyweight at the Big Ten tournament a year ago, also posted three easy wins on the trip. Heise, a senior who was redshirted a year ago, suffered his first loss of the year to Robbie Winter of Brigham Young, dropping a 4-3 decision. Heise bounced back, however, to defeat Portland State's James Sisson, a defending NCAA Division II champion, by a score of 7-5.

**Strong Top to Bottom:** The Gophers received strong performances throughout the lineup during their western swing, with a total of eight wrestlers recording at least two wins in the three duals. Aside from Balcom, Heise, and Morgan, Gopher standouts included sophomore **Joe Reasbeck** (Superior, WI), who was 3-0 at 158; sophomore **Ben Morris** (Wooddale, IL), 2-0-1 at 118; freshman **Brad Gibson** (Chokio, MN), 2-1 at 190; sophomore **Shannon Ward** (Irving, TX), 2-1 at 134; and sophomore **Scott Rohrer** (Waupun, WI), 2-1 at 126.

**Just Wait:** Although the Gophers have performed well during the early part of the season, they should become an even stronger squad during the second semester. That's when junior **Dave Zuniga** (Worland, WY), a transfer from Utah State where he was an NCAA qualifier, and **Chris Short** (Inver Grove Heights, MN), a sophomore who is ranked No. 1 in the country at 190 pounds, will become eligible for the Golden Gophers.

**National Rankings:** The Golden Gophers are ranked No. 11 in the latest Amateur Wrestling News national poll released on December 13. Short, Morgan, Heise, and Balcom also appeared in the individual rankings as well.

## **U. OF MINNESOTA FOOTBALL/BASKETBALL RADIO CONTRACT AWARDED**

Minneapolis, MN---Rick Bay, University of Minnesota Director of Men's Athletics, announced today that WCCO Radio has been awarded a five-year contract for exclusive broadcast rights to Golden Gopher football and basketball games beginning in the fall of 1990.

The contractual agreement also gives Midwest Radio Networks (MRN) the right to distribute men's football and basketball broadcasts throughout the Upper Midwest, and authorizes Dave Mona Sports Marketing of Bloomington to be the athletic department's exclusive agent in procuring corporate sponsorships and the selling of advertising in game programs and other allied publications.

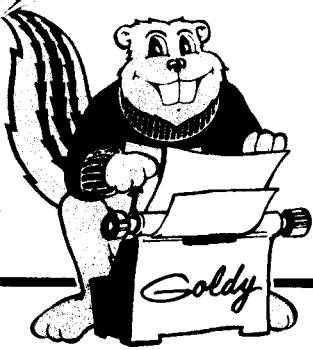
MRN, an operating unit of Midwest Communications, Inc., had distributed WCCO's Gopher football broadcasts to a network of 22 radio stations in the Upper Midwest the past three seasons. Included in the network have were affiliates in Duluth, St. Cloud, Fargo/Moorhead, and Grand Forks, ND.

"We are both pleased and excited about this joint venture with one of the nation's great radio stations, and one of the best marketing and public relations agencies in the country," Bay said today. "We are confident we can significantly increase our profits and enhance the quality of both our product and services to advertisers and sponsors under the terms of this agreement."
