VOLLEYBALL HOSTS OHIO STATE/INDIANA IN TIGHT CONFERENCE RACE --

The University of Minnesota volleyball team upped their overall record to 13-8 and Big Ten mark to 5-2 by sweeping Michigan State and Michigan last weekend. The Gophers have now won four-straight matches, and seven of their last eight. Both matches this weekend will help determine the Gophers fortunes in a very close conference race.

Other than first place Illinois (8-0), second through sixth place is a tight race with Iowa (6-1) followed by Minnesota and Ohio State (5-2), Purdue (5-3) and Indiana (4-3). This weekend's matches represent the halfway point in the Big Ten double round-robin league schedule. The Gophers will also be at home the following weekend, hosting Wisconsin October 31 and Northwestern, November 1.

SCHLEUDER PLEASED -- Coach Stephanie Schleuder says the Gophers have pulled out some close games. "We played consistently, and even though we got behind, late in the games we came back strong and played well under pressure. I will experiment with different blocking combinations this week -- we need to improve in that area. I think we have a tremendous desire to do well (vs. OSU and Indiana) and both matches should be hotly contested."

PAM MILLER TO BREAK SCHOOL KILL RECORD -- Gopher senior captain Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) is just 13 kills shy of the school career kills record of 1,350 held by former All-American Jill Halsted (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) who played from 1979-82. Miller led the Gophers with 16 kills against Michigan State while hitting .387 and then added 10 kills, hitting .348 with a career high 16 digs against Michigan. Overall, she has 335 kills on the season for a 4.14 kills per game average. Miller already holds school career records of most block assists and most total blocks. Halsted, and former Big Ten MVP Martie Larsen are ahead of Miller on the career block solo list.

BUCKEYE BRIEFS -- Ohio State is 11-6 overall prior to hosting Eastern Michigan on Tuesday, Oct. 21. The Buckeyes were third in the league last year with a 12-6 record. They are led by senior Kristi Neuman of Fridley, Minn. who has 285 kills overall for a 5.0 kills per game average (6th in nation)...the other top hitters are senior Victorea Wright with 2.77 kills per game and freshman Lisa Vitali who is hitting .226 with 2.75 kills per game. The setter has switched -- freshman Robin Bock has 298 assists, but senior Marlene O'Brien has 129 and played more recently.

SERIES-- Ohio State leads 8-6 and the Buckeyes have won the last five meetings...Minnesota's last win was at Ohio State, Sept. 23, 1982, but that year the match did not count in the conference schedule as OSU was in the East Division of the Big Ten and only one match was designated to count in single round-robin play -- therefore, the Gophers have never won an official Big Ten contest.

HOOSIER HIGHLIGHTS -- Indiana is 10-7 overall prior to playing at Miami, Ohio on Tuesday, Oct. 21 and at Iowa on Friday, Oct. 24. The Hoosiers were fifth in the league in '85 with a 10-8 mark. The highlight of this season was beating Purdue in three-straight at W. Lafayette, breaking a losing streak which had dated back to 1977 for the Hoosiers. Sophomore Liz Armbrustmacher leads the team with 218 kills, a .259 pct. and 3.63 kill avg. Two freshmen also lead in Julie Goedde (185 kills, .22 pct. 3.03 kill avg.) and Jill Beggs (187 kills, .207 pct.). Setter Karen Dunham, a junior, was the Big Ten's Rookie of the Year as a frosh, and has 589 assists for a 9.7 per game average.

SERIES -- Minnesota leads 8-3 and the Gophers won both matches last season.

GOPHER NOTES -- Sophomore Andrea Gonzalez led the Gophers with 20 kills and added 15 digs against Michigan, and against Michigan State, she added 15 kills and 13 digs. For the year, Gonzalez has 301 kills and in the Big Ten she is leading the team in kills with 117 for a 4.18 per game average. Overall, Gonzalez has 823 career kills, already eighth on the all-time list, and she should move to at least sixth place before the season ends.

Senior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) hit her third best single match kill pct. against Michigan State with a .500 kill pct. on 12 kills, zero errors in 24 attempts. Daline also had 11 digs in that match and 14 digs against Michigan. With 960 career kills, Daline should become just the fifth player to surpass the 1,000 career kill mark this season.

Freshman setter Sharon Oesterling (FRANKFORT, IN) had a best of 20 digs against Michigan State and set a .511 pct. in that match with 46 assists on 90 attempts. She also had 41 assists against Michigan. Overall, Oesterling is averaging 10.04 assists per game and in the Big Ten 10.21.

Freshman Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, KY) had a career best hitting pct. against Michigan State, hitting .391 with 12 kills, three errors in 23 attempts. Schaefer also had eight kills against Michigan and overall is third on the team in kills with 135 and a 2.70 per game average.

HOME CROSS COUNTRY MEET FINAL BIG TEN TUNE-UP -- The Gopher women's cross country squad will be host to their last home meet -- the Minnesota Quad at the Les Bolstad Golf Course Saturday, October 25 at 2:00 p.m. (a time change from the original schedule). Carleton, Northern Iowa and Club Sota will provide the opposition in the season's final home meet. "This will be sort of a tune-up for the Big Ten Championships (at Columbus, Ohio Nov. 1)," said Coach Gary Wilson. Wilson said that his top seven runners for Big Ten's is pretty well set "unless somebody really comes on this week (at practice)."

Those seven include junior tri-captain Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN/Mounds View), sophomores Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN/Highland Park) and Patty Burns (MENOMONIE, WI), and freshmen Wendy Babcock (IRON MOUNTAIN, MI), Cara Daniels (ANOKA, MN), Tiffany Church (APPLETON, WI), and Cherste Johnson (OSHKOSH, WI/West).

GOPHER "A" SQUAD PLACES EIGHTH AT ARIZONA; "B" SQUAD TAKES SEVENTH AT LA CROSSE

-- The Gophers competed at a pair of meets last week -- the Arizona Invitational at Tucson Oct. 13 and the La Crosse Invitational at La Crescent, Minn. Oct. 18. Wilson gave his top seven runners the weekend off after placing a respectable eighth of 20 teams at Arizona and he took his next seven runners to the La Crosse Invitational, where they placed seventh in a field of 16 teams.

RUNNERS-OF-THE-WEEK -- Since the Gophers ran two meets last week, Wilson named a runner-of-the-week from each race. Cara Daniels wins the award for her finish at Arizona. She was only 24 seconds behind the Gophers' top runner, Eileen Donaghy, and came within four seconds of her personal-best with a time of 18:59 on a course that, according to Wilson, was 30 seconds slower than the Les Bolstad course she toured in 18:55.

Junior Amy Mills (MINNEAPOLIS, MN/Southwest), the top Gopher finisher at La Crosse, was cited by Wilson for "the best race she has ever run." Mills finished 31st overall in a personal-record 19:04. Wilson also cited freshman Becky Canner (BALTIMORE, MD/Catonsville) and junior tri-captain Patti Eidman (ROSEVILLE, MN/Kellogg) for the top performances of their careers at La Crosse.

TENNIS TEAM TRAVELS TO IOWA INVITE -- After a one-week break from competition the Gopher tennis team will compete at the Iowa Invitational on Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 25-26, in Iowa City, Iowa. Four teams -- Minnesota, Iowa, Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, and Southwest Missouri -- are scheduled to compete in four singles and two doubles brackets. All positions will be played off, and head coach Jack Roach says that each player will compete in three singles and three doubles matches.

TENTATIVE GOPHER LINEUP -- First Bracket: Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN/Hill-Murray) and Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden). Second Bracket: Anne Marie Ovnik (LA GRANGE, IL) and Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden). Third Bracket: Tonya Breitag (SIOUX FALLS, S.D.) and Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA). Fourth Bracket: Jennie Huston (BURNSVILLE, MN) and Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario). Bengtsson and Ovnik have the team's top singles records with 6-2 marks.

Roach has not set the complete doubles lineup, but the Gorde/Jones and Bengtsson/Breitag teams will compete in the first bracket.

GOLFERS BACK IN ACTION AT LADY TAR HEEL -- The Gopher women's golf team, after a two-week layoff, returns to the links this weekend at the Lady Tar Heel Golf Tournament at Chapel Hill, N.C. The 54-hole tournament begins Friday with play continuing through Sunday. Many of the nation's finest golf teams, including top-ranked Florida, will compete at the Finley Golf Course in Chapel Hill.

GOPHERS SET GOALS -- Coach Anne Zahn said that the team sat down last week and discussed some of the goals they had established for themselves before play got under way this fall. "We had a team meeting," Zahn said, "and I spoke about how I felt about our season so far. We can compete with any team in the country if we get everyone playing well together." Zahn said the Gophers would like to shoot around 300 each round this weekend. "(Finley) is a fair, scorable course," she said.

LAST YEAR AT CHAPEL HILL -- The Gophers finished sixth of 14 teams last year, ahead of traditional Southern golf powers Georgia, Wake Forest, Florida International and North Carolina State. Sophomore Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) tied for fifth with a 226 and junior Mary Kuhlmann (MONTEVIDEO, MN) tied for eighth with a 227. Senior co-captains Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) and Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) are looking to improve upon last year's scores of 238 and 242, respectively.

CHIP SHOTS -- Zahn has been holding qualifying for the fifth and final traveling squad position for the past week. Forsberg, Hennessy, Kuhlmann and Hughes have earned positions on the squad based on their performances this fall...Mary Kuhlmann's back, which had bothered her at the Beacon Woods Invitational in Tampa two weeks ago, has benefited from the layoff, according to Zahn...the Gophers will again have to begin competition without a practice round, as they are not scheduled to arrive in North Carolina until late Thursday, so as to avoid missing too much class time. "Our players all know the course fairly well -- this will be the fourth time the seniors have played there, so we should be able to get off to a good start."

(VOLLEYBALL OPENS SECOND HALF OF SCHEDULE WITH WISCONSIN/NORTHWESTERN)--

The Gopher women's volleyball team remains tied with Ohio State in third place in the Big Ten race entering the second half of the Big Ten double round-robin schedule. Minnesota (14-9 and 6-3) will now host Wisconsin and Northwestern this weekend...but the Gophers must then face five of their next seven opponents on the road.

CHANNEL 29 TO BROADCAST NORTHWESTERN MATCH -- Channel 29, KITN TV, will broadcast the Minnesota-Northwestern volleyball match on a tape delay basis. The November 1 match will air on Saturday November 8 from 3-5 p.m. Dick Bremer will serve as the play-by-play announcer and Lynn McDonald will provide color commentary on the match. This will be the first time a Gopher women's volleyball match has been televised.

Channel 29's contract includes a total of five women's sporting events for this year. The station will also air the December 6 Japanese All-Star co-ed gymnastics meet on a tape delay basis and tentatively plans call for two live women's basketball telecast's and another gymnastics meet on a tape delay basis.

COACH SCHLEUDER COMMENTS -- "I was happy we bounced back Saturday night (against Indiana) after losing to Ohio State. I thought both Pam (Miller) and Andrea (Gonzalez) played well throughout the weekend. Our offense has been more productive and our blocking has improved. We can't afford to take either team lightly this weekend -- Wisconsin is much improved and Northwestern is always dangerous regardless of their record."

BADGER BRIEFS -- Wisconsin improved to 3-6 in the league and 13-9 overall with two home wins over Michigan and Michigan State last weekend. The Badger's had lost five straight Big Ten matches prior to last weekend. Junior Kristen Roman leads the team with 208 kills, a .208 pct. and 2.70 per game average; while junior Liz Potempa has 183 kills, and is averaging 2.41 per game. Junior Tracy Tiffany has a back injury and is questionable for this weekend -- she has 146 kills, a .242 pct., and a 2.43 per game average. The other Wisconsin Big Ten win came the first match of the year at Indiana. SERIES -- Minnesota leads 14-5 and has won the last six meetings.

WILDCAT WRAPUP -- Northwestern has lost five straight matches overall, and suffered defeats at home last weekend, both in five game matches, to Michigan State and Michigan. The Wildcat's only win was at home over Wisconsin. Second team all-Big Ten pick **Janine Makar** leads the team overall with a .229 kill pct. and 208 kills, but is hitting just .130 in the Big Ten. Junior **Kathy Burns** has a .227 pct. with 219 kills and freshman **Stephanie Kammes** has been a bright spot with 181 kills and a .209 pct. The setter had been sophomore **Renee Duckmann** up until last weekend when sophomore **Andrea Proos** came in and set a new Big Ten record with 83 assists against Michigan State. Also in that match freshman **Shelley Brzozowski** tied Gopher Pam Miller's Big Ten season high of 26 kills. **SERIES** -- Tied 7-7.

PAM MILLER BREAKS SCHOOL KILL RECORD -- Gopher senior captain **Pam Miller** (WORTH, IL) broke the all-time Minnesota school career kills record of 1,350 held by former All-American Jill Halsted (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) who played from 1979-82. Miller shattered the record against Ohio State, leading Minnesota with 17 kills in the match, and then added 14 on Saturday against Indiana. Halsted attended the Indiana match for a brief awards ceremony.

Miller now has 1,368 career kills, with 495 errors in 3,337 attempts for a career kill percentage of .262. She is also ranked first in total career blocks with 508, and in career block assists with 381. However, Halsted still owns the school career block solo's record with 178, followed by Big Ten MVP Martie Larsen (1980-83) with 171 and Miller, who has 127 to date.

For the season, Miller leads the Gophers with 366 kills, a .255 kill percentage and a 4.2 kills per game average. Miller had six blocks against Ohio State and four vs. Indiana, upping her season total to a 1.19 per game average.

GONZALEZ PUTS 'EM AWAY -- Sophomore **Andrea Gonzalez** had 20 kills for her second straight match against Ohio State, and hit .292 in the contest and also had a team leading 15 digs. The next night, she put away 13 kills and added 12 digs against Indiana. Gonzalez already has 856 career kills in less than two seasons. Gonzalez leads the Gophers in Big Ten matches with 150 kills for a 4.29 per game average.

DALINE APPROACHES 1,000 -- Senior **Karyn Daline** (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) continued her steady performance last weekend...she had eight kills hitting .273 against Indiana with 11 digs and had seven kills, hitting .208 against Ohio State. Daline now has 974 career kills.

CROSS COUNTRY READY FOR BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS -- The Gopher cross country team will be in Columbus, Ohio this Saturday for the Big Ten Championships after having their final tune-up at the Minnesota Quad, where they placed a solid second behind Club Sota. Gopher coach Gary Wilson was very pleased with the team's performance going into the Big Ten meet. "I think our runners ran well today because they were relaxed," Wilson said. "If we can be as relaxed next weekend, we should meet our goals for that meet."

GOPHERS GOAL: RUN WELL AS A TEAM -- Wilson's goals for his squad are not predicated on where the youthful Gophers finish, but on the way they run. "We want to score 150 points or less, (49 fewer than last year, when the Gophers placed ninth) have 45 seconds between our first and fifth runners, and one minute between our first and seventh," he said. "We also want to place two women in the top 20, two more in the top 30 and two more in the top 40."

WISCONSIN ODDS-ON FAVORITE AT BIG TEN MEET -- Two-time defending NCAA cross country champion Wisconsin returns three All-American runners: junior Stephanie Herbst, last year's Big Ten champion; sophomore Lori Wolter, who finished second to Herbst at Big Tens; and senior Kelly McKillen. Freshman Suzie Favor was running number two to Herbst, but she is injured and is questionable for the Big Ten meet. However, Wisconsin's depth makes them a strong favorite to win their fourth consecutive Big Ten title.

The next four spots are up for grabs, with Iowa, Indiana, Illinois and Ohio State all expected to make a run at Wisconsin. The Gophers hope to surprise some people by finishing ahead of Purdue, Illinois, Michigan State and Michigan for sixth, but Wilson says that will depend on how the other teams do. "Wherever we finish with 150 points will be something we can be proud of at this stage," he said.

DONAGHY, WALSH BREAK 18 MINUTES FOR FIRST TIME -- Sophomore Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN/Highland Park) and junior tri-captain Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN/Mounds View) both established personal bests in finishing second and third respectively in the Minnesota Quad. Donaghy broke her previous record by thirteen seconds, finishing in 17:50, the fourth-best Minnesota time ever at the Les Bolstad course. Walsh finished at 17:59.

GIENEART RUNNER OF THE WEEK -- Sophomore Gwen Gieneart (NEW HOPE, MN/Cooper) is the Gopher runner of the week for her showing at the Minnesota Quad last weekend. Gieneart shaved more than a minute off her previous personal record.

GOLFERS FACE FINAL FALL TEST AT STANFORD -- The Gopher golf team will be on the West Coast this weekend for the Stanford-Burger King Intercollegiate Tournament at Palo Alto, Cal. After meeting many of the South's top teams last weekend, the Gophers now will face the best of the West at Stanford. Minnesota will be hoping to match or beat last year's seventh place finish (310-311-305=926) on the 5,889-yard, par-73 Stanford Golf Course. Play in the 54-hole tournament begins Friday and continues with 18 holes Saturday and Sunday.

In last year's tournament, sophomore Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) was the top Gopher finisher, placing eighth (75-76-74=225). Senior co-captain Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) hopes to carry her final-round 73 from the Lady Tar Heel Invitational last weekend over to the Stanford tournament. Other Gophers competing this weekend will be senior co-captain Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN), senior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) and junior Mary Kuhlmann (MONTEVIDEO, MN).

GOPHERS PLACE NINTH AT LADY TAR HEEL -- The Gophers shot a final-round 307 to finish in ninth place with a 935 score, two shots behind eighth-place Kentucky and 10 strokes ahead of host North Carolina, in the Lady Tar Heel Invitational at Chapel Hill, N.C. last weekend. The University of Miami (Fla.) took team honors with an 899 score. Senior Julie Hennessy led the Gophers with a 78-76-73=227, just eight shots back of individual medalist Sarah LeBrun of Duke. Eleven of the sixteen teams competing at the Lady Tar Heel were ranked ahead of the Gophers in last spring's NCAA rankings.

SWIMMERS TO FACE TOUGH COMPETITION IN INTRA-SQUAD MEET

The women's swimming and diving team will have a tough opponent this weekend when they face-off against themselves in a co-ed intra-squad meet at the Cooke Hall Pool on Nov. 1, at 2 p.m. One-meter diving will start at 1:15 p.m., with three-meter diving at its normal place in the event's schedule.

"The intra-squad meet is an important one to us for many reasons," according to head coach Jean Freeman. "This is the first competition for the swimmers this season, and they need to know how they're progressing." Freeman's goal is to get everybody into three events, with some racing in four. "We plan on swimming people in events they normally don't compete in as well as their strong suits."

The NCAA has revised the scoring for meets since last season, and this is the first time Minnesota will compete under the change. Under the old scoring system only the first three finishers in each individual event would earn points. Now, the first five finishers will score, with a maximum of three places going to a team. In relays, the old "winner take all" scoring has been replaced with points going to the first three teams. "We will be using a lot more strategy under the new scoring systems in deciding who will swim in what events," Freeman says.

The meet will also decide which swimmers will make the traveling squad to Madison, Wisc., on Nov. 14, for the Gopher's Big Ten Conference opener. The Badgers are hosting a triple-dual meet with the Gophers and the Ohio State Buckeyes. The Big Ten coaches, in pre-season poll, have the Gophers ranked in fourth place, with Wisconsin sixth, and the Buckeyes first.

TENNIS TEAM TRAVELS TO TOP-TEN KENTUCKY -- After three weekends of individual tournament competition, the women's tennis team travels to Lexington, Ky., this weekend for dual matches against Kentucky, Kansas, and Miami (Ohio). Over the weekend the Gophers competed in the four-team Iowa Invitational in Iowa City, and head coach Jack Roach says that the team is ready for stronger competition: "We've been building along all season for this weekend. Kentucky is a top-10 team and Miami-Ohio and Kansas will be strong competition."

GOPHERS WIN FOUR OF SIX FLIGHT TITLES IN IOWA -- Minnesota netters won two singles titles and swept the doubles brackets at the Iowa Invitational. In singles play, junior **Karin Eneberg** (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) won the second flight with a 6-2, 6-1 win over Iowa's Liz Canzoneri. In the third flight, senior **Darcy Jones** (TOPSFIELD, MA) defeated teammate **Tonya Breitag** (SIOUX FALLS, S.D.) 7-5, 7-6 for her second consecutive tournament title.

In doubles action, Jones teamed with sophomore **Anne Gorde** (ROSEVILLE, MN) for the first flight championship. The Jones/Gorde team now has a 7-2 record, and they have won flight titles in the Gophers' three tournaments this year.

The second flight championship was not played in Iowa because of time, but Minnesota's number three team of **Eneberg** and freshman **Anne Marie Ovnik** (LA GRANGE, IL) will challenge the Gophers' number four team of sophomore **Lisa Dick** (DON MILLS, Ontario) and freshman **Dana Goldsmith** (SHEBOYGAN, WI) for the title later in the week.

The Gophers will meet Texas Tech at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 7, and they will play Big Ten rival Indiana at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 8. Both matches will be played at the 98th Street Racquet Club in Bloomington.

The Gophers will be looking to improve on their 2-3 dual record and rebound from three losses in last weekend's Kentucky competition. Miami-Ohio defeated Minnesota 6-3, Kentucky blanked the Gophers 9-0, and Kansas won 7-2 over the squad, but head coach Jack Roach said the team did show a lot of improvement, especially mentally.

NOTING TEXAS TECH -- The Red Raiders are 3-0 in duals with wins over West Texas State, New Mexico State and Texas-San Antonio. Individually, Annemarie Walson is 6-2 at No. 1 singles, and Austrian Eva Ziegler is 8-0 at No. 3 and No. 4 singles. Texas Tech had two undefeated doubles teams heading into last weekend's competition at the ITCA qualifying regionals. Their No. 1 team of Walson and Paula Brigance were seeded fifth in the region based on their 7-0 record.

Tech's No. 2 team of Cathy Carlson and Julie Hrebec also won their flight title at Nebraska, and they defeated Gophers Catharina Bengtsson and Tonya Breitag 6-4, 6-2 in the championship match. Carlson and Hrebec have a 7-0 doubles record, all at No. 2. In 1985, Minnesota defeated Texas Tech 5-4 when the Gophers' No. 3 doubles team of Anna Hallgren and Darcy Jones stopped Tech's Lisa Roberts and Paula Brigance 7-6 (7-2) 5-7, 7-5.

NOTING INDIANA -- The Hoosiers have played in invitationals during the fall, and Indiana's No. 1 singles player, Reka Monoki, was invited to play at the ITCA All-American Championships. An All-Big Ten first team selection, Monoki advanced to the quarterfinals, and now has a 10-3 singles record. Freshman Candy Copetzki has the team's best singles record, 10-1 at No. 2, and she has teamed with Jane Paulson for a 5-1 doubles record. Indiana defeated Minnesota 8-1 for third place at the 1985 Big Ten Championship and they were ranked 14th in the nation last season.

GOPHER NOTES -- Freshman Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden) and Anne Marie Ovnik (LA GRANGE, IL) have the team's top singles records with 9-5 marks. Senior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) and junior Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) are close behind at 8-6. Bengtsson and Eneberg won their singles matches against Miami-Ohio, while Ovnik defeated her Kansas opponent.

Freshman Dana Goldsmith (SHEBOYGAN, WI) saw her first singles action of the season in a 2-6, 6-0, 6-3 win over Miami's Stacy Made at No. 7 singles. Goldsmith's playing time has been slowed due to a foot injury.

In doubles, Eneberg and Ovnik have a 7-1 record after winning both of their weekend matches. Earlier in the week they defeated teammates Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario) and Goldsmith 6-4, 6-1 for the second flight doubles title of the Iowa Invitational.

VOLLEYBALL, IN THIRD PLACE, FACES STIFF ROAD TEST--

The Gopher women's volleyball team took over sole possession of third place in the conference by defeating Wisconsin and Northwestern at home last weekend. Minnesota (8-3, 16-9) must now travel to league-leader Illinois (11-0, 24-2) and fifth place Purdue (6-5, 15-9).

Minnesota moved up to eighth place in last week's NCAA Mideast Regional Poll, where Illinois is ranked second, Iowa fifth, Ohio State seventh and Purdue ninth. If the Gophers hope to finish third in the league and have a chance at an at-large berth to the NCAA tournament, they must at least split their matches this weekend.

"We seem to be showing a lot more consistency than early in the year," says Minnesota Head Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "Pam (Miller), Andrea (Gonzalez) and Karyn Daline had great weekends and overall our team play was improved."

Illini on 17-straight Streak -- The Fighting Illini have a 17-straight Big Ten match streak dating back to last season, and have won 14 conference and non-conference matches in a row this year. Illinois is ranked 13th nationally by both the NCAA and CVCA Coaches' Poll. The team is led by last year's Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Mary Eggers, who has 309 kills and a .440 kill pct. Eggers was leading the Big Ten in hitting as of last week, with 151 kills, a .462 kill pct., and a 4.08 per game average.

Other leading hitters include: senior **Sally Rea** (235 kills, .284), freshman **Nancy Brookhart** (186 kills, .302), junior **Elizabeth Binkley** (121 kills, .273), and setter, junior, **Disa Johnson** (90 kills, .322). Johnson is averaging 12.2 assists per game overall and has been leading the Big Ten in assists with a 13.43 conference game average. Illinois leads the series 10-6.

Boiler's Tough at Home-- With a young team, Purdue has slipped to fifth in the Teague this year, and the Gophers home win over the Boilermaker's earlier this year snapped a 13-match losing streak which had dated back to Oct. 27, 1978 at home. The series is still 19-3 in Purdue's favor and the Boiler's are the defending Big Ten Champions from last year.

A key loss for Purdue has been a season ending knee ligament injury to hitting leader, junior **Linda Reichl**. Now, the team is led by freshman **Debbie McDonald** (304 kills, .268), and senior **Debbie Leeman** (221 kills, .209). The teams' setter is sophomore **Darcy Orin** who has 1,003 assists for a 10.8 per game average.

GOPHER NOTES -- Minnesota set a new Williams Arena record with 11 block solos against Northwestern in the four-game win, and defeated Wisconsin on Friday night in three games after staging a come-back from a 2-12 deficit to win the first game 15-12.

Senior captain **Pam Miller** (WORTH, IL) had an outstanding weekend. She hit a .500 kill pct. against the Badgers with 21 kills, and vs. the Wildcats, Miller added 17 kills while hitting .275. Younger sister **Lori Miller** had five kills and two blocks against Wisconsin and four block solos and one block assist against Northwestern.

Senior **Karyn Daline** (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) now has 997 career kills, just three shy of the 1,000 mark. She is ranked fifth on the all-time career kill list. Daline had nine kills and eight digs on Friday night and then had 14 kills, while hitting .316 with a team high 16 digs on Saturday.

Sophomore **Andrea Gonzalez** (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) had 18 kills, hitting .270 vs. Wisconsin and added another team high 18 kills, hitting .262 vs. Northwestern. She is sixth on the all-time kill list with 892 kills in less than two seasons.

Coach Schleuder also praised the play of freshman setter **Sharon Oesterling** (FRANKFORT, IN). Oesterling had 36 assists and a .500 assist percentage vs. Wisconsin with seven digs and against Northwestern had 44 assists and nine digs with five kills.

CROSS COUNTRY IMPROVES AT BIG TEN MEET -- Coach Gary Wilson took the youngest team in the conference to Columbus, Ohio Saturday for the Big Ten Championships hoping to improve on last year's ninth-place finish. Despite losing All-American Jody Eder to graduation, the Gophers, with four freshmen among their top seven runners, shaved 32 points off last year's showing and moved up one spot in the standings. All seven Minnesota runners established new personal records in the process. The Gophers had one minute and 23 seconds between their first and seventh runners, only 23 seconds off their goal going into the meet, and they were less than a minute from reaching their other goal of having six runners among the top 40 finishers.

WILSON PLEASED WITH SHOWING -- Coach Wilson was pleased with the performance of his young team, which finished only 53 points out of second place. "We ran well today," he said, noting that few people expected the Gophers to improve on last year, and that some people felt Minnesota was destined for the conference cellar this season. "The only way I could have been happier is if we could have scored 150 points and finished seventh," Wilson said. "I am very encouraged for next season. We can be in the top three next year with another year of experience and maturity and with one more top runner added."

DONAGHY, WALSH, DANIELS LEAD GOPHERS -- Sophomore Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN/Highland Park) led the Gophers, placing 13th in 17:21, only 13 seconds from gaining All-Big Ten honors. Donaghy eclipsed her previous record time by 29 seconds and served notice that she is a star on the rise. She finished 36th at last year's meet. Junior tri-captain Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN/Mounds View) placed 22nd in 17:42, 17 seconds better than her previous record. Walsh also showed tremendous improvement over last year, when she was the fifth-best Gopher finisher, in 57th place overall. Freshman Cara Daniels (ANOKA, MN/Anoka) was in 58th place at the one kilometer mark, but moved all the way up to 33rd to finish in 18:00, 37 seconds better than her previous best.

WISCONSIN TAKES TEAM TITLE FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT YEAR -- Two-time defending NCAA Champion Wisconsin took the team championship handily with 30 points with Iowa and Northwestern tying for second with 114 points. Badger junior Stephanie Herbst repeated as Big Ten individual champion in 16:22 and Ohio State sophomore Kathryn Monard finished second in 16:35.

GOPHER RUNNER-OF-THE-WEEK -- Eileen Donaghy is honored as Gopher runner-of-the-week for her performance at the Big Ten cross country championships. Donaghy ran the second-fastest time ever for a Gopher at the Big Ten meet, and the fourth-fastest time ever for a sophomore at Minnesota. Her 17:21 was the 13th-fastest time ever for a Minnesota cross country runner. Donaghy finished strong at Columbus, moving up from 23rd at the one kilometer mark to finish in 13th place, an outstanding feat considering the quality of the runners she passed on the way up.

GOLFERS FINISH FALL SEASON IN CALIFORNIA-- The Gopher golfers concluded their fall season with a 10th-place finish at the Stanford Intercollegiate Invitational in Palo Alto, Cal. over the weekend. Minnesota finished with a 54-hole total of 938 (312-314-312), 29 strokes behind defending Big Ten champion Indiana, who took the team championship. Leading the way for the Gophers was sophomore Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN), who shot a final-round 1-under-par 72 to finish with a 227, six strokes back of individual medalist Michele Redman of Indiana, who shot a 2-over 221.

GOPHERS LOOK AHEAD TO SPRING -- While the golfers did not fare too badly against some of the nation's top competition, Gopher coach Anne Zahn believes the team can improve upon their fall performance. "We have a history of starting fast and fading," Zahn said. "I hope this year will be the other way around. Not that we played so badly, but we lacked consistency among our players which kept us from doing a lot better in some tournaments."

VOLLEYBALL KEEPS PLAYOFF HOPES ALIVE, HOSTS FINAL HOME WEEKEND --

The Gopher women's volleyball team will close out their home schedule this weekend by hosting conference rivals Michigan and Michigan State Friday and Saturday nights at 7:30 p.m. at Williams Arena. Minnesota could still receive an NCAA at-large play-off berth, if they remain in third place in the Big Ten. The Gophers close out the league schedule at Indiana, Ohio State and Iowa.

Minnesota upped its overall record to 17-10 by splitting a road trip last weekend, sweeping Purdue 15-12, 15-1, 15-12 and losing to 13th-ranked Illinois in four-games. Illinois kept a lock on first place with a 13-0 league mark, while Iowa stayed in second with a 11-2 record. Minnesota took over sole possession of third place when Michigan State upset Ohio State at E. Lansing, dropping the Buckeye's league record to 8-5.

The Gophers moved up to seventh place in the NCAA Mideast Regional Poll, where Nebraska is ranked first and Illinois second. Iowa is fifth, followed by Ohio State in sixth. The poll helps determine the at-large bids for the NCAA tournament.

Last weekend's win at Purdue marked the first time Minnesota has swept the Boilermaker's twice in a season. Against Illinois, the Gophers lost the first game 5-15, won the second 15-8, and had an 11-10 lead in the third game before losing 15-11, and then lost the match in the fourth game 5-15.

SCHLEUDER COMMENTS ON TEAM/LAST WEEKEND -- Gopher Head Coach Stephanie Schleuder says: "The way Illinois is playing right now they are deserving of more recognition in a higher ranking (currently 12th). Our level of intensity was good, we performed well against an outstanding Illinois team and had a crucial victory over Purdue. Pam (Miller) has been a real force in the front row the last couple of weeks. Sharon (Oesterling) is doing an outstanding job setting, and both Karyn (Daline) and Andrea (Gonzalez) have continued their outstanding performances."

ON MICHIGAN/MICHIGAN STATE -- "Michigan State is obviously playing much better since the last time we played them, they beat a good Ohio State team. Michigan took us to four games the last time we met. We have to be careful right now not to overlook any team. I'm really excited about where we're at as a team and the improvement we've seen in the past month."

NOTING MICHIGAN -- Prior to meeting Central Michigan on Tuesday, Nov. 11 -- Michigan dropped to tenth in the Big Ten (1-11) and 10-15 overall with home losses to Ohio State and Indiana last weekend. The Wolverines have lost three straight and nine of their last eleven matches. Sophomore **Marie Ann Davidson** leads the team with 239 kills, 2.4 per game, and a .207 kill pct. while junior **Heather Olsen** has 251 kills, for 2.6 per game, with a .187 hitting pct. Junior **Lisa Vahi** is the team's setter averaging 8.3 assists per game. **FIRST MEETING**-- Minnesota won 15-13, 15-11, 4-15, 15-13. Freshman **Karen Marshall** led Michigan with 21 kills; **Andrea Gonzalez** led Minnesota with 20 kills. **SERIES**-- Minnesota leads 13-0.

SPARTAN SHORTS -- Prior to hosting Bowling Green State, Tuesday, Nov. 11 and playing at Iowa Friday, the Spartans are 5-7 in the Big Ten and 13-14 overall. Last weekend, Michigan State took Indiana to four games before losing and then swept Ohio State 15-6, 15-12, 15-5. Senior **Shantelle Schmidt** has 415 kills, a .305 kill pct. and is averaging 3.95 kills per game. Senior **Pam Wischmeyer** also has 292 kills, for a 2.86 average and senior **Kris Durst** is questionable this weekend after spraining her ankle last Saturday, but has 211 kills, for a 2.0 game average. Sophomore setter **Judy Doles** is averaging 10.0 assists per game in the Big Ten.

DALINE SURPASSES 1,000 KILLS -- Senior **Karyn Daline** (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) moved over the 1,000 career kill mark over the weekend. She had 997 entering the match at Illinois, where she had eight kills and a team high 18 digs; and at Purdue she had 12 kills and 11 digs. Her career total now stands at 1017.

HOMEcoming FOR OESTERLING -- Freshman setter **Sharon Oesterling** (FRANKFORT, IN) grew up just eight miles outside of W. Lafayette, and she didn't disappoint her hometown fans. Oesterling had 47 assists and a .412 assist percentage in the match and added eight digs. Against Illinois, she had 40 assists and 11 digs.

OTHER GOPHERS -- **Andrea Gonzalez** had 15 kills, hitting .250 vs. Illinois and added 12 kills at Purdue with a match high 19 digs...In the Purdue match, **Karen Staab** (PALATINE, IL) had a season high 5 kills, hitting .444 kill pct. and added seven digs...Staab played front and back-row in that match...**Lori Miller** (WORTH, IL) also had five kills, hitting .625 kill pct...at Illinois, senior **Jennie Collings** (ROCHESTER, IL) played as a hitter in the match, and had three kills...she had not passed in the back-row for two years, but did an excellent job, according to Coach Schleuder...Collings has been a setter for three years.

HARRIERS PREPARE FOR DISTRICT IV MEET -- The Gopher cross country squad will be in Normal, Ill. Saturday, Nov. 15 for the NCAA District IV meet, which features teams from the Big Ten and Mid-American conferences plus the major independents in Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Indiana and Ohio. Last year, the Gophers placed 10th out of 23 teams, and Coach Gary Wilson is hoping his young team can continue to improve as they did in the weeks prior to the Big Ten meet.

Wisconsin won took team honors last year, followed by Northwestern, Michigan and Indiana. Western Michigan, Iowa and Purdue rounded out the top seven. An automatic NCAA berth is awarded only to the top finishing team, but Wilson said it is possible another Big Ten team, possibly two, may gain an at-large bid to the NCAA National Championships November 25 in Tucson, Ariz.

Individuals may qualify for nationals by placing in the top three, not including the winning team's individuals. Jody Eder qualified for the Gophers last year by finishing fourth overall, second after two Wisconsin individuals were taken out.

WILSON PLANS STRATEGY -- Wilson says his squad plans to experiment at this meet, in an attempt to see if the Gopher runners, who have finished strongly in recent meets, can improve their final positions by setting a faster pace at the start of the race. "We'll run very aggressively," Wilson said. "We want to see what going out about five seconds faster will do. Our goal is to finish in the top 10 as a team. Individually, (sophomore) Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN/Highland Park) and (junior tri-captain) Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN/Mounds View) have an outside chance of qualifying for nationals if they run a perfect race."

GOPHER FROSH RUNNING IN THEIR FIRST DISTRICT MEET -- For the four Gopher freshmen who have been running with the varsity, this will be another first. Cara Daniels (ANOKA, MN/Anoka); Wendy Babcock (IRON MOUNTAIN, MI/Iron Mountain); Cherste Johnson (OSHKOSH, WI/West); and Tiffany Church (APPLETON, WI/Appleton) will in all likelihood be closing out their initial cross country campaign with this meet. Sophomore Patty Burns (MENOMONIE, WI/Menomonie) rounds out Minnesota squad. Burns placed 116th with a time of 20:45.9 in last year's District IV meet, and she hopes to improve quite a few notches this year, as she has been running in the mid-18 minute range this year. Donaghy and Walsh finished 32nd and 99th, respectively, in the District meet a year ago. Donaghy was clocked at 19:09.4 and Walsh in 20:15.4. Both runners have improved significantly, with their best times ever (Donaghy in 17:21 and Walsh in 17:42) coming at the Big Ten meet November 1.

(BAKER ANNOUNCES RESIGNATION OF TENNIS COACH JACK ROACH)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Minnesota women's athletic director Merrily Dean Baker has announced the resignation of Jack Roach as head tennis coach effective at the end of the 1986-87 academic year.

Roach is in his fourth year as head coach and has compiled a 47-30 (.610) overall record and three consecutive fourth-place finishes at Big Ten championships. During his first year at Minnesota, 1983-84, he led the team to a fourth place finish in the Big Ten, up from 10th place in 1982-83.

"I want to spend more time with my family, especially on weekends. I have a student-athlete at home who needs my support as much as the women student-athletes at the U," says Roach on his decision to leave.

Baker says that she is sorry to see Roach leave, but she respects his decision. "We're really going to miss him," she says. "Jack has made tremendous contributions in the past four years and built a solid base for the future. We're grateful for what he has done."

A respected member of the Twin Cities tennis community, Roach has worked to bring national recognition and respect to the women's tennis program. His teams have traveled throughout the nation and competed against top tennis schools. Roach has also proven to be an effective recruiter, as four top Swedish players and area champions, including former Hill-Murray standout Anne Gorde, have competed for Minnesota.

Although he had never coached at the collegiate level before coming to Minnesota, Roach has extensive playing and coaching experience. He was inducted into the Minnesota Tennis Hall of Fame in 1982 and was named Outstanding Teaching Pro of the Year in 1977 by the Northwest Professional Tennis Association. As a coach, Roach led the U.S. team at the 1967 Pan American Games with a squad that included former pro player and Davis Cup coach Arthur Ashe. Locally, Roach has also coached at Minneapolis Edison and St. Paul Kellogg high schools.

A graduate of Minneapolis Central High School, Roach won the state prep doubles title in 1953. He played tennis while earning a teaching degree at Macalester College in St. Paul, and he received his master's degree from St. Cloud State. In addition to coaching high school tennis, Roach also served as head basketball and cross country coach. Roach and his wife Jean have three sons, Dan, Michael and Paul.

Baker said that a national search for Roach's replacement will begin in February, 1987.

NETTERS CLOSE FALL SEASON AT MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL -- The tennis team closed their fall season competition last weekend at the Minnesota Invitational at the 98th St. Racquet Club. Texas Tech defeated the Gophers 8-1 on Fri., Nov. 7, and Big Ten rival Indiana blanked Minnesota 9-0 on Sat., Nov. 8, and head coach Jack Roach was pleased with the team's improvement over the weekend and season.

"We played much better today (Saturday) than yesterday (Friday)," Roach says. "The points were close; we're in the game. The Indiana match was a lot closer than 9-0."

NETTER NOTES -- Two freshmen, Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden) and Anne Marie Ovnik (CHICAGO, IL) hold the team's top singles record with identical 9-7 marks. Ovnik and junior Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) have a 7-3 record at No. 3 doubles to lead the doubles teams. The No. 1 doubles team of sophomore Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) and senior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) have a 7-6 record.

SWIMMERS TO FACE THREE BIG TEN OPPONENTS AT WISCONSIN IN TWO MEETS

Forty percent of the Big Ten Conference women's swimming and diving teams will be in Madison, Wisc., this weekend when the Badgers host Minnesota, Illinois and Ohio State in a multiple dual co-ed meet on Friday, and the Midwest relays on Saturday.

The Friday meet is the first intercollegiate competition of the season for the Gophers, Buckeyes and the Fighting Illini. Wisconsin has a 1-1 overall and a 0-1 conference record after beating Iowa State 83-56, and losing to Iowa 119-145, this past weekend.

THE MEET-- A slightly different format will be in force for the 6:30 p.m. multiple dual meet on Friday, at the UW Natatorium. Each team is limited to two swimmers per event, and each swimmer is limited to three total events. The events include the 50, 100, 200, 500 and 1000 yard freestyles, the 200 back and breaststrokes, the 200 individual medley, the 100 butterfly, the 400 medley and free relays, and one and three meter board diving.

THE OPPONENTS-- Illinois: The Gophers have faced the Fighting Illini only once before in a dual meet, beating them during the 1984-85 season 77-52. Illinois ended the year in eighth place in the conference and holds the same slot in the Big Ten swimming coach's pre-season rankings poll. Illinois' Cheri Domitrz (distance freestyle) is a former Janesville (Wisc.) YMCA teammate of Minnesota's Lisa Camillo (DELAVAN, WI).

Wisconsin: Ranked sixth in the pre-season poll, the Badgers hold the series edge 6-3 in dual meets against the Gopher's. Wisconsin's Amy Justesen could be a threat in either of the breaststrokes, the butterfly and or the individual medley. The meet will be like "old home week" for former Gopher swimmer Sue Troia (MADISON, WI). A sophomore, Troia is swimming for the Badgers after transferring to Wisconsin after the last school year. Two other Wisconsin swimmers, Jennifer Gullickson and Rochelle Smith, were also teammates of the Gopher's Camillo at the Janesville 'Y'.

Ohio State: The pre-season fourth ranked Gophers have never beaten the Buckeyes in the four times the two have met in dual meets, but Minnesota coach Jean Freeman thinks OSU is vulnerable this early in the season. "The Buckeyes, ranked number one last year (and this year) in the Big Ten, were beaten last year in a dual meet by Purdue (ranked at bottom) early in the season - I think we can beat them, although the record doesn't show it," Freeman says. Two of Ohio State's strong swimmers are Janelle Bosse (distance free, 200 fly and 400 I.M.) and Betsy Skowran (100 and 200 backstrokes).

THE GOPHERS-- Freeman is looking towards eight swimmers to compete in the five freestyle events, including Big Ten Champions senior Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN), junior Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN) and sophomore Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN). Possible swimmers in the 200 breaststroke are tri-captain Roell, junior Diane Almstrom (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) and Tami Grewenow (BURNSVILLE, MN). Likely competitors in the 200 backstroke are Nancy Swanum (BURNSVILLE, MN) and Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD).

THE MIDWEST RELAYS-- On Saturday at 8:30 a.m., the Badgers will host the Midwest Relays -- the Gophers won the meet at Minnesota. "We are a strong relay team, and the relays will show just how much depth we have as a team this year," Freeman says. The same four women's teams will competing in the co-ed meet.

(VOLLEYBALL FACES FINAL THREE CONFERENCE FOES/SEEKS AT-LARGE BERTH)

The Gopher women's volleyball team remained in contention for an NCAA at-large berth with a weekend sweep over Michigan State and Michigan, but also improved their hopes of an NCAA berth as Iowa was upset by Michigan State. The Gophers, 19-10 overall and 11-4 in the Big Ten, could now tie for second in the league with Iowa if they defeat Indiana and Ohio State on the road this weekend, and then defeat the Hawkeyes on their home court Tuesday, Nov. 25 in the final match of the Big Ten and regular season.

Illinois will clinch at least a share of the Big Ten title if they defeat Purdue this Wednesday, but the Illini winning the title appears to be a mere formality as they are undefeated at 15-0 in the league and 29-2 overall. Iowa is in second place at 12-3 and 25-6 overall. The Hawkeyes defeated the Gophers 15-11, 15-8, 12-15, 19-17 in Minnesota's first home match and the Big Ten season opening match for both teams Sept. 24. However, Minnesota is a much improved team at this point in the season.

"The key to our success has been our aggressive style of play," says Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "We are more comfortable on the court and playing with a lot more desire. The end is in sight, and we want to be in the race at the end. Our confidence is the other factor -- we have come through some tight situations."

A LOOK AT INDIANA AND OHIO STATE -- Prior to the showdown in Iowa City, the Gophers and Hawkeyes will travel to Indiana and Ohio State this weekend. That road trip has always proven a tough test for the Gophers.

THE HOOSIERS are tied for fifth in the league at 6-8 and are 14-12 overall. After a mid-season slump, when they lost six straight conference matches, the Hoosiers have defeated Michigan and Ohio State. Sophomore Liz Armbrustmacher leads the team with 330 kills, a .253 pct. and 3.55 per game average while freshman Julie Goedde had 267 kills for a 2.84 per game average and a .191 kill pct. Junior setter Karen Dunham has a 9.47 per game assist average and 123 kills for a 1.31 per game average.

INDIANA FIRST MEETING -- The Gophers won at home, Oct. 25 -- 15-13, 15-4, 15-13. Armbrustmacher and Goedde both had 10 kills for IU, and Pam Miller had 14 kills and Andrea Gonzalez 13 for the Gophers. **SERIES** -- Minnesota leads 9-3 and has won the last three meetings.

BUCKEYE BRIEFS -- Ohio State has lost four straight Big Ten matches and dropped from third to fourth place since a season ending injury to senior Kristi Neuman of Fridley, Minn. at the very end of the match against Minnesota Oct. 24. The Buckeyes' are fourth in the league at 8-6 and 17-10 overall. Freshman Lisa Vitali leads the team with 280 kills, for 3.0 per game with a .194 pct.; senior Victorea Wright has 231 kills, 2.56 per game and a .200 pct.; and junior Sherri Rinker has 144 kills, 1.58 per game, and a .309 kill pct. Junior Shelly Ulmer has replaced Neuman in the lineup and has a .220 kill pct. and 1.86 per game average.

FIRST MEETING -- Ohio State won at Williams Arena Oct. 24 -- 13-15, 15-9, 15-3, 15-9. Lafayette, Ind. had 32 assists vs. Michigan with nine digs and a .465 assist percentage against State with 40 assists in 86 attempts.

SWIMMERS GO WEST TO THE GILLETTE UNIVERSITY SWIMMING MEET

The Campbell County School Aquatic Center in Gillette, Wyo., is the site of the Gophers next swimming and diving competition this Friday and Saturday. Joining the Gophers at the Gillette Invitational are Colorado, North Dakota and South Dakota. The Aquatic Center sponsors the meet and helps with expenses as part of their effort to bring top name colleges and universities to compete at the center which opened in January of 1983. The City of Gillette does not have a college or university.

The meet structure is similar to the Big Ten Championship meet, so the Gophers will have a chance to swim every Big Ten event. "This is a good preparatory meet for us - we can swim all of our events," says head coach Jean Freeman. Freeman expects senior tri-captain Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) to qualify for NCAA national competition in the 100 yard breaststroke at this meet. "Sue had a 1:04.3 split at Wisconsin last weekend in the breaststroke portion of the 400 medley relay -- NCAA cuts are 1:05.29. She should be able to make the cut in the 100 breaststroke race without too much difficulty.

GOPHERS SWEEP MULTIPLE DUALS AT WISCONSIN-- Minnesota made a clean sweep at the Wisconsin-sponsored Multiple Duals, defeating Wisconsin 62-51, Ohio State 80-31, and Illinois 60-53. This was the first time the Gopher's had beaten Ohio State in a dual meet, with the Gopher-Buckeye series record standing at 1-4. Minnesota pushed its series record to 2-0 with Illinois and narrowed the Wisconsin series record to 4-6. The Gophers are 3-0 in the Big Ten and overall for the season.

The Gophers were first in the 400 medley relay with a time of 4:00.45, with Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD), Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN), Jenny Benkusky (DUNEDIN, FL) and Shannon Heringer (BEAVERTON, OR) against all three teams. Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN) won the 1000 free in a time of 10:17.04 versus UW, ILL and OSU. In the 200 freestyle, Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MN) defeated OSU with a time of 1:55.27, while Roell beat the Buckeyes in the 50 freestyle with a time of :24.78.

In 3 meter diving, Maureen Lewis (GREEN BAY, WI) beat Ohio State and Illinois with 243.10 points, with Julie Sullivan (WEST ST. PAUL, MN) winning the one meter diving with 218.35 points, beating OSU and Illinois. Benkusky beat the Badgers in the 200 butterfly with a time of 2:12.89, and Volna won the 100 free in a time of :54.21 against OSU and UW.

McClure out swam the Buckeyes in the 200 backstroke with a winning time of 2:13.58, with Schirmers winning the 500 free (5:04.73) against UW and OSU. Roell swamped everyone in the 200 breaststroke with a time of 2:24.95. In the 400 free relay, the Gophers relay of Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN), Volna, Schirmers, and Heringer beat the Buckeyes with a time of 3:38.50.

MINNESOTA SECOND IN MIDWEST RELAYS-- The Gophers were second in the Midwest Relays, hosted by Wisconsin this past weekend. Minnesota scored 66 points, six points off of Illinois' lead of 72. Wisconsin was third with 61, and Ohio State fourth with 33.

HARRIERS CLOSE SEASON WITH NINTH AT DISTRICT IV MEET -- The women's cross country squad finished ninth out of 22 teams Saturday at the NCAA District IV meet in Normal, Ill. The Gophers, despite losing All-American Jody Eder to graduation after last season, improved their showing at both this meet and at the Big Ten meet earlier this month, while sporting the youngest team in the Big Ten.

OVERACHIEVERS "NEVER RAN A BAD RACE" -- Coach Gary Wilson has said that he would rather have a group of overachievers who are willing to work hard than a highly-touted group which lacks dedication. His current squad certainly fits the bill in that respect. For example, their top runner most of the year, Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN/Highland Park), was a walk-on as a freshman. She now holds the 13th fastest-time in Minnesota cross country history, with two years left.

DISTRICT IV SYNOPSIS -- The Gophers were seeded 11th in District IV coming into the meet, but they were able to scramble up a couple more notches than expected. Wilson singled out two runners, junior tri-captain Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN/Mounds View) and freshman Tiffany Church (APPLETON, WI/Appleton) for turning in good performances. Walsh placed 99th at the District IV meet a year ago; she improved to 38th place this year in a time of 18:14. Church had been running number six for the Gophers all year, but she moved up to fifth in this meet, finishing 93rd overall in a time of 19:03.

DONAGHY LEADS GOPHERS -- Sophomore Eileen Donaghy led all Gophers with a 27th place finish in a time of 18:00. Walsh was next, (38th in 18:14), followed by freshman Cara Daniels (ANOKA, MN/Anoka) (54th, 18:21), who had a very fine year after being unable to compete early in the season due to an injury. Freshman Wendy Babcock (IRON MOUNTAIN, MI/Iron Mountain) placed 80th in 18:43; Church was 93rd in 19:03; freshman Cherste Johnson finished 105th in 19:17; and sophomore Patty Burns (MENOMONIE, WI/Menomonie) placed 124th in 19:52. There were 163 runners competing in the meet.

WILSON HONORED -- Minnesota coach Gary Wilson received an unexpected surprise at the meet when it was announced that he had been named District IV representative to the National Committee. Wilson will be involved in policy, rules, scheduling and other administrative matters. "It was quite a surprise to me," he said. "I had no idea this was going to happen. I am honored to be voted to this position by my fellow coaches in the district." Wilson succeeds Indiana coach Carol Stevenson.

(MINNESOTA GYMNASTS HOST JAPANESE ALL-STARS DEC. 6)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The University of Minnesota men's and women's gymnastics teams will open their 1986-87 seasons with a co-ed meet against the Japanese University All-Stars on Saturday, Dec. 6. The meet will be held in Williams Arena on the university campus and will start at 1 p.m.

The 1986 Japan-Minnesota meet is the seventh meeting between the men's squads and the third between the women. The Japanese team includes seven top men and women gymnasts as determined by their finish at Japan's national collegiate championships. They will face two strong Gopher teams that placed second at the Big Ten Championships in 1986.

TICKET INFORMATION -- Tickets for the meet cost five dollars for adults and three dollars for students and are available at the Gopher Ticket Office in the Bierman Building.

GYMNASTICS MEDIA DAY TO BE HELD DEC. 2 -- On Tuesday, Dec. 2, the men's and women's gymnastics media day will be held from 2-4 p.m. in Cooke Hall. Coaches and team members will be available for interviews and practice footage.

1985 JAPANESE ALL-STAR MEET RESULTS -- After weather problems rescheduled the 1985 meet was moved from Dec. 1 to Dec. 6, the Japanese teams swept the team and all-around competition. The Japanese men defeated the Minnesota men 279.45-271.9, and the Japanese women topped the Minnesota women 178.9-176.75. In all-around competition, Koichi Mizushima won the men's title with a 57.35 score, and Eri Tanigawa led the women with a 36.00 mark. For Minnesota, seniors Dave Menke and Wendy Dorsey placed third overall to lead the Gophers.

In previous men's competition, the Japanese teams have never lost to Minnesota, but Brian Meeker has tied for the all-around title twice, in 1981 and 1983. Laurie Kaiser won the women's all-around competition in 1984, but the Japanese team has defeated the Gophers twice in close competition.

THE MINNESOTA WOMEN -- A mix of experienced upperclassmen and talented newcomers give the women's team depth in all events and a legitimate shot to unseat four-time Big Ten champion Ohio State at the conference championship in March. Katalin Deli enters her 14th year as the Gophers' head coach with six returning letterwinners and six newcomers, including two Olympians.

Despite the loss of three-time Big Ten champion Laurie Kaiser, who elected to leave the team before the start of her senior season, Deli is confident that the 1986-87 Gophers will win their first Big Ten team title this year. The prospects for team post-season competition are also brighter this year, as Minnesota has been moved to the NCAA's Central Region where they are a pre-season pick to win the regional title. From 1984-86 the Gophers competed in the powerful Midwest Region along with six-time national champion Utah.

BROWN LEADS RETURNERS -- Minnesota's leading returner is 5-6 senior **Shelley Brown** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/Jefferson). Brown surprised the Big Ten and nation last year by winning the Big Ten all-around title and competing at the NCAA National Championships. Brown set three school records on the vault (9.60), balance beam (9.75) and all-around (37.45) and finished first on the balance beam and seventh all-around at the NCAA Midwest Regional Championship.

Another strong all-around is 5-4 senior **Candace Doell** (SASKATOON, Canada). Doell was slowed by an injury in mid-season and never fully recovered, but she ranks as one of the Gophers' top vaulters and uneven bars workers. **Mary Jo Mastel** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/Jefferson), is the team's top returner in the floor exercise and a leading balance beam and uneven bars performer. A 5-6 junior, Mastel tied the school floor exercise record (9.60) last year and earned All-Big Ten honors in the floor exercise.

The remaining returners, seniors **Marie Bandrowski** (MILFORD, MI) and **Linda Bednar** (MAPLE GROVE, MN) and sophomores **Karen Howe** (TRAVERSE CITY, MI) and **Linda Umhoefer** (CEDARBURG, WI) will add depth at all events. Bandrowski was a regular balance beam and uneven bars competitor last year, while Bednar was a vaulting finalist at the 1986 Big Ten Championship.

TWO OLYMPIANS JOIN GOPHERS -- Five newcomers join the Gophers this year, including **Marie Roethlisberger** (HUNTINGTON BEACH, CA), a member of the 1984 Olympic team and daughter of Minnesota men's gymnastics coach Fred Roethlisberger. Marie Roethlisberger won the 1986 senior national uneven bars title in June and competed at the Goodwill Games in Moscow. She will be joined by a member of the Canadian Olympic team, **Kathleen Finnegan** (WINNEPEG, Canada). Finnegan is a strong all-arounder who created and patented a unique release move on the uneven bars -- the "Finnegan."

Junior **Laura Hicks** (CICERO, IL) has transferred to Minnesota after competing for two years at the University of Illinois, where she was the Illini's 1986 MVP. Two walk-ons, **Julie Newman** (LAKEVILLE, MN) and **Michelle Wise** (EDINA, MN), complete the recruiting class. Newman led her Lakeville High School to the 1986 Minnesota Class AA team title, while Wise was a two-time all-conference selection.

NOTING NORTHERN ILLINOIS -- The Huskies return their top three scorers and seven letterwinners from last year's team, but they are still relatively young. Top returners include 6-0 senior guard Shelly Roberts, who led the Huskies with 13.6 ppg a year ago; 6-2 sophomore center Carol Owens, who was selected to play in the Olympic Sports Festival in Houston last summer after averaging 13.4 ppg and leading the team in rebounding with 8.1 rpg; 5-7 senior guard Val Leitzen, who dished out 83 assists; and 5-8 sophomore guard Gena Stubbs, who averaged 11.6 ppg. Tammy Hinchee, a 6-1 freshman forward, has looked very good in practice this fall, and will be counted on as a starter. 5-7 freshman guard Lisa Foss, is a pure outside shooter who will provide "instant offense."

BASKETBALL OPENS SEASON BY HOSTING FIFTH ANNUAL DIAL CLASSIC--

The season gets under way for the Gophers and for three other women's basketball teams this weekend with the fifth annual University of Minnesota Dial Classic tournament Nov. 28 and 29.

Clemson and Auburn will open the tournament with a first-round game at 1 p.m. Friday, followed by the Gopher-Northern Illinois clash at 3 p.m. The consolation game will be Saturday, Nov. 29 at 1 p.m., followed by the championship at 3 p.m.

Auburn comes into the tournament ranked fourth in the nation, returning 10 of 11 letter winners, including their top scorers and rebounders from last year's 24-6 team that advanced to the NCAA tournament round of 16.

Clemson, Northern Illinois and Minnesota all return most of their top players from a year ago, and all hope to get a shot at Auburn in this tournament.

The Gophers are led by co-captains Molly Tadich, a 6-2 senior forward from Bloomington, Minn. who is a two-time All-Big Ten second-team selection, and Cindy Phillips, a 5-10 senior guard from East Lansing, Mich., an exciting player who quarterbacks the Gopher offense.

A LOOK AT KANSAS STATE / KANSAS GAMES-- The Gophers will be on the move immediately after the Dial Classic for road games against Big Eight powers Kansas and Kansas State. The first stop will be Monday, Dec. 1 in Manhattan, where Kansas State will provide the opposition in a 7:30 p.m. game. On Tuesday, Dec. 2, Minnesota will be in Lawrence for a 5 p.m game with Kansas.

NOTING KANSAS STATE-- The Lady Cats return three starters from last year's team, along with three other experienced veterans. However, they are relatively young, with six freshmen on their 12-player roster. Leading the way for Kansas State is **Carlisa Thomas** (11.5 ppg; 8.2 rpg), the team's leading rebounder the last two years. However, Thomas's status is questionable due to an inflamed disc in her back. Guard **Susan Green** averaged 10.6 ppg last year, and center **Sue Leiding** (9.2 ppg; 5.2 rpg) has worked hard during the off-season to add strength. **Theza Fitzpatrick** (6.4 ppg) will run the Kansas State offense. Top newcomers include **Amy Davidson**, a 5-9 forward/guard from St. Louis Park, Minn., **Janet Madsen**, a 5-9 forward/guard from Elk River, Minn., and **Rita Matteucci**, a 5-11 forward.

SWIMMERS TAKE FOUR-WEEK BREAK BEFORE NEXT MEET

Honolulu, Hawaii will be the site of the next swim meet (Dec. 20) for the Gopher women's swimming and diving team as they take a four-week break from competition. The meet at Honolulu is one of two meets the team will participate in during their winter training trip to the islands.

GOPHERS WIN BY 430 POINTS AT THE GILLETTE INVITATIONAL

The women's swimming and diving team virtually cleaned house as they won 18 of the 20 events at the Gillette Invitational at the Campbell County Aquatic Center, Gillette, Wyo. Minnesota won with 1,104 points, with North Dakota second (674 points), Colorado third (365 points) and South Dakota fourth (240 points). The Gophers led by 91 points after the first of three sessions and then stretched the winning margin to 430 points at the conclusion of the meet.

ROELL MAKES NCAA CUTS -- Senior tri-captain Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) qualified for the NCAA National Championships in the 100 breaststroke by 1/100ths of a second with an altitude conversion time of 1:05.28. Before the conversion, her winning time was 1:05.38. Roell also won the 200 breaststroke (2:28.50), and was on the winning 200 medley relay team (1:50.40). Nancy Swanum (BURNSVILLE, MN), Shannon Heringer (BEAVERTON, OR) and Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN) shared in the 200 medley relay victory.

Swanum was one of the Gophers big winners at the invitational, winning three individual events - she won the 200 individual medley (2:15.02), the 100 (1:02.47) and 200 backstroke (2:14.38) events. Another four event winner for Minnesota was Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN), who won the 500 freestyle (5:06.09), the 400 individual medley (4:51.84), the 200 free (1:58.83), and the 1650 free (17:27.82). Schirmers was also on the winning 800 freestyle relay team (8:03.92) with Heringer, Tara Rehder (HASTINGS, MN), and Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MN).

MORE WINNING GOPHERS -- Volna also won the 100 free (:54.58), the 100 butterfly (1:00.46), was second in the 200 free (1:59.34), and was on the winning 400 free relay team (3:43.87) with Ruth Gunard, Mary Louise Brix (ST. CLOUD, MN) and Kelly Gallagher (MINNETONKA, MN). The team of Rehder, Tami Grewenow (BURNSVILLE, MN), Heringer and Ruth Gunard won the 400 medley relay (4:11.37). Jennifer Benkusky (DUNEDIN, FL) won the 200 butterfly with a time of 2:13.28.

DIVERS QUALIFY FOR ZONES -- Two Gopher divers qualified for NCAA Zone Diving competition in both one and three meter diving at the invitational. Jennifer Carpenter (GRAND RAPIDS, MN) won the one meter diving with 417.65 points and the three meter diving with 443.45 points to make the cuts. Sara Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MN) made the cuts by scoring 393.90 points in one meter diving and 411.70 points in the three meter event. She was second in both events.

VOLLEYBALL TEAM MOVES INTO SECOND PLACE TIE -- The volleyball team split its weekend road matches with a 15-5, 6-15, 7-15, 9-15 loss to Indiana last Friday, but the Gophers rebounded and defeated Ohio State 15-4, 15-4, 11-15, 15-5 Saturday for the first time since 1982. Minnesota moves into a second place tie with Iowa in the Big Ten with a 12-5 conference and 20-11 overall record. As Iowa dropped both of their weekend matches, the Minnesota-Iowa match Tuesday in Iowa City is for second place and a possible post-season at-large bid.

The Gophers hit .349 as a team against Ohio State with 64 kills, 12 errors, in 149 attempts. Senior captain Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) led the Gophers with 19 kills and only one error in 34 attempts for a .529 kill pct. Freshman Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, KY) also hit over .500 with 8 kills and zero errors in 15 attempts (.533). In the Gophers' loss to Indiana, sophomore Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, Argentina) led the team with 12 kills and a career-best 23 digs.

GYMNASTICS TEAM INJURY REPORT -- With less than two weeks before the start of the season, Gopher gymnasts are battling assorted injuries, but they should be ready for the Dec. 6 Japanese All-Stars co-ed meet. According to assistant athletic trainer Karen Swanson, seniors Marie Bandrowski (MILFORD, MI) and Linda Bednar (MAPLE GROVE, MN) and freshman Michelle Wise (EDINA, MN) are healthy and will be ready for the meet. Senior Shelley Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) sprained her thumb last week, but should be at full strength by next week.

Freshman Marie Roethlisberger (HUNTINGTON BEACH, CA) is improving after several pre-season setbacks. Senior Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) is recovering from knee surgery, and will at least compete on the uneven bars at the Japanese meet. Two newcomers, freshman Kathleen Finnegan (WINNEPEG, Canada) and junior transfer Laura Hicks (CICERO, IL), are training all-around, but Finnegan has a bone chip in her ankle and Hicks has an undiagnosed elbow problem. For now, freshman Julie Newman (LAKEVILLE, MN) is the only gymnast out indefinitely with a stress fracture.

GYMNASTICS TEAM OPENS SEASON BY HOSTING JAPANESE ALL-STARS --

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team opens their 1986-87 season with an exhibition co-ed meet against the Japanese University All-Stars on Saturday, Dec. 6, at 1 p.m. in Williams Arena. The 1986 Japan-Minnesota meet is the seventh meeting between the men's squads and the third between the women. The Japanese men's team is the nation's top seven gymnasts as determined by their finish at Japan's national collegiate championships. The women's team is the Tsukuba University women's gymnastics team, the 1986 Japanese national championship team. Both Minnesota teams placed second at their 1986 Big Ten championships and are looking to win conference titles in 1987.

GOPHER WOMEN'S PREVIEW -- A mix of experienced upperclassmen and talented newcomers give the 1986-87 team depth in all events and a legitimate shot to unseat four-time Big Ten champion Ohio State at the conference championship in March. Head coach Kataljn Deli enters her 14th season as head coach with the tradition of a first-class national contender with a history of successes at the state, conference and regional levels.

The Big Ten Conference ranks among the nation's elite, and Minnesota gymnastics teams have consistently ranked among the best in the conference. Gopher teams have finished second at the league championship three times in the past four years, and they came within .45 of winning the 1986 title.

The prospects for team post-season competition are also brighter this year, as Minnesota has been moved to the NCAA's Central Region, where they are a pre-season pick to win the regional title. Gopher teams also fare well nationally -- they finished the 1985-86 season ranked 20th in the country and were placed as high as 15th during the year.

Minnesota's leading returner is 5-6 senior Shelley Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN). Brown surprised the Big Ten and nation last year by winning the Big Ten all-around title and competing at the NCAA National Championships. Brown set school records on the vault (9.60), balance beam (9.75) and all-around (37.45) and finished first on the balance beam and seventh all-around at the NCAA Midwest Regional Championship. She is joined by five returners, including All-Big Ten selection Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN) and all-arounder Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Canada), a top uneven bars worker.

Five newcomers join the Gophers this year, including Marie Roethlisberger (HUNTINGTON BEACH, CA), a member of the 1984 Olympic team and daughter of Minnesota men's gymnastics coach Fred Roethlisberger. Marie Roethlisberger won the 1986 senior national uneven bars title in June and competed at the Goodwill Games in Moscow. She will be joined by a member of the 1984 Canadian Olympic team, Kathleen Finnegan (WINNEPEG, Canada), a strong all-rounder who created and patented a unique release move on the uneven bars -- the "Finnegan."

ASSISTANT COACH GABOR DELI SAYS -- "Everyone has been training very hard, and the injuries are getting better. This is a fun meet, and we'd like to win, but the first meet is not the best all the time."

Deli lists possible all-rounders as Brown, Roethlisberger, Finnegan, senior Marie Bandrowski (MILFORD, MI) and Illini transfer Laura Hicks. In addition, senior Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Canada), who is recovering from pre-season knee surgery, will compete on the uneven bars, and senior Linda Bednar (MAPLE GROVE, MN) will compete on her specialties, the vault and floor exercise.

MINNESOTA MEN'S PREVIEW -- Senior captain Collin Godkin (WEST ALLIS, WI), the 1985 Big Ten all-around runnerup and two-time pommel horse All-American Steve Braun (BLOOMINGTON, MN) lead the Gopher gymnasts into the 1986-87 season. Head coach Fred Roethlisberger, in his 15th season, expects big things from his two senior leaders and also help from his returning squad member and freshmen recruits.

The Gophers were 10-2 last season in dual meets and placed second at the 1986 Big Ten Championship, and their 272.45 statistical average earned them 11th place in the final NCAA stats. Under Roethlisberger, the Gophers have won seven of the last twelve Big Ten titles and the veteran coach has a 110-41 career dual meet record at Minnesota.

In addition to Godkin and Braun, key returners are senior Dale Langefels (EDINA, MN) and sophomore Mike McCabe (DES PLAINES, IL). Langefels placed third in the floor exercise at the Big Ten Championship last year, and McCabe is back at full strength after sitting the 1985-86 season due to a shoulder injury.

Four highly-sought freshman compile Roethlisberger's recruiting class. Mike Miller (ALOHA, OR), Mark McKiernan (DARIEN, CT), Dan Zimpfer (KENT, OH) and Mike Graham (GREEN BAY, WI) all ranked among the top 15 high school gymnasts in the nation last year, and Roethlisberger predicts that they will have an immediate impact in the Big Ten.

VOLLEYBALL TEAM FINISHES SECOND IN BIG TEN/MISSES NCAA BID -- Minnesota completed its Big Ten season at Iowa on November 25, where they clinched second place in the Big Ten with an 8-15, 15-10, 15-11, 16-14 win. The Gophers' 13-5 Big Ten and 21-11 overall records were not enough, though, to give the team an NCAA at-large berth, ending head coach Stephanie Schleuder's most successful volleyball season since coming to Minnesota in 1982. No team from the NCAA Mideast Region received an at-large bid to the NCAA tourney, despite the fact that 17 at-large bids were handed out and the tournament was expanded to 32 teams. This was the first year the Mideast Region did not receive at least one at-large berth.

Against Iowa, the Gophers dropped the first game but came from behind to win the second and never trailed in the third game. The Hawkeyes were ready for a comeback in game four, leading 14-10, when freshman Sharon Oesterling (FRANKFORT, IN) served the Gophers to the win. Sophomore Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, Argentina) had two kills and freshman Lori Miller (WORTH, IL) added a block solo during the rally, and a service ace by Oesterling clinched the point, game and match for the Gophers.

GOPHER NOTES -- Senior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) had 24 kills and a .408 kill pct (14-4-49) to lead the team. She added a career-best 19 digs, two block solos and two service aces. Miller had 517 kills this season, only five short of the Minnesota single-season record of 522 set by Gonzalez in 1985. Miller also re-set Gonzalez's single-season attack attempts record of 1,153 with 1,162 this year.

Oesterling had another good match with 57 assists, second-best this year. She also set new career bests with 21 digs, 5 block assists and 4 service aces, including two game-winners. Gonzalez had 19 kills and 13 digs to bring the new single-season digs record to 322. Gonzalez broke senior Karyn Daline's (MINNEAPOLIS/Southwest) 293 record with a career-best 23 digs against Indiana on Nov. 21.

NOTING ILLINOIS STATE -- The Redbirds are 1-1 after placing second at the Kentucky Lady Kat Invitational where both Susan Wellman and Ellen McGrew were named to the All-Tourney team. Illinois State is playing without its top returning conference scorer and rebounder of a year ago, 5-10 sophomore forward Char Govan, who is out with a broken foot. However, 6-0 senior center Juli Stiles is the team's leading returning scorer overall; she averaged 10.3 points per game. NOTING SOUTH DAKOTA -- South Dakota, a NCAA Division II school, is 3-1 as of December 1, with games at Creighton on Dec. 2 and at Hamline Dec. 5 before facing the Gophers. The Coyotes, like Illinois State, have suffered early-season injuries to key performers. Diane Lutz, a 6-0 junior guard who dished out 117 assists last season, is out after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery a month ago. Kari Myli, a 5-10 sophomore forward who averaged 8.1 points per game last season, is out with a stress fracture in her foot.

AUBURN "RUNS AWAY" WITH DIAL CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP-- The fourth-ranked Auburn University Tigers used full-court pressure and a run 'n gun offense in defeating Minnesota 101-46 in the Gophers home fifth annual Dial Classic Championship last weekend. Clemson defeated Northern Illinois 72-71 in the consolation championship. In the first round Minnesota defeated Northern Illinois 87-71 while Auburn downed Clemson 91-50.

Auburn placed three players on the All-Tournament team, including Dial Classic MVP Vickie Orr, a 6-3 sophomore center who scored 36 points and grabbed 18 rebounds in the tourney. Joining her were teammates Mae Ola Bolton and senior point guard Helene Baroody. Freshman guard Lisa Foss of Northern Illinois and Gopher senior Molly Tadich rounded out the tourney team.

The 55 point loss to Auburn represented the second largest margin of defeat in Minnesota history, next to the record of 56 in a 58-114 loss to Texas on 12/14/78. The 101 points also represented a new women's Williams Arena record for most points scored by an opponent since 1981-82 when the women first moved over to Williams Arena.

GOPHER INDIVIDUALS -- Senior 6-2 forward Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON) led all tourney scorers with 42 points and also collected 15 rebounds. Tadich scored 27 points and tied her career high with six assists in the Gophers opening round win over Northern Illinois, and then led Minnesota with 15 points against Auburn. Junior 6-0 forward Susie Pizam (ST. PAUL/DERHAM HALL) had a career best of 20 points against Northern Illinois in a career high 31 minutes and also led the Gophers with 13 rebounds in that game.

Other Gophers in double figures against Northern Illinois included junior 6-4 center Diane Kinney (BURNSVILLE) with 12 points and 10 rebounds, and 5-10 senior guard Cindy Phillips (E. LANSING, MI) with 12 points. Junior 5-10 guard Debbie Hilmerson (LITTLE FALLS, MN) added a career high 10 assists against Northern Illinois. A bright spot for Coach Ellen Mosher Hanson in the championship loss was freshman Juanita Boehland (SHOREVIEW, MN) came off the bench and scored 10 points in just 16 minutes.

(VOLLEYBALL TEAM FINISHES SEASON SECOND IN BIG TEN) ---

(Minneapolis, Minn.) -- The University of Minnesota volleyball team ended the year second in the Big Ten with a 13-5 record, their best Big Ten finish since league play began in 1982. The Gophers also posted a 21-11 overall record, giving head coach Stephanie Schleuder her most successful season at Minnesota since joining the program in 1982.

Although the team was ranked sixth in the Mideast Region final poll, they did not earn an at-large bid to the NCAA Mideast Region Tournament, but the season ended on a high note with a 3-1 win over Iowa on Nov. 25. This win gave the Gophers, who had trailed the Hawkeyes throughout the Big Ten season, sole possession of second place and dropped Iowa to 12-6 and third in the Big Ten.

No team from the NCAA Mideast Region received an at-large bid to the NCAA tourney, despite the fact that 17 at-large bids were handed out nationally and the tournament field was expanded to 32 teams. This was the first year the Mideast Region did not receive at least one at-large berth.

MILLER, GONZALEZ EARN ALL-BIG TEN HONORS -- Senior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) and sophomore Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, Argentina) were named to the All-Big Ten first team. Miller was also honored as the final Big Ten Player of the Week for the season, the first time in her career she has been named Player of the Week. In addition, she came in third in the voting for Player of the Year, behind Illinois hitter Mary Eggers and setter Disa Johnson.

Miller and Gonzalez finished the Big Ten season tied for the lead in kills per game, with identical 4.22 averages. The team's .209 kill pct. and 14.8 kills per game average ranked third among Big Ten teams, as did Minnesota's 13.0 assists per game average.

SEASON RECAP -- Seven letterwinners and four recruits gave the team depth at all positions, but early-season lineup changes hurt the team's pre-season progress. The season opened in Hawaii with seven matches, with Schleuder using upperclassmen in the lineup. After defeating Chaminade University and Hawaii Pacific, the team dropped matches to BYU-Hawaii and Hawaii-Honolulu, a top-ranked Division I school, but they rebounded to defeat Hawaii-Hilo twice. Next the team, now starting three freshmen, defeated Weber State and competed at the Brigham Young Invitational in Provo, UT. They finished 11th, which later hurt the Gophers' chances for at-large bid to the NCAA tournament.

The Big Ten season opened with a four-game loss to Iowa in Williams Arena, but after that the Gophers revamped their lineup and game plan and won 10 of their next 12 matches. Included in that stretch was a five-game win over defending conference champion Purdue -- Minnesota's first over the Boilermakers since 1978.

The Gophers continued to improve down the stretch, including road wins at Purdue and Ohio State and a home win over Northwestern. The team swept home-and-away series with Purdue and Northwestern for the first time ever, and their four-game win over Ohio State was the first Minnesota win in seven meetings dating back to 1982. Minnesota's Ohio State victory, paired with Iowa's losses at Indiana and Ohio State, tied the teams for second in the conference before their season-ending match.

The team's improved defensive play resulted in a new single-season record of 1,753 digs. The old record of 1,552 was set in 1985. A new fewest blocking errors record of 59 was also set; the old record of 79 was set last year.

SCHLEUDER PLEASED WITH WINNING RESULTS -- "I was really pleased with the second half of our season. We pulled together as a team," said head coach Schlueder. "The most encouraging part of the season was how we came through against strong teams in critical situations."

Schlueder cited road wins over Purdue, Ohio State and Iowa as key victories late in the season. She was also pleased with the team's home win over Northwestern, because it was the first televised volleyball match ever at Minnesota.

Schlueder said that the team matured during the year: "As the season went on there was a positive development in their mental attitudes and toughness. Our freshmen came through and played very well, and I was really pleased with the play of our seniors. It was a team effort the entire season."

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS/RECORDS -- Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) shattered career hitting and blocking records and led the team in most major statistical categories all season. She ended the year with 517 kills, just five short of the Minnesota single-season record, and she finished her career as Minnesota's all-time leading hitter with 1,519 kills. After starting the season with 1,002 kills, Miller broke Jill Halsted's career record of 1,350 against Ohio State on Oct. 24.

A 5-11 middle hitter, Miller's career hitting percentage of .268 ranks third-best in Minnesota history, and she leads all players with 3,661 career attack attempts. The Big Ten's leading blocker and second-team all-conference pick in 1985, Miller is the Gophers' leading blocker with 398 block assists and 536 total blocks. In addition, Miller finished her stellar career with 138 block solos and 137 service aces, both third on the all-time lists.

During the season, Miller led the Gophers with a .275 kill pct., and her 1,211 attack attempts set a new single-season record. Miller's 46 block solos and 87 block assists were tops on the team, as were her 1.09 blocks per game and 4.24 kills per game averages.

GONZALEZ SETS NEW SEASON DIGS MARK -- Sophomore Andrea Gonzalez followed her spectacular rookie year with a solid offensive performance and improved defensive play. A 5-11 outside hitter, Gonzalez broke the Minnesota season digs record of 293 with a career-high 23 digs against Indiana Nov. 21. She finished the year with 322 digs, 2.71 per game. A middle hitter and All-Big Ten first team selection in 1985, Gonzalez moved to outside hitter and collected 475 kills, second on the team, to bring her career total to 997 in only two years of play. Gonzalez averaged 3.99 kills per game and had the team's top service ace average with 48 aces for .40 per game.

FRESHMAN OESTERLING EARNS STARTING SETTER POSITION -- Five-nine setter Sharon Oesterling (FRANKFORT, IN) distinguished herself as a blue-chip player early in the season. She earned the starting spot during the Hawaii pre-season trip and later re-set the Minnesota single-match assists record with 68 assists against Montana. Oesterling averaged over 10 assists per game throughout the Big Ten season and ranked fourth among Big Ten setters. Oesterling was also the only Big Ten player to consistently use a jump serve during the season, and she finished the year with 35 service aces, one of which clinched Minnesota's win over Iowa.

DALINE GOES OVER 1,000 KILL MARK -- Senior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/Southwest) became only the fifth Gopher to pass the 1,000 kills mark, and she finished her career fourth on the all-time list with 1,073 kills. A 5-9 outside hitter, Daline moved to right-side hitter this year, and continued her steady and consistent defensive play. She finishes her career as the top server in Gopher history with only 58 service errors in over 1,500 attempts. An accurate hitter, Daline also compiled the second-fewest hitting errors with 368 errors in 3,196 attempts, and her .221 career kill pct. ranks fourth on the all-time list.

BINDER, COLLINGS CONCLUDE CAREERS -- Five-seven hitter Julie Binder (HANOVER PARK, IL) and 5-9 setter Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) also finished their careers. Binder continued her comeback from 1984 reconstructive knee surgery and earned a starting hitting position during the Hawaii trip, but a shoulder injury during the BYU Invitational limited her front-row play. Binder continued to see action as a defensive player, and she was a top server and passer throughout the season.

Collings finished her career with 46 block solos and 166 block assists, ranking her among the top Minnesota blockers. The starting setter for the past two years, Schleuder used Collings' setting abilities in several clutch situations during the season. In addition, Collings played in the front-row in several matches in order to assist with blocking.

FRESHMAN MAKE INSTANT IMPACT -- All of the Gopher freshmen were immediate influences on the team's successes, and three of them: Oesterling, Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, KY), and Karen Staab (PALATINE, IL) were starters throughout the Big Ten season. Lori Miller (WORTH, IL) also saw considerable action by splitting front and back-court play with Staab.

Miller, like her sister Pam, was a strong blocker and she finished the year second on the team with 37 block solos and 51 block assists. She also tied the Williams Arena match record of five block solos against Michigan State on Nov. 15. Miller hit .239 during the Big Ten season, the team's second-best kill pct. during the conference season, and she hit .212 with 135 kills on the year.

Staab was a top-twenty prep recruit, but a summer leg injury slowed her progress. She saw extensive back-court play and had 22 service aces, including six at Northwestern on Oct. 3. Schaefer showed steady improvement throughout the year and compiled 187 kills for a 2.23 average per game, both fourth on the team.

RESERVES ALSO CONTRIBUTE -- Junior Rochele Goetz (WACONIA, MN) was off to her best start during the pre-season, but a nagging shoulder injury slowed her play later in the year. A 5-9 hitter, Goetz will undergo surgery later this month. Another junior, 5-4 setter Missy Larson (GLEN ELLYN, IL) switched roles and played primarily as a defensive specialist. Sophomores Shaleen Hipschen (HOWELL, MI) and Dawn Rasmussen (BURNSVILLE, MN) saw limited action and showed improvement.

HOOPSTERS IN SUNSHINE STATE FOR THREE GAMES --

The Gopher women's basketball team will hope to improve their overall record (3-3) as they travel to Florida for three games in Miami. Minnesota will meet South Carolina State on Dec. 19 at FIU, and Florida International on Dec. 20 with both games starting at 6:30 p.m. CST. On Dec. 22, the Gophers will face Miami at 4:15 p.m. CST. Following the Florida trip, Minnesota will host Colorado at Williams Arena on Dec. 30 with a 2 p.m. game.

HANSON HOPES FOR ROAD WIN -- Head Coach Ellen Hanson has seen some bright spots from her squad, but acknowledges that the Gophers would like to break their losing streak on the road in Florida. "It is important that we play well on the road. This is our last chance to play non-conference road games, and we open the Big Ten season with two road weekends," says Hanson. "We need three wins, but two of the three would be really good. We look at every game as a competitive game, and we will have to play well to win."

Hanson has been pleased by the amount of playing time she has been able to give the non-starters this year. "Overall, we have been giving our freshmen playing time, and if we are going to be successful over the long haul, it will take more than our starting five."

GOPHERS EVEN RECORD WITH PAIR OF WINS -- The Gophers had a busy week, playing four games in six days. They opened the week Dec. 1 with a 79-68 loss at Kansas State before falling the next day at Kansas by a score of 87-74. The two losses extended the Gophers road losing streak to 15 games, dating back to the last road game of the 1984-85 season. The Gophers found a return to Williams Arena to their liking, however, beating Illinois State 72-67 Friday, Dec. 5 and rolling to a 80-61 victory over South Dakota on Saturday. "Both the Kansas and Auburn games will help us this year," says Hanson. "Both teams play a pressure type defense and we are gaining confidence in being able to break a press."

She also tied a career high with five steals and grabbed five rebounds before fouling out with just under a minute to go...the next night, she suffered a hamstring pull early on and had to leave, but she recovered enough to start both home games. She is expected to be back at full strength for the Florida trip.

KINNEY TOO MUCH FOR REDBIRDS -- At 6-4, junior center **Diane Kinney** (BURNSVILLE, MN/Burnsville) is tough to stop inside the paint, as Illinois State found out Friday night. Kinney had the best game of her career, scoring 25 points and grabbing 17 rebounds, both career highs. Eight of her rebounds came on the offensive end, and she converted 10 of 17 shots from the field and five of seven from the line.

GUARDS HILMERSON/HALL SPARK TEAM -- Junior 5-10 **Debbie Hilmerson** (LITTLE FALLS, MN/Little Falls) contributed three of her team-high six assists in the final five minutes of the Illinois State win, after the Redbirds had taken a three point lead...Hilmerson had a career high 13 points against Kansas on 5 of 6 shooting from the floor and 3 of 4 from the line, besting her previous career high of nine against Colorado in 1985...she had four steals in both road games and she dished out six assists against Kansas State.

Five-foot-nine freshman guard **Jennifer Hall** (BURNSVILLE, MN/Burnsville) was a big factor in the Illinois State win...she stole the ball and drove the length of the court for a layup with 4:22 remaining to put Minnesota ahead for good 62-61...Hall also hit three of six shots and dished out three assists in 18 minutes in that game...against Kansas, she had eight rebounds in just 24 minutes, and she scored eight points and grabbed five rebounds against Kansas State in just 17 minutes...Hall made all four of her free throws against South Dakota, and has missed only once in seven tries this year.

Vernon) is shooting the ball well from the outside...Hufford hit 3 of 5 shots from the outside in only nine minutes against South Dakota to tie her career high of six points set earlier this year against Northern Illinois...she is shooting at a .529 clip (9-17) for the season...Juanita Boehland (SHOREVIEW, MN/Minnehaha Academy), a 6-3 freshman forward, leads the team with a .556 mark (10-18).

Six-foot-four freshman center Sue Renner (GRAND RAPIDS, MN/Grand Rapids) saw her first extended action of the season against South Dakota, playing 10 minutes...5-7 freshman guard Jodi Olson (BELLEVUE, WA/Interlake) grabbed three rebounds in only five minutes against South Dakota and had two assists in three minutes against Illinois State.

SWIMMERS 18TH IN THE NATION IN LATEST NCAA RANKINGS

The women's swimming and diving team is among the top twenty teams in the nation after the second rankings of the season. The Gophers are 18th in the rankings and are the highest ranked Big Ten team. Michigan, at 19th, is the only other Big Ten team in the top twenty.

"I'm extremely pleased with the rankings," head swimming coach Jean Freeman says. "This is the first time we've been ranked after the season has started." The Gopher's were 21st at the 1986 NCAA championships after starting the year being ranked 13th in the pre-season poll.

TRAINING TRIP TAKES SWIMMERS TO HAWAII, DIVERS TO BOCA RATON -- Gopher swimmers and divers will be heading different directions for their winter training trips. Coach Freeman is taking the swimmers to the University of Hawaii at Honolulu for two weeks of intensive training, starting Dec. 16. While in Hawaii, the Gophers will have a meet with Hawaii on Dec. 20. The two teams have competed once before with Minnesota winning by six points during the 1982-83 season.

The Mission Bay Training Center at Boca Raton, Fla., which opened in June of this year, is the site of the divers winter training session from Dec. 13-23. "All we will have on our minds is diving, with no school work to worry about," says Chris Gentz, head diving coach. "We'll be training with the country's best divers - it will all be very intensive."

JAPANESE ALL-STARS EDGE GYMNASTS -- For the third consecutive year, the Minnesota gymnastics team opened the season with an exhibition meet against the Japanese University All-Stars. The Japanese team defeated the Gophers 179.15-175.70. The team is now off until their regular-season opener at the Nebraska Invitational on January 16.

The meet, a co-ed competition with the Minnesota men's team, will be televised by KITN-29 on Saturday, Dec. 13 from 3:30-5 p.m. Former Gopher All-American Robin Huebner will provide commentary with Dick Bremer announcing.

Kyoko Ikejiri of the Japanese team won the all-around with a 37.05 score. She has won the all-around three times during the Japanese team's United States tour. Ikejiri tied for first on the vault (9.25) and balance beam (9.35) and placed second in the floor exercise (9.35) and third on the uneven bars (9.10).

BROWN, ROETHLISBERGER LEAD GOPHERS -- Senior Shelley Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) tied for first in two events, the vault (9.25) and balance beam (9.35), and finished fourth on the floor exercise (4.15). The defending Big Ten all-around champion, Brown placed fourth all-around with a 36.35 score.

Freshman Marie Roethlisberger (HUNTINGTON BEACH, CA) had her collegiate debut, and she placed first on the uneven bars with a 9.45 mark and third all-around with a 36.50 score. She also scored 9.00 on the balance beam and floor exercise. Roethlisberger is the daughter of Minnesota men's gymnastics coach Fred Roethlisberger and a 1984 Olympian.

GOPHER NOTES -- Senior Linda Bednar (MAPLE GROVE, MN) placed fourth on the vault with a 9.15 score, but fell during her first tumbling pass in the floor exercise. She is out indefinitely with an ankle injury...senior Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) scored 9.00 on the uneven bars, the Gophers' second-highest bars score of the meet. (BASKETBALL OPENS BIG TEN SCHEDULE ON THE ROAD)

After hosting Colorado on Tuesday, Dec. 30, the Gopher women's basketball team will open the double round-robin Big Ten schedule on the road this weekend at Northwestern on Friday night and at Wisconsin on Sunday. The following weekend the Gophers will be at Iowa (Jan. 9) with the first home Big Ten weekend Jan. 16 and 18. Minnesota will be hoping to improve upon last year's 4-14 Big Ten record and ninth place finish, but Coach Ellen Hanson says that task will not be an easy one.

"As far as I can see, we are going to have to play extremely well every game because all the Big Ten team's are strongly competitive. There are three teams ranked in the top twenty and that doesn't even reflect the strength of the other seven teams," says Hanson. Defending Big Ten champion Ohio State, along with last year's second place Iowa Hawkeyes and the third place Fighting Illini are the top pre-Big Ten favored teams again this year.

GOPHERS 1-2 IN FLORIDA -- The Minnesota basketball team won their first road game since the 1984-85 season, although it was at a neutral site against South Carolina State, 73-60 at Miami. Then, Minnesota lost to host Florida International University 69-87 and Miami 64-77. Turnovers represented a problem in both games as Minnesota coughed the ball up a season high 40 times against the Hurricanes. "It is critical that we hang onto the ball for us to have any success at all," says Coach Hanson. "We have to get the ball down the court so we have a chance to shoot. When we stay with our strengths, we look like a pretty good team."

WILDCAT QUICK FACTS -- Northwestern returns all five starters and 10 letterwinners overall from last year's team which was 6-12 in the Big Ten, finishing eighth, and 16-12 overall. But, the Wildcat's appear to be ready to challenge for a higher spot this year, after narrowly losing to top-ranked Auburn 56-58 at the Old Dominion tournament last weekend. The two guards, McNamee and Palombo, lead the team in scoring in double figures and McNamee is rated sixth in the nation in assists with a 6.5 per game average. Northwestern is outshooting their opponents .536 to .429 from the field and .726 to .536 from the line, and outscoring them 74.6 to 56.0. **HEAD COACH** -- Don Perrelli, third year at NU, 37-26, 11th year overall, 212-97. **SERIES** -- Northwestern leads 9-5, the two team's split games last year, with both Minnesota and NU winning at home.

BADGER BRIEFS -- Wisconsin begins a new era with first-year coach Mary Ellen Murphy, who was formerly an assistant at Notre Dame and a former Big Ten player at Northwestern. She has her hands full in improving upon last year's tenth place 1-17 Big Ten and 4-24 overall record, with no recruiting class, but she does have nine letter winners and three starters returning. Guard Karen O'Malley started 23 games last year, and forward Lisa Bonnell was the Badgers' leading scorer and rebounder last year and is leading the team in both categories so far this year. **HEAD COACH** -- Mary Ellen Murphy, first year Wisconsin and career. **SERIES** -- Minnesota leads 12-3, both team's won their home game last year.

GOPHER NOTES -- The Gophers will be without the services of their leading scorer and rebounder for both the Colorado game and this weekend's Big Ten games. Coach Ellen Hanson has suspended 6-2 senior forward Molly Tadich from both trips and practices for disciplinary reasons. Tadich is averaging 16.9 ppg and 9.1 rebounds, and had started 49 consecutive games, dating back to midway through the 1984-85 season prior to the suspension. In Miami, Tadich led all scorers with 23 points, converting 11-16 in field goals against South Carolina State, and had 12 points against Florida International and 12 points and 13 rebounds against Miami.

Junior Diane Kinney (BURNSVILLE) scored 13 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against South Carolina State, and then had the second most points of her career against FIU, converting 12-16 shots from the field for 24 points. Against Miami, Kinney had 16 points. Senior 5-10 guard Cindy Phillips (E. LANSING, MI) scored the second most points of her career as well, against Florida International University when she had 16 points and five steals in 34 minutes of play. Against Miami, Phillips had 12 points, five rebounds and five assists.

BASKETBALL NOTES CONTINUED -- Forward Susie Piram (ST. PAUL/DERHAM HALL) has been suffering from the flu since returning to Minnesota, but will start if she is able to play against Colorado and is expected to play this weekend. Against South Carolina State, Piram had 13 points, hitting 6 for 8 field goals in 21 minutes of play. She also added 11 points and 9 boards against FIU and 13 points, eight rebounds and three assists against Miami. Junior guard Debbie Hilmerson (LITTLE FALLS) scored six points and had five assists in 21 minutes against South Carolina State and had a career high 6 rebounds against Miami.

Candidates to see increased playing time with Tadich out of the lineup include freshman Juanita Boehland (SHOREVIEW). Boehland played 19 minutes against South Carolina State and had six points, hitting 3-3 field goals and grabbed six rebounds in 19 minutes against Miami. Other players who have seen more playing time and could fill the slot are junior Beth Hufford, sophomore Cindy Bradley and freshman Jennifer Hall. So far this year, everyone has seen action off the bench.

SWIMMERS TO HOST CO-ED INTRA-SQUAD MEET JAN. 3 -- The women's and men's swimming and diving teams will compete on co-ed teams during an intra-squad meet on Jan. 3 at the Cooke Hall Pool. The meet will give both squads a chance to test their skills gained during the recent Christmas training trip to Hawaii before the Gold Country Invitational on Jan. 9-10.

The Minnesota hosted co-ed Gold Country Invitational will bring teams from North Dakota, St. Olaf, Mankato State and Northern Illinois for the two-day meet.

SWIMMERS VICTORIOUS OVER HAWAII -- The University of Minnesota women's swimming team remained undefeated in dual meets with a 93-89 victory over the University of Hawaii-Honolulu Dec. 20, in Hawaii. The Gophers were led by junior tri-captain Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN) and sophomore Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MN), who both took first in two events.

Schirmers won the 500 (5:07.76) and 1000 (10:26.66) freestyles and Volna took the 100 (:54.11) and 200 (1:65.34) freestyle events. Other Gopher winners included Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) in the 200 breaststroke (2:24.83) and Nancy Swanum (BURNSVILLE, MN) in the 200 individual medley (2:12.27).

HOLT RESIGNS AS PROMOTIONS DIRECTOR -- Athletic director Merrily Dean Baker has announced that Pam Holt has submitted her resignation, effective June 30, 1987 as promotions and public relations director for the women's athletic department. (BASKETBALL TRAVELS TO 14th RANKED IOWA/HOME OPENER JAN. 16)

The Gopher women's basketball team will travel to Iowa City to meet the 14th ranked Hawkeyes this Friday, Jan. 9, and then open the home Big Ten season Jan. 16 with Purdue and Jan. 18 with Illinois. Last weekend, the Gophers lost both season opening Big Ten games on the road to Northwestern 48-88 and to Wisconsin 73-81. The loss to Northwestern was the Gophers worst in the series history and the second biggest Big Ten loss in school history.

Minnesota was playing without the services of leading scorer and rebounder Molly Tadich who was suspended from the team for disciplinary reasons Dec. 29. Coach Ellen Hanson said that at this time the suspension is still in effect. For the two games last weekend, the Gophers shot just .355 from the field and .500 from the line, and were outrebounded 53.0 to 40.5.

A LOOK AT THE IOWA HAWKEYES -- Prior to hosting Louisiana State this Wednesday, and the new AP poll being released Jan. 6, Iowa is 8-3 overall and ranked 14th in the nation. The Hawkeyes are hoping to win the Big Ten title this year, after placing second in the league last year with an 15-3 conference and 22-7 overall record. Iowa defeated both Wisconsin, 83-44 and Northwestern, 72-61, last weekend. All five starters return from a year ago, along with one of the nation's top prospects in freshman Franthea Price.

The attack is directed by Michelle "Ice" Edwards, the leading scorer from a year ago and a first team all-Big Ten selection. Edwards scored 14 points at Wisconsin last weekend and then set a new school record hitting 11 of 12 field goals (.917 pct.) against Northwestern (25 points). Forward Lisa Long added 18 points, hitting 8 of 10 field goals against the Wildcats as Iowa set a new school record, shooting .67 per cent from the field in that win.

SERIES -- Although Minnesota leads 11-8, Iowa has won five straight from the Gophers, and holds a 6-4 advantage at Iowa City. The Hawkeyes narrowly escaped Williams Arena last year with a 63-60 victory before returning home to deal the Gophers a 61-51 defeat. Iowa averaged 3,156 fans for Big Ten games last year, and the Hawkeyes were unbeaten at home in conference play.

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson is in her tenth year at Minnesota with a 165-109 overall record (64-42 in the Big Ten), and in her 13th season overall (219-120) C. Vivian Stringer is in her 4th year at Iowa, compiling a 67-28 record (42-14 in the Big Ten), and in her 15th year overall with a 318-79 mark. Stringer is the third-winningest active Division I coach, and was named NCAA Division I Coach of the Year in 1982 while at Cheyney State.

After entertaining Purdue Friday night, Minnesota will host 19th ranked Illinois on Sunday at 2 p.m. The Illini game will be telecast live locally on KITN-TV, Channel 29.

Minnesota head basketball coach Ellen Hanson has announced that senior 6-2 forward Molly Tadich has been reinstated to the team effective immediately. Tadich's suspension was based on violations of team rules relating to on-court behavior. "I'm pleased we've been able to resolve the situation with Molly and we're looking forward to having her back this weekend," said Hanson.

So far this season, Tadich has been the Gophers leading scorer and rebounder, averaging 16.9 points and 9.1 rebounds. She has been selected to the second team all-Big Ten as well as the Big Ten academic team the past two years, and led the conference in rebounding and blocked shots last year.

The Gophers won the first game, at Williams Arena, 75-66. **HEAD COACH** -- **Marsha Reall** is in her first season at Purdue (11-2 overall; 3-1 in the Big Ten), and in her eighth year overall with a 175-53 mark. Reall was the NCAA Division II Coach of the Year while at Saginaw Valley State in 1984-85.

THE ILLINI -- Illinois surprised the Big Ten last year by finishing third in the League (20-10 overall, 12-6 Big Ten) and earning an NCAA tournament berth. Six letterwinners and four starters return from that team, and the Illini are currently ranked 19th in the AP poll (prior to Jan. 13 poll). Senior **Jonelle Polk** has picked up right where she left off last year, leading the team with a 23.3 scoring average. Polk was a first team all-Big Ten pick in 1986 and led the conference in scoring with a 21.9 per game average.

The other returning starters include **Angie McClellan**, **Lisa Bradley** and former Minneapolis/Armstrong graduate, point guard **Jenny Johnson**. So far this season, Illinois has defeated Michigan and Michigan State on the road, and Wisconsin and Northwestern at home. In the Big Ten, they are outscoring their opponents by 10 points, 78.0 to 68.0, while shooting .539 from the field and

GOPHER NOTES -- Iowa handed Minnesota their second biggest loss of the season in Iowa City last Friday night, 81-40. The Gophers fell behind early in the game, as Iowa hit their first 13 field goal attempts, and shot .587 from the field for the game. Minnesota, meanwhile, hit their lowest field goal percentage of the year, .271 connecting on just 16 of 59 attempts. **Cindy Phillips** (E. LANSING, MI) was the only Gopher in double figures scoring 10 points.

GYMNASTICS TEAM OPENS SEASON AT NEBRASKA AND UTAH STATE -- The women's gymnastics team begins their drive for an NCAA regional berth this weekend on the road. The Gophers travel to the Nebraska Invitational in Lincoln for a triangular meet against Nebraska and Arizona on Friday, Jan. 16. On Monday, Jan. 19, they will meet Utah State in Logan.

NOTING NEBRASKA/ARIZONA -- The Nebraska Cornhuskers ended the 1986 season ranked 17th in the country, and they placed third at the Big Eight Championship and sixth at the NCAA Midwest Regional meet. The Huskers are coached by Rick Walton, and they return an NCAA national qualifier in sophomore Jeaneane Smith. Smith was the 10th-seeded individual at nationals and she placed 32nd overall. **Series Notes:** Nebraska leads Minnesota 8-5-1 and has won the last four meetings, including two last year. The Huskers outscored the Gophers 177.70-173.85 at the Florida Invitational and 179.70-179.30 at the Georgia Invitational.

The Arizona Wildcats ended last year ranked 10th nationally, but did not qualify for the NCAA championships because Louisiana State, the 11th-ranked team, won the Central Regional title and earned an automatic bid to nationals. Arizona compiled a 20-8 overall record in 1986 and placed third at the Midwest Region Championship. All-American Mary Kay Brown is the Wildcats' leading returner. Brown was the top-seeded individual all-arounder at nationals and she finished 14th overall, and fourth on the vault and third in the floor exercise. **Series Notes:** Arizona leads 3-1. The Gophers last competed against the Wildcats during the 1985 season in a dual meet at Arizona and at the Arizona State Invitational.

NOTING UTAH STATE -- The Minnesota dual is Utah State's season opener, and the Aggies are looking to improve on last year's fifth-place finish at the Midwest Region Championship. The Aggies are led by junior Lena Adomat, a Swedish Olympian who placed 29th overall at the NCAA Nationals, and sophomore Patty Delaney, the top alternate to nationals last year. Utah State also has a top recruit in two-time Minnesota high school all-around champion Tana Call. **Series Notes:** The Gopher-Aggie series is tied 4-4, and Utah State narrowly defeated Minnesota 181.20-180.90 at the BYU Invitational last year.

GOPHER NOTES -- Head coach Katalin Deli is optimistic about this weekend and she says that everybody is looking much better in training. Many of the Gophers were recovering from injuries when they competed against the Japanese All-Stars in December...senior Linda Bednar (MAPLE GROVE, MN) has resumed training after a severe ankle sprain. She fell while performing her floor exercise routine at the Japanese meet.

NETTERS COMPETE AT MILWAUKEE CLASSIC -- Two members of the tennis team opened winter season competition at the Milwaukee Tennis Classic last week. Freshman Anne Marie Ovnik (LA GRANGE, IL) advanced to the third round of the 128-player singles draw before South Carolina's Rita Winebarger, the tourney's seventh seed, stopped her 6-3, 6-4.

Sophomore Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE/Hill-Murray) was defeated in the first round of singles play, but she then won three consolation matches. Gorde defeated Purdue's top singles player, Krista Schreck, 6-1, 6-4 in the round of 16, but bowed to Jacqui VanWijk of Wake Forest 7-5, 3-6, 6-3 in the consolation quarterfinals. Gorde and Ovnik also competed in the doubles draw, but they were eliminated in the first round.

SWIMMERS TRAVEL TO NORTHWESTERN TO FACE THE WILDCATS AND NOTRE DAME

The Gopher women's swimming and diving team will face Northwestern and Notre Dame in a co-ed double-dual meet Sunday at the Evanston (Ill.) High School. The 2 p.m. meet is being held at the high school since Northwestern's new swimming facility is still under construction.

After winning their last four meets, the Northwestern Wildcats (4-3 1-1) will try to do something they have never done before - beat the Minnesota (3-0 2-0) women's swimming and diving team in a dual meet. The Gophers have a 7-0 series record with the Wildcats, and Minnesota's head swimming coach Jean Freeman wants to make it 8-0. "Northwestern has recorded some good times this season, so we will be looking at some good races in the freestyle sprints, the 100 backstroke and the 100 and 200 butterfly's. We will be swimming a strong line-up against both schools and hope to come away with two more wins under our belts," Freeman says. This meet will mark the first meeting ever of the Gopher and Notre Dame women's swimming and diving teams. The Fighting Irish are 2-2 for the season, defeating Mankato State by 25 points and Denison University by 123 points.

SWIMMERS WIN GOLD COUNTRY INVITATIONAL -- Minnesota defeated Mankato State and North Dakota easily at the co-ed Gold Country Invitational the Cooke Hall Pool this past weekend. The Gophers scored 882 points to win, with Mankato State second (322 points) and North Dakota third (280 points). Minnesota won every event but the one and three meter diving events. The divers were competing at the Midwest Diving Invitational in Brown Deer, Wisc.

ROELL QUALIFIES FOR NCAA'S, SETS NEW RECORDS -- Senior tri-captain Sue Roell, (BURNSVILLE, MN) qualified for the NCAA Division I championships in the 200 breaststroke with a time of 2:19.28, which is more than a second faster than the qualifying time of 2:21.29. Roell's 200 breaststroke time set the Minnesota varsity and Cooke Hall Pool record - Roell held the previous record in both events with a time of 2:23.31, set last season.

SCHIRMERS SETS POOL RECORD -- Junior tri-captain Jodi Schirmers, St. Cloud, set a new Cooke Hall Pool record in the 1,650 freestyle with a time of 17:10.85, breaking the five-year-old record of 17:16.68, set in 1982 by former Gopher Mana Raikkala.
