GOLDEN GOPHERS BLANK MIN-NESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY, MANKATO 45-0: The No. 2 ranked

Golden Gopher wrestling team defeated No. 7 ranked Minnesota State

University, Mankato, 45-0 in front of 2,185 at Otto Arena in Mankato, Minn., Thursday night. Freshman LEROY VEGA (Portage, Ind.) got the Golden Gophers started with a pin over Chris Maggard in 5:54 at 125 to earn Minnesota six points. Senior PAT CONNORS (Longview, Wash.), ranked 10th in the nation, continued the winning ways with a major decision over Mark Natzke 20-9 at 133. Freshman CHAD ERIKSON (Apple Valley, Minn.), ranked 11th in the nation, who upset the No. 8 ranked Jamill Kelly of Oklahoma State Sunday, defeated

At 149, senior **TROY MARR** (Wyoming, Minn.) decisioned the defending NCAA Division II champion Troy Szydel, 6-3 to up the Golden Gopher lead to 17-0. Senior **CHAD KRAFT** (Lakefield, Minn.), ranked No. 1 in the nation, increased Minnesota's lead to 21-0 with a major decision over Matt Petsinger 18-6.

Travis Shives, ranked fifth in the Division II, 17-5.

Senior JOSH HOLIDAY (Anaheim, Calif.), ranked fourth in the nation defeated Brian Beste 15-6, at 165 to open the second half and increase the lead to 25-0. Junior DELANEY BERGER (Mandan, N.D.) earned his first pin of the year in defeating Billy Dehmer in 2:39 at 174 pounds. Junior Delaney Berger lost a close match to No. 1 ranked Mark Smith 2-1 at 174. Junior Brandon Eggum, ranked No. 1 in the nation, decisioned eighth ranked Mark Munoz 5-2 at 184. No. 1 ranked senior Tim Hartung put the Golden Gophers up 17-11 after a 21-6 technical fall decision over Pat Popolizio. Heavyweight Brent Boeshans was pinned by 16th ranked Dave Anderton to even the score 17-17 heading into the final match.

GOLDEN GOPHERS ARE NO. 2 IN LATEST RANKING:

Minnesota is ranked No. 2 in the nation according to *Intermat* and No. 3 according to *Amateur Wrestling News*. According to *Intermat*, seniors Tim Hartung, Chad Kraft and junior Brandon Eggum are all ranked No. 1 at 197, 157 and 184 respectively. Senior Josh Holiday is No. 4 at 165, junior Delaney Berger is No. 10 at 174, senior Pat Connors is ranked No. 10 at 133, freshman Chad Erikson is ranked No. 11 at 141 and freshman Leroy Vega is ranked No. 16 at 125.

NO. 1 RECRUIT SIGNS WITH MINNESOTA: The University of Minnesota wrestling program announced that Damion Hahn signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

Hahn, a native of Lakewood, N.J., is the No. 1 high school wrestler in the nation at any weight class according to Amateur Wrestling News, Wrestling Institute Newsmagazine, USA Wrestling and the National Wrestling Coaches Association. A standout at Lakewood High School, Hahn has won two New Jersey state titles at 189 pounds. He is also a two-time Junior National Freestyle Champion and a four-time Junior Olympic champion at 178 pounds. In three years, Hahn has racked up a 94-2 overall record and has won 64 consecutive matches at Lakewood.

"Landing Damion Hahn is another big step in bringing our program to the top," Minnesota Head Assistant Coach Marty Morgan said. "He had it narrowed down to Oklahoma State and us and usually at that point we lose them, but it was different this time. Damion and his dad realized Minnesota is an up and coming powerhouse and they wanted Damion to be a part of it."

Hahn will compete in the 184 pound weight class at Minnesota.

HARTUNG IS FINALIST FOR PRESTIGIOUS HODGE AWARD:

Senior Tim Hartung, a two-time Big Ten Champion and the 1998 NCAA Champion, was named a finalist for the Dan Hodge Trophy given to the most outstanding wrestler in the college ranks. The Hodge Trophy is the equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. Hartung joins Oklahoma State's Eric Guerrero and Cal State-Bakersfield's Stephen Neal as finalists for the award. Hartung was also a Hodge Trophy award finalist last year.

UP NEXT: Minnesota hits the road Sunday, Dec. 13, to face Oregon Portland State and Oregon State. The Golden Gophers will wrestle Portland State at 12 p.m. in Portland, Ore. and then travel to Corvallis, Ore. to wrestle Oregon State at 9 p.m.

NO. 2 GOLDEN GOPHERS TO MEET NO. 6 IOWA STATE: The No. 6 ranked Iowa State Cyclones are 10-1 on the season thus far. Iowa State has seven

wrestlers ranked in the top 20 according to *InterMat's* December 2 poll. At 133, junior Cody Sanderson is ranked fourth, sophomore Cole Sanderson is ranked 10th at 149. David Maldonado is ranked fifth at 157, freshman Joe Heskett is ranked fifth at 165, junior Ben Perkins is 14th at 174, at 184 freshman Cael Sanderson is sixth, at 197 sophomore Zach Thompson is seventh and freshman Mark Knauer is 15th at heavyweight.

THE SERIES: Iowa State leads the Golden Gophers 29-13-2 in the all-time series. The last time the two teams met was January 4, 1998, when Minnesota defeated the Cyclones 20-15 at Hilton Coliseum in Ames, Iowa. Minnesota claimed six matches, which included five decisions. Bart Golyer, Jason Davids, Josh Holiday, Zac Taylor, Brandon Eggum and Tim Hartung picked up victories for the Golden Gophers. The last time Iowa State defeated the Golden Gophers was January 4, 1997, at Williams Arena, where the Cyclones downed Minnesota 19-16. Minnesota and Iowa State have met five consecutive seasons and the Golden Gophers lead the series 3-2 in those five years.

NO. 2 MINNESOTA WINS TWO DUAL MEETS IN OREGON:

The No. 2 ranked Golden Gopher wrestling team defeated No. 10 Oregon State 26-12 at Gill Coliseum in Corvallis, Ore. Minnesota claimed six of the 10 matches to defeat the Beavers. Senior Josh

Holiday, ranked No. 4 in the country, started Minnesota off with a 14-4 major decision victory over Isaac Wood at 165. No. 1 ranked junior Brandon Eggum defeated Isaac Weber 16-5 at 184. Senior Tim Hartung, ranked No. 1 in the nation, defeated sixth-ranked Shane Zajac with a technical fall decision in 6:45. At 125, freshman Leroy Vega defeated Nathan Navarro with a major decision score of 14-6. Freshman Chad Erikson, ranked No. 11 in the nation, pinned Shane Cunanan in just 0:21 seconds to earn the Golden Gophers six points at 141 pounds. Sophomore Brad Pike lost a close match to No. 1 ranked Oscar Wood with a 4-3 decision at 149 and senior Chad Kraft, ranked No. 1 in the nation, defeated No. 15 ranked Eric Jorgensen 7-6 to clinch the victory.

The No. 2 ranked Golden Gophers defeated Portland State 37-6 at Stott Center in Portland, Ore. Minnesota won matches to defeat the Vikings and improve its dual meet record to 4-1. Senior Chad Kraft, ranked No. 1 in the nation, pinned Derek Smith in 4:13 to earn Minnesota six points to start off the match at 157. Following him, senior Josh Holiday, ranked fouth in the country, defeated R. J. Gillespie 14-5 at 165 pounds. No. 1 ranked junior Brandon Eggum defeated Lonnie Eggert 16-7 at 184 and senior Tim Hartung, also ranked No. 1 at 197, earned his seventh pin of the season over Adam Thomas in 2:46. Also winning for Minnesota at 133 was senior Pat Connors with a 18-5 major decision, freshman Joe Calavitta with a 24-10 major decision over Casey Hunt at 141 and senior Troy Marr with a 9-3 decision over Brad Galletes at 149.

The Hodge Trophy is the equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. Hartung joins Oklahoma State's Eric Guerrero and Cal State-Bakersfield's Stephen Neal as finalists for the award. Hartung was also a Hodge Trophy award finalist last year.





MINNESOTA MEN'S TRACK TEAM STARTS OFF 1999 SEA-SON WITH THE NORTHWEST OPEN: The University of Minnesota men's track and field team is set to start off the 1999 season by hosting the Northwest Open on Saturday, Jan. 9, 1999 at the University of Minnesota Fieldhouse starting at 9:00 a.m.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST YEAR: 1998 turned out to be a banner year for the Golden Gopher Track and Field Team.

Head Coach Phil Lundin and his team accomplished something that no other Minnesota track and field team has done since 1968. They won a Big Ten title in both the indoor and outdoor track and field seasons. Lundin was honored for those accomplishments by being named Big Ten Coach of the Year for both the indoor and outdoor seasons.

During the indoor season, Minnesota utilized its depth to unseat three-time defending champion Wisconsin at the Big Ten Championships held in West Layfayette, Ind. STAFFAN STRAND (Uppsland Vasby, Sweden) won the indoor high jump title by tying his Big Ten Champion meet record jump of 7-4 1/2. BENJAMIN JENSEN (Mandal, Norway) also captured a title for the Maroon and Gold when he won his second straight hepthalon title.

During the outdoor season, the Golden Gophers also ended Wisconsin's reign at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships when they took their second title of the year in Columbus, Ohio. Minnesota finished with 134.50 points to Wisconsin's 120 points. Fred Rodgers paced the Golden Gophers by winning his first Big Ten title in the 100-meter dash.

"There was no other feeling like," said junior FRED RODGERS (Hamilton, Ohio). "It was great to win the 100-meter in my home state and in the last track event at Ohio Stadium."

Now as the Golden Gophers enter the 1999 season, the task at hand is to successfully defend their titles. With the return of Strand, Jensen and Rodgers, as well as numerous other talented runners, throwers and jumpers, Coach Lundin feels that another Big Ten title is well within their reach.

"It's going to be a daunting task to try and follow up the success of last year," Coach Lundin said. "But if we can keep everyone happy and injury-free, I think we'll definitely be in the hunt for another title."

Pat McNamara of Michigan State then defeated Lawrence 10-2 in the second round. In the consolation round, Lawrence defeated Tim Brosnan of Lehigh, 12-2, but lost to Jason Nashbaum of Michigan State 6-4. Freshman JOE CALAVITTA (Yorba Linda, Calif.) was defeated in the preliminary round 8-4 by Mark Perryman of Arizona State. He then went on to defeat Aaron Paterson of

second round. In the third match of the night, Benjamin was pinned by Angelo Borzio of NYAC in 4:51.

NO. 2 MINNESOTA WINS TWO DUAL MEETS IN OREGON:

The No. 2 ranked Golden Gopher wrestling team defeated No. 10 Oregon State 26-12 at Gill Coliseum in Corvallis, Ore. Minnesota claimed six of the 10 matches to defeat the Beavers. Senior JOSH HOLIDAY (Anaheim, Calif.), ranked No. 4 in the country, started Minnesota off with a 14-4 major decision victory over Isaac Wood at 165. No. 1 ranked junior BRANDON EGGUM (Sidney, Mont.) defeated Isaac Weber 16-5 at 184. Senior TIM HARTUNG (Durand, Wis.), ranked No. 1 in the nation, defeated sixth-ranked Shane Zajac with a technical fall decision in 6:45. At 125, freshman LEROY VEGA (Portage, Ind.) defeated Nathan Navarro with a major decision score of 14-6. Freshman CHAD ERIKSON (Apple Valley, Minn.), ranked No. 11 in the nation, pinned Shane Cunanan in just 0:21 seconds to earn the Golden Gophers six points at 141 pounds. Sophomore BRAD PIKE (Brownsdale, Minn.) lost a close match to No. 1 ranked Oscar Wood with a 4-3 decision at 149 and senior CHAD KRAFT (Lakefield, Minn.), ranked No. 1 in the nation, defeated No. 15 ranked Eric Jorgensen 7-6 to clinch the victory.

The No. 2 ranked Golden Gophers defeated Portland State 37-6 at Stott Center in Portland, Ore. Minnesota won matches to defeat the Vikings and improve its dual meet record to 4-1. Senior Chad Kraft, ranked No. 1 in the nation, pinned Derek Smith in 4:13 to earn Minnesota six points to start off the match at 157. Following him, senior Josh Holiday, ranked fouth in the country, defeated R. J. Gillespie 14-5 at 165 pounds. No. 1 ranked junior Brandon Eggum defeated Lonnie Eggert 16-7 at 184 and senior Tim Hartung, also ranked No. 1 at 197, earned his seventh pin of the season over Adam Thomas in 2:46. Also winning for Minnesota at 133 was senior Pat Connors with a 18-5 major decision, freshman Joe Calavitta with a 24-10 major decision over Casey Hunt at 141 and senior TROY MARR (Wyoming, Minn.) with a 9-3 decision over Brad Galletes at 149.

University of Minnesota freshman

Jacob Clark of St. Paul, Minn., won the Junior Level Championship Belt Series with 214 points, defeating runner-up Clark Forward of Archbold, Ohio by an impressive 52 points. Junior wrestlers are athletes in grades 9-12. Clark won a gold medal at the Asics Tiger Junior Nationals in Greco-Roman and placed second in the Junior National in freestyle. He won the Most Falls Trophy in the Greco-Roman event. He was also a Southeast Regionals double champion and a Northern Plains Regional freestyle champion.

Senior Josh Holiday is No. 4 at 165, junior Delaney Berger is No. 13 at 174, senior Pat Connors is ranked No. 13 at 133, freshman Chad Erikson is ranked No. 10 at 141, freshman Leroy Vega is ranked No. 19 at 125 and senior Troy Marr is ranked 20th at 149.

NO. 1 RECRUIT SIGNS WITH MINNESOTA: The University of Minnesota wrestling program announced that Damion Hahn signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

Hahn, a native of Lakewood, N.J., is the No. 1 high school wrestler

in the nation at any weight class according to Amateur Wrestling News, Wrestling Institute Newsmagazine, USA Wrestling and the National Wrestling Coaches Association. A standout at Lakewood High School, Hahn has won two New Jersey state titles at 189 pounds. He is also a two-time Junior National Freestyle Champion and a four-time Junior Olympic champion at 178 pounds. In three years, Hahn has racked up a 94-2 overall record and has won 64 consecutive matches at Lakewood. Hahn will compete in the 184 pound weight class at Minnesota.

HARTUNG IS FINALIST FOR PRESTIGIOUS HODGE AWARD:

Senior Tim Hartung, a two-time Big Ten Champion and the 1998 NCAA Champion, was named a finalist for the Dan Hodge Trophy given to the most outstanding wrestler in the college ranks. The Hodge Trophy is the equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. Hartung joins Oklahoma State's Eric Guerrero and Cal State-Bakersfield's Stephen Neal as finalists for the award. Hartung was also a Hodge Trophy award finalist last year.
