GOPHERS LOOK FOR FIRST CONFERENCE ROAD WIN— Minnesota (8-4, 1-2) will be looking for its first Big Ten road win of the season as it travel through the state of Indiana.

GOPHERS VS. PURDUE — The Boilermakers own a 14-9 advantage in the overall series. The teams split the series last year, with Minnesota winning the first contest, 67-51 at home, and falling at West Lafayette, 72-64.

GOPHERS VS. INDIANA — Minneost leads the series, 15-12. Minnesota won both contests last season, defeating the Hoosiers 80-70 at home and 60-59 on the road.

MINNESOTA FALLS AT ILLINOIS— Illinois used a 52-27 second-half scoring advantage to post a come-from-behind 88-78 victory last Sunday in Champaign.

After Minnesota led 55-39 early in the second half, the Illini went on a 19-2 run to take a 58-57 lead with 12:20 remaining. After four lead changes, the Gophers went on an 11-0 run of their own to take a 70-60 lead with 6:48 remaining. Illinois scored the next 10 points to knot the score at 70-70. Illinois closed out the game with a 10-2 run.

The Illini were led by Kris Dupps with 29 points while Carol Ann Shudlick led the Gophers with 26 points, including 20 in the first half.

COACH LINDA HILL-MACDONALD NOTCHES CAREER WIN #200 — Minnesota Golden Gopher head women's basketball coach Linda Hill-MacDonald recorded her 200th career coaching victory with a 76-65 victory over Kansas State on Dec. 21. Hill-MacDonald, now 202-186 in her career and is 36-56 at Minnesota. She was 166-130 in 10 years at Temple.

THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME — The new Sports Pavilion has been kind to the Gophers, as the team has won its first five games in the newly renovated facility. The Gophers have defeated Chicago State (95-47), Boise State (78-68), Wisconsin-Green Bay (73-54), Kansas State (76-65) and Wisconsin (89-84). Minnesota will not play at home again until the last weekend in January, when it hosts Michigan State and Michigan.

NON-CONFERENCE WRAPUP— After losing the season opener at Marquette, 87-68, the Gophers rebounded and won five straight games, including the Dial Classic tournament championship and an upset of then third-ranked Texas Tech, 92-82 in overtime. The winning streak was ended when Wichita State defeated

Minnesota in the championship game of the Shocker Shootout. Closing out the non-conference season, the Gophers defeated Kansas State at home and Northern Iowa on the road.

TEXAS TECH UPSET — Minnesota's victory over Texas Tech on Dec. 18 broke a 24-game winning streak for the defending national champions. Minnesota's 92 points was the most scored against Texas Tech in the previous 144 games.

SHUDLICK NAMED TOURNAMENT MVP — Despite the team losing in the championship game, **Shudlick** earned tournament MVP honors for her 30.5 points per game average. She tied her career high with 44 points against Texas Tech, including 12 in the overtime period. Shudlick's 44 points set a tournament record and a Levitt Arena record. It is also the second-best performance in Div. 1 so far this season. (Kristy Ryan of Cal State Sacramento scored 45 points against UC-Irvine on Dec. 4).

GOPHERS AMONG 'OTHERS RECEIVING VOTES' — Minnesota continues to receive points in the AP Top 25 poll. Other Big Ten school ranked this week include #2 Iowa, 33 Penn State, #13 Purdue, #18 Ohio State and #19 Northwestern. Indiana is also among the others receiving votes.

CAREER DAY FOR LOEBLEIN, FLINT — Junior **Shannon Loeblein** had a career day against the Badgers in Minnesota's conference home opener, scoring career highs with 28 points and eight steals. She also tied her career high in assists with five. Loeblein shot six-of-six from the free throw line and 11-of-18 from the field.

Senior **Crystal Flint** also had a career day, recording career highs for points with 22 and rebounds with 12.

STEADY STARTERS — Minnesota's starting lineup remained steady for the first 10 games of the season but changed slightly on Jan. 9 against Wisconsin. Senior **Mary Klotzbeeher** replaced senior **Nikki Coates** as the starting point guard slot and has started the last two games. Klotzbeeher started twice last season, replacing Coates while she was recovering from a concussion. Shudlick, Pearson and Flint are all returning starters from last season. Loeblein had started two games as a freshman and one game as a sophomore before earning the starting off-guard slot thus far in '93-94.

LAWLER INJURED — Junior guard **Lori Lawler** did not make the trip to Illinois due to a stress fracture. She is being evaluated on a day-to-day basis and is questionable for this weekend's play.

STAFFORD REDSHIRTS — Sophomore **Cheri Stafford** underwent surgery on her ankle on Dec. 10 and will redshirt the 1993-94 season. Stafford appeared in the first two games this season and scored a total of four points. She averaged 1.9 ppg for the Gophers as a freshman.

SHUDLICK SHOTS

SHUDLICK PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA — **Carol Ann Shudlick** was named a preseason first-team all-America selection by *Street and Smith* magazine. Shudlick averaged 22.6 ppg last season and was eighth in the nation in scoring.

SHUDLICK RANKS AMONG NATION'S LEADERS IN SCORING — In games through Sunday, Jan. 15, **Shudlick** ranked third in the country in scoring with a 25.3 points per game average. Shudlick was as high as second in the nation in early January. Here are this week's top scorers in the nation:

1. Kristy Ryan, Cal State Sacramento, 31.7 ppg
 2. Cornelia Gaydah, LSU, 25.6 ppg
 3. **Carol Ann Shudlick, Minnesota, 25.3 ppg**

- Gaydah and Shudlick have both played in 12 games — Gaydah has 307 points while Shudlick has 303

CAREER SCORING UPDATE — **Shudlick** now has 1,722 career points and is only the fourth player in Gopher history to reach the 1,700 point plateau. She has just moved into third place in career scoring at Minnesota. Shudlick needs 134 points to move into second place (held by Linda Roberts with 1,856 points) and 322 points to catch Laura Coenen, the currently career scoring leader, with 2,044 career points. To do that, Shudlick will need to average 21.5 ppg in the next 15 regular season contests.

DOUBLE FIGURES — Shudlick has scored in double figures in 39 consecutive games. Her season high is 44 points and her season low is 17 points.

SHUDLICK MOVING INTO NEW RECORDS — While she is known best for her scoring, Shudlick has also moved into the top ten in career rebounding. She now has 622 career rebounds and is 16 away from moving into ninth.

WHAT'S NEXT — After completing the road swing through Indiana, Minnesota returns home to host Michigan State on Jan. 28 and Michigan on Jan. 30.

GOPHERS SIGN SIX RECRUITS DURING EARL SIGN-

ING PERIOD — Joining the basketball team next season will be six players, including four from Minnesota. Signing were **Jaime Ellis** of Lake Oswego, Ore.; **Angie Iverson** of Owatonna, Minn.; **Sarah Klun** of Madison, Wis., **Toni Melancon** of Maple Grove, Minn.; **Kay Schmidt** of Bloomington, Minn.; and **Sarah Schieber** of Caledonia, Minn.

Schmidt, a 5-11 guard at Bloomington Kennedy High, has scored 1,111 career points and is a *Street & Smith's* preseason honorable mention all-American.

Schieber, a 5-11 forward/guard at Caledonia High, has 1,380 career points, making her the second-highest active scorer in Minnesota.

Klun, a 6-0 center/forward at LaFollette High in Madison, averaged 12 points and 7.3 rebound per game last season.

Iverson, a 6-0 forward at Owatonna High, averaged 19 ppg and 13 rpg in her junior season.

Melancon, a 6-6 center at Osseo High, has been playing organized basketball for three years and will be the tallest player ever to play at Minnesota.

Ellis, a 5-9 point guard at Lake Oswego High in Oregon, averaged 10 points, six assists and three rebound per game last season.
