WOLF SIGNS WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

Ryan Wolf, a 6-foot-4, 185-pound guard from Martinsville (IN) High School, has signed a national basketball letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

"Ryan will be a nice addition to our backcourt," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins. "He is an excellent outside shooter and three-point threat, and that's something we'll need next season with the loss of Kevin Lynch. On top of that, he is a committed student-athlete who strives to excel not only on the basketball court, but in the classroom as well."

A four-year starter, Wolf broke Jerry Sichting's all-time school scoring record (1,240) by registering 1,792 points during his prep career. A two-year all-state choice and three-time all-conference selection, he averaged 18 points a game in four seasons at Martinsville.

Wolf averaged 25.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.1 assists and 3.6 steals a game as a senior, while shooting 54 percent overall from the field, 48 percent from three-point range and 81 percent from the free throw line. He helped lead Martinsville, the hometown of coaching great John Wooden, to a 21-2 overall record, the team title at the prestigious Hall of Fame Holiday Classic Tournament and the South Central Conference championship. The Artesians were the top-ranked team in the state for much of the season and climbed as high as No. 14 in the USA Today national prep poll.

In the annual Indiana East-West All-Star Classic held recently at the Hulman Center on the campus of Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Wolf scored 17 points to lead the West to a 91-80 victory. As a junior, he helped lead Martinsville to the league championship and then to within one game of Indiana's Final Four, when he averaged 21 points a contest for the Artesians.

"Ryan has worked very hard to get where he's at," said his father and Martinsville Head Coach Tim Wolf. "He's not only a great shooter, but a smart player as well. He grew up in the gym and as a result he understands the game very well. Minnesota is definitely a class program and this is a great opportunity for him."

Wolf becomes the fourth player to sign a national basketball letter of intent with the University of Minnesota this year. David Grim, a 6-foot-7, 205-pound forward from Washington High School in Massillon, OH, Josh Nichols, a 6-foot-6, 185-pound forward from Jackson (MI) High School and Jayson Walton, a 6-foot-5, 200-pound forward from Kimball High School in Dallas, TX, signed with the Golden Gophers during the early signing period last fall.

UNIVERSITY RECEIVES GIFT OF \$100,000 FROM CALVIN GRIFFITH

Minneapolis, Minnesota - Men's Athletic Director Rick Bay today announced the receipt of a major gift from Calvin Griffith, former owner of the Minnesota Twins. Griffith, a long-time friend of former University Baseball Coach Dick Siebert, has made a gift of \$100,000 to Men's Intercollegiate Athletics to endow a scholarship to be offered through the baseball program.

According to Bay, the gift will establish the Calvin Griffith Endowment Fund. The interest from the fund will provide a scholarship and support the educational expenses for the catcher on the University's baseball team beginning next year and on into the future. "I am delighted to have the Griffith name associated with the University of Minnesota and our baseball program," Bay said in making the announcement. "Mr. Griffith's generous gift is testimony not only to his long-time friendship with Dick Siebert, but to his respect for the exceptional quality of our program under John Anderson. I believe Calvin's gift is also reflective of his understanding of the importance of the University and its intercollegiate ahtletics program to this state and this community." Anderson indicated it is the department's goal to eventually endow all starting positions on the baseball team.

"Calvin is aware of how important it is for us to address the educational expenses of the athletes in our program on an ongoing basis," said John Anderson, the University's head baseball coach. "It is our hope that Calvin's gift will be a stimulus for other major gifts to the baseball program and will build a solid endowment program that will enhance our strong Minnesota baseball tradition."

Griffith, who sold his interest in the Minnesota Twins in 1984, is now retired and lives in Indialantic, Florida.

STUDENT-ATHLETES RECORD OUTSTANDING WINTER QUARTER

The University of Minnesota men's athletics department charted one of the finest academic quarters in the history of the program this past winter.

During the winter quarter just completed, Golden Gopher men's student-athletes charted an overall GPA of 2.65, which is the third highest ever recorded. A total of 129 student-athletes out of 358, or 36 percent, finished the quarter with a 3.0 average or better, and 14 of those, or four percent, recorded a perfect 4.0 GPA. The tennis team led the way with a 3.15 GPA, while the Big Ten champion gymnastics squad also finished above the 3.0 mark at 3.04.

"I'm really proud and pleased with the progress the student-athletes are making in their academic pursuits," said Elayne Donahue, director of academic counseling. "To have done so well in the classroom during such a heavily competitive quarter athletically, is very good news. The student-athletes are working hard and it's paying off."

GOPHERS SPLIT WITH MICHIGAN ST.; TRAVEL TO IOWA FOR TWO BEFORE BIG TEN SIEBERT FIELD OPENER FRIDAY NIGHT

The University of Minnesota baseball team returned from a four-game road trip to East Lansing, MI with a split of the series. The split raises the Gophers overall record to 16-15, with a 4-4 mark in Big Ten play.

Spartan Split: The Gophers started strong in the opener of the four-game series when co-captain Jeff Monson (Bloomington, MN) hit a grand slam homerun, and centerfielder Ryan Lefebvre (Los Angeles, CA) added a two-run shot on the way to a 10-3 victory over the Spartans. Junior Scott Bakkum (LaCrosse, WI) picked up the win to raise his record to 4-2. In the second half of Saturday's doubleheader the Gophers were held to one run until the seventh inning when the Gophers allied for four runs in a 7-5 loss. The Gophers did not give up any extra base hits but committed a season-high four errors in allowing the Spartans seven runs on nine hits.

Monday Madness: Minnesota and Michigan State were rained out on Sunday so the games were played on Monday. The weather was not any better as the two teams battled in fifty mile an hour wind gusts and driving rain in the first game. The Spartans squeaked out three runs on seven hits as they held the Gophers to five hits and no runs in the 3-0 victory. In the night-cap the weather cleared and so did the dust off the Gophers bats as they opened up a 10-0 lead on the strength of co-captain John Kopfer's (Oconomowoc, WI) six RBI's while batting four for five. All of Kopfer's hits were for extra bases with three doubles and a homerun for the game. Adding additional muscle to the Gopher attack was Monson who was two for five with two doubles and scored three runs, while Joe Wallraf (Waukegan, IL) was two for four with a double and two RBI's. J. T. Gilbert (LaCrosse, WI) picked up his first win as a starter this year to raise his record to 2-1.

Next Up: The Gophers travel to Iowa Wednesday to take on the Hawkeyes in a doubleheader scheduled for a 1:00 p.m. start. The Hawkeyes were the 1990 regular season champs of the Big Ten but were knocked out of the Big Ten Tournament by Big Ten Champions, the fighting Illini. The Gophers lead the series 112-86-1, but the Hawkeyes took all four games from the Gophers last year.

Siebert Field Opener: Following the Iowa doubleheader the Gophers will finally return to the friendly confines of Siebert Field to open their Big Ten slate at home Friday night against the Ohio State Buckeyes. The Friday night contest is scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m. and be on a delayed telecast on Sports Channel of America. The Gophers record with Ohio State is 42-34 but in the last meeting between the two teams the Buckeyes prevailed 6-4 which knocked the Gophers from the Big Ten Tournament. The Buckeyes are the conference leaders as of 4/16/91 with a 10-2 record and are ranked in the top 15 in the country.

Gates on All-American Pace: Pre-season All-American Brent Gates (Grandville, MI) is on a record-breaking pace for the Maroon and Gold. He has set the Gophers career doubles record with 48 and has 11 this year. Currently batting at a .407 clip the switch-hitting shortstop is leading the team in every offensive category. If he continues at his current pace, Gates will be the first Gopher to bat over .400 since Terry Steinbach batted .402 for the 1982 season.

What A Schedule: The Golden Gophers once again have played one of the toughest schedules in the country. For starters, 26 of their first 33 games will be played on the road. The Gophers have played national powers Miami, Stanford, Wichita State, Notre Dame, UCLA, and Florida State. The Gophers have complete game victories against Miami (9-0 at Miami), and Stanford. The strength of this schedule will be important as the Gophers prepare for a run at the Big Ten title and a possible NCAA post-season berth.

SPRING FOOTBALL CLINIC ON TAP THIS WEEKEND

Another major scrimmage is on tap for the University of Minnesota football team Saturday, and it has been scheduled as part of the 1991 Golden Gopher Spring Football Clinic.

Activities get underway with registration Friday at 7:30 a.m. in the Bierman Football Complex. Lectures and demonstrations are scheduled throughout the day before the Minnesota High School Football Coaches Association holds its 27th annual Hall of Fame Banquet at the Radisson University Hotel Friday evening.

Lectures and demonstrations continue Saturday beginning at 9 a.m. before Coach John Gutekunst puts his Golden Gophers through their paces with a full-scale scrimmage beginning at 2:30 p.m.

This year's clinicians, in addition to Gutekunst and his staff, will include Coach De-Wayne Johnson from Anoka High School, Coach Steve Solem from Bird Island-Olivia-Lake Lillian High School, Coach Jim Perry from Fridley

High School and Coach Mark Trestman from the Minnesota Vikings.

The Golden Gophers battled through a gruelling scrimmage last Saturday, and Gutekunst termed the session productive. "It was a pretty impressive performance," he said, "especially considering the fact that we did not turn the ball over. We seem to be far ahead of where we were at this stage in spring practice of previous years."

Numbers certainly were a big part of things last weekend. Thirteen different Golden Gophers carried the ball, four different quarterbacks were used and a total of 16 gridders recorded pass receptions.

Chuck Rios (6-1, 210, So, Roseville, MN) led Minnesota's rushers with 109 yards in 10 carries. He also scored one touchdown on a 70-yard run and another on a nine-yard pass from Scott Eckers (6-4, 198, Fr, St. Louis Park, MN). Eckers was 12-of-14 for 141 yards and that one TD.

Veteran Marquel Fleetwood

(6-0, 191, Jr, Decatur, GA) was 6-of-8 for 91 yards and Minnesota's other touchdown via the airways.....a seven yarder to John Lewis (5-7, 171, Jr., Miami, FL).

Four Golden Gophers paced the receivers with three each....Lewis Garrison (5-11, 174, Fr., West DesMoines, IA) for 57 yards, Steve Cambrice (6-5, 210, So, Gretna, LA) for 40, Dan LiSanti (6-1, 194, Fr, NY, NY) for 33 and David Vertin 6-7, 248, Fr, Plymouth, MN) for 13.

"Fleetwood had an outstanding day," Gutekunst said, "and the second effort by some of the running backs, including Rios, was particularly noteworthy. LiSanti, among others, caught the ball well."

Now Gutekunst hopes those charges will be as impressive for the visiting coaches attending the clinic this weekend and for the fans attending the Spring Game Apr. 27. That's on tap at 3:30 p.m. on the infield of the new track facility at the Bierman complex. It will be part of Minnesota's All Sports Day.

WOLF SIGNS WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

Ryan Wolf, a 6-foot-4, 185-pound guard from Martinsville (IN) High School, has signed a national basketball letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

"Ryan will be a nice addition to our backcourt," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins. "He is an excellent outside shooter and three-point threat, and that's something we'll need next season with the loss of Kevin Lynch. On top of that, he is a committed student-athlete who strives to excel not only on the basketball court, but in the classroom as well."

A four-year starter, Wolf broke Jerry Sichting's all-time school scoring record (1,240) by registering 1,792 points during his prep career. A two-year all-state choice and three-time all-conference selection, he averaged 18 points a game in four seasons at Martinsville.

Wolf averaged 25.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.1 assists and 3.6 steals a game as a senior, while shooting 54 percent overall from the field, 48 percent from three-point range and 81 percent from the free throw line. He helped lead Martinsville, the hometown of coaching great John Wooden, to a 21-2 overall record, the team title at the prestigious Hall of Fame Holiday Classic Tournament and the South Central Conference championship. The Artesians were the top-ranked team in the state for much of the season and climbed as high as No. 14 in the USA Today national prep poll.

In the annual Indiana East-West All-Star Classic held recently at the Hulman Center on the campus of Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Wolf scored 17 points to lead the West to a 91-80 victory. As a junior, he helped lead Martinsville to the league championship and then to within one game of Indiana's Final Four, when he averaged 21 points a contest for the Artesians.

"Ryan has worked very hard to get where he's at," said his father and Martinsville Head Coach Tim Wolf. "He's not only a great shooter, but a smart player as well. He grew up in the gym and as a result he understands the game very well. Minnesota is definitely a class program and this is a great opportunity for him."

Wolf becomes the fourth player to sign a national basketball letter of intent with the University of Minnesota this year. David Grim, a 6-foot-7, 205-pound forward from Washington High School in Massillon, OH, Josh Nichols, a 6-foot-6, 185-pound forward from Jackson (MI) High School and Jayson Walton, a 6-foot-5, 200-pound forward from Kimball High School in Dallas, TX, signed with the Golden Gophers during the early signing period last fall.

STUDENT-ATHLETES RECORD OUTSTANDING WINTER QUARTER

The University of Minnesota men's athletics department charted one of the finest academic quarters in the history of the program this past winter.

During the winter quarter just completed, Golden Gopher men's student-athletes charted an overall GPA of 2.65, which is the third highest ever recorded. A total of 129 student-athletes out of 358, or 36 percent, finished the quarter with a 3.0 average or better, and 14 of those, or four percent, recorded a perfect 4.0 GPA. The tennis team led the way with a 3.15 GPA, while the Big Ten champion gymnastics squad also finished above the 3.0 mark at 3.04.

"I'm really proud and pleased with the progress the student-athletes are making in their academic pursuits," said Elayne Donahue, director of academic counseling. "To have done so well in the classroom during such a heavily competitive quarter athletically, is very good news. The student-athletes are working hard and it's paying off."

GOLDEN GOPHER TRACK & FIELD TEAM FINISHES FIFTH AT NEBRASKA INVITATIONAL

Sophomore Chris Murrell (Grand Island, NE) captured the high jump, and freshman Martin Eriksson (Stockholm, Sweden) and sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH) continued their assault on the school pole vault record, to pace the Golden Gopher track & field team to a fifth-place finish in the final team standings at the Nebraska Invitational in Lincoln last Saturday.

Welcome Home: A native of nearby Grand Island where he won the Nebraska state prep title as a senior in 1989, Chris Murrell returned home to win the meet's high jump crown for the second straight year with a leap of 6-10 3/4 last Saturday. Teammate Matt Burns (Cedar Rapids, IA), a freshman, was fourth in the event for the Golden Gophers with a jump of 6-7 1/2.

Flying High: Martin Eriksson and Justin Daler have been rewriting the school record book in the pole vault all season long and last Saturday both cleared 17-0 3/4 to crack the old outdoor school mark of 16-11 1/4 set by Eriksson at the Texas Relays on April 6. Pat Manson of Kansas won the event with a vault of 17-4 1/2, with Eriksson finishing second (fewer misses) and Daler third. Junior co-captain Ross Thompson (Esko, MN) finished ninth with a personal-best vault of 16-0 3/4. During the indoor season, Daler set a new school record of 17-10 1/4 en route to qualifying for the NCAA Championships, while Eriksson set a new freshman indoor record at 17-6 1/4.

Looking Good: The Golden Gophers turned in a number of other outstanding performances on the day. Sophomore Mark Narveson (Mankato, MN) placed second in the 1500 meters with a time of 3:53.7, sophomore Chad Goldstein (St. Louis Park, MN) was second in the shot put with a throw of 55-10, sophomore Doug Milkowski (Stevens Point, WI) was third in the 3000 meter steeplechase with a personal-best clocking of 9:32.6, freshman Jason Cole (Shelby, MT) placed third in the javelin with a toss of 182-9, and sophomore Curt Kotsonas (Chanhassen, MN) was fourth in the 10,000 meters with a personal-best of 31:49.32.

GOPHERS WIN THREE OF FOUR FROM OHIO STATE IN BIG TEN SIEBERT FIELD OPENER

The Golden Gopher baseball team finally opened up its 1991 Big Ten home slate by pounding out 42 hits and 34 runs in the first three games of the series defeating Ohio State by 15-6, 7-6, and 12-5 before losing the series finale on Sunday 6-0. The wins vaulted Minnesota into third place in the Big Ten at the end of Sunday's action.

Gopher Power Supply: The Gophers raised their overall record to 20-17 and their Big Ten record to 8-6. Offensively the Gophers were led by pre-season All-American shortstop Brent Gates (Grandville, MI), who was 7-14 for the weekend and is 11-20 in his last six Big Ten games with five RBIs and five doubles. Co-captain John Kopfer (Oconomowoc, WI) was right there with Gates, batting 7-14 for the weekend with five RBIs on two doubles and two home runs, including the game-winning two-run shot in the bottom half of the sixth inning in the first game of Saturday's doubleheader. Kopfer holds a slim lead in Big Ten batting over Gates with a .408 average to Gates .400 pace, and is pacing the team in doubles with 17.

More Power: The efforts of Gates and Kopfer should not overshadow the team's performance for the weekend as the Gophers batted 45-115, a .392 clip with 28 RBIs and 34 runs scored. Co-captain **Jeff Monson** (Bloomington, MN) had another strong weekend batting 6-14 with eight RBIs. Monson is tied for the team lead in home runs with five and is second only to Gates in total bases with 74 to the "Gator's" 92.

Mound Notes: The Gophers had some strong pitching performances over the weekend as Brent Davis (Minnetonka, MN), and Jeff Schmidt (LaCrosse, WI) each had complete game victories, while Scott Bakkum (LaCrosse, WI) picked up his fifth win of the season in five and two-thirds innings of action on Friday night. The Gophers also got a strong performance out of John Lowery (Shepherdstown, WV) on Sunday as he entered the game in relief and pitched three and one-third innings, giving up only one hit while striking out four.

Next Up: The Gophers continue Big Ten action this week as they play host to the Iowa Hawkeyes on Wednesday afternoon in a doubleheader slated to begin at 1:00 p.m. The Gophers split with the Hawkeyes last week at Iowa City by scores of 1-6, 6-3. Last season the Hawkeyes won all contests between the two teams, winning 13-0, 8-6, at Iowa City, and sweeping the series at Siebert Field 5-3, and 3-2. Those two losses were the Gopher's only two defeats at Siebert Field last year.

All Sports Day: The Gophers will host the University of St. Thomas Thursday night in non-conference action before hosting the Fighting Illini this coming weekend. Saturday will be Golden Gopher All-Sports Day with the Gophers and the Illini playing a split-doubleheader at 1:00 and 7:00 p.m. on Saturday at Siebert Field, with John Gutekunst's Golden Gopher football team playing its spring football game in between the two baseball games on the Bierman Track and Field facility infield. One ticket gets you into all three events and it promises to be a great day of Gopher sports. The Gophers will finish up the weekend series with the Illini on Sunday when they play a twinbill at 1:00 p.m.

Oh What a Schedule: The Ohio State Buckeyes came into Siebert Field with an outstanding record of 34-5, but the Gophers schedule which has now had them face top 25 foes in 17 of their 37 games, has finally paid off. The Golden Gophers have played highly-ranked Stanford, Miami, Florida State, Wichita State, Notre Dame, and Ohio State. The Gophers strength of schedule is the toughest in the Big Ten and should be an important factor as the Gophers make a run for NCAA post-season play.

That Siebert Field Magic: The Golden Gophers welcomed the return to Siebert Field with a battery of hits on Friday and Saturday. The Gophers always seem to find a way to win at Siebert Field. The team's Siebert Field record this season is 4-1 and over the last two seasons the Maroon and Gold has compiled an impressive 23-3 record within the friendly confines of this collegiate baseball classic.

Rookie Contributions: The Gophers are getting some great contributions from some newcomers to the team. Charlie Nelson (Perham, MN), a freshman outfielder has performed solidly in left field and is second on the team in batting to Gates with a .346 average. He also has seven stolen bases and has scored 28 times for the Maroon and Gold. in addition to Nelson, freshman second baseman Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) has seen more action lately. Merila has a sterling 1.000 fielding percentage in 20 games played and is hitting the ball hard while batting .225.

Doyle on the Rise: Rightfielder and DH Tom Doyle (Rapid City, SD) has settled down and is really starting to make contact with the ball. He went 6-12 for the weekend to raise his Big Ten average to .381. If this talented lefthander can continue to contribute it will give the Gophers one of the best lineups in the conference from the one spot to the number six spot.

Pitching Staff Notes: The Gophers deep pitching staff continues to improve and show consistency. The fine complete game performances by Davis and Schmidt gave the staff some time to rest after a grueling travel schedule in past weeks. They will need the rest as the Gophers dig into this big homestand. With seven games in five days starting Wednesday with Iowa, the Gophers will need some fine outings by this group to continue their winning ways.

Baseball Card Giveaway Continues: The Golden Gopher baseball card giveaway continues this week as the featured players for the Iowa doubleheader are Jeff Schmidt and Tom Doyle. The St. Thomas game features Eric Slagle (Barrington, II) and Keith Krenke (Owatonna, MN), while the Ilinois series has J.T Gilbert (LaCrosse, WI) and Scott Bakkum as the featured players. The Gophers will have a trading day on the final day of the regular season when the Gophers will be playing Michigan at Siebert Field.

If the fans who attend the game don't see a no-hitter they receive a free pass to the Northern Iowa game on Tuesday, April 30 at 7:00 p.m.

Last weekend St. Sauver was 7-of-10 for 166 yards and a touchdown while Eckers was 7-of-12 for 60 yards. Schaffner was 5-of-12 for 77 yards while Fleetwood was only 2-of- 6 for 9 yards.

Antonio Carter (6-1, 226, So, Columbus, OH) was the top rusher of the day with 63 yards in 10 carries. He also had a touchdown. Lewis Garrison (5-11, 174, Fr, West Des Moines, IA) was the leading receiver with three catches for 103 yards and a TD.

Defense held the upper hand in last weekend's affair, and Gutekunst was quick to point out that, "The defense made excellent progress." He also said, "They controlled things through the second half of the scrimmage. But offensively we have to remember that we can't have negative plays and expect to maintain any kind of ball control. We also have to set a goal of getting better every day."

As he looks ahead to the Spring Game on Saturday, Gutekunst indicated that the squad had suffered some injuries. "We're nicked up a little bit," he said, "and that is going to force us to make some adjustments for Saturday. But our people will make the game a competitive one."

MINNESOTA GYMNASTS FINISH FOURTH AT NCAA; ROETHLISBERGER WINS NCAA ALL-AROUND CHAMPIONSHIP

Minnesota just missed qualifying for the team finals at the 1991 NCAA Championships by a mere one-tenth of a point at University Park, PA, last weekend. It was the same margin by which they lost the National Championships to Nebraska last season in Williams Arena. Minnesota recorded a season high point total of 285.550 in prelims to finish fourth. Led by Nissen Award winner Jarrad Hanks, Oklahoma won its third gymnastics team title with a school record 288.025 points. Penn State was second with 285.500, UCLA was third with 284.825, Minnesota was fourth, followed by Stanford, Ohio State, Nebraska and Iowa.

But all was not lost, as sophomore John Roethlisberger (Afton, MN), who came back from an early season ankle injury, won the all-around competition with a score of 115.450 and tied for the parallel bars championships with UCLA's Scott Keswick with a score of 9.75. It was the Golden Gophers first NCAA Champion on an individual event since Kenneth Bartlett's still rings championship in 1953. It also marked the first NCAA individual champion for Head Coach Fred Roethlisberger. He also finished fifth on the still rings (9.825) and seventh on the floor exercise (9.625). Seniors Mike Farina (Mundelein, IL) and Jay Caputo (Longwood, FL) completed their senior seasons by finishing 14th (110.900) and 15th (110.775) respectively in the all-around competition. Farina also finished sixth on the pommel horse in the individual championships with a score of 9.575 and Caputo finished tied for third on the parallel bars with a score of 9.70. Sophomore Leif Carlson (Bloomington, MN) finished fourth on the horizontal bars with a score of 9.775. Minnesota's Roethlisberger, Caputo, Carlson and Farina were named to the gymnastics 1991 All-America team for their finishes in the individual events.

A total of 164 University of Minnesota student-athletes were honored on Tuesday evening at the second annual Scholar-Athlete Awards Reception at The Minneapolis Institute of Arts in Minneapolis.

To be honored as a scholar-athlete, one must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better and be a member of one of the Golden Gopher athletic teams. The total number of student-athletes honored has increased by 21 percent from a year ago, when 136 student-athletes earned the distinction. An aerospace engineering major in the Institute of Technology with a 3.91 GPA, Howatt joined Upper on the Academic All-Big Ten swimming & diving team. In the pool, he turned in a fine season, placing third in the 100 breaststroke and fifth in the 200 breaststroke with personal-best times of 59.26 and 2:13.33 respectively at the Gopher Invitational.

Schmid, who finished 44th at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships hosted by the University of Minnesota last fall, is a chemical engineering major in the Institute of Technology with a 3.78 GPA. Honored on the Academic All-Big Ten cross country team, he is also a member of the Golden Gopher track & field squad as well.

A quarterback on the Golden Gopher football team, Schaffner has completed 256 of 467 passes (55 percent) for 3,204 yards and 20 touchdowns through three seasons in Gold Country. On top of that, he has added six rushing touchdowns as well. In the classroom, the Academic All-Big Ten selection has registered a 3.66 GPA as a business administration major in the school's prestigious Carlson School of Management.

Staats, a business administration major in the Carlson School of Managment with a 3.74 GPA, joined Schaffner as a member of the Academic All-Big Ten football squad, as well as being a District V GTE Academic First-Team selection. On the gridiron, the linebacker earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors after finishing fourth on the team with 89 tackles last season.

"It's exciting that men and women who are so committed to their athletic pursuits have also achieved such a high degree of excellence in their academic work," said Elayne Donahue, director of academic counseling. "The increasing number of student-athletes who can do both well is gratifying."

GOLDEN GOPHERS SPLIT SERIES WITH ILLINOIS; TRAVEL TO WISCONSIN FOR FOUR-GAME SERIES THIS WEEKEND

The Golden Gopher baseball team split its series with the Fighting Illini over the weekend. The Gophers prevailed 1-0, and 5-2, but lost a pair of one-run games 10-9 and 4-3. The Gophers overall record now stands at 25-19 with a 12-8 Big Ten record. The Gophers are in third place in the conference with eight games to go. This weekend the Maroon and Gold will travel to Madison, WI to take on the Badgers in a pair of double headers, before finishing the regular season at Siebert Field on May 10-12, hosting the Michigan Wolverines.

On the Road Again: The Golden Gophers will take to the road again this week with a non-conference trip to St. Cloud State followed by the weekend series in Madison. The Gophers will have a busy schedule this week hosting Northern Iowa Tuesday night before playing at St. Cloud State on Wednesday and returning home to host MIAC power St. Olaf on Thursday night at Siebert and then packing up and heading for Madison.

Home Stretch: The Gophers are entering the home stetch of the regular season and two team goals are still looming on the horizon. The Gopher didn't help their chances of hosting the Big Ten Tournament by splitting with the Illini, but the schedule still favors them. The Ohio State Buckeyes and Indiana Hoosiers are two games and one and a half games ahead respectively, but Ohio State travels to Michigan State this weekend and finishes with Indiana at Cooper Stadium, while Indiana finishes on the road at Michigan and Ohio State. The other team goal of winning the Big Ten Championship is getting closer by the day.

Mound Notes: The Gophers had solid performances out of Scott Bakkum (LaCrosse, WI) and J.T. Gilbert (LaCrosse, WI), who both pitched well in gaining victories. Gilbert pitched six and two-thirds innings before leaving the game with a leg injury when a line shot hit him. John Lowery (Sherpherdstown, WV) came in to get the out and the save to preserve the 1-0 victory on Saturday night. Bakkum pitched his fourth complete game of the season and upped his record to 6-2 with his 5-2 victory on Sunday. He limited the Illini to two runs on seven hits while striking out two and walking two.

Fantastic: The surprising good weather over the weekend made the Gophers All-Sports Day a great success as 2,500 jammed into Siebert Field for the first game on Saturday. For the weekend over 5,600 fans came out to the park to see some exciting baseball.

Next Up: The Wisconsin Badgers will host the Gophers this coming weekend after losing three of four games at Northwestern over the weekend. The Badgers are now 5-15 in the Big Ten and in last place. They can still be a spoiler though, with games with Minnesota and Purdue left. This is the last season the Badgers will have baseball and it should be an emotional series.

Gator Hunt: Pre-season All-American Brent Gates (Grandville, MI) is having a stunning year and is in the hunt to break numerous Golden Gopher career and single season records. Gates in his three seasons has never missed a game, starting in every game since his arrival. He is on pace to break the career batting average record of .375 held by Terry Steinbach of the Oakland A's and Greg Olson of the Atlanta Braves. He is also on pace for the career RBI's record, total bases record, and the doubles record, which he resets every time he gets a two-bagger. He is also on a pace this seaon to be the first Golden Gopher to bat over .400 since Terry Steinbach batted .402 in 1982. Gates currently is batting at a .437 clip with a .422 Big Ten average. Other single season records in jeopardy during the "Gator Hunt" are; (games played, at bats (which he holds already from the 1990 season), most RBI's, most total bases, most doubles and most hits both which he already holds for his performance last season. The "Gator" may be the finest all-around baseball player to ever don the Maroon and Gold.

Rookie Contributions: The Gophers are getting some great contributions from some newcomers to the team. Charlie Nelson (Perham, MN), a freshman outfielder has performed solidly in left field and is batting for a .320 average. He also has eight stolen bases and has scored 34 times for the Maroon and Gold. In addition to Nelson, freshman second baseman Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) has seen more action lately. Merila has a sterling 1.000 fielding percentage in 20 games played and is hitting the ball hard while batting .345 with a solid .410 average in Big Ten games.

Infield Investigation: The backbones of the infield for the Gophers are Gates and Monson, who are arguably two of the best at their positions in the conference. Monson is a great fielding first baseman with a .995 fielding percentage and his bat is counted on heavily by the Gophers. He is second on the team in RBI's with 40 and batting at a .323 clip. At third base, fifth-year senior Greg Johnson has come in from the outfield to play solidly. He is batting .305 and is on the way to his best season as a Gopher.

Outfield Outlook: Going into the season, the outfield position was viewed as one of the team's stronger areas as far as depth and talent were concerned. This prediction has come true and more. The Gophers are led by All-Big Ten Honorable Mention center fielder Ryan Lefebvre who is second in team batting from the number one or two spot. He is hitting .343 with 65 total bases in 42 games played. Lefebvre has also stolen eight bases and driven in 21 runs while scoring 42 times himself. In addition he has developed into the best drag bunter in all of the Big Ten.

Doyle on the Rise: Rightfielder and DH Tom Doyle (Rapid City, SD) has settled down and is really starting to make contact with the ball. He is now batting .323 and .364 in Big Ten action. If this talented lefthander can continue to contribute it will give the Gophers one of the best lineups in the conference from the one spot to the number six spot.

All-American Replacements: The jobs of replacing outgoing All-Americans Brian Raabe, and Dan Wilson have fallen into the hands of four people. At second, Raabe's former job has been held by converted third baseman Steve Calvert (Edina, MN) and freshman Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN). Calvert has been steady with a .943 fielding percentage but freshman Merila has come on strong. The switch-hitter has not committed an error in 27 games in the field and is batting .345 and .410 in Big Ten action. At the catcher position fifth-year senior Joe Wallraf and junior Brian Hartmann have shared the duties. While neither has the total package that Wilson possessed, Hartmann has come in and batted .244 with 12 RBI's and Wallraf has knocked in 17 RBI's while picking off some base runners in the process.

Pitching Staff Notes: The Gophers deep pitching staff continues to improve and show consistency. The team ERA is now at 4.62 and sinking. With all of the talented arms ready to go, the Gophers staff should be in good shape down the stretch. Junior Scott Bakkum is the anchor of the starting rotation with a 6-2 record and a 3.68 ERA with complete game victories over top ten ranked foes Miami and Stanford. Reliever John Lowery is tough out of the bullpen with a 6-3 record and three saves, while lefty Brent Davis (Minnetonka, MN) has had a good year with a 4-2 record and a 5.48 ERA. If the Gophers are to contend for the conference title the pitching staff must continue to improve. This staff led the Big Ten last season with a 19-9 record and a 3.97 ERA. With all of the top starters returning there is high expectations for this group.

Gopher Baseball Broadcasts: The Golden Gophers Big Ten games are broadcast on KMZZ Z-Rock 980 AM radio. The voice of Golden Gopher baseball is Doug McLeod with Tom Greenhoe on the color.

Stub and Herbs Lefthanders Night: Thursday night's game vs. St. Olaf is Stub and Herbs Lefthanders Night, when all lefthanded people will get a free admission to the game.

SCHOLAR-ATHLETES HONORED AT AWARDS RECEPTION

A total of 164 University of Minnesota student-athletes were honored last Tuesday at the second annual Scholar-Athlete Awards Reception at The Minneapolis Institute of Arts in Minneapolis.

To be honored as a scholar-athlete, one must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better and be a member of one of the Golden Gopher athletic teams. The total number of student-athletes honored has increased by 21 percent from a year ago, when 136 student-athletes earned the distinction. Senior Scott Upper (Pompano Beach, FL), along with juniors Derek Howatt (St. Paul, MN), Scott Schaffner (West Chester, OH), Chris Schmid (White Bear Lake, MN), and Joel Staats (Winona, MN) were named as the men's top five scholar-athlete award recipients for 1990-91.

Upper, a psychology major who has recorded a 3.64 GPA, was selected to the Academic All-Big Ten Team. A transfer from UCLA where he won a pair of Pac-10 titles for the Bruins, he collected All-America honors this past season for the Golden Gophers by finishing seventh on the three meter board at the NCAA Championships. He also finished 10th on the one meter board to help lead the team to an 18th-place finish in the final team standings. At the Big Ten Championships, he finished second on the three meter and third on the one meter board to help pace the Golden Gophers to their second straight runner-up finish.

An aerospace engineering major in the Institute of Technology with a 3.91 GPA, Howatt joined Upper on the Academic All-Big Ten swimming & diving team. In the pool, he turned in a fine season, placing third in the 100 breaststroke and fifth in the 200 breaststroke with personal-best times of 59.26 and 2:13.33 respectively at the Gopher Invitational.

Schmid, who finished 44th at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships hosted by the University of Minnesota last fall, is a chemical engineering major in the Institute of Technology with a 3.78 GPA. Honored on the Academic All-Big Ten cross country team, he is also a member of the Golden Gopher track & field squad as well.

A quarterback on the Golden Gopher football team, Schaffner has completed 256 of 467 passes (55 percent) for 3,204 yards and 20 touchdowns through three seasons in Gold Country. On top of that, he has added six rushing touchdowns as well. In the classroom, the Academic All-Big Ten selection has registered a 3.66 GPA as a business administration major in the school's prestigious Carlson School of Management.

Staats, a business administration major in the Carlson School of Managment with a 3.74 GPA, joined Schaffner as a member of the Academic All-Big Ten football squad, as well as being a District V GTE Academic First-Team selection. On the gridiron, the linebacker earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors after finishing fourth on the team with 89 tackles last season.

"It's exciting that men and women who are so committed to their athletic pursuits have also achieved such a high degree of excellence in their academic work," said Elayne Donahue, director of academic counseling. "The increasing number of student-athletes who can do both well is gratifying."

The '91 edition of the Golden Gopher spring football season came to a close on Saturday with the Maroon team scoring three touchdowns in the second half to win the game 21-0 over the Gold team and thus wrapping up 15 sessions of spring practice. The game pitted the two-deep starters against the rest of the team. On offense for the Maroon team, freshman Antonio Carter (Columbus, OH) led all rushers with 11 carries for 46 yards and a touchdown on a 10 yard scamper to give the Maroon team all the points they needed to win. MURRELL WINS DRAKE RELAYS HIGH JUMP CROWN; MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL ON SATURDAY

Sophomore Chris Murrell (Grand Island, NE) took top honors in the high jump to pace the University of Minnesota track & field team at the 82nd annual Drake Relays held last Friday and Saturday at Des Moines, Iowa.

Murrell Joins Elite Group: Chris Murrell cleared 7-1 in Saturday's high jump, and defeated Texas Southern's Eddie McGill, who also made the height, on fewer misses to claim the 27th title (24 individual, three relays) for the University of Minnesota at the prestigious Drake Relays. Murrell narrowly missed on his third and final attempt at 7-3. He is the first Golden Gopher to win a title at Drake since 1986 when Ron Backes took the shot put crown and only the second in history to stand atop the victory platform in the high jump. Thomas Stuart won the event for the Golden Gophers in 1967 with a leap of 6-8.

Record Setters: The sprint medley relay team consisting of sophomore Kirk Dyer (San Jose, CA), junior Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria), freshman Norris Williams, Jr. (Milwaukee, WI), and senior Steve Scarince (St. Cloud, MN) raced to a runner-up finish in Saturday's finals with a school record clocking of 3:21.13. Williams ran an outstanding 400 meter split of 47.2, with Scarince bringing the baton home with a blazing 1:51.4 800 split. Prairie View won the race in 3:17.73. The Golden Gopher foursome had initially set the record in Friday's preliminaries with a 3:22.42 clocking, before breaking it again in the finals. Prior to the weekend, the record was 3:24.2. That was set back in 1966 by Bill Stevens, Phil Soltvedt, Mike Gillham and Stan Gaffin.

Looking Good: The Golden Gophers turned in a number of other outstanding performances as well last weekend. Junior Mark Lacy (Oak Brook, IL) finished second to Nebraska's Jeff Hooper (172-4) in Friday's discus with a personal-best toss of 169-9. Sophomore Chad Goldstein (St. Louis Park, MN) placed fifth in the shot put on Saturday with a heave of 56-2 1/2, with Lacy in eighth at 53-5. Junior co-captain Sean Fitzgerald (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada) placed fifth in Saturday's 1500 meter final with a personal-best time of 3:47.90. Sophomore Mark Narveson (Mankato, MN) also clocked a personal-best in the race, finishing 10th in 3:49.58. Senior Chris Harder (Austin, MN) placed fifth in Saturday's 3000 meter steeplechase with a time of 9:10.03, while Dyer also crossed the line fifth in the 100 meter final on Saturday with a 10.70 (headwind) clocking. Sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH) finished sixth in Saturday's pole vault final with a vault of 16-8. In Friday's 10,000 meters, senior Keith Eidman (Roseville, MN) placed seventh with a time of 30:49.33, while sophomore Doug Milkowski (Stevens Point, WI), running the distance for the first time on the oval, finished 15th in 31:29.9.

Drake Relays Magic: Capacity crowds once again filled Drake Stadium for the tradition-rich Drake Relays. Saturday's overflow crowd of 18,000 gave the prestigious event its 26th consecutive sellout on the meet's final day.

Minnesota Invitational: The Golden Gophers will host the co-ed Minnesota Invitational beginning at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday at the world-class Bierman Track & Field Stadium, site of the 1990 U.S. Olympic Festival and 1992 Big Ten Championships. Men's teams scheduled to compete in the meet are Drake, Iowa, Iowa State and Wisconsin.

MURRELL HONORED AS THE BIG TEN ATHLETE OF THE MONTH

University of Minnesota sophomore Chris Murrell has been honored as the Big Ten Conference Track & Field Athlete of the Month for April.

Murrell took top honors in the high jump at the prestigious Drake Relays last Saturday in Des Moines, Iowa. He cleared 7-1 and defeated Texas Southern's Eddie McGill, who also made the height, on fewer misses to claim the 27th overall title (24 individual, three relays) for the University of Minnesota at Drake. He narrowly missed on his third and final attempt at 7-3.

With his victory last Saturday, Murrell became the first Golden Gopher to win a title at the Drake Relays since 1986 when Ron Backes took the shot put crown, and only the second in history to stand atop the victory platform in the high jump. Thomas Stuart won the event for the Golden Gophers in 1967 with a leap of 6-8.

A native of Grand Island, NE, where he won the Nebraska state prep title as a senior in 1989, Murrell returned home to win the Nebraska Invitational high jump crown for the second straight year with a leap of 6-10 3/4 in less than ideal conditions back on April 13. He also won the Texas Quad meet in the team's outdoor season opener with a leap of 6-11 1/2.

GOPHERS SWEEP WISCONSIN AND CLIMB INTO FIRST PLACE TIE WITH OHIO ST.; FINISH WITH MICHIGAN AT HOME THIS WEEKEND

The University of Minnesota baseball team completed a four-game sweep of the Wisconsin Badgers to climb into first place in the Big Ten with a 31-19 record overall and a 16-8 mark in the Big Ten. The Golden Gophers host Michigan this weekend in a four-game series at Siebert Field that will decide the site of the Big Ten Tournament. The Buckeyes who share an identical 16-8 conference mark with the Gophers host third-place Indiana at Columbus, OH. If the Gophers and Buckeyes finish in a tie for first place, the Gophers would host the tournament based on the Gophers edge in head-to head-competition.

The Gophers series with Michigan starts Friday night at 7:00 p.m. Saturday the Gophers will play a doubleheader scheduled to begin at 4:00 p.m. with the series finale coming Sunday at 1:00 p.m. Sunday will also mark Senior Recognition Day, Rollerblade Day and the Golden Gopher Player Card Swap.

Pitching Shines: The Golden Gophers pitching staff came up with some stellar performances this weekend just when they needed them most. Gopher starters Scott Bakkum (La Crosse, WI), John Lowery (Shepherdstown, WV) and Jeff Schmidt (La Crosse, WI) all had complete game victories for the Gophers. Bakkum and Lowery started it out on Saturday at Warner Park with 7-3 and 5-1 victories respectively. Bakkum scattered nine Badger hits over seven innings, walking two and striking out one. Lowery came out of the bullpen for his second start in the Big Ten and threw seven strikeouts while holding the Badgers to one run on six hits.

Power Output: The two games at Warner Park Saturday had the Gophers pounding out 24 hits and 12 runs as the team went a combined 24 for 62. Offensively the Gophers were led by their Co-Captains Jeff Monson (Bloomington, MN) and John Kopfer (Oconomowoc, WI). Kopfer, who was in a family hitting duel with younger brother Ross who plays for Wisconsin, was four for seven for the day with a dramatic two-run homerun in the seventh inning of the second game to seal the victory for Minnesota. Monson went three for four with two RBIs in game one and added a two for four performance in game two. All-American candidate Brent Gates (Grandville, MI) was two for six for the day with two walks. Freshman Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) had a stellar day batting one for three in game one and three for three with a walk in game two. The switch-hitting Merila has taken over second base for the Gophers and is batting at a .412 clip in conference play.

Monday in Madison: The final two games of the series were played on Monday at Guy Lowman Field due to rain on Sunday. The Gophers started strong on Monday jumping out to a three run lead but the Badgers battled back and scored two in the third and went ahead in the fourth inning as the Gophers pitching walked in four unearned runs. J. T. Gilbert came in to get the Maroon and Gold out of the inning and held the Badgers to two hits the rest of the way. In the top of the sixth inning John Kopfer hit a two-run homerun to cut the Badger lead to one run and in the top of the seventh the Gophers led off with two singles before Brent Gates drove home the go ahead run on a sacrifice fly.

Schmidt Completes Sweep: The Gophers completed the four-game sweep of the Badgers when Jeff Schmidt hurled a two-hitter, holding the Badgers to one run while striking out six.

Greg Johnson (Edina, MN) led the Gophers offensively, batting two for three and scoring the Gophers third run. Catcher Brian Hartmann (Arlington, MN) had a fine day as well, batting two for three with a double and a run scored.

Michigan in Spoiler Role: The Michigan Wolverines are in the spoiler role this week as they host Michigan State who is fighting for the last tournament spot. Michigan heads to Siebert Field after that where the Gophers will be fighting for the regular season title. The Wolverines are not eligible for post-season play but will have an impact who wins the title. The Wolverines are 11-11 and tied for fifth place in the conference.

RODVOLD LEADS TRACK & FIELD TEAM TO MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL TEAM TITLE; LAST CHANCE MEET TO BE HELD SATURDAY

Sparked by sophomore Chad Rodvold's (Williston, ND) school record performance in the javelin, the Golden Gopher men's track & field team captured the six-team Minnesota Invitational last Saturday at the Bierman Track & Field Stadium.

Rodvold Shines: Chad Rodvold uncorked a throw of 203-7 to win the javelin and break his own school record of 197-1 that he set last year. He was the runner-up at the Big Ten Championships in the event as a rookie a year ago, and will be in the hunt for the top spot once again at the league meet this season. Freshman Jason Cole (Shelby, MT) was second in the event on Saturday with a personal-best toss of 194-6.

Freshman Phenom: Norris Williams, Jr. (Milwaukee, WI) added the freshman outdoor 400 meter school record to the one he collected indoors (48.24) by finishing second on Saturday behind Iowa's Anthuan Maybank (46.78) with a clocking of 47.49. That erased the previous record of 47.94 set by Ike Okolue back in 1977.

Looking Good: Head coach Roy Griak's Golden Gopher men's team collected a total of six individual event victories in the competition. Junior Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria) won the 100 meters with a hand-held time of 10.7, and then completed an outstanding day by placing second in the 200 in a season-best 21.37. Sophomore Mark Narveson (Mankato, MN) took the 1500 meters with a 3:50.15 clocking, with junior co-captain Sean Fitzgerald (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada) right on his heels in 3:50.81. Senior Chris Harder (Austin, MN) captured the 3000 meter steeplechase in a personal-best time of 9:01.7, while sophomore Doug Milkowski (Stevens Point, WI) also turned in a personal-best time in fourth with a 9:20.6 clocking. Junior Mark Lacy (Oak Brook, IL) won the discus with a throw of 168-4 and sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH) took the pole vault, edging teammate Martin Eriksson (Stockholm, Sweden), a freshman, on fewer misses after both cleared 16-6 3/4. Senior Keith Eidman (Roseville, MN) also placed second in the 5000 meters with a personal-best time of 14:34.10, while fellow senior Steve Scarince (St. Cloud, MN) was second in the 800 in 1:52.54.

Last Chance Meet: The Golden Gophers will host the co-ed Minnesota Last Chance Meet on Saturday beginning at 11:00 a.m. at the Bierman Track & Field Stadium. The competition will be the team's last before the Big Ten Championships to be held on May 18-19 at Columbus, OH.

MINNESOTA GOLFERS CAPTURE SPARTAN INVITATIONAL

The Golden Gopher golf team won handily at Michigan State over the weekend, scoring 871 for the three round tournament, five shots better than second place Indiana. The team has had top five finishes in six of the 11 tournaments they have competed in this season.

Leaders: Junior Terry O'Loughlin (Maplewood, MN) paced the Gophers with scores of 68-73-73=214 to finish in second place, while senior co-captain Paul Keller (Dickinson, ND) finished third with rounds of 73-70-72=215. Junior Rick Kuhn (Bismarck, ND) finished at 70-79-73=222, nine shots off the lead. Sophomore Joe Guillon (San Antonio, TX) completed the weekend with a sensational round of 68, helping to erase a three-shot deficit Minnesota faced going into Sunday's final round. Guillon scored rounds of 80-77-68=225.

Rankings: Ranked sixth in District Four going into the Michigan State Invitational, Minnesota finished ahead of district foes Indiana and Ball State. With the top six teams from the district going to the NCAA Regionals, this victory almost ensures the team of post-season play.

TENNIS LOSES BIG TEN TITLE AND HOPES OF NCAA BID

The number one seed at the Big Ten Championships, the Golden Gophers met Purdue in the second round and breezed past the Boilermakers, 5-1. Next up were the Hoosiers of Indiana, a top-ranked team most of the year, and the result was the same -- 5-1 Minnesota. The stage was set for the Gophers' second Big Ten tournament championship in three years, unfortunately the sixthseeded Ohio State Buckeyes had different ideas. OSU upset Minnesota, 5-4, to claim its first Big Ten title since 1944.

Minnesota's hopes of earning a spot in the NCAA tournament were dashed with the loss, yet some Gophers may still get the chance. Senior captain Kevin Werwie (Sheboygan, WI) has been recommended by the Region IV Advisory Committee for an At-Large bid at singles, as well as at doubles with senior partner Anthony Cruz (Medinah, IL). Werwie is ranked 52nd in the

nation, while the doubles pair ranks 14th.

The Golden Gophers finished the season 22-6 overall and 10-2 in the conference. Minnesota began the '90-91 season by winning its first 12 matches in a row. The team's only conference loss of the regular season came at the hands of the Iowa Hawkeyes -- a 5-4 defeat on April 13. The team went on to win its final four matches of the season, including the finale against Wisconsin (5-3), to capture the regular season title.

Kevin Werwie led the Gophers in victories with a record of 31-10 (11-5), while freshman Adam Krafft (Saginaw, MI) finished with a 26-9 (12-4) standard. At doubles, Werwie and Cruz led the way with a 23-10 (6-4) mark, followed by Krafft and junior Brian Uihlein (Lake

Forest, IL), who put together a record of 16-3 (8-0).

Coach David Geatz (Grand Forks, ND) completed his third season at Minnesota with a record of 58-28. In eight years of Division I coaching, Geatz is now 179-93 (6 years at New Mexico).

GOPHERS SPLIT WITH MICHIGAN; TRAVEL TO OHIO STATE FOR TENTH BIG TEN TOURNAMENT IN 11 YEARS

The Golden Gopher baseball team split the series with Michigan last weekend to finish the Big Ten regular season with a 18-10 record and a second place finish, with an overall mark of 34-23. The Gophers will travel to Ohio State to take on the Indiana Hossiers in the first round of the double-elimination tournament. The Gophers are making their tenth appearance in 11 years in the tournament. Minnesota won the tournament and the Big Ten title that goes with it in 1982, 1985, and 1988.

The Gophers and Hoosiers did not meet in the regular season. Indiana finished the regular season in a tie with Northwestern for fourth place, but picked up the third seed on the head-to-head competition tie-breaker with the Wildcats. Indiana is 38-21-1 overall with a 15-12-1 conference record.

Minnesota at a Glance: The Gophers enter the play-offs having won 23 of their last 35 games. The Gophers pitching has steadily reduced its ERA to a 4.35 mark. Offensively the Gophers are batting .317 as a team with a .321 mark in Big Ten action. The Gophers are at or near the top in batting, pitching and fielding categories for the Big Ten. Minnesota has a deep pitching staff that has nine pitchers with 20 or more innings pitched. The pitchers have struck out 298 while walking 208, allowing 207 earned runs to the 331 the team has scored. The Gophers have a great deal of flexibility on offense with two switch-hitters, the Gophers can offer as many as seven lefthanders in the lineup or come back with a crew of righthanders depending on the opponents starter. Team speed is way up from past years with Ryan Lefebvre, Charlie Nelson, Greg Johnson, and Darren Schwankl all possessing great speed in the outfield and on the basepaths.

Weekend Review: The Golden Gophers started the weekend strong with a pair of victories over the visiting Wolverines. Friday night the Gophers were led by pitcher Scott Bakkum LaCrosse, WI) who pitched a three-hit shutout and his sixth complete game of the year. The win raised Bakkum's record to 8-2, 4-1 in Big Ten action. Offensively on Friday night the Gophers were led by All-American candidate Brent Gates (Grandville, MI) who was two-for-three with three RBIs on a double and a triple. Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) added three RBIs on a hit and a walk, while Darren Schwankl (Burnsville, MN) batted two-for-three with two runs scored. In the opening game of Saturday's double header, the Gophers again received an outstanding pitching performance. This time it was left-hander John Lowery (Shepherdstown, WV) who pitched a complete game victory (7-1) limiting the Wolverines to six hits while striking out seven. Gates again led the offensive charge batting two-for-three with a two-run homerun. Merila added a three-for-four performance and two RBIs.

More Review: The second half of the weekend series with Michigan did not go as well as the first two games as the Gophers lost a 3-0 lead and the game 4-3 in the nightcap of Saturday's double header. In Sunday's game the Gophers were held to four hits by Wolverine starter Russell Brock. The Gophers lone run was scored by John Kopfer (Oconomowoc, WI) when he hit his seventh homerun of the year over the left field wall. On Monday night the Golden Gophers rebounded with a 15-3 defeat of the UMD Bulldogs at Duluth Municipal Stadium. The Golden Gophers pounded out 15 hits while the Maroon and Gold pitchers limited the Bulldogs to three runs on four hits. Eric Slagle (Barrington, II) got credit for the win but Jason Karrmann (Platteville, WI) and Chris Lawler (LaCrosse, WI) both pitched effectively.

Oh What a Schedule: The Golden Gophers have once again faced one of the toughest schedules of any team in the Big Ten. The Gophers started by playing 24 of their first 32 games on the road. The Gophers now have faced top 25 teams 17 times in their 54 games. The Gophers have faced top 10 teams, Ohio State, Miami, Stanford, Florida State, and Wichita State. Coach Anderson's philosophy is that to get better, you have to play the best competition. The Golden Gophers have done that and more. The tough schedule can only be a plus when it comes to NCAA post-season selection time.

Gator Hunt: Pre-season All-American Brent Gates (Grandville, MI) is having a stunning year and is in the hunt to break numerous Golden Gopher career and single season records. Gates in his three seasons has never missed a game, starting in every game since his arrival. He is on pace to break the career batting average record of .375 held by Terry Steinbach of the Oakland A's and Greg Olson of the Atlanta Braves. He is also on pace for the career RBI's record, total bases record, and the doubles record, which he resets every time he gets a two-bagger. He is also on a pace this season to be the first Golden Gopher to bat over .400 since Terry Steinbach batted .402 in 1982. Gates currently is batting at a .426 clip with a .414 Big Ten average. Other single season records in jeopardy during the "Gator Hunt" are: (games played, at bats (which he holds already from the 1990 season), most RBI's, most total bases and most hits, both of which he already holds for his performance last season. The "Gator" may be the finest all-around baseball player to ever don the Maroon and Gold. Gator currently has 21 doubles this season which is a Minnesota single season record.

Infield Investigation: The backbones of the infield for the Gophers are Gates and Monson, who are arguably two of the best at their positions in the conference. Monson is a great fielding first baseman with a .993 fielding percentage and his bat is counted on heavily by the Gophers. He is second on the team in RBI's with 45 and batting at a .313 clip. At third base Steve Calvert has moved over from second to take over the duties at third that he had last season. Calvert is batting .274 with a .947 fielding percentage.

Outfield Outlook: Going into the season, the outfield position was viewed as one of the team's stronger areas as far as depth and talent were concerned. This prediction has come true and more. The Gophers are led by All-Big Ten Honorable Mention center fielder Ryan Lefebvre who is hitting .335 with 72 total bases in 46 games played. Lefebvre has also stolen nine bases and driven in 23 runs while scoring 47 times himself. In addition he has developed into the best drag bunter in all of the Big Ten. Kopfer, Greg Johnson, Nelson and Schwankl have all seen playing time in the outfield and work into John Anderson's tactics in late innings.

Rookies Shine: The Gophers are getting some great contributions from some newcomers to the team. Charlie Nelson (Perham, MN), a freshman outfielder has performed solidly in left field and is batting for a .289 average. He also has ten stolen bases and has scored 37 times for the Maroon and Gold. In addition to Nelson, freshman second baseman Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) has seen more action lately. Merila has a sterling .982 fielding percentage in 38 games played and is hitting the ball hard while batting .372 with a solid .431 average in Big Ten games. Transfer Darren Schwankl, while not a true rookie, is in his first season wearing the Maroon and Gold and is making solid contributions. He has 67 at bats in 35 games and is batting .269 with a perfect record in the field while playing outfield for the Gophers. The Burnsville, MN native has also added some additional speed to the team and depth in the outfield. In addition Bill Mobilia (Ely, MN) has come in as a red-shirt freshman and shown flashes of brilliance in the field. His strong arm and sure glove will play a large part in the Gopher infield of the future.

Pitching Staff Notes: The Gophers deep pitching staff continues to improve and show consistency. The team ERA is now at 4.35 and sinking. With all of the talented arms ready to go, the Gophers staff should be in good shape down the stretch. Junior Scott Bakkum is the anchor of the starting rotation with an 8-2 record and a 3.38 ERA with complete game victories over top ten ranked foes Miami and Stanford and six complete games. Reliever John Lowery is tough out of the bullpen with a 8-3 record and three saves, while lefty Brent Davis (Minnetonka, MN) has had a good year with a 4-3 record and a 5.34 ERA. This staff led the Big Ten last season with a 19-9 record and a 3.97 ERA.

The Golden Gopher track & field team turned in a number of impressive performances at the Minnesota Open Last Chance Meet held last Saturday at the Bierman Track & Field Stadium. The non-scored meet was the last competition for the team before this weekend's Big Ten Championships at Columbus, Ohio.

Weight Men Star: The Golden Gopher weight crew turned in a sparkling day last Saturday. Mark Lacy (Oak Brook, IL) took the shot put with a career outdoor-best throw of 58-1 1/4. He captured the Big Ten title in the event indoors with a personal-best heave of 59-9. The Golden Gopher junior then won the discus with a personal-best toss of 172-0. Chris Brinkworth (Bloomington, MN), third in the shot put with a personal-best throw of 54-4 3/4, also broke his own two-week old freshman school record of 163-3 in the discus with a runner-up toss of 167-5. Sophomore Chad Goldstein (St. Louis Park, MN) also got into the act, finishing second in the shot put with a throw of 56-10 3/4 and third in the discus with a personal-best throw of 163-4.

Looking Good: Sophomore Chad Rodvold (Williston, ND) in the javelin (201-3), sophomore Kirk Dyer (San Jose, CA) with a season-best in the 100 meters (10.56), junior co-captain Sean Fitzgerald (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada) in the 800 meters (1:53.00) and junior Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria) in the 200 meters (22.53) also captured individual events for the Golden Gophers on Saturday.

Big Ten Championships: The Golden Gophers will compete at the Big Ten Championships on Saturday and Sunday at Columbus, Ohio. The meet will get underway at 2:00 p.m. (Central) on Saturday and 10:45 a.m. (Central) on Sunday.

Chad Rodvold was the runner-up in the javelin with a throw of 191-2 last year. High jumper Chris Murrell (Grand Island, NE) also finished second as a freshman a year ago with a leap of 7-1. Mark Lacy was fourth in the shot put with a throw of 56-0. Sprinter Tim Arinze finished fourth in the 100 and fifth in the 200 last year with wind-aided times of 10.40 and 21.40. Sean Fitzgerald placed sixth in the 1500 meters with a 3:52.07 clocking. Seniors Keith Eidman (Roseville, MN) and Chris Harder (Austin, MN) finished seventh in the 10,000 meters (32:24.75) and eighth in the 3000 meter steeplechase (9:09.57) respectively.

An All-Metro catcher last year for Brooklyn Center, he is in line for post-season honors this year as well. Darnell has impressive stats from the mound as well with a 4-1 record and a 1.50 ERA. Last summer he was a catcher for the Gold Medal winning North Team at the U.S. Olympic Festival. In addition ,he was an All-State quarterback last fall and was named the Metro Player of the Year in football.

McCarthy is a 6-1, 185-pound right-handed pitcher who has led the Billings Scarlets to two consecutive state American Legion championships. In addition to his pitching credentials, McCarthy is a solid hitter. He was recruited hard by a number of Division 1 programs including Arizona, Washington State, and San Diego State.

"Shane is a national pitching recruit who is an outstanding student-athlete," said Anderson. "He is a quality person who has great credentials on the field and in the classroom. He will get the opportunity to contribute to our team not only on the mound, but as a batter as well."

"We feel the addition of these two fine student-athletes along with our two recruits from the fall signing period give us an outstanding class, that is not a large recruiting class, but a quality one, that fits the needs of our team for the coming years," said Anderson.

GATES NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE YEAR/MERILA GARNERS FROSH HONORS; MONSON AND GATES NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-BIG TEN

Golden Gopher shortstop Brent Gates, a junior pre-season All-American, was named Big Ten Player-of-the-Year as selected by the coaches. Gates leads Minnesota in six major offensive categories: runs (50), hits (84), RBI (84), average (.431), on base percentage (.530) and slugging percentage (.708). This marks the first time a Golden Gopher has received this honor since 1983, when Terry Steinbach won it as a third baseman. He also was named to the All-Big Ten first team with senior co-captain and first baseman Jeff Monson. Monson is second on the team in RBI (52). Freshman second baseman Mark Merila was named Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Year and a member on the All-Big Ten second team with senior co-captain and right fielder John Kopfer. Merila is second on the team in batting average at .385 and 17 RBI, he is the second Golden Gopher to receive this honor as Dan Wilson garnered the honor in 1988.

GOPHERS FINISH 2ND AT BIG TEN TOURNAMENT; RECEIVE NCAA ATLARGE BID; TRAVEL TO L.A. TO PLAY HAWAII IN WEST I REGIONAL

The University of Minnesota baseball team went 2-2 at the Big Ten Tournament losing the championship game 3-2 to Ohio State. The Gophers were selected as an at-large team in the 48-team field for the NCAA Tournament. The Gophers will head West as the fifth-seeded team in the West I Regional. The Maroon and Gold will open up the regional by playing second-seeded Hawaii Friday, May 24, at 1:00 p.m. (CST) from Dedeaux Field on the University of Southern California campus.

The Golden Gophers will be making their 18th NCAA post-season appearance and their fifth in ten years under Head Coach John Anderson. Anderson has upped his career record to 341-229-3. He has a 1-8 record in NCAA post-season play with the lone victory coming against Oral Roberts in the 1982 Mideast Regional. Anderson has notched three Big Ten crowns during his tenure at Minnesota and holds a 133-75 mark in Big Ten play.

Next Up: The Hawaii Rainbows have a 48-16 overall record and a 22-5 record in the Western Athletic Conference. The Rainbows played their first 31 games at home and finished with an impressive 38-9 record at home and a 10-7 road record. The one common foe the two teams had this year was Wichita State who the Rainbows defeated 6-5 to open their Easter tournament. The Rainbows are led by pitcher Bill Blanchette who has a 14-0 record with a 2.33 ERA and eight complete games under his hat this season. Offensively, senior outfielder Tim Albert is the top hitter with a .389 average and 29 RBIs. The leading RBI man on the team is senior catcher Todd Takayoshi who is batting .344 with 54 RBIs on 11 doubles and seven homeruns. The Rainbows are batting .316 as a team and have a team ERA of 4.70

Minnesota Tradition: The Gophers have finished in the first division of the Big Ten for 24 straight years. This year marks the 29th consecutive winning season for Minnesota baseball, and since 1934 the Gophers have had only three losing seasons. The tradition of excellence was started by Dick "Chief" Siebert and has been continued by Anderson who started as a student manager under Siebert in the early seventies.

Minnesota at a Glance: The Gophers enter the playoffs having won 25 of their last 39 games. The Gophers pitching has steadily reduced its ERA to a 4.42 mark. Offensively the Gophers are batting .321 as a team with a .321 mark in Big Ten action. The Gophers finished in the top two in batting, pitching and fielding categories for the Big Ten. Minnesota has a deep pitching staff that has nine pitchers with 20 or more innings pitched. The pitchers have struck out 327 while walking 225, allowing 232 earned runs to the 372 the team has scored. The Gophers have a great deal of flexibility on offense with two switch-hitters. The Gophers can offer as many as seven lefthanders in the lineup or come back with a crew of righthanders depending on the opponents starter. Team speed is way up from past years with Ryan Lefebvre, Charlie Nelson, Greg Johnson, and Darren Schwankl all possessing great speed in the outfield and on the basepaths. The Gophers are not a long ball team with 37 homeruns, but they hit the alleys with a vengence with 129 doubles and a team slugging percentage of .456. The pitching staff has some power pitchers in J. T. Gilbert and Eric Slagle, but primarily relies on control and a variety of pitches in the starters.

Big Ten Honors: Although the Golden Gophers did not bring home the championship from Columbus, OH, they did receive many prestigious individual honors. All-American candidate Brent Gates (Grandville, MI) was named the First Team All-Big Ten shortstop, and received the coveted Big Ten Player of the Year award for his outstanding season. Gates was joined on the First team by Co-Captain Jeff Monson (Bloomington, MN) at first base. On the Second team the Gophers other Co-Captain outfielder John Kopfer (Oconomowoc, WI) joined them followed by outfielder Ryan Lefebvre (Los Angeles, CA) and second baseman and Big Ten Freshman of the Year Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN).

Big Ten All Tournament Team: The Golden Gophers also landed some hardware from the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. Brent Gates at shortstop, Jeff Monson at first base, outfielders John Kopfer, and Darren Schwankl (Burnsville, MN) all were named to the team.

Tournament Review: The Golden Gophers went into the Big Ten Tournament as the number two seed with aspirations of bringing home John Anderson's fourth Big Ten title. The Gophers opened up the tourney with a 15-11 victory over third-seeded Indiana. The Maroon and Gold pounded out 18 hits in the record-setting game, including a pair of three-run homers by co-captain Jeff Monson. Monson set a single game RBI record for the tourney with seven in the game as he went 4-6. Coming across the plate in front of Monson was All-American candidate Brent Gates who was 3-4 on the day scoring four runs. Starter Scott Bakkum (LaCrosse, WI) went 8 innings and left the game with a 10 run lead.

Buckeye Blues: The Golden Gophers advanced to the winners bracket game against the Ohio State Buckeyes. The Gophers had taken three of four games form OSU at Siebert Field earlier in the season. The Buckeyes used the wind blowing out and the small confines of Trautman Field to their advantage as they hit five homeruns off of Minnesota pitchers and cruised to a 15-5 victory over the Gophers while out-hitting them 17-10. The Buckeye win gave them their first Big Ten crown since 1967.

In the Backdoor: The Gophers knew they faced an arduous task in trying to win the championship through the losers bracket, but they also knew that two John Anderson teams had accomplished that feat (1982, 1988). Minnesota started off the first game against Northwestern strong taking a 6-1 lead after five innings. Starter Jeff Schmidt (LaCrosse, WI) picked up the win pitching 6.2 innings and holding the Wildcats to four runs on seven hits. Offensively the Gophers were led by Darren Schwankl as he batted 3-5 with three Minnesota RBIs. The sophomore center fielder who was playing in place of the injured Ryan Lefebvre had an outstanding tournament batting 8-17 with five RBIs.

Championship Showdown: The Gophers and the Buckeyes met once again in what turned out to be the championship game. The Buckeyes threw pitcher Tom Schwarber at the Gophers while the Gophers started left-hander Brent Davis (Minnetonka, MN) who had defeated the Buckeyes earlier in the season with a seven-hit complete game 7-6 victory. The two pitchers dueled for nine innings as they both went the whole way. Both pitchers were outstanding with Davis walking none and striking out seven while Schwarber walked one and struck out seven. The Buckeyes won the game on a single to left field which scored Greg Frey on a disputed call at home.

West I Regional Outlook: Minnesota will be making another trip to California, as the Gophers have played there in their last three NCAA appearances. The team hopes to improve on their previous trips to the state by advancing to the College World Series in Omaha, NE. Of the five other teams in the regional, Minnesota has played Creighton the most often with the Gophers holding a 20-9 advantage over the Blue Jays. Minnesota has a 1-0 advantage over Pepperdine, and a 4-2 advantage over the USC Trojans. Middle Tennessee State holds a 1-0 lead over the Gophers courtesy of a victory in the 1982 Mideast Regional, while the Gophers and the Hawaii Rainbows have never met. The Gophers overall NCAA post-season record stands at 39-28 in 17 appearances with five College World Series appearances where they have posted a 17-7 record with national titles in 1956, 60, 64 under the leadership of legendary coach Richard "Chief" Siebert. The Gophers enter the West I Regional with the fifth best record, but plenty of experience against top-ranked teams.

Oh What a Schedule: The Golden Gophers have once again faced one of the toughest schedules of any team in the Big Ten. The Gophers started by playing 24 of their first 32 games on the road. The Gophers now have faced top 25 teams 19 times in their 56 games. The Gophers have faced top 10 teams, Ohio State-#2 Midwest, Miami-#1 West II, Stanford-#2 West II, Florida State-#1 South, and Wichita State-#1 Midwest, all who are in the tournament and seeded in the top two spots. Coach Anderson's philosophy is that to get better, you have to play the best competition. The Golden Gophers have done that and more. The tough schedule was a key factor in the Gophers at-large selection.

Gator Hunt: Pre-season All-American Brent Gates is having a stunning year and is in the hunt to break numerous Golden Gopher career and single season records. Gates in his three seasons has never missed a game, starting in every game since his arrival. He is on pace to break the career batting average record of .375 held by Terry Steinbach of the Oakland A's and Greg Olson of the Atlanta Braves. He is also on pace for the career RBI's record, and the total bases record. He holds the doubles record (60), which he resets every time he gets a two-bagger. He is also on a pace this season to be the first Golden Gopher to bat over .400 since Terry Steinbach batted .402 in 1982. Gates currently is batting at a .423 clip with a .414 Big Ten average and a .390 career average. Other single season records in jeopardy during the "Gator Hunt" are: (games played, at bats ,which he holds already from the 1990 season), most RBI's, most total bases (which he holds with 143 and most hits (which he holds with 88 hits this season). The "Gator" may be the finest all-around baseball player to ever don the Maroon and Gold. Gator currently has 23 doubles this season which is also a Minnesota single season record.

Rookies Shine: The Gophers are getting some great contributions from some newcomers to the team. Charlie Nelson (Perham, MN), a freshman outfielder has performed solidly as a platoon man in left field and a DH and is batting for a .277 average. He also has ten stolen bases and has scored 39 times for the Maroon and Gold. In addition to Nelson, freshman second baseman Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) has seen more action lately. Merila has a strong .963 fielding percentage in 43 games played and is hitting the ball hard while batting .359 with an outstanding .431 average in Big Ten games. Merila was named the Freshman of the Year in the Big Ten and has been an impact player for the Gophers. Transfer Darren Schwankl, while not a true rookie, is in his first season wearing the Maroon and Gold and is making solid contributions. He has 84 at bats in 39 games and is batting .310 with a perfect record in the field while playing outfield for the Gophers. The Burnsville, MN native has also added some additional speed to the team and depth in the outfield. In addition Bill Mobilia (Ely, MN) has come in as a red-shirt freshman and shown flashes of brilliance in the field. His strong arm and sure glove will play a large part in the Gopher infield of the future.

Infield Investigation: The backbones of the infield for the Gophers are Gates and Monson, who are arguably two of the best at their positions in the conference. Monson is a great fielding first baseman with a .992 fielding percentage and his bat is counted on heavily by the Gophers. He is second on the team in RBI's with 54 and batting at a .326 clip. At third base Steve Calvert has moved over from second to take over the duties at third that he had last season. Calvert is batting .274 with a .947 fielding percentage. Backing up Calvert is freshman Mobilia who is batting .349 in 30 games.

Outfield Outlook: Going into the season, the outfield position was viewed as one of the team's stronger areas as far as depth and talent were concerned. This prediction has come true and more. The Gophers are led by All-Big Ten Honorable Mention center fielder Ryan Lefebvre who is hitting .329 with 75 total bases in 49 games played. Lefebvre has also stolen nine bases and driven in 24 runs while scoring 48 times himself. In addition he has developed into the best drag bunter in all of the Big Ten. Kopfer, Greg Johnson, Nelson and Schwankl have all seen playing time in the outfield and work into John Anderson's tactics in late innings.

Pitching Staff Notes: The Gophers deep pitching staff continues to improve and show consistency. The team ERA is now at 4.42 and sinking. With all of the talented arms ready to go, the Gophers staff should be in good shape down the stretch. Junior Scott Bakkum is the anchor of the starting rotation with an 9-2 record and a 3.48 ERA with six complete games, including complete game victories over top ten ranked foes Miami and Stanford. Reliever John Lowery is tough out of the bullpen with a 8-4 record and three saves, while lefty Brent Davis (Minnetonka, MN) has had a good year with a 4-4 record and a 4.92 ERA. This staff led the Big Ten last season with a 19-9 record and a 3.97 ERA.

TRACK & FIELD TEAM FINISHES SIXTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS; HOST GOPHER TWILIGHT MEET ON WEDNESDAY

Behind a total team effort, Head Coach Roy Griak's Golden Gopher track & field squad finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships held last Saturday and Sunday at Columbus, OH.

Shot Putters Shine: After a disappointing day in the discus on Saturday, the Golden Gopher weight crew bounced back in convincing fashion by racking up 13 points in Sunday's shot put competition. Junior Mark Lacy (Oak Brook, IL) finished a close second to Indiana's Scott Cappos (58-5 3/4) with an outdoor personal-best toss of 58-3 1/4. Sophomore Chad Goldstein (St. Louis Park, MN) finished fourth with a throw of 56-5 1/4, while freshman Chris Brinkworth (Bloomington, MN) placed sixth with a personal-best heave of 55-3 3/4. Goldstein scored the lone Golden Gopher point in the discus with a throw of 160-6 1/4.

Williams Lowers Record Again: Freshman Norris Williams, Jr. (Milwaukee, WI) lowered his own freshman school 400 meter record by finishing fifth in the event on Sunday with a swift 47.12 clocking. He had initially set the record with a time of 47.49 at the Minnesota Invitational on May 4.

Middle Distance/Distance Runners Excel: The Golden Gopher middle distance/distance brigade turned a few heads as well at the league meet. Junior co-captain Sean Fitzgerald (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada) and sophomore Mark Narveson (Mankato, MN) finished third and fourth respectively in the 1500 meters with times of 3:49.69 and 3:51.38. In the 800 meters, senior Steve Scarince (St. Cloud, MN) placed fourth with a clocking of 1:51.73, while senior Chris Harder (Austin, MN) finished third in the 3000 meter steeplechase with a personal-best time of 9:00.70. Sophomore Doug Milkowski (Stevens Point, WI) finished eighth in the steeple with a personal-best time of 9:14.14.

Looking Good: The Golden Gophers recorded a number of other outstanding performances over the weekend. Sophomore Chad Rodvold (Williston, ND) placed third in the javelin with a toss of 197-6 1/4. He was followed in fourth by freshman Jason Cole (Shelby, MT), who recorded a distance of 195-11 1/2 on his very first throw and then was forced to the sidelines with a back injury. The 4 x 100 meter relay team consisting of freshman Omar Douglas (New Orleans, LA), junior Andre Thaddies (Brooksville, FL), sophomore Kirk Dyer (San Jose, CA) and junior Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria) placed fifth with a time of 41.52. Sophomore Chris Murrell (Grand Island, NE) also finished fifth with a leap of 6-10 3/4 in the high jump.

Future Looks Bright: A total of 40 of the 50 points that the Golden Gophers scored at last weekend's Big Ten Championships will return next year. After finishing just eight points out of fourth place, Griak's squad is looking ahead with great anticipation to the 1992 Big Ten Championships to be held at the world-class Bierman Track & Field Stadium.

Gopher Twilight Meet: The Golden Gophers will host the co-ed Gopher Twilight Meet on Wednesday at 5:00 p.m. at the Bierman Track & Field Stadium. The competition represents the final opportunity to meet qualifying standards for the NCAA Championships to be held May 29-June 1 at Eugene, OR. Mark Lacy in the shot put (59-9) and sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH) in the pole vault (17-10 1/4) have provisionally qualified for the national meet in their respective events.

GOLF FINISHES IN SIXTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS; JUST MISS NCAA TOURNAMENT BID; O'LOUGHLIN NAMED TO ALL-BIG TEN TEAM

The University of Minnesota Men's golf team finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships in West Lafayette, IN this past weekend. The Gophers were led by Terry O'Loughlin(Maplewood, MN) who shot 71-72-77-68=288 for an eighth place finish.

As a team the Gophers finished three strokes behind Wisconsin whom they needed to beat to gain an NCAA post-season berth, and only ten strokes back of second place Ohio State. O'Loughlin was named to the All-Big Ten team for his efforts this season and he will be a key factor in the success of the Minnesota golf program next year.

If you review the 1990-91 golf campaign it can only be termed a huge success. First-year Head Coach John Means has led the revival of the program and the results were immediately evident. Individual stroke averages and team averages are down from a year ago. The Gophers finished in the top five in eight of the 13 tournaments they competed in, and only placed out of the top ten twice during the entire season. The Gophers top performance was at the Spartan Invitational on May 4-5 when they took first place with a 287-298-286=871 performance.

With the core of young outstanding golfers coming back, including some fine players that were red-shirted, and some talented newcomers on the way, the future of the University of Minnesota men's golf program looks promising. With John Means as the architect of this rebuilding process, the Maroon and Gold tradition has returned to the golf courses of the Big Ten.

GOPHERS ELIMINATED FROM NCAA WEST I REGIONAL; FINISH SEASON WITH 37-27 OVERALL RECORD

The University of Minnesota baseball team finished off the 1991 season with a 37-27 overall record, the third highest number of wins under Head Coach John Anderson's tenure at Minnesota. The Gophers were eliminated from the NCAA West I Regional by Hawaii 12-9 at Dedeaux Field in Los Angeles, CA on Sunday. Although the Golden Gophers dream of reaching the College World Series was broken, the season was still a success.

The Gophers continued the fine tradition of baseball at Minnesota by recording their 29th consecutive winning season and their 24th consecutive year of finishing in the top division of the Big Ten. In addition the Gophers broke a nine-year drought of NCAA post-season victories by defeating number two seed Hawaii 5-3 in the first round of the tournament. The Gophers' appearance marks the 18th time the Maroon and Gold has played in NCAA post-season action.

The Gophers also had a number of outstanding individual performances this season. **Brent Gates (Grandview, MI)** was the statistical leader for the Gophers in almost all offensive categories. He set single season marks in: most hits-91, most doubles-24, most total bases-147, and finished the season batting .412 (the first .400 hitter since Terry Steinbach in 1982). Gates also established career marks in total bases with 384, doubles-61, and batting average with a .387 career mark, breaking the mark of Terry Steinbach and Greg Olson at .375.

Senior Co-captains Jeff Monson (Bloomington, MN) and John Kopfer (Oconomowoc, WI) both finished their collegiate careers with fine seasons. They were the backbone and emotional leaders of the team throughout the season and really played their finest ball when it counted most.

The future of the Gophers baseball program looks very promising. They will lose some potent offense in fifth-year seniors Jeff Monson and John Kopfer, as well as steady play by fellow seniors Greg Johnson (Edina, MN) and Joe Wallraf (Waukegan, IL). A large part of the future of this team lies in the talented group of underclasssmen on the roster. The team will probably return all of its pitching staff and add several talented newcomers. The outfield will be solid with returning lettermen at all three positions. There will be some big holes to fill at first base and maybe shortstop, but the nucleus of another strong team is already there on the roster. There will be 14-17 lettermen returning next season. Add to that the talented red-shirt freshmen and incoming players and you have some stiff competition for playing time. All that adds up to is another exciting season of Golden Gopher baseball

Ryan Lefebvre (Los Angeles, CA) leads the returning players in the field. Lefebvre returned from an ankle injury to have an outstanding NCAA tournament in his hometown of Los Angeles. He batted 8-13 and made some outstanding defensive plays in the field enroute to being named to the West I All-Tournament team. First-year players Darren Schwankl (Burnsville, MN), Bill Mobilia (Ely, MN), Charlie Nelson (Perham, MN), Jason Karrman (Platteville, WI), and Big Ten Freshman of the Year Mark Merila (Plymouth, MN) all made big impacts on the team during the course of the season and will help form a solid core of players to lead the Gophers next season. In addition, three-time letterwinners Steve Calvert (Edina, MN), and Keith Krenke (Owatonna, MN) will be solid veterans looking to duplicate the feats of this year's senior class. The future of the Gopher baseball team is bright and before you know it the 1992 campaign will be in progress.

MORGAN RECEIVES TOP HONOR AT M BANQUET

Marty Morgan, a senior wrestler from Bloomington, MN, was named recipient of the University of Minnesota's Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor at the M Banquet on Wednesday at the Radisson University Hotel in Minneapolis.

Each member school in the Big Ten Conference presents this award annually to a studentathlete who demonstrates a high degree of proficiency in both scholarship and athletics.

Morgan capped off a perfect 39-0 season this year by winning the NCAA 177-pound title at the national meet in Iowa City with a 17-7 victory over Iowa State's Matt Johnson in the championship match. He had earlier won his second straight Big Ten crown with an 11-6 win over Iowa's Bart Chelsevig in the title match. As a junior in 1989-90, he won his first Big Ten title at 177 pounds and was NCAA runner-up. He finished the season with a 39-2 overall mark and registered a single-season school record with 20 pins.

After transferring from North Dakota State University where he was the NCAA Division II champion at 167 pounds in 1987, Morgan recorded a fine 32-10 overall record as a sophomore for the Golden Gophers in 1988-89. He finished sixth at the NCAA Championships at 167 pounds, after having earlier finished third at the Big Ten Championships. During his career at Minnesota, the two-time team MVP collected three straight All-American certificates and racked up an impressive 110-12 overall record with 41 pins.

Morgan's wrestling career, however, is far from over. He and his two brothers, former Golden Gopher All-American Gordy and U.S. Olympian John, are attempting to become the first set of brothers to make the U.S. Olympic Wrestling team in the same year. The 1992 Olympic Games will be held in Barcelona, Spain, next summer.

A two-time member of the 300 Club which recognizes Golden Gopher student-athletes who have earned at least a 3.0 GPA, Morgan is an art education major who will complete his graduation requirements this summer. An accomplished cartoonist/caricaturist, he is scheduled to begin student teaching this fall.

MURRELL & LACY COLLECT ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Sophomore Chris Murrell (Grand Island, NE) and junior Mark Lacy (Oak Brook, IL) garnered All-American honors at the NCAA Track & Field Championships which were held last Wednesday thru Saturday at Eugene, Ore.

Murrell Finishes Eighth: Chris Murrell finished eighth in Saturday's high jump final with a leap of 7-0 1/2 (2.15m) to earn his first All-American certificate. He had surpassed the NCAA provisional standard with a personal-best leap of 7-3 1/4 (2.22m) at the Gopher Twilight Meet held May 22 at the Bierman Track & Field Stadium. He captured the Drake Relays title with a jump of 7-1 (2.16m) earlier this season. As a freshman last year, he won the Big Ten indoor title with a school indoor record leap of 7-3 (2.21m), before going on to finish 10th at the NCAA Indoor Championships with a jump of 7-2 1/2 (2.20m).

Outdoor Personal Best For Lacy: With an outdoor personal-best throw of 58-10 1/4 (17.94m), Mark Lacy finished 10th overall in the shot put final on Saturday. The top eight American competitors in each event are decorated with All-American honors, and since three foreigners finished in front of him in the final standings, he earned the distinction as well. Lacy, who won the Big Ten indoor title with a personal-best and NCAA provisional qualifying throw of 59-9 (18.21m), placed 15th at the NCAA Indoor Championships last March with a toss of 53-3 1/2 (16.24m). He finished second at the recent Big Ten Outdoor Championships with a throw of 58-3 1/4 (17.76m).

Daler Competes At Second National Meet: Sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH), who tied for 14th in the pole vault at the NCAA Indoor Championships with a mark of 17-0 3/4 (5.20m), sailed over 16-8 3/4 (5.10m) in Wednesday's preliminary round, but failed in three attempts at 17-0 3/4 and did not advance to Friday's finals in the event. The national meet concluded an outstanding season for Daler, who among other accomplishments, registered a personal-best and NCAA provisional qualifying mark of 17-10 1/4 (5.44m) at the Iowa State Last Chance Meet back in March. That vault also set a new indoor school record.

Giel was runnerup to Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Lattner of Notre Dame as a senior and was most valuable player of the Big Ten Conference in 1952 and 1953. He was the first conference player honored in such a way in consecutive years. He was a Big Ten medal winner in 1954, Captain of the University's 1953 football team, UPI Player of the Year in 1953 and AP Back of the Year in 1953. Giel is a member of the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame and served as the University's sixth director of athletics from 1971 to 1988.

"The improvement of our on-campus sports facilities is absolutely crucial at this time in the history of the University of Minnesota," said Rick Bay, Director of Men's Intercollegiate Athletics, in the wake of news that the University yesterday requested proposals from building contractors on a new \$17.5 million ice hockey facility.

The remodeling will make the arena more comfortable for our fans, give us a dedicated section for student season ticket holders and help with recruiting."

"Minnesota hockey fans deserve a facility like this one," said Head Hockey Coach Doug Woog. "They'll finally be able to see better and enjoy the style and tradition of Gopher hockey."

In June of 1990, the University Regents voted in principle to approve the three components of the project, designed to keep University athletic teams on campus. Williams Arena was constructed in 1927. Mariucci Arena was carved out of the same structure in 1949. Neither facility has seen major improvements since.

U OF M REQUESTS PROPOSALS FOR HOCKEY ARENA

The University of Minnesota Tuesday, June 25, sent out a request for proposals from building contractors interested in bidding on the design and construction of a new ice hockey facility on campus.

The proposals are being solicited in anticipation of presenting an on-campus sports facilities construction and renovation package to the university's Board of Regents July 12. The package includes major remodeling of Williams Arena and the conversion of Mariucci Arena to a sports pavilion primarily for women's intercollegiate athletics, in addition to the new ice hockey facility.

In June 1990, the regents voted in principle to approve the three components of the project, designed to keep university athletic teams on campus. Williams Arena was constructed in 1927. Mariucci Arena was carved out of the same structure in 1949. Neither facility has seen major improvement since.

Sports facility improvement became a university-wide priority under the direction of the late Gus Donhowe, the university's former senior vice president for finance and operations, who, along with university President Nils Hasselmo, championed the project. Both identified the potential of athletics for drawing together the diverse population of the institution and building a sense of community on campus as the critical reasons to proceed.

The plan calls for maintaining the basic configuration of Williams Arena while refurbishing seating and improving team, locker room and concession areas. The pavilion, with a planned seating capacity of 6,000, is evidence of the university's commitment to gender equity in its intercollegiate athletic programs, according to Senior Vice President Bob Brickson. The new ice hockey facility calls for an initial seating capacity of 8,000 with room to expand to 9,600.

"The initial step in this process is requesting proposals on the ice hockey facility that meet that programmatic needs of the university and Gopher hockey while falling within a \$17.5 million construction budget," said Erickson. "The financial limits of this project are strict and are based upon our anticipated ability to generate additional revenue with the facilities and secure private donations. No state or university funding is included in any component of the project."

WOMEN'S ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT SUPPORT OF FACILITIES PROJECT

University of Minnesota women's athletic director Chris Voelz is pleased with the new sports facilities plans which are scheduled to go before the University Board of Regents on July 12. The package includes major remodeling of Williams Arena and the conversion of Mariucci Arena into a sports pavilion primarily intended for women's intercollegiate athletics, in addition to a new ice hockey facility.

The new sports pavilion will house women's volleyball, basketball and gymnastics and will have the potential to accommodate 6,000 plus fans. "The Mariucci renovation into a women's sports pavilion is significant in substance and in symbol," said Voelz. "It's competition area, fan seating, locker rooms, weight rooms, club room and study rooms offer the substance of a major intercollegiate athletic program. The new west entry and the designated space for women offer clearly a strong identity and is symbolic of the significant and equal role women should play at our university."

Women's basketball coach Linda Hill-MacDonald also supported the plan. "The new pavilion will give us a facility we can call our home and have the potential of filling on a regular basis, which will make our games more exciting for our student-athletes and fans."

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA SIGNS WOOG TO FIVE-YEAR DEAL

The University of Minnesota announced today that Hockey Coach Doug Woog has signed a five-year contract. The new contract provides no increase in compensation due to the University-wide freeze on wages and salaries. Woog's salary was \$66,030 in 1990-91.

"I am very happy to have signed Coach Woog to a new five-year contract," said Athletic Director Rick Bay. "The University of Minnesota hockey program has established a consistent level of success that is often taken for granted. Doug Woog has played a very important role in shaping that success."

Woog took over the coaching duties at Minnesota prior to the 1985-86 season and has guided the team to six straight NCAA playoff berths, including four Final Four appearances. Woog is the 11th head coach in Golden Gopher hockey history and enters the 1991-92 season with a career mark of 195-74-11. His 195 wins is second only to the legendary John Mariucci, who notched an overall 215-148-18 record.

"It's nice to finally have a signed contract," Woog said. "The contract negotiations were handled in good faith and the contract was worked out fairly within the University's salary restrictions.

"I like the people I work for and those I work with," he added. "The athletic department's administration gives me the tools to run a first-class program and have demonstrated they have the same willingness I do to provide our student-athletes the best opportunity to gain a quality education while achieving their athletic goals."

STUDENT FOOTBALL SEASON TICKETS SELLING WELL
