## LITTLE BROWN JUG DUEL FRIDAY NIGHT

Minnesota's annual battle for the Little Brown Jug is set for Friday at 7 p.m. in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome. That schedule variation was made because of the Minnesota Twins participation in the World Series and a potential conflict in the dome on Saturday.

The invading Wolverines will bring an overall record of 5-1 and a Big Ten Conference mark of 3-0 into Friday night's game after they downed Indiana 24-16 last weekend. It was their third straight victory.

Minnesota, meanwhile, will risk a 2-4 overall record and a 1-2 Big Ten log after it dropped a disappointing 20-12 decision at Michigan State last Saturday.

"Once again we made too many mistakes," Coach John Gutekunst lamented. "We have said all along that turnovers, penalties, long yardage plays, the kicking game and goal line defense were key factors in winning or losing. The goal line defense was the only one of those that didn't play a part in our loss to Michigan State."

Minnesota had two turnovers against the Spartans including a fumble at the MSU five when the Golden Gophers appeared

headed for what would have been a key touchdown. Then they promptly gave up an 88-yard touchdown run to Michigan State. Throw in four penalties, one of which nullified an apparent 43-yard touchdown run by Marquel Fleetwood (Jr, QB, Decatur, GA), ineffective kick coverage and a pair of missed conversions and Gutekunst's analysis becomes obvious.

"We don't give ourselves a chance to win when we commit mistakes like that," Gutekunst stressed. "I can't fault our people for their effort, and they hit right to the end. But we had our chances, and we just could not put Michigan State away."

Now the Golden Gophers face the unenviable task of squaring off with a team that stands in first place in the conference and looms as the highest ranking team remaining on Minnesota's 1991 schedule.

"To say that Michigan is an outstanding team is somewhat of an understatement," Gutekunst said. "They have outstanding individual athletes like Desmond Howard (he scored three times in last weekend's win over Indiana), and they've lived up to their pre-season ranking as the

Big Ten favorite."

Michigan holds a commanding bulge in the series. The Wolverines lead 2-0 at neutral sites, 30-11-1 at Ann Arbor, 24-12-2 in Minneapolis and 54-23-3 overall. Michigan is 4-0 in the Metrodome, and it has not lost to the Golden Gophers since Rickey Foggie and Chip Lohmiller led Minnesota to a 20-17 triumph at Ann Arbor in 1986.

While Minnesota suffered additional bumps and bruises at Michigan State, it is not expected that any additional Golden Gophers will be lost for the invading Wolverines. Chip Brixius (Sr, C, Excelsior) however, missed last weekend's contest with a knee problem and is not expected to be ready by Friday.

The big question, then, is can Minnesota bounce back against a national power. "It is always difficult to get ready after a loss," Gutekunst admitted, but he has maintained all along that the Golden Gophers were fighters and that they had character. Those characteristics are expected to be tested to the maximum in the battle for the Little Brown Jug at the Metrodome Friday night.

## **GOPHERS GAIN SPLIT AT UMD; TRAVEL TO DENVER THIS WEEKEND**

The Golden Gopher hockey team opened up the 1991-92 season by splitting their series at Duluth. The Gophers won the first game 7-3 and lost the series finale 7-4. The Gophers are now one point behind Northern Michigan in the WCHA standings after the Wildcats gained a tie and a win against Colorado College last weekend. This week the Gophers travel to Denver to take on the Pioneers, who lost two games at home against North Dakota to fall into last place with St. Cloud State who was idle.

**UMD Recap:** The Gophers opened the season with an exciting 7-3 come-from-behind victory led by All-American candidate **Larry Olimb's (Warroad, MN)** four point night. The Gophers trailed the game 3-1 until the 8:49 mark of the second period. In the next 32 seconds the Gophers scored three goals and just missed breaking a forty-four year old team record. That record for the fastest three goals was set in 1947 and remained intact, but another team record did not. The fastest two goals record had been set by Larry Olimb and Lance Pitlick in the 1988-89 season against Colorado College. That record of eight seconds for the fastest two goals fell to **Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN)** and All-American candidate **Travis Richards (Crystal, MN)** as the two scored goals seven seconds apart at the 9:14 and 9:21 marks of the period. The Gophers went on to cruise to the victory scoring the last six goals of the game.

In the Saturday game, the Gophers dug a hole letting the Bulldogs jump out to a 3-0 lead before the Gophers cut it to 3-2 at the end of the second period. The Bulldogs came out flying in the third period, scoring three straight goals to take a 6-2 lead and never looked back. On the bright side, the Gophers power play scored five times in 18 attempts in the penalty marred games and showed some offensive flash. Pre-season All-American **Trent Klatt (Osseo, MN)** had a strong weekend, scoring three goals and three assists, while his center **Craig Johnson** had two goals and four assists. **Larry Olimb** notched six points for the Gophers and freshman **Steve Magnusson (Dayton, MN)** had a his first goal as a Gopher and two key assists. **Next Up:** The Gophers have a tough assignment this week with the vastly improved Denver Pioneers, Friday October 25 and Saturday Oct. 26, with game times slated for 7:05 p.m. MT both nights. Head Coach **Frank Serratore's** squad lost both games of their opening series with North Dakota, but are looking to improve on their last place finish of a year ago. The Pioneers return 14 lettermen, including defenseman **Ken MacArthur**, who spent last season with the Canadian National Team. The Gophers won all four games with the Pioneers last year, including 5-2 and 2-0 victories at Denver, October 19-20, 1991.

**The Series:** The Gophers series with Denver stands at 62-41-6 in favor of the Maroon and Gold with Gophers last loss to the Denver team coming in the first game of the 1989-90 WCHA Tournament in St. Paul, MN. **Woog** has a 15-6-1 record against Denver, with four of the Gophers losses coming in **Woog's** first season when Denver made it to the NCAA Final Four and lost the third place game to the Gophers. **Woog** is 8-0 in the last four season's at Denver Arena and 8-3-1 overall at DU.

**Serratore Connection:** Denver Head Coach **Frank Serratore** was a former player for **Woog** with the St. Paul Vulcans, In fact, **Serratore** shared goaltending duties with Gopher Assistant Coach **Mark Mazzoleni** while with the Vulcans. **Serratore** had great success in the USJHL at Rochester, MN before signing on with the Pioneer's for the 1990-91 season.

## GOLDEN GOPHERS SET TO INVADE INDIANA

Minnesota's Golden Gophers take to the road Saturday for a Big Ten Conference football assignment with the Indiana Hoosiers. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. (EST).

Host Indiana will put an overall record of 4-2-1 and a conference mark of 3-1 on the line against the Golden Gophers after scoring a gutty 28-20 come-from-behind win at Wisconsin last weekend.

Coach John Gutekunst's charges, meanwhile, enter Saturday's game with an overall record of 2-5. They are 1-3 in Big Ten play after falling 52-6 to Michigan in the annual battle for the Little Brown Jug last Friday night.

"We continue to make mistakes," Gutekunst said after his club spotted the Wolverines to a 21-0 first-quarter lead on three consecutive fumbles. "You just can't give a good football team like Michigan that kind of advantage and expect to win."

Gutekunst obviously was not happy with Minnesota's turnovers (the Golden Gophers had five in all), with its offense (or lack of it) or with its kicking

game.

"Our turnovers gave Michigan field position time after time," he pointed out. "I don't have the answers for the lack of consistency with our offense, but we have to credit Michigan for playing very well."

As for the kicking game (Minnesota averaged less than 40 yards per punt and again failed on a point-after-touchdown attempt), Gutekunst was totally distressed. The Golden Gophers, who have kicked only one conversion in 1991, botched another attempt against the Wolves. "It was bad enough when we just were missing them," he admitted, "but now we can't even hold for them."

All of which means that the error-prone Minnesota contingent now must play a red-hot Hoosier team that boasts All-America candidate Vaughn Dunbar at tailback and Trent Green at quarterback...and on the road.

"We know that we have to come back," Gutekunst maintains. "We've got four Big Ten games remaining on our 1991 schedule, and we know that the next one (at Indiana) will be extremely difficult. We have

great respect for Indiana, but our people are fighters, and they are still fighting. They will regroup."

On the plus side, Minnesota came out of the Michigan game without any further injuries that would fall into the major category. On top of that **Prince Pearson (Jr, OG, Ft. Lauderdale, FLA)** who has missed the last three games with a knee injury has returned to the Golden Gopher two-deep.

In addition, **Mark Smith (So, TB, New Orleans, LA)** who led Minnesota in rushing a year ago saw action for the first time in two weeks against Michigan, and Gutekunst hopes to have him available for starting duty against the Hoosiers.

Minnesota and Indiana have met 52 times on the gridiron, and the Golden Gophers will take an overall edge of 31-18-3 into Saturday's contest. Minnesota also leads 28-7-1 in games played in Minneapolis after posting a 12-0 verdict last fall.

Indiana, however, boasts a commanding 11-3-2 bulge in games played in Bloomington, and the Golden Gophers have not won there since 1985 when they prevailed 22-7. Gutekunst is 2-3 against the Hoosiers.

## **GOPHERS SPLIT PAIR WITH DENVER; HOME OPENER IS PART OF ST. CLOUD STATE HOME-AND-HOME SERIES THIS WEEKEND**

The University of Minnesota hockey team split the weekend series at Denver to bring their record to 2-2 overall. The games followed the opposite pattern of the previous weekend when they had won the first night and lost the second night. The Gophers were sluggish and penalty ridden in the Friday night game losing to the Pioneers for the first time in 16 games by a score of 4-2. The Gophers rebounded on Saturday night gaining a 5-1 victory to capture the split.

The split left the Gophers just two points out of first place in the WCHA standings. Wisconsin and North Dakota are in first place with 3-1 records, Northern Michigan has a 2-1-1 slate, while Minnesota and UMD both are at 2-2.

**Denver Recap:** The Gophers opened up the series with Denver sluggishly and could never gain any flow. The Maroon and Gold was penalized 16 times and played five on five hockey for only 22 minutes of the game. A bright spot in the game was the play of **Scott Bell (St. Paul, MN)** and **Cory Laylin (St. Cloud, MN)**. Those two players competed and Bell got the Gophers on the board with an outstanding individual effort at the 10:33 mark of the second period. Another bright spot was the play of All-American candidate **Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk, MN)** in nets. The WCHA's leading goalie in 1990-91 had another outstanding game and kept the Gophers in the contest even though he suffered the loss. The game also marked the debut of freshman goalie **Jeff Callinan (Minnetonka, MN)**, who came into the game with seven minutes left to spare Stolp some of the Denver barrage.

On Saturday, the Gophers regrouped and got their offense on track. The Pioneers scored first on a breakaway goal at the 6:09 mark of the opening period, but that ended up being their only tally of the night as Stolp and the Gopher defense shut the door on them. The Gophers responded to the opening Denver goal with their own goal 33 seconds later when Scott Bell knocked in a rebound off a **Steve Magnusson (Dayton, MN)** shot and tied the game. The Gophers picked up another goal from **Joe Dziedzic (Minneapolis, MN)** before the end of the first period. In the second period sophomore **Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN)** put on a display, scoring a pair of goals, including a beautiful individual play where he split the Denver defense and beat the goalie between the legs.

**Home Opener:** The Gophers open up their 1991-92 home schedule this weekend as part of a home-and-home series with the St. Cloud State Huskies. The Gophers travel to St. Cloud on Friday to play the Huskies on their sheet, before opening up the '91-'92 home slate on Saturday night, at 7:05 p.m. in Mariucci Arena.

**The Series:** The Gophers have never lost to the Huskies, holding a 4-0-1 record against them. One of those games was the 1987 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame game which was counted as one of the Gophers 38 games that year. Last season the Gophers opened up against the Huskies in their WCHA debut. Both teams battled intensely before a standing room only crowd as the teams tied 3-3 in overtime. The Gophers won the other three games of the series last season by scores of 5-4, 7-1 and 7-3.

**About the Huskies:** St. Cloud had an immediate impact on WCHA standings last season and more of the same is expected this year. Head Coach Craig Dahl returns 10 lettermen and a host of talented newcomers. The Huskies opened their season last weekend losing a pair of 5-4 decisions to Wisconsin at home. The top players for St. Cloud this year are forwards Jeff Saterdalen and Tim Hanus, and defenseman Brett Livers. That trio was three of the top five scorers from last year. The Huskies suffered a big loss to the U.S. Olympic team when defenseman Brett Hedican was chosen to play for the Red, White and Blue this past summer.



**About Dahl:** Head Coach Craig Dahl is going into his fifth year at St. Cloud and holds a 65-81-9 record at the helm. His overall record stands at 124-152-7 in this his 11th season of collegiate coaching. The Huskies surprised many people last year when they finished tied for fifth in the WCHA standings and defeated UMD in the first round of the WCHA playoffs before falling to the North Dakota Fighting Sioux in three games.

**Broadcast Notes:** Both Games of the St. Cloud State series will be broadcast by MSC with Doug McLeod and Dick Bremer bringing you all of the action. The Huskie series, like all Gopher games, will be broadcast on KFAN 1130 AM, with Greg Harrington and Doug Johnson calling the action.

**Border Battle:** The Gophers are playing host to the Wisconsin Badgers on November 15-16. The Badger grid team will also be in town to play the Gophers at the Metrodome and the weekend has been dubbed the "Border Battle." The Saturday hockey game has been moved to the Met Center in Bloomington, MN to accommodate more fans for this always thrilling series. The Met Center game is scheduled for a 7:35 p.m. start, while the Friday night Mariucci arena game is scheduled to start at 7:05 p.m.

NO telephone numbers of student-athletes will be made available under any circumstances and the student-athletes are not available to the media on game day until after the conclusion of the game.

The first 15 minutes (usually 3:30 to 3:45 p.m.) of practice each Tuesday will be open to the media. Any action photo's/video should be taken at that time. All other practice sessions will be closed.

## **BARNES NAMED ASSISTANT BASKETBALL COACH**

University of Minnesota Head Basketball Coach Clem Haskins has announced the appointment of Milton Barnes as an assistant basketball coach for the Golden Gophers on an interim basis. The search process for a permanent replacement for Al Brown, who resigned last week to take a similar post at Tennessee, will begin immediately.

Barnes, who was as an assistant coach on Haskins' staff during the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons, returns to Gold Country after serving as the athletic director/head basketball coach at Albion (Mich.) Public Schools since 1988. Under his direction, Albion finished second at the Michigan State Class B Tournament this past season after claiming league, district and regional titles along the way. He also led the school to the district championship in 1990 and the league and district crowns in 1989. In three seasons at the helm, the school racked up an impressive 65-11 overall record.

During the 1985-86 season, Barnes served as the top assistant coach at the University of Detroit. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan (1983-85), part-time assistant coach and head softball coach at Detroit (1982-83), assistant coach at Kent State (1980-82) and volunteer coach at Albion College (1979-80).

Barnes charted an outstanding prep basketball career of his own at Saginaw (Mich.) High School, before going on to play four years at Albion College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1979. He is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the Black Coaches Association.

"I'm excited to get Milton back in our program," Haskins said. "We certainly will miss Al, but we're pleased to be able to bring in a coach of Milton's caliber at this time of the year. He will be in charge of our defense and we look forward to having him bring back the intensity that has been lacking for us on the defensive end of the floor."

"I'm excited about the opportunity to return to the University of Minnesota," Barnes said. "I've remained close to the program since I was first there and I'm anxious to do my part to help continue to build upon the momentum that Coach Haskins and his staff have established through the years."

## BUCKEYES UP NEXT FOR GOLDEN GOPHERS

Minnesota returns to the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome Saturday to play host to the Buckeyes from Ohio State University.

Kickoff is set for 11:30 a.m., and the game will be part of ESPN's Big Ten Game of the Week television package.

The invading Buckeyes will put an overall record of 6-2 on the line after falling 16-9 at home to Iowa last weekend. That setback dropped OSU to 3-2 in conference play.

Coach John Gutekunst's contingent, still smarting from last Saturday's 34-8 loss at Indiana, will bring an overall record of 2-6 into Saturday morning's game. The Golden Gophers are 1-4 in the Big Ten, and they now have lost three straight in league play.

"We just can't continue to make the kind of mistakes we are making and expect to win," Gutekunst said. "Penalties, turnovers and lack of offensive execution continued to kill us." He was referring to the nine infractions for 79 yards, the four turnovers (two lost fumbles and two interceptions) and an attack that generated a meager 202 yards (only 79 in the first half).

Defensively Minnesota registered a similar kind of story at Indiana. Besides giving up those 34 points, the Golden Gophers yielded 472 yards of offense to the Hoosiers.

"Indiana made the plays when it had to," Gutekunst conceded, "and we didn't. Everytime we seemed to do something good, something bad would happen. We just couldn't finish things off."

Now, with hopes for posting another winning record in 1991 gone, Minnesota faces the unenviable task of facing an Ohio State team that holds a commanding edge of 28-6 in the series dating back to 1921.

The Buckeyes are 15-2 against the U of M in Columbus where they shelled the Golden Gophers 52-23 a year ago, and they also lead 13-4 in games played in Minneapolis. They are 4-0 in games played in the Metrodome.

Minnesota's last win over Ohio State was by a 35-31 margin in 1981, and that came in old Memorial Stadium.

"We've been close a couple of times in recent years," Gutekunst pointed out, "and we owe them one. But we know

they will be smarting after losing their second Big Ten game of the season last weekend, and we also know that we must eliminate mistakes if we hope to get the job done."

Gutekunst's reference to "owing them one" may be pointed directly at the 1989 decision in the Metrodome when the Golden Gophers led 31-0 late in the second quarter only to fall 41-37.

His reference to errors might be aimed primarily at the offense where Minnesota has not produced a 100-yard rusher during the 1991 season. The closest to that coveted mark was the 81-yard game by Antonio Carter (So., RB, Columbus, OH) at Colorado early in the season.

In fact the last time a Golden Gopher went over 100 yards was the fifth game of the 1990 season when Mark Smith (So., RB, New Orleans, LA) netted 169 yards against Northwestern.

That means Minnesota, which lived by the 100-yard game through four years of Darrell Thompson, now has gone 14-consecutive assignments without such a production. Gutekunst hopes one surfaces against OSU.

## **GOPHERS SWEEP HUSKIES; GAIN FIRST-PLACE TIE WITH WISCONSIN** **Woog ties John Mariucci's all-time victory record with 199th career win**

The University of Minnesota Golden Gophers swept the St. Cloud State Huskies in a home-and-home series 7-4, 7-2 this past weekend, propelling themselves into a first-place tie with Wisconsin in the WCHA standings. The cold winter weather conditions ignited the Gophers offense as they exploded for 14 goals in the two games after scoring only 18 in their first four games. This week the Maroon and Gold have a week off from WCHA action as they renew an old rivalry with the Michigan Wolverines of the CCHA. Michigan was one of the original members of the WCHA and Big Ten Conference but left the WCHA after the 1980-81 season.

**St. Cloud St. Recap:** The Gophers high-powered offense was started by Hobey Baker Award candidate **Larry Olimb (Warroad, MN)**, who notched four points with two short-handed goals in the Gophers' 7-4 victory over host St. Cloud State on Friday. The Minnesota special teams were clicking as they scored two power play goals and one of Olimb's short-handed goals in the first period to jump out to a 3-0 lead. For the weekend the Gophers power play unit was 5-15 for an impressive 33% rate. Other top players in Friday Night's victory were **Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, MN)**, who had a goal and two assists, while All-American candidate **Trent Klatt (Osseo, MN)** added a goal and an assist of his own. Other players who scored goals were, **Steve Magnusson (Dayton, MN)**, **Doug Zmolek (Rochester, MN)** and **Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN)** also notched a goal a piece in the victory.

**Home Opener:** The Gophers opened up their 1991-92 home slate with an impressive 7-2 come-from-behind victory on Saturday night. Minnesota spotted St. Cloud two goals in the first period, before turning the rockets on and scoring seven unanswered goals. The Gophers were led by **Scott Bell (St. Paul, MN)** who had his first career hat trick with two of the goals being of the short-handed variety. **Larry Olimb** and **Travis Richards (Crystal, MN)** added power play goals as the Gophers raised their record to 4-2. **Steve Magnusson** and **Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, MN)** also found the back of the Huskie net.

**About the Wolverines:** The Michigan Wolverines were a consensus top five pick in the national polls this season and were favored to win the CCHA. They returned 18 lettermen from last seasons CCHA runner-up squad, including nine of their top 10 scorers. They are led by wingers **Danny Felsner** and **David Roberts**. Felsner scored 40 goals and 35 assists last year and is a Hobey Baker candidate, while Roberts had 26 goals and 45 assists. Last year Michigan was the number three seed in the west for the NCAA playoffs, but they were eliminated in the semifinals by Boston University. Michigan is coached by **Red Berenson** who has a 141-133-15 record in seven years at the helm.

**The Series:** The Gophers hold a slight edge in the series which stands at 108-95-12 with the most recent meeting between the two teams taking place in 1986, when the Gophers took a pair of games from the Wolverines at Mariucci Arena and that is the only time the two have met since **Doug Woog** became head coach. The Minnesota/Michigan hockey tradition is nearly as storied as the grid history. The Gophers have played Michigan more times than any other team, with 215 games between the two schools. **John Mariucci's** teams were always battling Michigan for the WIHL and later WCHA title. The Wolverines took an NCAA title from the "Maroosh" 7-3, after the Gophers had edged the Wolverines for the WIHL title. From 1951-58 the Wolverines finished no lower than second in the WIHL and notched four NCAA titles in that time span. Overall, Michigan has seven NCAA titles to lead all schools, with **Denver**, **North Dakota** and **Wisconsin** tied for second with five titles.

**Woog Watch:** Head Coach **Doug Woog** is one game away from becoming the winningest coach in Golden Gopher history. The "Wooger" has an overall mark of 199-76-11 in six+ years and is currently tied with his mentor **John Mariucci** in total wins. **Mariucci** had a career mark of 199-137-18 in his 13 years at the helm of the Gopher program. **Woog** has the top career winning percentage of any active coach in Division I hockey, with a .715 mark. **Woog's** winning percentage is not the best in Gopher history. **I.D. McDonald (10-1-1, .875)** and **Emil Iverson (70-20-13, .743)** the first two Gopher coaches, both have winning percentages higher than **Woog**.

## PAUL BUNYAN'S AXE AT STAKE SATURDAY

Paul Bunyan's Axe will be the prize Minnesota and Wisconsin battle for when they meet at 1:30 p.m. in Big Ten Conference football at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome on Saturday.

It will be the 1991 home finale for the Golden Gophers who will put an overall record of 2-7 and a conference mark of 1-5 on the line after falling 35-6 to Ohio State this past weekend. Invading Wisconsin stands at 3-6 overall and 0-6 in the Big Ten. It lost 20-7 at home to Michigan State last Saturday.

The meeting between the Golden Gophers and the Badgers will be the 101st in a series dating back to 1890 and ranking as the nation's longest continuing rivalries.

Minnesota will take an overall edge of 55-37-8 into Saturday's game. Wisconsin leads 23-21-7 in games played in Madison, but the Golden Gophers are on top 34-14-1 in games played in Minneapolis.

Wisconsin has won only once in the Metrodome, that a 56-17 decision in 1983. Coach John Gutekunst is 4-1 in games with the Badgers, and his Golden Gophers have won two

straight.....24-22 at home in 1989 and 21-3 in Madison last fall.

Coach Gutekunst expects Saturday's matchup to be a tough one as both teams battle not only for the cherished Axe but also for respect and "Border Battle" bragging rights.

"We know that Wisconsin is playing well defensively," Gutekunst points out, "but we did some good things on offense against Ohio State, and maybe we can build on that. We've shown some improvement in certain areas. Now we just need to put it all together against Wisconsin."

One of the "good things" Gutekunst was pointing to in last weekend's shootout against the Buckeyes was the 120 yards rushing notched by **Antonio Carter (So., TB, Columbus, OH)**. It was the first over 100-yard game recorded by a Golden Gopher since **Mark Smith (So., TB, New Orleans, LA)** did the job against Northwestern a year ago.

Gutekunst was not pleased, however, with Minnesota's turnovers and the inability to capitalize on scoring opportunities. "We had chances to score," he pointed out, "but we just

couldn't get the job done. Mistakes killed us, especially in the second quarter."

Minnesota had three turnovers in the game. The first was a fumble which gave Ohio State a scoring opportunity at the 24-yard line. The second was an interception at the goal line which stopped a Golden Gopher scoring drive. And the third was a fumble which stopped a Minnesota scoring drive at the one-yard line.

"We did some things well," Gutekunst maintained, "but every time we had a chance to get something done we would make a mistake and the chance would get away. We have to finish the job if we hope to beat Wisconsin Saturday."

Minnesota's injury report will make the task even bigger. Defensively, the Golden Gophers have lost **Joel Staats (Sr., LB, Winona, MN)** with a knee injury.

Offensively, **Marquel Fleetwood (Jr., QB, Decatur, GA)** suffered a hip pointer, and while he remains on Minnesota's depth chart for Saturday's home finale against the Badgers, his status has been described as a "day-to-day" situation.

## **GOPHERS LOSE PAIR TO MICHIGAN; RESUME WCHA ACTION THIS WEEKEND WITH WISCONSIN IN BORDER BATTLE**

The Golden Gophers hockey team took it on the chin this past weekend 7-3 and 7-6 in a pair of non-conference games with the Michigan Wolverines in Ann Arbor, MI. The Gophers were in the penalty box more often than not and the explosive Michigan power play unit made them pay by scoring seven power play goals in the two games. Michigan jumped to early leads in both games leading by 3-1 and 4-1 margins at the end of the first period on five power play goals in the two games.

The Gophers and Wolverines were evenly matched in five on five play, but the Golden Gophers were whistled down for 32 penalties in the two games and the difference was the power play unit of Michigan. The Gophers' penalty killing unit struggled and the power play unit was one for seven on Friday, but rebounded to go four of ten on Saturday. That game had many bright spots for the Maroon and Gold as they battled back to within one goal in the third period and had Michigan reeling, but the Gophers fell short and the many last period chances couldn't make up the four goal advantage the Wolverines enjoyed entering the final period.

**Michigan Recap:** Although the Gophers lost a pair of games they battled hard and there were some positive things of note that happened. Saturday night, freshman **Jeff Callinan (Minnetonka, MN)** got his first start and gave up seven goals in the loss, but his play was solid and four of the goals came when the Gophers were short-handed. In the third period, he held the Wolverines scoreless and stopped them cold on some breakaway situations. Another positive event in the game was when senior **Cory Laylin (St. Cloud, MN)** scored his first goal of the year. If the Gophers are to be successful, they must get offensive output from Laylin on a consistent basis. In addition, **Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, MN)** continued to improve, scoring two goals and two assists for the series. Meanwhile, **All-American candidate Larry Olimb (Warroad, MN)** continues to lead the Gophers in scoring. After notching a goal and three assists for the series the "Big O" has five goals and 13 assists for 18 points.

**Border Battle:** The Golden Gophers can't dwell on the losses at Michigan, because WCHA action returns in a hurry this week when the league-leading Wisconsin Badgers come to town for the "Border Battle." Friday night's game will be at Mariucci Arena at 7:05 and the Saturday event will be played in front of 15,000 at the Met Center in Bloomington with a 7:35 start time. Nestled in between the two will be the Wisconsin/Minnesota grid match at the Metrodome with both teams fighting to stay out of the cellar of the Big Ten. The Wisconsin hockey club is 6-2 and is leading the league with eight points after sweeping the Michigan Tech Huskies in Madison, 3-2 and 4-3 with both games being won in overtime. The Badgers have played all eight of their games in WCHA league play with four of the games played at the Dane County Coliseum.

**About the Badgers:** The Badgers are coached by Jeff Sauer who has a 252-132-17 mark in his 10th season at the helm of the Wisconsin program. A 20-year veteran of the WCHA, Sauer has been Coach of the Year twice, and has won two NCAA Championships for the Badgers. The Badgers finished third in the WCHA last season with a 19-11-2 record and lost to the Gophers 3-2 in the WCHA Tournament in St. Paul. The overall record between the teams stands at 96-58-11 with the edge going to the Gophers. The first game of the series was in 1922 in Madison when I.D. McDonald's Gophers won 3-0. Wisconsin dropped hockey in 1935, but resumed play in 1963 and have been a national power ever since. The strength of the Wisconsin club starts in the goal where senior Duane Derksen returns and is off to a strong start this year.

**Woog Watch:** Head Coach Doug Woog is one game away from becoming the winningest coach in Golden Gopher history. The "Wooger" has an overall mark of 199-78-11 in six+ years and is currently tied with his mentor John Mariucci in total wins. Mariucci had a career mark of 199-137-18 in his 13 years at the helm of the Gopher program. Woog has the top career winning percentage of any active coach in Division I hockey, with a .715 mark. Woog's winning percentage is not the best in Gopher history. I.D. McDonald (10-1-1,.875) and Emil Iverson (70-20-13,.743), the first two Gopher coaches, both have winning percentages higher than Woog.

## *GOPHERS TO CLOSE SEASON AT IOWA ON SATURDAY*

Minnesota will bring down the curtain on their 1991 football season Saturday when invading the University of Iowa to take on the Hawkeyes in this year's Big Ten Conference finale at 1:00 p.m.

Coach John Gutekunst's charges, with memories of their heartbreaking 19-16 loss to Wisconsin last weekend still fresh in their minds, will put an overall record of 2-8 and a conference mark of 1-6 on the line against arch-rival Iowa in the annual battle for Floyd of Rosedale.

Minnesota's most-recent setback seemed like a carbon copy of the 1991 season. Missed opportunities, turnovers, ineffective kick coverage and costly penalties made the difference in the outcome.

"We moved the ball well, especially in the second half," Gutekunst pointed out, "but we couldn't finish things off. We just didn't score enough when we had the chances. In spite of moving the ball well, we would lose field position when our coverage failed. We dominated play in the second half, but still came up empty."

Statistically, the verdict went to the Golden Gophers. They had 29 first downs to 10 for the Badgers. They had 423 yards of total offense to 208 for Wisconsin. Antonio Carter (So., TB, Columbus, OH) had over 100 yards (136) for the second straight game.

The Hawkeyes, meanwhile, will risk an overall record of 9-1 and a Big Ten standard of 6-1 after whipping Northwestern 24-10 last Saturday. Iowa continues to nurse slim hopes for a share of the '91 title, but it knows it already has locked up a berth in the Holiday bowl.

There have been a total of 83 gridiron meetings between these two schools dating back to 1891. Minnesota will take an overall edge of 53-28-2 into Saturday's game, and it also leads 31-11-1 in games played in Minneapolis as well as 22-17-1 in games played in Iowa City.

The Golden Gophers finished on top 31-24 at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome a year ago.

In fact Minnesota has won two straight from the Hawks. It also posted a 43-7 verdict at Iowa City in 1989.

This year's challenge, how-

ever, is a major one for Coach Gutekunst and his physically-battered contingent against the nationally-ranked favorites. He realizes that the Hawks are an excellent football team that is having an excellent season.

"We know it will not be easy Saturday," Gutekunst said.

"While we're glad that we have a chance to play once more after the taste of the Wisconsin game, we also realize what a challenge Iowa is going to be. We know that the series has been a great one with some real surprises, however, so who knows."

Saturday's contest will be Minnesota's third "trophy" battle of the '91 season. The Golden Gophers lost the Little Brown Jug to Michigan and then Paul Bunyan's Axe to Wisconsin last weekend.

They hope to reverse things with Floyd of Rosedale in Saturday's finale and keep the hog in Minnesota.

Twenty-two Golden Gopher seniors make their final appearances in the maroon and gold Saturday. They would like to erase some of their '91 disappointments with a win at Iowa.

## **WOOG WINS NUMBER 200 AS GOPHERS SWEEP WISCONSIN AND REGAIN SHARE OF WCHA LEAD; TRAVEL TO ALASKA-ANCHORAGE THIS WEEKEND**

The University of Minnesota swept a pair of games from the Wisconsin Badgers to regain a tie in the WCHA standings with Wisconsin. Head Coach Doug Woog reached a milestone on Friday night at Mariucci Arena when the Gophers came from behind to win 5-4. With that win, Woog became the all-time win leader at Minnesota, surpassing the record of his coach and mentor, the late John Mariucci, who had a career record of 199-137-18. Woog's charges set another milestone on Saturday night as the Golden Gophers defeated the Badgers 4-1 in front of a WCHA and NCAA regular-season record crowd of 15,712 at the Met Center in Bloomington.

**Border Battle Recap:** The Gophers raised their record to 6-2 in the WCHA and 6-4 overall, good for a tie for first-place in the WCHA. The victories were like all Minnesota/Wisconsin affairs, hard-fought battles filled with emotion. The Badgers jumped out to a 2-0 lead on Friday night as the Gophers penalty woes continued. The Gophers have been whistled down 56 times in the first period this year compared to 40 times for their opponents. The Gophers battled back from that deficit to tie the game in the second period on the first of Trent Klatt's (Osseo, MN) three goals. The Gophers took a 5-2 lead on the strength of Klatt's three goals, while Cory Laylin (St. Cloud, MN) and Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, MN) each added a goal to pace the Gophers.

**Live at the Met:** The Gophers and Badgers took to the ice in front of a standing-room only crowd on Saturday night at the Met Center. The crowd set an WCHA and NCAA regular-season attendance record, surpassing the record of 15,684 set last year when Michigan and Michigan State squared off at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit. The Gophers scored twice in the opening period with the Grand Rapids, MN connection of Jeff Nielsen and John Brill getting the goals. The Badgers tallied one goal in the period before senior All-American candidate Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk, MN) shut the door on them for the night. For the weekend, Stolp gave up only five goals and raised his record to 6-2 for the year with a 3.30 GAA. Trent Klatt and Travis Richards (Plymouth, MN) also tallied goals as the Gophers cruised to a 4-1 win.

**Gophers travel to Alaska to Battle Seawolves:** The Golden Gophers travel to Alaska-Anchorage this weekend to play a pair of non-conference games against the Seawolves. The Seawolves are coming off a successful season a year ago when they advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals before being eliminated by the eventual NCAA champion Northern Michigan Wildcats in Marquette, MI. The Seawolves are coached by Kelvin Christiansen who has a 207-141-17 record in his 12 years at the helm. Anchorage returns seven of their top ten scorers from last season. They also return veteran goalie Paul Krake who played in 37 games last year, including the Seawolves' stunning two-game upset of Boston College in Boston. With 12 seniors in the lineup, the Seawolves are a veteran team with NCAA post-season experience and a tough one to beat in their own building. Sullivan Arena (6,290) is a beautiful building, featuring an Olympic-sized ice sheet and many other amenities.

**The Series:** The Gophers and Seawolves have met four times, with the Gophers holding a 3-1 edge in the series. The last game between the teams was February 3, 1990 when the Seawolves upset the Gophers 4-3 in overtime at Mariucci Arena. 

**STATEMENT BY PRESIDENT NILS HASSELMO CONCERNING THE  
UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA FOOTBALL PROGRAM**

After a series of discussions with John Gutekunst, I have accepted his resignation as coach of the University of Minnesota football team. The resignation will be effective Jan. 1, 1992.

I discussed his resignation with John and with Men's Athletic Director Dan Meinert and Dean Robert Stein, the men's faculty representative to the Big Ten Conference, and others. On the basis of those discussions, I decided to accept John's resignation.

I agreed to this action with appreciation for John's dedication to the University and with appreciation for what he has contributed to Gopher athletics.

The best I can do in summarizing the reasons for this action is simply to say that the time comes when new leadership is needed. This is not because the old leadership is bad but because new leadership can bring new perspective, new opportunities and new energy to an enterprise.

John Gutekunst is a fine man. He has demonstrated his concern for the players, for their education as well as their development as athletes. He has played by the rules, and he has given us some exciting moments on the field.

I want to express my own and the University's appreciation to Coach Gutekunst for his contributions to the football program.

I know of no reason why the University of Minnesota should not be one of the best universities in the nation in football as it is, and strives to be, in all its academic activities. I am committed to a course of action that will produce excellence in athletics as well as academics.

As we undertake our search for a new head football coach, we will focus on the three basic requirements that we have established for our athletic programs and that were all considered in the review of the football program: educating our student-athletes, playing by the rules, and fielding competitive teams.

All three components are essential and none can stand alone.

## Gophers End '91 Season with Final Mark Of 2-9

What had already been a season of disappointments ended in the same fashion for the University of Minnesota's football team when it dropped the 1991 finale 23-8 at Iowa.

The setback was the sixth straight for the Golden Gophers who finished at 2-9 overall and 1-7 in the Big Ten Conference. That final loss dropped Minnesota into the conference cellar.

"I feel sorry for the seniors," Coach John Gutekunst said, "but we wish them the best. The loss to Iowa was a disappointment, especially after we had played so well in the first half. And our people have to be given credit.....they fought Iowa right to the end, and I am extremely proud of them for that."

Like the rest of the season and the rest of the losses, it was a case of untimely penalties, a turnover and a necessity to play from behind that proved Minnesota's downfall.

"We missed a scoring opportunity in the first half because of a penalty," Gutekunst pointed out, "and then when we had to try to overcome Iowa's lead we wound up giving up a couple of

long gainers, big plays."

For Gutekunst, who resigned as Minnesota's head coach just prior to the Iowa finale, it was a tough loss and a tough season, but he wound things up by saying, "I thank you Minnesota," and by predicting that the Golden Gophers would come back.

What he says might be closer to the truth than experts think. Although there were 22 seniors on the 1991 U of M roster, Gutekunst played approximately 58-60 Golden Gophers a game. "Minnesota will have a lot of good people coming back next year who have some solid Big Ten game experience under their belts."

In addition, Gutekunst re-dshirted over 20 players in 1991, and those gridders, when added to the approximately 40 lettermen who should return for 1992, will provide Gutekunst's successor with anything but a bare cupboard.

Season-ending statistics show that **Marquel Fleetwood (Jr., QB, Decatur, GA)** led the U of M this year in total offense with 1,820 yards. Fleetwood rushed for 178 yards and passed for 1,642 (155 of 264 for 58.7%).

**Patt Evans (Sr., TE, Swarthmore, PA)** was the top Golden Gopher receiver. He had 35 catches for 454 yards and a touchdown. **Antonio Carter (So., TB, Columbus, OH)** who had two over 100-yard games late in the season, finished as Minnesota's leading rusher. He netted 660 yards on 165 carries.

Defensively **Sean Lumpkin (Sr., SS, Golden Valley)** finished as the top defender. He had 84 solo tackles and 31 assists for a total of 115 hits. Lumpkin also logged five interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

**Paul Hopewell (Sr., SE, Loveland, OH)** was Minnesota's most productive scorer with 22 points. **Chuck Rios (So., TB, Little Canada, MN)** despite missing the final three games of the season was tops in kickoff returns with 11 for 227 yards.

Gutekunst wound up his six-plus years at Minnesota with an overall record of 29-37. He was 1-1 in post-season bowl appearances, beating Clemson in the 1985 Independence Bowl and losing to Tennessee in the 1986 Liberty Bowl. He finished four of his six years at the U of M with winning records during regular-season play.

The committee has been asked to begin work immediately. A tentative target date of December 16 has been set for closing the application process.

The Minnesota-Arkansas and Arizona State-Rice first round games both will be televised, as will both of Tuesday's semifinal contests and Wednesday's championship game. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of University of Minnesota basketball with Ray Christensen, who has broadcast a total of 994 Golden Gopher games heading into his 36th season, calling all of the action. The contest against Akron at Williams Arena on Wednesday, December 11 will be his 1,000th game.

**Golden Gopher Maui Headquarters:** Minnesota's headquarters at the Maui Invitational will be the Maui Marriott. The phone number is (808) 667-1200 and the FAX number is (808) 667-0692. Assistant SID Marc Ryan will arrive with the team in Hawaii on Saturday evening, November 23.

**Tough Field:** The Maui Invitational has once again attracted a star-studded field led by Arkansas, rated No. 3 in the AP poll, and No. 24 Arizona State. Arkansas, Arizona State and Michigan State all qualified for the 1991 NCAA Tournament, while Providence and Rice played in the NIT. Since the tournament's inception in 1984, there have been 62 institutions that have reached the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 field, 31 have reached the Elite Eight, 16 the Final Four, nine teams have made it to the championship game and six teams (Indiana, Kansas, Louisville, Michigan, UNLV and Villanova) have won national championships.

**Scouting Arkansas:** No. 3 Arkansas is moving into the Southeastern Conference this season and Head Coach Nolan Richardson's talent-laden squad appears to be more than capable of handling the challenge. Four starters and five other lettermen return from the team that racked up an impressive 34-4 overall mark and reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament a year ago. Seven of those returning lettermen were members of the 30-5 team that advanced to the 1990 Final Four. Superstar guard Todd Day, Roosevelt Wallace, Darrell Hawkins and Elmer Martin, however, are suspended and will not play in the Maui Invitational. But the cupboard is hardly bare for the Razorbacks. Leading the way in Maui will be a trio of seniors: Lee Mayberry, Isaiah Morris and Oliver Miller. Mayberry (13.2 ppg) is a 6-2 silky, smooth guard with unlimited range, who already owns the school career, single season and single game records for assists. A force in the paint, Miller, a 6-9, 290-pound center, averaged 15.7 points and 7.7 rebounds a game last season. He also led the nation in field goal percentage with a sparkling mark of .704. Morris, a 6-8, 228-pound forward, is an exceptional all-around athlete. He started 25 games last season and averaged 7.5 points and 4.1 rebounds a contest.

**Season Openers:** The University of Minnesota has registered an overall record of 71-25 (.740) in season openers through 96 seasons of intercollegiate basketball competition. Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins is 2-3 in season openers at Minnesota.

**Golden Gophers in Hawaii:** This will be the third time in history that the University of Minnesota basketball program has journeyed to Hawaii and the Golden Gophers have recorded a 4-2 overall mark on their previous two trips. During the 1971-72 season, the Golden Gophers played in the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, falling 60-57 to Temple in the first round, before bouncing back with victories over Hawaii-Marines (86-71) and TCU (83-57). In 1985-86, the Golden Gophers defeated West Virginia State 120-106, lost to Middle Tennessee State 92-79 and then topped Brigham Young-Hawaii 87-80 in the BYU-Hawaii Classic in Laie.

**Frequent Flyer Miles:** The eight schools participating in the 1991 Maui Invitational will fly a combined 67,000 miles round trip for the three-day event.

**Youth Prevails:** The Golden Gophers' roster has eight freshmen, five sophomores, two juniors and one senior.

**Looking Back:** Minnesota split a pair of exhibition games this season. On Monday, November 18, Athletes in Action, behind 42 points from former NBA guard Lorenzo Romar, came away with an exciting 100-93 overtime victory over the Golden Gophers before 11,758 at Williams Arena. Freshman Voshon Lenard led the Golden Gophers with 20 points, followed by sophomore Randy Carter with 15 points. Junior captain Dana Jackson collected an offensive rebound and then scored as time ran out in regulation play to send the game into the extra session. Behind 13 points apiece from Jackson and Lenard, the Golden Gophers scored a tough 67-66 exhibition game victory over Brazil Ripasa on November 9 before 13,303 at Williams Arena. Freshman **Jayson Walton (Dallas, Texas)** also scored in double figures with 10 points on the night. Coach Haskins, who used 11 different players in the contest, saw his young club rally from a deficit that reached nine points with just over 16 minutes remaining. Brazil had the ball and the opportunity to win the game in the closing seconds, but junior **Nate Tubbs (Fort Wayne, Ind.)** blocked Wagner Machado's shot as time expired.

**Coach Haskins:** Entering his sixth season at the helm, Head Coach Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he directed the program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament in 1989 (Sweet Sixteen) and 1990 (Elite Eight). This past July he coached the North squad to an unbeaten record and the gold medal at the U.S. Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. Known as "Clem the Gem," he was a consensus All-America choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 2, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT appearance. Coach Haskins has recorded a 73-74 overall record at Minnesota, including a 54-37 mark the past three seasons. He has a 174-147 overall record in 11 seasons.

**Carter & McDonald Shine:** Randy Carter and Arriel McDonald distinguished themselves as two of the finest rookie players in the Big Ten last season. Carter, a 6-8 forward, ranked first on the team in rebounding (5.9) and third in scoring (9.6) during his first season in Gold Country. McDonald, a 6-2 guard, finished as the team leader in assists (4.5) and was fourth in scoring (9.3).

**Winter Signs With Minnesota:** Trevor Winter, a 7-foot, 245-pound center from Slayton (Minn.) High School, has signed a national basketball letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota. He averaged 22.4 points, 12.0 rebounds and 5.0 blocks a contest last season for Slayton which finished with an overall 13-10 record. An All-Red Rock Conference choice and an honorable mention all-state selection following his junior season, he was invited to the prestigious NIKE Camp this past summer which included many of the nation's finest prep players and was also a member of the Minnesota Select Team. An outstanding all-around athlete, he is a first baseman on the school's baseball squad where he hit a sparkling .375 at the plate as a junior. He is also one of the top students in his senior class.

"It's great to have Trevor become a part of our family here at the University of Minnesota," said Coach Haskins. "He will be a welcome addition to our program and he exemplifies everything you look for in a student-athlete."

**Looking Ahead:** The Golden Gophers will play their home opener this Saturday when they host Howard at 3:00 p.m. at Williams Arena. Head Coach Butch Beard's squad returns seven letterwinners from 1990-91 when the Bison registered an 8-20 overall record. Headlining the returnees is 6-6 senior forward Juluis McNeil who averaged 11.3 points and 3.4 rebounds last season. Saturday's contest marks the first time that the two schools have met on the basketball court.

**Williams Arena:** The Golden Gophers have become very tough to beat at home in front of their loyal home fans. They have registered an impressive 36-11 record (.766) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

## **GOPHERS WIN TWO GAMES AT ALASKA-ANCHORAGE; HOST NORTH DAKOTA FIGHTING SIOUX THIS WEEKEND AT MARIUCCI ARENA**

The University of Minnesota ice hockey team took a pair of games from the Alaska-Anchorage Seawolves this past weekend 4-0, 3-2 (OT). The Golden Gophers, 8-4 (6-2 in WCHA), return to WCHA action this weekend at Mariucci Arena when the North Dakota Fighting Sioux come to town.

**Alaska-Recap:** The Gophers traveled three time zones away to play the Alaska-Anchorage Seawolves in non-conference action. The Seawolves came into the series with an unblemished 6-0 record. On Friday night, the Gophers jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first period and never looked back, as they shutout the Seawolves 4-0. **All-American candidate Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk, MN)** posted the third shutout of his career stopping 33 shots. Stolp has now lowered his GAA to 2.93 overall. The Gophers were led in scoring by **Freshman of the Year candidate Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, MN)**, who notched two goals and an assist in the game. Craig Johnson had the opening goal and eventual game-winner on a first period power play, while pre-season **All-American Larry Olimb (Warroad, MN)** had two assists. The shutout was the first ever by a collegiate team at Sullivan Arena.

On Saturday the script was very similar as the Gophers jumped on top, 2-0, at the end of one period. Sophomore **Joe Dzedzic (Minneapolis, MN)** opened the scoring with his third goal of the year. **Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, MN)** then banged home his sixth goal of the year at the 13:53 mark. That's when the script changed as the Seawolves assaulted freshman goalie **Jeff Callinan (Minnetonka, MN)** with 22 shots in the first two periods. Callinan hung tough but gave up two goals, the tying goal on a controversial call when the puck went into the net as it was being knocked from its moorings by a Seawolves player. The Gophers' defense shut down Alaska in the third period, holding them to three shots on goal while they peppered Seawolf goalie Paul Krake with 11 shots. Krake held the Gophers at bay and forced an overtime period. At 3:50 of the extra period, **All-American candidate Travis Richards (Plymouth, MN)** set Darby Hendrickson up on a breakaway. Krake came out to cut down the angle. As the two players collided, the puck popped over Krake and into the net, giving the Gophers the victory and their fourth straight victory.

**Sioux Review:** The North Dakota Fighting Sioux's season has been an up and down one already. They opened with three victories and five in their first six games. They followed that with four consecutive road losses to fall to sixth-place in the WCHA. Last weekend, they returned home to play a strong Michigan Tech team, and swept the series 6-1, 5-2. The Sioux are led offensively by **All-American Greg Johnson** who has six goals and 20 assists already this season. North Dakota has three of the top five scorers in the league in Johnson, Dixon Ward (11-12=23) and Jeff McLean (10-17=27). Their problem has been on defense, where they have given up 4.6 goals per game.

**Chief of the Sioux:** Gino Gasparini has been at the helm of the North Dakota hockey program for 14 seasons. His career record stands at 359-184-19, with three NCAA titles and three WCHA titles under his belt. A former Sioux letterwinner, he has built the program into one of the finest in the country. Their patented late-season runs on the league title are well known. If he can get this unit playing solid defense they will be in the thick of things come March.

**Woog against North Dakota:** Last year, the Gophers won three of four from the Sioux. The Gophers' 13-game winning streak was halted in Grand Forks by a score of 6-1. The following night the Maroon and Gold rebounded for a 6-3 victory to gain the split. Last February at Mariucci Arena the Gophers overwhelmed the Sioux 4-1, 11-5 in the final games of the regular season. Doug Woog has an impressive 11-2 record at Mariucci against North Dakota, with a 17-10 record overall against them.

**Broadcast Schedule:** The Friday night game will be telecast on KITN-FOX 29 with Frank Mazzocco and Wally Shaver, while Saturday's game will be telecast on MSC with Doug McLeod and Dick Bremer calling the action. The radio broadcast has Friday's game on live on KFAN 1130 AM with Greg Harrington and Doug Johnson, while Saturday's will be live on KJJO 950 AM with a tape-delayed broadcast on KFAN following the completion of the Timberwolves basketball game.

## IOWA STATE DEFEATS U OF M IN MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL

The Iowa State Cyclones came back from a 19-point deficit after the first two days of competition to capture the 1991 Minnesota Invitational with a score of 1621. The Maroon & Gold closed out the three day event with 1429 points for a second place finish, while Florida Atlantic rounded out the top three with 306 points. The University of Manitoba was fourth with 123, followed by a tie between Nebraska and St. Olaf at 123, North Dakota was seventh with 62 and Hamline University rounded out the nine team field with 31 points. Iowa State swept the top three spots in the 200 backstroke and the 100 freestyle. Minnesota top finishers were **Scott Hart (Rochester, Minn.)** and **David Zarns (New Brighton, Minn.)**. Hart touched first with a time of 15:54.47 in the 1650 freestyle and Zarns won the 10 meter platform diving event with a score of 649.25. After two nights of competition, Minnesota held a narrow lead over Iowa State (1122-1103) by winning the last four events. Minnesota had its strongest performance in the 100 butterfly, where **Sean Quackenbush (Rochester, Minn.)** with a time of :49.44, **Del Cerney (Staples, Minn.)** in :49.74, and **Can Ergenekan (Beaverton, Ore.)**, with a time of :50.86 to finish 1-2-3. On the first night of competition, Minnesota moved out to a 27-point lead over Iowa State (527-500). **Up Next:** Minnesota will compete in the U.S Open meet next weekend with no team scoring. Meet time is set for 9:00 a.m. with prelims followed by finals at 6:00 p.m. After Minnesota competes in the U.S. Open the team will take their winter training trip to St. Croix, Virgin Islands, from December 12 through the 24.

**Smith signs with U:** Nathan Smith, a prep All-American diver, from Laguna Niguel, Calif., has signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota. Smith earned All-American honors on the one and three-meter diving events and has been a multiple finalist at the Junior Olympic National Championships. In addition he also was a Senior National qualifier on the one, three and ten meter boards this past summer.

"Nathan is a very well rounded and talented athlete," says Head Diving Coach Doug Shaffer. "I feel he is Minnesota's most prominent male recruit, and he should help us contend for the Big Ten Championship throughout his four-year career."

The committee has been asked to begin work immediately. A tentative target date of December 16 has been set for closing the application process.

## **MINNESOTA WRESTLING SIGNS THREE MORE BLUE-CHIPPERS**

The University of Minnesota announced the signing of three outstanding prep wrestlers to national letters of intent. A year ago Minnesota brought in the nation's top recruiting class, and appears on a similar track with this group of early signers.

"It's not just important to get the number one recruiting class, but to put quality individuals back to back," Coach J Robinson said. "This is our third such class in a row. In many ways it's the same as the number one class we brought in last year -- just not as many."

Robinson's recruits include two of the state's top-flight wrestlers, while the other comes to Gold Country all the way from Sandpoint, Idaho.

Brandon Paulsen, of Anoka, has signed a national letter of intent to attend the University next year. Paulsen, considered to be one of the best lightweights the state has ever produced, has charted a 105-8-1 prep record -- all eight of his losses came during his freshman season. His mat resume includes a fifth place finish at the Pan-Am Games as a member of the U.S. delegation at the tender age of 16. Paulsen, who is a two-time state champion, is one of three finalists competing for a spot on this summer's United States Olympic team.

In 1991, Paulsen became the first high school wrestler ever selected as a member of TEAM USA. His achievements include three Espoir national championships, two Olympic Festival Gold medals and five Junior National All-America certificates.

Joining Paulsen as the other Minnesotan to sign with the Golden Gophers is Simley High School's Nick Halverson. Halverson was a runner-up at last year's state high school tournament, the third year in a row he has done so. He begins his final prep campaign with a 43-1-1 record, while earning First Team Academic All-State honors. Halverson has also wrestled with Minnesota's Junior National team for two years, and was a member of the USA Exchange team that travelled to Germany.

Zack Taylor (Sandpoint, Idaho), the team's first out-of-state signee this year, is a two-time Idaho High School state champion. Taylor has compiled a three-year prep record of 93-3 and recently won a silver medal at the Cadet Worlds. He is expected to wrestle at 167 pounds or heavier next season for the Gophers.

Riding a three-game win streak, Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gopher basketball squad will host non-conference foe Youngstown State at Williams Arena on Monday. Tip-off is at 7:00 p.m.

**Broadcast Coverage:** Monday's Minnesota-Youngstown State contest will be broadcast on the Midwest Sports Channel (MSC). WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of University of Minnesota basketball with Ray Christensen, who is in his 36th season and has broadcast a total of 998 Golden Gopher games during his career, calling all of the action. The game against Akron at Williams Arena on Wednesday, December 11 will be his 1,000th game.

**Scouting Youngstown State:** After opening with wins over Messiah (54-53) and Dyke (72-49), Youngstown State dropped to 2-1 on the season after Ohio University topped the host Penguins 72-62 at the Beeghly Center on Saturday. Jerome Sims, a 6-6 junior forward, led the way for Head Coach John Stroia's club with 15 points and a game-high 16 rebounds. Through three games, Bob Fick, a 6-8, 225-pound senior center, leads the team in scoring with an average of 12.3 points a game. Ray Ellington, a 6-2, 230-pound senior guard who is an ex-Penguin football standout and an excellent all-around athlete, and Sims are next at 11.3 points an outing. Sims leads the team in rebounding with an impressive average of 12.7. In his third season as head coach, Stroia has registered an overall record of 22-37 heading into Monday's game.

**The Series:** Minnesota holds a 3-0 edge in the all-time series with Youngstown State, including a 95-77 victory at Youngstown last January.

**Williams Arena:** The Golden Gophers have become very tough to beat at home in front of their loyal home fans. They have registered an impressive 37-11 record (.771) over the past three-plus seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

**Impressive Start:** Head Coach Clem Haskins' young Golden Gopher squad served notice that they will be a tough team to contend with in the 1991-92 season by taking two of three games at the prestigious Maui Invitational, and then scoring a 41-point victory over Howard in the home opener at Williams Arena on Saturday. The Golden Gophers led No. 2 Arkansas 54-49 with 12:18 to play in Monday's opening round of the Maui Invitational, before the experienced and talent-laden Razorbacks, who will play in the Southeastern Conference this season, went on a 14-0 run over the next 3:56 of play to take a 63-54 advantage en route to the 92-83 victory. Randy Carter led the Golden Gophers with 19 points and 11 rebounds. Behind 20 points and seven assists from Voshon Lenard, the Golden Gophers stormed back on Tuesday to take an 89-82 victory over Big East Conference foe Providence. Bob Martin scored a career-high 15 points on a perfect seven of seven shooting day from the field, while sophomore guard **Townsend Orr (Dolton, Ill.)** came off the bench to score a career-high 12 points on an equally sizzling four of four shooting from the floor. The Golden Gophers turned up the defensive heat in Wednesday's consolation championship game against No. 25 Arizona State of the Pac-10 Conference to score a convincing 69-37 victory. They held the Sun Devils to 27 percent (15 of 55) shooting from the field in the game and the 37 points allowed is a new Maui Invitational record. The previous low came in 1988 when Memphis State defeated Chaminade 88-44. All 12 players suited up for the game scored, led by 10 points apiece from Carter and Martin. Freshman forward/guard **Jayson Walton (Dallas)** collected a game-high nine rebounds in the victory. The Golden Gophers

bolted out to a 9-0 advantage in the home opener in front of 12,923 at Williams Arena on Saturday and never looked back en route to an easy 95-54 victory over Howard. Five players scored in double figures in the contest. Despite playing just 14 minutes, Carter registered 17 points and collected eight rebounds, both game-highs, to lead the way. He was joined in double figures by Lenard with 15, sophomore Ernest Nzigamasabo (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) with 13, Martin with 11 and freshman Chad Kolander (Owatonna, Minn.) with 10 points. All 13 players suited up for the game played and scored.

**Big Victory Margin:** The 41-point margin of victory over Howard on Saturday was the largest margin of victory for the Golden Gophers since a 116-48 trouncing of Rider at Williams Arena back on January 3, 1990.

**Coach Haskins Says:** "We went into the (Maui Invitational) tournament with a lot of question marks and I think we learned some things about ourselves. We won two of three games and we really got a lot out of the tournament. It was a great experience for our young ballclub."

"I feel real good about being 3-1 at this point. Howard played hard and tried hard, but it was a game we should have won and we did. We've played very well on the defensive end of the floor and I'm especially pleased about that."

**Big Man In The Middle:** Bob Martin played three consecutive outstanding games for the Golden Gophers at the Maui Invitational and then continued to shine in the home opener against Howard. He has scored in double figures in all four games and held his own in the opener of the Maui Invitational against Oliver Miller, the highly-regarded Arkansas center. Miller scored just two points in the first half, but finished with a game-high 23 points and took control underneath only after Martin got into foul trouble in the second half and eventually fouled out of the contest. Through four games, Martin is ranked third on the team in scoring (11.8 ppg), second in rebounding (6.0 rpg) and is the team leader in blocks (3.0 bpg). He is shooting a sparkling 67.9 percent (19 of 28) from the floor. He is ranked fifth on the all-time school career blocks list with 96 and is closing in on Mychal Thompson who is fourth with 102.

"Bob Martin really came of age in this tournament," said Coach Haskins following the victory over Arizona State in the Maui Invitational finale. "He really matured as a player here and that's one of the biggest things we'll take back with us."

**Great Balance:** In the 69-37 victory over Arizona State on Wednesday, all 12 Golden Gopher players suited up for the game played...and scored. The Golden Gophers did one better than that against Howard on Saturday when all 13 players suited for the contest accomplished the feat. In the victory over Providence, 10 of 11 players that got into the contest scored, while in the loss to Arkansas, 11 played and a perfect 11 found their way into the scoring column. Through four games, 10 players are averaging at least five points, two rebounds and 12 minutes a game.

**Defense-Defense:** The Golden Gophers have really cranked up the defensive pressure this season. At the Maui Invitational they came away with the tournament record for fewest points allowed in the 69-37 win over Arizona State, which included only 15 Sun Devil points in the first 20 minutes of play. In Saturday's 95-54 win over Howard, the Bison didn't get on the scoreboard until 3:21 had elapsed in the contest and they became the third straight opponent to shoot less than 39 percent against the Golden Gophers. Through four games, Golden Gopher opponents are shooting just 36.1 percent (90 of 249) from the field.

**Getting The Range Down:** The Golden Gophers shot above 50 percent in the back-to-back victories over Providence (30 of 55, 54.5 percent) and Arizona State (30 of 56, 53.4 percent)...something they failed to do through all of last season. In fact, Haskins' youthful squad shot at or above the 50 percent mark in just five of 28 games a year ago. The last consecutive games at or above 50 percent were in the 1990 NCAA Tournament against Northern Iowa (30 of 59, 50.8 percent), Syracuse (33 of 56, 58.9 percent) and Georgia Tech (29 of 56, 51.8 percent).

**Tough Field:** The Maui Invitational once again attracted a star-studded field led by Arkansas, rated No. 2 in the AP poll, and No. 25 Arizona State. Arkansas, Arizona State and eventual Maui

champion Michigan State all qualified for the 1991 NCAA Tournament, while Providence and Rice played in the NIT. Since the tournament's inception in 1984, there have been 62 institutions that have reached the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 field, 31 have reached the Elite Eight, 16 the Final Four, nine teams have made it to the championship game and six teams (Indiana, Kansas, Louisville, Michigan, UNLV and Villanova) have won national championships. In other words, keep your eye on some of these teams when March Madness rolls around.

**Golden Gophers in Hawaii:** The Maui Invitational marked the third time in history that the University of Minnesota basketball program had journeyed to Hawaii and the Golden Gophers have now recorded a 6-3 overall mark in paradise. During the 1971-72 season, the Golden Gophers played in the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, falling 60-57 to Temple in the first round, before bouncing back with victories over Hawaii-Marines (86-71) and TCU (83-57). In 1985-86, the Golden Gophers defeated West Virginia State 120-106, lost to Middle Tennessee State 92-79 and then topped Brigham Young-Hawaii 87-80 in the BYU-Hawaii Classic in Laie.

**Coach Haskins:** In his sixth season at the helm, Head Coach Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he directed the program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament in 1989 (Sweet Sixteen) and 1990 (Elite Eight). This past July he coached the North squad to an unbeaten record and the gold medal at the U.S. Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. Known as "Clem the Gem," he was a consensus All-America choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 2, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT appearance. Coach Haskins has recorded a 76-75 overall record at Minnesota, including a 57-38 mark over the past three-plus seasons. He has a 177-148 overall record in 12 seasons.

**The Foul Situation:** As much as any other statistic, the foul situation certainly demonstrates that the Golden Gophers are coming of age on the defensive end of the floor. After being outscored 599-360 (21.4-12.9) at the free throw line during the 1990-91 season, the Golden Gophers hold an 85-65 advantage at the charity stripe through four contests this season and have been whistled for 79 total fouls compared to 101 for their opponents.

**Looking Ahead:** Because of final exams, following Monday's game against Youngstown State, the Golden Gophers will not be in action again until Wednesday, December 11 when they host Akron at Williams Arena. Tip-off is at 7:00 p.m.

## **GOPHER GRAPPLERS STRUGGLE AT NORTHERN OPEN**

Following successful tournaments the past two weekends, Coach J Robinson's Golden Gopher wrestling team left Madison, Wis. very disappointed at the conclusion of the Northern Open.

Only three Gophers came away with three victories in their weight class, and no Gopher advanced beyond the third round.

Seniors **Ben Morris (118; Wooddale, Ill.)** and **Scott Rohrer (126; Waupun, Wis.)**, along with junior **Brad Gibson (177; Chokio, Minn.)** all won three matches on Saturday.

Next up for Minnesota will be the California Duals at Fullerton, Calif. on December 15.

## **GOPHERS SWEEP SIOUX, GAIN FIRST PLACE IN WCHA, TAKE WEEK OFF FOR FINAL EXAMS BEFORE HOSTING NO. MICHIGAN DECEMBER 14-15**

The University of Minnesota Golden Gophers swept a pair of games from North Dakota this past weekend to raise their WCHA record to 8-2 (10-4 overall), good for a tie for first place with Northern Michigan. The Wildcats have the same number of wins as the Gophers, but have two ties and have also played two more games. The Maroon and Gold will take this week off for final exams before hosting the Wildcats at Mariucci Arena on December 14-15 in two matinee affairs scheduled for 2:05 p.m. starts.

**Stolp Leads the Way:** Pre-season All-American goaltender Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk, MN) was again the backbone of the Gopher's success this past weekend. He stifled the high-powered North Dakota offense, limiting them to four goals total in the two contests. Stolp was phenomenal on Friday night when he held the Sioux at bay, stopping 30 shots, including six North Dakota break-aways. Stolp had 22 saves in the first two periods, until the Minnesota offense cranked up for three goals to take a 3-1 lead into the final period. The two teams exchanged goals in the final period for a 4-2 final tally. On Saturday, it was more of the same. Stolp shut down the Sioux in the first period, stopping two break-aways and gained his ninth win in the 8-2 victory. The two victories give the senior All-American candidate a 9-2 record with a 2.78 GAA overall and an 8-1 WCHA record with a 2.68 GAA.

**Freshmen Shine:** The Golden Gophers offensive efforts were led by two fine freshmen this past weekend. WCHA Freshman of the Year candidate Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, MN) had a pure Hat Trick on Saturday night to give him 10 goals and six assist for the year. Hendrickson has now scored 10 goals in his last nine games. Fellow freshman center Steve Magnusson (Dayton, MN) was not to be outdone, he scored two goals and had three assists to raise his season totals to five goals and eight assists.

**The Big "O":** All-American candidate Larry Olimb (Warroad, MN) had another solid weekend, notching four assists to give him the team lead with 21 assists. He is the team leader in scoring with five goals and 21 assists for 26 points. The Big "O" also stood for offense, as the Gophers continued their strong scoring pace. The Gophers are averaging 4.9 goals per-game and 5.3 in WCHA play. On the defensive side Minnesota is limiting its opponents to 3.2 goals per-game and 2.9 in WCHA play.

**Pre-season All-American wing Trent Klatt (Osseo, MN)** leads the team in goals with 11. The Gophers now have seven players scoring in double figures. Sophomore center Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN) has seven goals and 15 assists, while fellow sophomore Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, MN) has developed into a solid scorer with six goals and eight assists. On the blue line, juniors, Doug Zmolek (Rochester, MN) and Travis Richards (Plymouth, MN) lead the team in both ends of the rink. They have 1-9=10, and 5-4=9 numbers respectively.

**Homestand:** After starting the season with nine of their first 12 games on the road the Gophers have entered a stretch of the schedule where they will play 11 of 13 games within the friendly confines of Mariucci Arena. The Gophers then finish the 1991-92 regular season schedule with nine of 14 on the road.

**Mariucci Classic:** The Gophers play host to hockey powers Boston College, Providence and Bowling Green in the first annual Mariucci Classic hockey tournament on December 21-22. This fine field will provide what promises to be some exciting holiday hockey action. In the first game, perennial hockey powerhouse Boston College takes on an improved CCHA club in Bowling Green at 2:05 p.m. The 7:05 p.m. game has the Golden Gophers and Providence Friars playing a re-match of their 1991 NCAA first round games last year at Mariucci Arena. The Friars came into Mariucci last year and upset the Gophers 4-3, before the Maroon and Gold bounced back with 8-4 and 8-3 victories to advance in the NCAA playoffs. The consolation game is scheduled for 2:05 p.m. on Sunday, with the championship slated for a 7:05 p.m. start.

## NELSEN SHINES, AS HE WINS TITLE AT U.S. OPEN


Junior swimmer **Paul Nelsen (Lincoln, Neb.)** captured the 200 individual medley title at the U.S. Open meet held in the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center last weekend. Nelsen's personal best and school record time of 2:04.01 guaranteed him a spot for the Olympic Trials next March. He also added a NCAA Championship qualifying time of 54.98 in the 100 breaststroke. Senior **Sean Quackenbush (Rochester, Minn.)** also qualified for the Olympic Trials with his second place finish in the 100 butterfly, with a time of 54.60. In addition to qualifying for the Olympic Trials, Quackenbush qualified for the NCAA Championship meet with his time in the 100 butterfly and the 200 butterfly (1:47.23). Sophomore **Can Ergenekan (Beaverton, Ore.)** added another NCAA qualifying time for the Golden Gophers with a 2:01.64 time in the 200 butterfly. Minnesota also set a school record in the 200 free relay (1:19.61) and qualified two relay teams for the NCAA Championship meet. The 200 free relay team members included seniors **Del Cerney (Staples, Minn.)** and **Jay Fischer (Hutchinson, Minn.)**, junior **Steve Busse (Cincinnati, Ohio)**, and sophomore **Eric Jorgensen (Rochester, Minn.)**. The 400 free relay team finished first with a time 3:48.82 and the team members included senior **Scott Tripps (Seattle, Wash.)**, Nelsen, Cerney and Quackenbush.

**Up Next:** The team will take their winter training trip to St. Croix, Virgin Islands, from December 12 through the 24. The Golden Gophers will open their 1992 schedule by hosting the Gold Country Invitational, January 4. The meet is scheduled to begin at 11:00 a.m.

**Williams signs with U:** Derek Williams, a prep All-American swimmer from Lansdale, Pennsylvania, has signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

Williams earned All-American honors in the 200 individual medley and has been a Junior National finalist in both the 100 butterfly and the 100 freestyle. In addition, he was also the Pennsylvania State High School champion in the 200 individual medley, 200 medley relay, and the 400 free relay.

## **BASKETBALL TEAM HOSTS AKRON ON WEDNESDAY, TRAVELS TO ALABAMA-BIRMINGHAM SATURDAY; RAY CHRISTENSEN REACHES MILESTONE**

Riding a four-game win streak (4-1), Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gopher basketball squad will host non-conference foe Akron at Williams Arena on Wednesday at 7:00 p.m., before visiting Alabama-Birmingham for a 7:05 p.m. tip-off on Saturday.

**Broadcast Coverage:** Both the Akron and Alabama-Birmingham games will be broadcast on the Midwest Sports Channel (MSC). WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of University of Minnesota basketball with Ray Christensen calling all of the action.

**Christensen Reaches Milestone:** In his 36th season of broadcasting Golden Gopher basketball, Wednesday's game against Akron at Williams Arena will be Ray Christensen's 1,000 Golden Gopher basketball broadcast during his long and illustrious career. The Iowa-Minnesota football game in the 1990 season finale was his 400th Golden Gopher football broadcast.

**Scouting Akron:** Head Coach Coleman Crawford's Akron Zips upped its record to 3-1 on the season with a 65-62 home victory over Lamar last Saturday. Mark Alberts, a 6-1 junior guard, drained 10 of 15 three-pointers and scored 32 points in the win. On Tuesday, December 3, the Zips, despite 28 points from 6-4 senior Roy Coleman, dropped a heartbreaking 55-53 decision to host Kent State for their only defeat of the young season. Prior to the loss, the Zips had defeated Mississippi Valley (80-65) and Wooster (80-71). Coleman (21.0 ppg/8.3 rpg), a multi-talented performer who was honored as the Mid-Continent Conference Newcomer of the Year last season, has been sensational once again this season. Alberts (19.3 ppg), who missed all of last season with a broken leg, is a prolific outside shooter who has come back strong after a season on the sidelines. Randy Ballard (9.8 ppg/6.0 rpg), a 6-7, 230-pound forward who transferred to Akron from Wabash Valley College, has provided an all-important physical presence for the Zips underneath. The Zips finished with a 15-13 overall mark (6-10 Mid-Continent, tied for sixth) in 1990-91. In his third season at Akron, Crawford has charted a 34-26 overall record at the helm.

**Scouting Alabama-Birmingham:** Alabama-Birmingham won the UAB Classic this past weekend to raise its overall record to 6-1 on the season. Elbert Rogers, a 6-8, 230-pound senior forward, is averaging a team-leading 20.6 points and 7.0 rebounds a game. Stanley Jackson, a 6-3 junior guard, provides double trouble to opponents. He is averaging 18.8 points a contest. The Blazers, members of the Great Midwest Conference this season, finished 18-13 overall, 9-5 (2nd) in the Sun Belt Conference in 1990-91, qualifying for the NIT in the process. Head Coach Gene Bartow is in his 14th season at UAB where he has charted a record of 278-144. This is his 30th season (600-293) overall.

**Hi Strangers:** Minnesota has never met Akron or Alabama-Birmingham on the basketball court.

**Winning Big:** Arriel McDonald tallied 21 points and seven assists to lead the Golden Gophers to an easy 98-59 victory over Youngstown State before 12,314 at Williams Arena last Monday. Dana Jackson with 13 points, Randy Carter and sophomore **Ernest Nzigamasabo** (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) with 12, and Voshon Lenard and fellow freshman **Jayson Walton** (Dallas) with 11, joined McDonald in double figures in the victory. The Golden Gophers have now won their last three games by an average of just over 37 points. The 41-point margin of

victory over Howard on November 30 was the largest margin of victory for the Golden Gophers since a 116-48 trouncing of Rider at Williams Arena back on January 3, 1990.

**Williams Arena:** The Golden Gophers have become very tough to beat at home in front of their loyal home fans. They have registered an impressive 38-11 record (.776) over the past three-plus seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

**Big Men In The Middle:** The Golden Gophers have been getting outstanding play at the center position this season from Bob Martin and Ernest Nzigamasabo. Martin is ranked third on the team in scoring (10.4 ppg), second in rebounding (6.4 rpg) and is the team leader in blocks (3.4 bpg). He is shooting a sparkling 67.7 percent (21 of 31) from the floor and is ranked fifth on the all-time school career blocks list with 101. Mychal Thompson is fourth with 102. Nzigamasabo is averaging 7.0 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.4 blocks a game. In the past two victories he has scored a total of 25 points, hauled down 10 rebounds and registered three blocks.

**Great Balance:** Through five games, 10 players are averaging at least five points and 12 minutes a game for the Golden Gophers.

**Defense-Defense:** The Golden Gophers have really cranked up the defensive pressure this season. At the Maui Invitational they came away with the tournament record for fewest points allowed in the 69-37 win over Arizona State, which included only 15 Sun Devil points in the first 20 minutes of play. Through five games, Golden Gopher opponents are shooting just 36.0 percent (112 of 311) from the field.

**Getting The Range Down:** The Golden Gophers have shot above 50 percent in three of five games thus far this season. Haskins' youthful squad shot at or above the 50 percent mark in just five of 28 games a year ago.

**Coach Haskins:** In his sixth season at the helm, Head Coach Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he directed the program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament in 1989 (Sweet Sixteen) and 1990 (Elite Eight). This past July he coached the North squad to an unbeaten record and the gold medal at the U.S. Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. Known as "Clem the Gem," he was a consensus All-America choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 2, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT appearance. Coach Haskins has recorded a 77-75 overall record at Minnesota, including a 58-38 mark over the past three-plus seasons. He has a 178-148 overall record in 12 seasons.

**The Foul Situation:** As much as any other statistic, the foul situation certainly demonstrates that the Golden Gophers are coming of age on the defensive end of the floor. After being outscored 599-360 (21.4-12.9) at the free throw line during the 1990-91 season, the Golden Gophers hold a 94-77 advantage at the charity stripe through five contests this season and have been whistled for 101 total fouls compared to 112 for their opponents.

## **GOPHERS HOST DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPION NORTHERN MICHIGAN**

The fourth-ranked Golden Gophers resume play this weekend at Mariucci Arena after a week off for final exams. The action heats up right away as the high-powered Northern Michigan Wildcats come to town in a much awaited showdown between two of the finest teams in the country. The Wildcats, coached by Rick Comley, are coming off a storybook year that had them winning the WCHA regular season, the WCHA tourney and the NCAA title last spring in an overtime thriller against Boston U.

**About the Wildcats:** For the season, the Wildcats record stands at 9-5-2 overall and 8-4-2 in conference play. They are one point behind league-leading Wisconsin, but the Badgers have played two more games. The "Cats" lead the league in scoring with a 6.07 average per game. They have three of the top four scorers in the league in Scott Beattie (13-28), Jim Hiller (16-26) and Dallas Drake (16-20). On defense, veterans Lou Melone and Phil Soukoroff lead the way, while freshman Corwin Saurdiff has been strong in goal. The Minnesota/Northern Michigan series stands at 18-9-5 in favor of the Gophers, while Doug Woog holds a 12-7-4 record against them. Last year the Gophers took three of four points at home against the Wildcats, when a puck deflected off of a skate and into the net with seven seconds left on the clock in the second game, leading to the overtime tie.

**Stolp Leads the Way:** Pre-season All-American goaltender Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk, MN) has been the backbone of the Gophers' success this year. He stifled the high-powered North Dakota offense, limiting them to four goals in the two contests, garnering WCHA Player of the Week honors. Stolp was phenomenal the first night when he held the Sioux at bay, stopping 30 shots, including six North Dakota break-aways. Stolp had 22 saves in the first two periods. While the Minnesota offense cranked up for three goals to take a 3-1 lead into the final period. The two teams exchanged goals in the final period for a 4-2 final tally. In the Saturday game, it was more of the same. Stolp shut down the Sioux in the first period, stopping two break-aways, gaining his ninth win in the 8-2 victory. The two victories give the senior All-American candidate a 9-2 record with a 2.78 GAA overall and an 8-1 WCHA record with a 2.68 GAA, which leads the WCHA and puts him second in the country in winning percentage.

**Freshmen Shine:** The Golden Gophers offensive efforts against North Dakota were led by two fine freshmen. WCHA Freshman of the Year candidate Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, MN) had a pure Hat Trick in the Saturday night game, to give him 10 goals and six assists for the year. Hendrickson has now scored 10 goals in his last nine games. Fellow freshman center Steve Magnusson (Dayton, MN) was not to be outdone. He scored two goals and had three assists to raise his season totals to five goals and eight assists.

**The Big "O":** All-American candidate Larry Olimb (Warroad, MN) had another solid weekend, notching four assists to give him the team lead with 21 assists. He is the team leader in scoring with five goals and 21 assists for 26 points, which ranks seventh in WCHA scoring with the Gophers having four games in hand. The Big "O" also stood for offense, as the Gophers continued their strong scoring pace. The Gophers are averaging 4.9 goals per-game and 5.3 in WCHA play. On the defensive side, Minnesota is limiting its opponents to 3.2 goals per-game.

**Pre-season All-American wing Trent Klatt (Osseo, MN)** leads the team in goals with 11. The Gophers now have seven players scoring in double figures. Sophomore center Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN) has seven goals and 15 assists, while fellow sophomore Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, MN) has developed into a solid scorer with six goals and eight assists. On the blue line, juniors, Doug Zmolek (Rochester, MN) and Travis Richards (Plymouth, MN) lead the team in both ends of the rink. They have 1-9=10, and 5-4=9 numbers respectively.

**Mariucci Classic:** The Gophers play host to hockey powers Boston College, Providence and Bowling Green in the first annual Mariucci Classic hockey tournament on December 21-22. This fine field will provide what promises to be some exciting holiday hockey action. In the first game, perennial hockey powerhouse Boston College takes on an improved CCHA club in Bowling Green at 2:05 p.m. The 7:05 p.m. game has the Golden Gophers and Providence Friars playing a re-match of their 1991 NCAA first round games last year at Mariucci Arena. The Friars came into Mariucci last year and upset the Gophers 4-3, before the Maroon and Gold bounced back with 8-4 and 8-3 victories to advance in the NCAA playoffs. The consolation game is scheduled for 2:05 p.m. on Sunday, with the championship slated for a 7:05 p.m. start.

**Ben Morris (Sr., Wooddale, Ill.)** and **Eric Folkins (Sr., Sacramento, Calif.)** will represent the U of M at 118 pounds. **Scott Rohrer (Sr., Waupun, Wis.)** and **Steve Baer (Fr., Agoura Hills, Calif.)** will handle the 126-pound assignment.

At 134, Coach Robinson will use **Tim Harris (Fr., St. Louis, Mo.)**, and he'll go with **Chris Berglin (So., West Bend, Wis.)** in the 142-pound slot.

**Chad Carlson (Fr., Pennock, Minn.)** appears set at 150. **Cole Labalestra (So., Falcon Heights, Minn.)** is expected to be Coach Robinson's choice at 158 while veteran **Mike Marzetta (Jr., Liberty Lake, Wash.)** will get the nod at 167.

Robinson could use both **Brett Colombini (Fr., Ukiah, Calif.)** and **Joe Russell (Jr., Portland, Oregon)** at 177. **Todd Moss (So., St. Paul, Minn.)** appears to be Minnesota's choice at 190. **Eric Betterman (So., Prior Lake, Minn.)** remains a fixture at heavyweight.

An Outland Trophy winner while at Minnesota, Bell this year was inducted into the U of M Men's Athletic Hall of Fame, and in special halftime ceremonies at the Wisconsin football game was honored for being selected to this year's National Football Foundation honor squad.

"It is a great honor for us to induct the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 1991," National Football Foundation Chairman William Pearch said. "These 12 players and three coaches will take their place among the legends of the sport. It is the overriding purpose of the Hall of Fame to recognize individuals worthy of this honor."

**McKinley Boston**, University of Rhode Island athletic director, and **Jerry Noyce**, director of Northwest Racquet, Swim and Health Clubs, have been named finalists for director of Men's Intercollegiate Athletics at the University of Minnesota.

Search committee chair Jack Merwin forwarded the two names Friday, Dec. 13, to university President Nils Hasselmo, who expects to make his recommendation to the Board of Regents within the next week.

Background on the two candidates follows:

- **Boston** has been director of athletics and recreational services and adjunct professor of Afro-American studies at the University of Rhode Island since 1988. He held a similar position at Kean College for two years before that. He was a professional football player for the New York Giants and the Vancouver Lions in the late '60s and early '70s. Boston attended the University of Minnesota from 1964 to 1968, and received bachelor's and master's degrees from Montclair State College in 1972 and 1973, and a doctor of education degree from New York State University in 1987.

- **Noyce** has been director of Northwest Racquet, Swim and Health Clubs since 1973. He was head tennis coach at the University of Minnesota from 1973 to June 1988. Before that, he sold life insurance for Life of Minnesota Insurance Co., was head tennis professional at Interlachen Country Club and worked at Oakdale Racquet Club, Service Bureau Corp. and Honeywell. Noyce received a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Minnesota in 1967.

## **McKINLEY BOSTON DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**

McKinley Boston was named the University of Minnesota's 10th director of men's intercollegiate athletics on December 17, 1991. He succeeds Rick Bay who resigned three months earlier to accept a post as head of the Cleveland Indians.

Boston, 46, comes to the U of M from the University of Rhode Island where he served as director of athletics from 1988 until accepting the position at Minnesota. Prior to that, he was director of athletics and recreational services at Kean (N.J.) College for two years and earlier director of students at Montclair (N.J.) State College for 12 where he also functioned as assistant head football coach.

At Rhode Island, Boston was responsible for overseeing the coordination of all aspects of intercollegiate athletics and recreation. He directed a full-time staff of 70 and was responsible for an athletic budget in excess of five million dollars.

No stranger to Golden Gopher athletics, Boston played football at the U of M under Coach Murray Warmath and won letters as a defensive lineman in 1965-66-67. He was an All-Big Ten Conference selection his senior year.

When his gridiron days at Minnesota were over, Boston went on to play four years of professional football, two with the New York Giants in the National Football League and two more with the BC Lions in the Canadian Football League.

After retiring from professional football following the 1971 season, Boston returned to the classroom and received his B.S. degree from Montclair (N.J.) State College in 1972. He also received his M.S. degree from that same institution in 1973 and then his Ed.D. from New York University in 1987.


Boston also gained experience in public relations with the New York Giants and in NCAA Youth Sports Programs while at Montclair State. Additionally, he has been involved in youth camp work in New Jersey and taught at the elementary school level there.

Over the years Boston has been a guest lecturer at Harvard University, Montclair State College, Kean College and the University of Rhode Island. He also has taught courses at each of those institutions as well as at New York University.

Honors have been numerous for Boston. He received the Outstanding Alumni Education Award from Montclair State College in 1991 and Citizenship Awards from the Lions Club in West Orange, NJ, Newark's St. Joseph School for the Blind, The Boys Club of Newark, the Weequahic Athletic Booster Club of Newark, B'Nai Brith and from the Rhode Island Ram Athletic Association.

A 1964 graduate of P.W. Moore High School in Elizabeth City, N.C., Boston helped Minnesota win a share of its last Big Ten Conference football championship in 1967. He was selected to play in the Blue-Gray Football Classic that same year.

Dwayne Kelley, a 6-4 junior guard, led all scorers in Saturday's game with 23 points and is averaging a team-leading 15.4 points a game coming into Tuesday night's contest. In his fourth season at Detroit Mercy, Head Coach Ricky Byrdson is 30-61 overall and 0-2 against Minnesota. Minnesota freshman standout Voshon Lenard and Detroit Mercy's Michael Hamilton, a 6-5 freshman forward who is averaging 10.3 points and 3.7 rebounds a game, will be on opposite benches on Tuesday night. The talented twosome helped lead Detroit Southwestern High School to back-to-back Michigan State Class A titles, as well as the top ranking in the *USA Today* final national prep poll last year.

**Scouting Memphis State:** The Tigers lost a heartbreaking 65-64 decision to visiting Tennessee on Saturday to fall to 1-2 on the season heading into Monday's home game against Southwestern Louisiana. Guards Anfernee Hardaway, a 6-7 sophomore, and Tony Madlock, a 6-1 senior, pace a talented backcourt, while 6-9, 232-pound freshman center David Vaughn anchors the frontcourt. Head Coach Larry Finch, a former All-American for the Tigers in the early 1970s, is in his sixth season at Memphis State where he has recorded an overall record of 103-60. He has directed the Tigers to four straight post-season appearances. Thursday's game will be played in the Pyramid, Memphis State's sparkling new, state-of-the-art 20,136 seat arena. The contest will feature the return of Minnesota's Randy Carter to Memphis, where he charted a star-studded prep career at Central High School.

**Series Records:** Minnesota holds a 10-2 advantage in the all-time series with Detroit. The Memphis State-Minnesota series is tied at 1-1.

**Streak Snapped:** Despite a 20-point, 10-rebound performance from Randy Carter, the Golden Gophers' five-game winning streak was snapped as the Elbert Rogers-led Alabama-Birmingham Blazers came away with an 86-80 victory at the UAB Arena on Saturday. Rogers finished the game with 32 points, including 26 in the second half when he shot a perfect nine of nine from the field. Voshon Lenard joined Carter in double figures. He scored all of his 18 points in the final 20 minutes. The Golden Gophers had won their previous four games by an average margin of victory of just under 35 points. In addition, the Blazers shot 62 percent (26-42) from the field in the game, including a sizzling 79 percent (15-19) in the second half. Heading into the contest, Golden Gopher opponents were shooting just 35.7 percent from the field, and only one (Arkansas, 42.3 percent), had shot above 40 percent.

**Williams Arena:** The Golden Gophers have become very tough to beat at home in front of their loyal home fans. They have registered an impressive 39-11 record (.780) over the past three-plus seasons within the hallowed halls of Williams Arena, including a spotless 3-0 mark this season.

**Great Balance:** Through seven games, 10 players are averaging at least 4.7 points and 14 minutes a game for the Golden Gophers.

**Coach Haskins:** In his sixth season at the helm, Head Coach Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he directed the program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament in 1989 (Sweet Sixteen) and 1990 (Elite Eight). Known as "Clem the Gem," he was a consensus All-America choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons in the professional ranks. Coach Haskins has recorded a 78-76 overall record at Minnesota, including a 59-39 mark over the past three-plus seasons. He has a 179-149 overall record in 12 seasons.

## GOPHERS LOSE PAIR TO NORTHERN MICHIGAN; MARIUCCI CLASSIC UP NEXT

The University of Minnesota hockey team lost a pair of games to defending NCAA champion Northern Michigan 7-5, 4-3 this past weekend, vaulting the Wildcats into first place in the WCHA. The home-sweep against the Gophers was the first since the opening weekend of the 1989-90 season when the UMD Bulldogs swept the Gophers 9-6 and 4-2 and only the sixth time that it has occurred in Head Coach Doug Woog's tenure. The two losses broke a six-game winning streak and a 5-0 unbeaten home mark.

The Golden Gopher losses were especially tough to stomach given the fact that Minnesota outshot the Wildcats 92-46 for the weekend. The Wildcats won the games on opportunistic shooting, strong power-play output and a fast-developing goalie in Corwin Saurdiff. The Golden Gophers now must rebound in a hurry as they play host to some of the finest hockey talent in the country this weekend in the Mariucci Classic.

**Mariucci Classic:** The tournament opens with Bowling Green taking on perennial Hockey East power Boston College at 2:05 p.m. on Saturday, and the Gophers hosting last year's NCAA first round opponent, the 12th-ranked Providence Friars at 7:05 p.m. The Sunday format has the Consolation Game at 2:05 p.m. and the Championship at 7:05 p.m.

**Boston College vs. Bowling Green:** The Boston College Eagles are coached by NCAA all-time wins leader (666-328-36) Len Ceglarski, who is in his 34th and final season as a collegiate coach. The Eagles are 7-7-1 and 4-4 in the Hockey East. They are coming off a 6-3 loss to Providence on December 10, at Boston College. The Bowling Green Falcons are coached by Jerry York, who has an impressive 298-196-24 collegiate coaching record at Clarkson and Bowling Green. The Falcons are 3-8-1 overall and in the CCHA.

**Minnesota vs. Providence:** This game is a rematch of the teams' NCAA play-off series at Mariucci Arena last March when the Gophers lost the first game 4-3, but came back to win the next two games 8-4 and 8-3. Providence is coached by Mike McShane, who is in his seventh year at Providence and his 12th as a coach. His overall record stands at 203-174-22, while his record at Providence is 110-109-16. The Friars come into the tournament following a big win on the road at Boston College (6-3). They are 10-4 overall with a 4-2 Hockey East record. Providence is led by Mike Boback, who has eight goals and 24 assists in 14 games. Rob Gaudreau is second in scoring with 13 goals and 15 assists.

**Gopher Notes:** Minnesota's two losses have created a logjam in the WCHA standings, with six points separating the top six teams. The Gophers still have four games in hand with Northern Michigan and Wisconsin, the two teams ahead of them in the standings. The Gophers are now 10-6 overall with an 8-4 WCHA slate. The Gophers are ranked seventh in the country by the Albany-Times poll. Minnesota holds a 10-4-1 edge in the overall series with Providence, while Doug Woog has a 6-2 record versus the Friars. The Minnesota power-play is scoring at a .22 percent clip (3rd in WCHA), while the penalty-killing unit is allowing goals at a .18 percent rate (3rd in WCHA) after giving up five to Northern Michigan in 10 attempts.

**Weekend Recap:** On the surface, the Gophers two losses to Northern Michigan at home were difficult, but there were some individual bright spots. **All-American candidate Larry Olimb (Warroad, Minn.)** had another fine weekend, notching five points on two goals and three assists. Olimb is the leading scorer on the team with seven goals and 24 assists, which puts him in sixth place in the WCHA in scoring. **Craig Johnson (St. Paul, Minn.)** had a goal and two assists and has had points in 14 of 16 games. **Pre-season All-American Trent Klatt (Osseo, Minn.)** has points in 13 games and is third in team scoring with 24 points. Freshmen centers **Darby Hendrickson (Richfield, Minn.)** and **Steve Magnusson (Anoka, Minn.)** continue to impress. Hendrickson had a goal and an assist and has scored 11 goals in his last 11 games. Magnusson had two points for the weekend and is the team's fourth leading scorer in WCHA games with five goals and 10 assists.

A trio of Golden Gophers won all three of their assignments. **Tim Harris (Fr., St. Louis, Mo.)** prevailed at 134 pounds, **Chad Carlson (Fr., Pennock, Minn.)** swept at 150 and **Mike Marzetta (Jr., Liberty Lake, Wash.)** won three at 167.

## WACKER NAMED GOLDEN GOPHER FOOTBALL COACH

Jim Wacker, who finished the 1991 football season with a 7-4 record as head coach at Texas Christian University, has been named the 24th head football coach in Golden Gopher history, Director of Athletics Dr. McKinley Boston announced in a news conference today.

"Coach Wacker represents a great fit for the University of Minnesota and the values we embrace," Boston said. "He is a proven winner with a national reputation for honesty, integrity and attention to the academic achievements of his student athletes."

Wacker's 144-91-3 career record places him among the top 20 coaches in the nation in winning percentage for those who have coached at the NCAA Division IA level for at least five years.

Wacker, 54, has been recognized as the top coach in the nation twice during his 21-year head coaching career. In 1983, Wacker led TCU to an 8-3 record and the Bluebonnet Bowl. His success earned him National Coach of the Year honors from THE SPORTING NEWS, United Press International and ESPN. The same year, Wacker was recipient of the American Sportsmanship Council's Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award. Wacker's 1982 Southwest Texas State national champions finished 14-0, and he was selected college division coach of the year by numerous agencies and publications.

In 1984, Wacker was the subject of national attention again when he uncovered a payment plan to TCU players in violation of NCAA rules. The plan had been put in place prior to the arrival of Wacker and his staff. Wacker dismissed seven players from his team and reported the violation to the NCAA. The result was national acclaim for Wacker's actions and one of the stiffest penalties ever levied on an NCAA-member institution -- the loss of 30 football scholarships.

The Horned Frogs record this past fall, according to many, represented the second time Wacker had rebuilt a program whose record from 1973 to 1982 was a dismal 17-90-3.

Wacker and his staff also doubled graduation rates within the football program during his nine-year tenure. In 1991, all 23 of TCU's senior football players graduated.


Law School Dean Robert Stein, who served as chair of the search committee that recommended Wacker, expressed enthusiasm for the future of Minnesota football. "Jim Wacker has rebuilt programs on four different occasions," Stein said, referring to Wacker's successes at Texas Lutheran, Southwest Texas State, North Dakota State and Texas Christian. "He's a coach who operates with absolute integrity and concern for the academic experience of his student athletes. In addition, he plays an exciting brand of football with an explosive offense that will be entertaining for all of us to watch."

"Minnesota is a school with a tremendous tradition of football success," said Wacker. "Every place I've been, I've faced challenges to build or rebuild. With all the resources available in the Twin Cities and at the University of Minnesota, I'm certain that a return to that traditional success is possible. I'm happy to have this opportunity."

According to Wacker, the process of assembling a staff and hiring assistant coaches will begin immediately. The Gopher's new head coach also plans to begin his recruiting tomorrow.

A Detroit native, Wacker graduated from Valparaiso University (Indiana) as a three-year football letterwinner in 1960. He holds a masters degree from Wayne State University and a doctorate in education from the University of Nebraska. His midwest ties include successful coaching stints at Augustana (South Dakota) and North Dakota State.

Wacker and his wife, Lil, have three sons.

Scott Rohrer (126) and Todd Moss (190) finished third, while John Meyers (134) and Wade Short (158) settled for fourth place. Rounding out the Gopher honorees were Steve Baer (126) and Erin Dougherty (134), both of whom finished in fifth place in their divisions.
