Team South includes seniors Dan Trebil of Bloomington, Minn. and Hobey Baker Award candidate Brian Bonin of White Bear Lake, Minn.

Team East has Maroon and Gold sophomore forward Casey Hankinson of Edina, Minn. and incoming freshman forward and 1995 Minnesota Mr. Hockey recipient Erik Rasmussen of St. Louis Park, Minn. Team West has three Golden Gophers, including Bloomington natives Mike Crowley, a sophomore defenseman, and Nick Cheeco, a junior forward. Incoming freshman forward Reggie Berg rounds out the Golden Gopher contingent in the Festival.

There are 80 players total selected to play in the 1995 U.S. Olympic Festival, which includes 24 native Minnesotans.

Smith Withdraws From Consideration For U of M Head Men's Track Coaching Position

Martin Smith, one of four finalists for the head men's track and field coaching position at the University of Minnesota, has withdrawn his name from consideration for the post.

Smith, who interviewed for the position in May, had decided to stay in his current capacity as head men's cross country and assistant men's track and field coach at the University of Wisconsin.

"We are disappointed that a coach of Martin's caliber has taken his name out of the hopper," said Mark Dienhart, U of M senior associate director of athletics. "But we respect his decision and wish him continued success at Wisconsin."

Smith's withdrawal leaves three finalists who are candidates for the position: In alphabetical order they are: Don Larson, head men's cross country and track and field coach at North Dakota State, Phil Lundin, assistant men's track and field coach at Minnesota, and Jerry Quiller, head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach at Colorado.

Men's Director of Athletics Dr. McKinley Boston is out of the office until after the Fourth of July, but is expected to make his decision as to who will be the new head men's track and field coach sometime next week.

LUNDIN NAMED GOLDEN GOPHER HEAD TRACK & FIELD COACH

Dr. Phil Lundin has been named head men's track and field coach at the University of Minnesota, pending final approval of the U of M's Board of Regents.

Lundin has served as Roy Griak's top assistant coach for the last 12 years. Griak, who retired as head track & field coach following the 1995 season after 32 years at the helm, will remain cross country coach and serve as an administrative assistant to the track & field program.

During his career at the University of Minnesota, Lundin has coached student-athletes to a total of 10 All-America performances including 1993 NCAA indoor pole vault champion Martin Eriksson. The Golden Gophers finished sixth in the final team standings at the 1993 NCAA Indoor Championships, the best in the history of the program at the national indoor meet, and have now placed in the upper division at the past eight Big Ten Championships.

An outstanding recruiter, Lundin's efforts have brought a number of world-class competitors to the U of M, including '94 World Junior Championships decathlon champion Benjamin Jensen of Norway who will be a redshirt freshman for the Golden Gophers this season. He will be joined by Glenn Lindqvist of Finland, the '94 World Junior decathlon bronze medalist, Vesa Rantanen, the top-ranked junior pole vaulter in Finland with a mark of 18-2 1/4, and Marcus Westberry of Minneapolis Washburn, who was a multiple Minnesota state champion in the jumps during his prep career for the Millers.

Before joining the staff at the University of Minnesota, Lundin taught physical eduation and health, and was cross country/track and field coach for 12 years at Burnsville High School. While there, he helped build the school into a state powerhouse. The school won three straight Class AA cross country crowns (1978, 1979, 1980), as well as the 1978 Class AA track and field title under his direction.

A native of Columbia Heights, Minn., Lundin is a 1974 graduate of Augsburg College in Minneapolis, where he was a four-year letterwinner in track and field and football for the Auggies during his collegiate career.

Lundin, who is widely recognized for his work in the research and application of training theories, went on to earn his master's degree in physical education from the University of Minnesota in 1976, and then added his Ph.D. in biomechanics from the U of M in 1983.

"Phil is the right person to work hand-in-hand with Roy as cross country coach to take our program to the next level," said Vice President for Student Development and Athletics Dr. McKinley Boston in announcing his decision. "His energy and effectiveness as a recruiter, and the strong support of current team members, were factors working strongly in Phil's favor."

"I'm excited about this opportunity and look forward to the future with great anticipation," Lundin said. "We've made steady progress the past few years and the goal is to bring the program to the point where we can compete for Big Ten indoor and outdoor titles on an annual basis."

Dale Named To Coach West Swim Team At Olympic Festival

University of Minnesota head men's swimming coach **Dennis Dale** has been named the head coach of the West team at the 1995 Olympic Festival. This year's Fest will take place at the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colo. The swimming events will be contested July 22-24.

Dale led Minnesota to its sixth consecutive Big Ten runner-up finish this past spring. His Golden Gophers placed ninth at the 1995 NCAA Championships. Dale has a career dual record of 77-21 during his 10 years as the U of M head coach, and is regarded as one of the top collegiate coaches in the country.

The Olympic Festival's connection with Golden Gopher swimming does not stop with Dale. Incoming freshman **John Cahoy**, a 1995 graduate of **Hudson (Wis.) High School**, will compete for the North squad. The Golden-Gopher-to-be will race in the 100 free, the 200 free and the 100 fly. He placed third in the 200 free and fourth in the 100 free at the National High School Championships in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., in June.

Another Dennis Dale recruit, **Martin Zielinski**, also fared well at the National High School Championships. Zielinski, a 1995 **Bloomington Jefferson High School** grad, set a new meet record in the 100 fly, winning that event in 49.70. He also placed fourth in the 100 back.

THREE NAMED U OF M MEN'S ATHLETIC DIRECTOR FINALISTS

Mark Dienhart, senior associate director of men's intercollegiate athletics at the University of Minnesota; Charles Harris, former Arizona State University athletic director; and Fred Mims, University of Iowa associate athletic director, have been named finalists for director of Men's Intercollegiate Athletics at the University of Minnesota.

Search committee chair Norman Chervany forwarded the names Thursday (July 13). The three candidates will be invited to campus for executive interviews as soon as schedules can be arranged. McKinley Boston, vice president for student development and athletics, to whom the position reports, will then make a recommendation to university President Nils Hasselmo. After that, the appointment goes on to the board of regents for final approval.

Background on the candidates follows:

- Mark Dienhart has been with the university men's athletics department for five years, four as senior associate director. Before that he served 15 years in a variety of capacities at the University of St. Thomas, including executive director of public and alumni affairs and head coach of football and track and field. He has a bachelor's degree from St. Thomas and master's and doctorate degrees from the University of Minnesota. He was drafted by and played briefly for the Buffalo Bills of the National Football League in 1975.
- Charles Harris has recently completed 11 years as Arizona State's athletic director. Before that, he served six years as director of the division of recreation and intercollegiate athletics at the University of Pennsylvania and six years at the University of Michigan in a variety of positions, including assistant athletic director. He did his undergraduate study at the Hampton Institute (Hampton, Va.), and also completed academic work at the University of Pennsylvania, University of Michigan and Arizona State University.
- Fred Mims has been with the University of Iowa since 1977, serving as academic counselor, assistant baseball coach, assistant athletic director and, since 1989, associate athletic director, athletic compliance officer and athletic student services director. He played professional baseball in the Houston Astros organization from 1972 to 1975. Mims has bachelor's and master's degrees from Iowa.

HASKINS TO BE RELEASED TODAY FROM HOSPITAL AFTER UNDERGOING ANGIOPLASTY ON A CORONARY ARTERY

University of Minnesota Head Men's Basketball Coach Clem Haskins will be released today from the University of Minnesota Hospital and Clinics after undergoing angioplasty yesterday on a coronary artery.

Angioplasty is a procedure in which a small balloon is inserted into the artery in the thigh and guided up to the area where the blockage exists. In this case the first attempt to enlarge the flow of the artery was not as successful as doctors would have liked, so a stainless steel stent (mesh tube) was inserted permanently to help keep the artery fully open.

Haskins entered the hospital late Saturday evening after developing chest discomfort. Dr. Robert Wilson of the U of M Hospital and Clinic's Cardiology Department performed the procedure while Haskins was under local anesthesia.

"Coach Haskins procedure was very successful and we expect a complete and full recovery," said Dr. Robert Wilson. "He will need to rest for a couple of weeks, but after that should be able to resume his normal schedule. Coach Haskins' cholesterol count was normal when he was admitted, and like any coronary patient he should watch his intake, but it was not a major factor in the problem; nor are any significant dietary changes necessary."

"Let me first say that I feel great and I want to thank the hospital staff and Dr. Wilson for the outstanding job they have done," said Haskins. "I'm not the easiest patient in the world and they did a great job both when I was admitted and during the procedure. This procedure will not in any way effect my duties and responsibilities as head basketball coach at the University of Minnesota, or my obligations to USA Basketball as a member of the 1996 U.S. Olympic basketball coaching staff."

BASKETBALL, HOCKEY SEASON TICKETS ON SALE AUGUST 14

The University of Minnesota Men's Athletics Department has announced that basketball and hockey season ticket sales will begin on Monday, Aug. 14.

Basketball season tickets are priced at \$309 each, with the sale of season tickets continuing through Friday, Oct. 20. If individual game tickets remain available, they will go on sale beginning Wednesday, Nov. 15. Single game tickets are \$19 each. Single game ticket orders for basketball may not be accepted before Nov. 15, with the exception of two exhibition games scheduled for Nov. 9 and 16. Tickets for those games may be ordered beginning Nov. 2, at a cost of \$12 each.

The non-conference game on Dec. 16 against California will be held at the Metrodome. Tickets for that game will go on sale Saturday, Sept. 16 and can be purchased at all Dayton's ticket outlets in addition to the Golden Gopher Athletic Ticket Sales Office.

Hockey season tickets are priced at \$357 each. The sale of season tickets will continue through Friday, Sept. 29. If individual game tickets remain available, they will go on sale beginning Monday, Oct. 16. Single game tickets are \$17 each. Single game ticket orders for hockey may not be accepted before Oct. 16.

The cost of tickets reflects a \$2 increase per game for basketball and a \$1 increase per game for hockey. Ticket prices are adjusted on an annual basis to allow the Men's Athletics Department to offset anticipated expenses and produce a balanced budget. The department is mandated by the University to be financially self-supporting.

MARK DIENHART NAMED U OF M MEN'S DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Mark Dienhart was named director of men's intercollegiate athletics at the University of Minnesota after a vote today, Aug. 2, by the university's board of regents. Dienhart, 41, has been with the department for five years, the past four as senior associate director. He was chosen by McKinley Boston, vice president for student development and athletics, and endorsed by university President Nils Hasselmo. He succeeds Boston in the director's post.

A lifelong Minnesotan, Dienhart came to the university in 1990 after 15 years in a variety of capacities at the University of St. Thomas, including executive director of public and alumni affairs, head football coach and head men's track and field coach. He has a bachelor's degree from St. Thomas and master's and doctorate degrees from the University of Minnesota. He was drafted and played briefly for the Buffalo Bills of the National Football League in 1975. He is a graduate of De La Salle High School in Minneapolis.

"I have come to appreciate the high quality of Mark Dienhart's work over the last three years, and believe he is more than ready to step in and be the next men's director of athletics," said Vice President Boston. "Not only am I looking forward to working with him in my new capacity, but I'm really excited about the continuity that this appointment affords for the university and its athletics program."

"I'm delighted with the choice that Dr. Boston has made," said President Hasselmo. "Mark Dienhart shares Mac's commitment to athletic competitiveness, fiscal accountability, rule compliance and, most important, the long-term best interests of student-athletes. He and Mac developed an excellent working relationship during Mac's tenure as men's A.D., and we expect that to continue as both move into new positions."

"My top priority is to see our recent progress continue," said Dienhart. "There is plenty of work yet to be done. I am an educator, like my predecessor, and I believe there has never been a better time to fully integrate intercollegiate athletics into the broader educational mission of the university. I intend to work closely with Mac Boston toward that end."

(Mark Dienhart's bio follows)

Dr. Mark Dienhart, 41, has been a member of the University of Minnesota men's intercollegiate athletics staff since May 8, 1990, when he signed on as the associate director for external operations under then-Director of Athletics Rick Bay. Dienhart took over as the interim senior associate director of athletics in Dec. of 1991 under Director of Athletics Dr. McKinley Boston, before assuming the permanent title on June 18, 1992. On Aug. 2, 1995, he was named director of men's intercollegiate athletics.

As senior associate director of athletics, Dienhart served as second in command of the men's athletics department. He managed all administrative areas of the department and directly supervised the operations of all of the 11 men's sports. He also negotiated all media contracts, assisted in facilities planning and managed budgets of \$2 million.

During his tenure at Minnesota, Dienhart has played a major role in enabling the department to balance its budget each of the last three years and significantly reduce a \$2 million deficit. In addition, Minnesota has placed second in the Big Ten men's all-sports standings three of the last four years. He also served as media relations director for the 1991 NCAA Basketball First and Second Rounds and the 1992 Final Four.

A native of Minnesota, Dienhart came to the University of Minnesota from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, where he had served at different times as head football coach, head track and field coach, and executive director of public and alumni affairs.

As a football coach at St. Thomas, Dienhart's teams ranked in the nation's top 20 on an annual basis, and amassed a record of 44-14-1, which ranked him among the top 10 active NCAA Division III coaches in the nation in winning percentage (.758). He developed four consensus All-America football players and two players who successfully competed for NFL teams.

As the track and field coach, Dienhart led the Tommies to their first conference track and field title in 30 years in 1983. His teams successfully defended that title each of the next three seasons. Dienhart's 1985 team won the NCAA indoor championship and finished third in the outdoor championship that year. He developed 21 All-America track and field athletes in his six years as head coach.

Dienhart is a 1971 graduate of De La Salle High School in Minneapolis. The class Salutatorian, he attended the College of St. Thomas and was graduated Summa Cum Laude in 1975. While at St. Thomas, he earned All-America honors in football and track and field, and was named Academic All-American twice. Dienhart holds a bachelor's degree from St. Thomas in philosophy. He earned a master of arts degree in journalism from the University of Minnesota in 1978. He went on to earn his doctorate in higher education from the U of M in 1988. In 1989 he was awarded a Bush Leadership Fellowship for post-doctoral work at both Harvard and Stanford.



REGENTS TO DISCUSS FOOTBALL, VOTE ON SWITCH TO SEMESTERS THURSDAY, SEPT. 7

The University of Minnesota board of regents will receive the final report from President Hasselmo's blue ribbon panel on football, and will vote on a resolution to change to a semester-based academic calendar by fall 1999 during their monthly meetings Thursday and Friday, Sept. 7 and 8.

Action on the resolution to switch to a semester system will be taken at Thursday's educational planning and policy committee meeting. The resolution cites several advantages of a semester-based calendar over the current quarter-based system, including easier transferability for many students, the chance for more cooperative ventures with other institutions and greater administrative efficiency.

The blue ribbon panel on football was appointed last November to develop recommendations for improving the Gophers' on-field competitiveness. Though no immediate board action is necessary, the regents will be asked to approve a resolution making clear that winning will not be pursued at all costs, that there are no plans to build an on-campus football stadium and that academic standards will not be relaxed for student-athletes. The resolution will be voted on at Thursday's committee of the whole meeting. After the meeting is over, there will be a media availability in 238 Morrill with President Hasselmo, regents board chair Tom Reagan, Vice President for Student Development and Athletics McKinley Boston and Men's Athletic Director Mark Dienhart.

STAFF RESPONSIBILITY CHANGES ANNOUNCED IN MEN'S ATHLETICS

University of Minnesota Men's Athletics Director Dr. Mark Dienhart has announced a number of staff responsibility changes that are effective immediately.

Three veterans to lead 1995 harriers: Head Cross Country Coach Roy Griak will be looking to a talented three-some to lead the otherwise youthful Golden Gopher cross country team this fall. Senior JASON BOON (Cottage Grove, Minn.), along with juniors RICK OBLEMAN (Regina, Saskatchewan) and PAUL MICHALEK (Bloomington, Minn.), are seasoned veterans who will lead the way for a Golden Gopher squad that has 16 runners that are either freshmen or sophomores on its preseason 21-man roster. Louisiana State was led to the team title by P.J. Smith and D.A. Points who carded 67 and 68 respectively on the last day. The Tigers came from six strokes behind the Golden Gophers to win by 11 over Northwestern. They shot seven under par as a team on the final round to finish at 874.

Golden Gopher Recap: Golden Gopher sophomore ADAM DOOLEY (Albany, Minn.) finished ninth in only his second collegiate tournament at 221. Minnesota freshman BILL THOMPSON (Wayzata, Minn.), competing as an individual, carded a 223 to finish in a tie for 13th with teammate ANDY KOMOR (New Brighton, Minn.). Rounding out the Minnesota team scoring was freshman MATT DOYLE (Simsbury, Conn.) with a 225, good for 21st. Junior MARK HALVERSON (Fargo, N.D.) carded a 227 to finish 30th, while sophomore ROB KERR (Pointe Claire, Quebec) was 40th at 229.

Next up: The Golden Gophers travel to Ann Arbor. Mich. this weekend for the Wolverine Invitational. Following the Wolverine Invitational, the Maroon and Gold will have a week off before competing in the Windom Memorial in Evanston, Ill., on Oct. 9-10.
