KUHLMAN A LONG HITTER WITH MUCH POTENTIAL

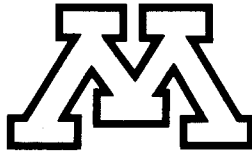
Minneapolis, Minn. -- Gopher golf coach Anne Zahn says Montevideo freshman Mary Kuhlman "hits the ball a long way and has the potential to become a strong player on the Gopher team." Kuhlman, after all, has a good role model to follow; her sister, Barbara Moxness, is on the Lady's Professional Golf Association (LPGA) tour.

In her only regular season outing of the spring season, Kuhlman tied for eighth at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational at the University of Iowa, shooting 80-76-79=235. Competing in the Big Ten Championships in early May, she finished in a three-way tie for 36th with 88-87-81-85=341.

While attending Montevideo High school, Kuhlman was a member of the volleyball, basketball and golf team, lettering in basketball and golf. As captain of the golf team for three years, Kuhlman garnered many district, regional and conference wins. Majoring in business, she is the daughter of Roger and Marth Kuhlman, of rural Montevideo.

SMITH WINS BIG TEN MEDAL OF HONOR, MVP AWARD

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Senior golfer Jocelyn Smith, of Lennoxville, Quebec, was honored this week as Minnesota's recipient of the Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor. The award, given to a senior at each Big Ten School, is based on academic excellence, athletic achievement and leadership. Smith also won Most Valuable Player honors this year, after winning MVP as a sophomore, when she qualified for the AIAW Nationals. She is the second golfer in a row to win the Medal Of Honor; last year, the recipient was Nancy Harris.

Smith has finished in the top ten at the Big Ten Championship the last three years in a row, including a fourth place this season. She shot the lowest round of the tournament (72) and earned All-Big Ten recognition. The conference tourney capped a spring that was the second best in Gopher history, with a 78.1 scoring average. She ended her career with a 79.50 scoring average.

The first collegiate victory for the Alexander Galt High school graduate came just a week before the Big Ten's at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational (76-75-74=230), with three consistent rounds in the mid-70's.

"Jocelyn was our top golfer this year," said coach Anne Zahn. "She's been a key influence on the team, and it will be hard to replace her, both in terms of ability and team leadership."

Besides her victory at the Lady Hawkeye, Smith tied for fourth at the Duke Spring Invitational (76-78-76=230), and was fourth at the Azalea Seahawk Invitational (77-78-78=233).

Top 54 Hole Scores - ties at 4th with 225, 7th with 228, 10th with 229, 13th with 230, and 18th with 231 ---

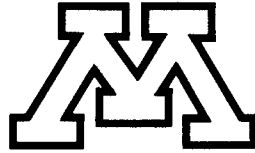
Top 72 Hole Scores - 3rd with 315 ---

Last summer, Smith finished second in the Quebec Amateur, after winning that event the year before. While attending Alexander Galt High school, she competed in soccer, basketball, hockey, badminton, cross country and track. GODFREY FINISHES SECOND YEAR ON GOLF TEAM

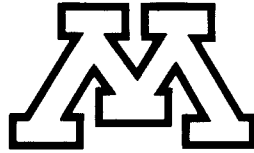

Finishing the year with a 82.50 stroke average, Zahn feels Godfrey "needs more competiton to get her experience level up higher, which in turn will give a consistency to her play."

KRAFKA HAS SUCCESSFUL FRESHMAN YEAR ON GOLF TEAM

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Jodi Krafka, had a successful freshman year as a member of the Gopher women's golf team, where she finished third in one tournament and tied for 36th at the Big Ten Championships. "Jodi is very competitive in a tournament situation," says head coach Anne Zahn. "She has a lot of potential, which was shown during her first season of play."

Krafka finished third at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational, hosted by the University of Iowa, with a 75-76-79=230 during the spring season, which was her best 54 hole score of both the fall and spring season. She placed 36th, in a three way tie, at the recent Big Ten Championships in Indianapolis where she shot 84-88-85-85=341 for 72 holes.

"We had Jodi change her swing over the winter, and her spring play shows the improvement she made with those adjustments," says Zahn of the former high school National Honor Society member.

While attending Alexandria's Jefferson High school, Krafka competed in gymnastics, tennis and golf. She earned five letters in gymnastics, was team captain for two years, and was named Hardest Worker and Most Improved. A four year varsity tennis career earned her three letters, and Hardest Worker and Most Improved awards.

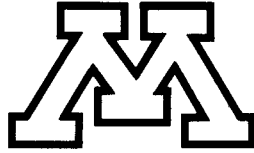

HENNESSY TO BE "KEY INGREDIENT" ON 1985-86 GOLF TEAM

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Sophomore Julie Hennessy is to be "a key ingredient on next year's team," say golf coach Anne Zahn. "I'm very pleased with her play this past year, and will be looking toward Julie for leadership capabilities."

The Lewiston-Altura High school graduate finished the 1984-85 season in the number 2 spot on the Gopher squad with a season's stroke average of 79.32, only .36 of a stroke behind team leader Jocelyn Smith, of Lennoxville, Quebec, Canada. Hennessy led the team after the fall season with 78.3 average, but Smith, a senior, had a stronger spring season.

"Julie has shown growth this season, and has matured both in her mental attitude, and her physical approach to the game," says Zahn.

Hennessy's best finish of the spring season was a tie for second at the Seahawk Azalea Invitational (81-73-77=231) at Wilmington, N.C. Two weeks later, she finished fifth at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational (78-73-80=231), hosted by the University of Iowa, at Iowa City. In all, she carded a 73 round three times this year.

A six-time letter winner in golf at Lewiston-Alutra High school, Hennessy was the 1982 Minnesota Class A Golf Champion, and was runner-up in 1983. She is the daughter of Thomas and Mitzie Hennessy, of rural Lewiston, Minn.

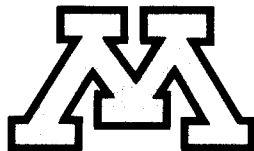

FORSBERG, OTNESS TO BE KEY FACTORS ON GOPHER GOLF SQUAD

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Dee Forsberg and Lynda Otness, both graduates of Farmington High school, are viewed by Minnesota head golf coach Anne Zahn as key factors to the team in the coming years. Forsberg, a sophomore, and Otness, a freshman, had their high school golf careers directed by Farmington High golf coach Stanley Otness, Lynda's father.

Forsberg ranks third on this year's team with a 81.6 stroke average for the season. "We're looking forward to next year when Dee will play an important part on the team," says Zahn. "Her play hasn't reached a consistency of shooting in the 70's, but she's putting everything together and has the potential to be a really strong player next season."

Forsberg's season best came at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational (76-78-79=233) where she tied for 6th place. She ended the season with a 39th place finish at the Big Ten Conference Championships.

During her freshman year, Forsberg ended the season in the number 3 spot with a 81.6 stroke average, placing 11th at the Big Ten's, was eighth at the Minnesota Invitational and 11th at the Lady Spartan.

In high school, Forsberg competed in golf on the varsity level for six years, and was named Most Valuable three times and co-captained the team for two years. Tentatively planning a teaching career, she is the daughter of Richard and Barbara Forsberg, 22185 Albatross Circle, Farmington.

Otness competed only once this spring (Seahawk Azalea Invitational - 83-82-85=250), after playing 10 rounds in four tournaments this past fall. "Lynda had a good fall, but during the winter we put her through some swing changes," says Zahn. "She'll have all the kinks worked out by next fall when she will be vying for a permanent position on the traveling team."

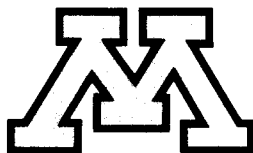

MEYER'S GOLF GAME COMING TOGETHER

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Ann Meyer, a sophomore from Sauk Centre "is a very determined young woman who has worked hard to bring her golf game together," says her coach, Anne Zahn. "She had very little experience when she started two years ago, but has learned alot about the game since then."

Meyer only saw competition twice during the spring season; first at the South Carolina Invitational, and then at the Big Ten Championships. At South Carolina, she carded a 95-89-87=271 for 73rd, but came on much stronger at the Big Ten's, where she finished with a 83-85-85-82=335 for 30th.

The 1983 graduate from Sauk Centre High school competed in golf, as well as volleyball and basketball. Her prep career was highlighted by nine letters in the three sports, seven All-Conference honors and two Most Valuable Player Awards.

Meyer, who hasn't decided on a major course of study, is the daughter of John and JoAnn Meyer, of rural Sauk Centre.
