GOLDEN GOPHER WRESTLERS SIGN TWO TOP RECRUITS

The University of Minnesota wrestling squad received national letters of intent over the weekend from two of the state's top high school wrestlers, Chad Kraft of Heron Lake-Okabena-Lakefield, and Troy Marr of Forest Lake.

Kraft, a two-time state champion at 140 pounds as a junior and 125 pounds as a sophomore, was named a high school All-American last season. Kraft also won the Cadet National Freestyle tournament this past summer and finished eighth in the world in the Cadet World Freestyle tournament. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Johnny Johnson referred to Kraft as "the best high school wrestler in the state this season and one of the best in the country. Chad will definitely be a great addition to our program." Kraft has compiled an impressive 153-14-1 career record heading into this season.

Marr was the 1993 Class AA state champion at 145 pounds, and is expected to wrestle at either 134 or 142 next season for the Maroon and Gold. Marr is a five-time letterwinner, two-time Section 7AA champion, and has logged a 129-34-1 record going into this season. The Forest Lake senior also captured second in both the Cadet National Greco and Cadet National Freestyle tournaments last summer, and went on to place ninth in the Cadet World Freestyle tournament. "We are very happy and pleased to get both Troy (Marr) and Chad (Kraft)," Johnson added. "They were the two wrestlers we wanted to sign early and recruited hard."

HARRIS SIGNS WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

Eric Harris, a 6-foot-1, 190-pound guard from St. Raymond's High School in Bronx, N.Y., has signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

Recognized as one of the finest prep defensive players in the country, Harris averaged 13.3 points, four rebounds, three assists and three steals as a junior last season to help lead the Ravens to the New York City and New York State titles. He was honored on the all-conference and all-division teams following the regular season. In addition, he was an all-tournament selection at both the Key Cotton Classics in Arkansas and the Tournament of Champions in Missouri.

"Eric is a tenacious defender and an outstanding player at both ends of the floor," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins. "On top of that, he is a fine young man who will be a welcome addition to our program."

Harris joins Sam Jacobson, a 6-foot-5, 200-pound guard from Park High School in Cottage Grove, Minn., as early signees for the Golden Gophers.

GOLDEN GOPHER BASEBALL TEAM INKS TWO PLAYERS TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

The University of Minnesota baseball team announced today the signing of two players to national letters of intent. Jason Dobis, a right-handed pitcher from Little Falls, Minn., and infielder/pitcher Andy Thompson of Sun Prairie, Wis., will both join the Golden Gophers next year.

The 6-1, 185-pound Dobis is a stellar high school player for the Little Falls Flyers. He has a 10-1 prep career record in 72 innings pitched. He has thrown 98 strikeouts, with only 21 walks and a .98 ERA. In American Legion baseball last summer he was 7-1 with a 1.18 ERA in 51 innings pitched. An outstanding student as well, he has a 3.5 GPA and intends to go into aerospace engineering. He was recruited by Iowa State and Nebraska among other Division I schools.


“We are happy that Jason decided to join the Golden Gopher baseball program,” said Head Coach John Anderson. “He is a good match for our program. He is a quality student and has the potential to be a successful Division I pitcher.”

Thompson is an outstanding multi-sport athlete who had scholarship offers in football and baseball. He is a 6-3, 195-pounds and is also an excellent student with a 3.2 GPA. In 1993 he was 13-0 as a pitcher and batted .540. He played on the North Team at the 1993 U.S. Olympic Festival in San Antonio, Tex., and batted .545 with eight RBIs in four games. He has been honored as all-conference in three sports two different times. Last year, he was the Big Eight Conference Player of the Year in football and baseball and was the first team all-state at quarterback in Wisconsin. He turned down football scholarship offers from six Big Ten schools as well as Notre Dame. He was also turned down baseball scholarship offers to perennial powers Arizona and LSU to come to Gold Country.

“Andy is a multi-talented athlete with a broad background of success in many sports,” said Anderson. “We are very pleased he has chosen to focus on baseball at Minnesota and we expect him to help continue our great baseball tradition.”

The two players are expected to contribute as early as their freshman season. “The 40-plus years of winning tradition in our program has been built around players like these two,” said Anderson. “We are excited about their potential and look forward to helping them accomplish their goals at the University of Minnesota.”



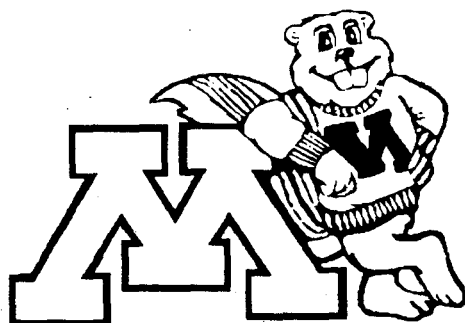

GRIDDERS LOSE FINALE AT IOWA 21-3 TO FINISH SEASON AT 4-7; TIE FOR 8TH IN THE BIG TEN

Minnesota finished the 1993 season on a losing note at Iowa last weekend when the Hawkeyes ended Golden Gopher hopes of keeping Floyd of Rosedale around for another year.

Coach Jim Wacker's contingent, which finished 4-7 overall and 3-5 in the Big Ten (tied for eighth) fell 21-3 with a sub-par effort and concluded the year with three straight losses after having won three in a row midway through the campaign.

Opinions surfaced once again that after those three victories, when confidence and momentum were at a peak, the heartbreaking 23-20 loss at Illinois in the final seconds of the game took more out of the Golden Gophers than anyone realized. Michigan hammered the demoralized Minnesota team a week later, and last Saturday the U of M simply could not bounce back mentally.

"We just did not play well," Coach Wacker lamented. "We did not execute. We made too many mistakes, had too many penalties and turned the ball over too many times."

In the penalty department, Minnesota had eight for a total of 92 yards. That was something the Golden Gophers did all season long, and they finished 1993 with a total of 89 infractions for 801 yards. The opposition had only 58 penalties for 454 yards.

Turnovers were even more destructive. Against the Hawkeyes, Minnesota threw five interceptions and coughed the ball up on a fumble. The Golden Gophers, who had five interceptions against Wisconsin and five more against Illinois, had zero at Iowa, and they failed to come up with a fumble recovery.

That, too, was a problem all season long when Minnesota threw 27 interceptions and lost the ball 11 times on fumbles. It recorded 18 interceptions of its own and recovered 10 opponent fumbles, but that left it minus 10 in the turnover department.

The Golden Gophers held their own at Iowa in the first half when trailing only 7-3, but the Hawkeyes added one touchdown in the third and an insurance TD in the fourth while keeping Minnesota back on its heels through the final two periods.

"We just had terrible field position," Wacker pointed out, "and in the end we just ran out of gas. But we didn't run the ball too badly," he maintained. Statistics show, however, that most of the yardage was gained on the wrong side of the 50 yard line.

Individually, **Antonio Carter (Sr., RB, Columbus, Ohio)** finished with 37 yards on the day. He had 430 during the season and wound up as Minnesota's second-leading rusher.

Chris Darkins (So., RB, Houston, Texas), after netting 80 yards on 11 carries, finished his second season with the Golden Gophers as the team's number-one rusher. He had 610 yards on 124 carries for an average of 4.9 per attempt and 61.0 yards per game. His best effort of the 1993 campaign was against Purdue when he notched 149 yards.

"The bottom line, however, is that our quarterbacks made some wrong decisions throwing the ball," Wacker said, and that resulted in five Iowa interceptions. "We have to learn not to throw into coverage." Part of that problem may have been because of pressure applied by Iowa which recorded four sacks.

Wacker also felt the receiving corps could have done a better job. "We dropped too many passes," he said. "Our passing game will improve when we protect better and catch better."

That despite **Omar Douglas (Sr., SB, New Orleans, La.)** setting another University of Minnesota receiving record. At Iowa, Douglas caught five passes for 66 yards. That gave him 60

catches on the year (one short of his own single-season record of 61 set a season ago) good for 880 yards. In his career, Douglas caught 130 passes, a new U of M record, and had 1,675 yards receiving, breaking the old standard of 1,627 set by Dwayne McMullen (1982-84). He also owns records for most TD's receiving in a single game (five against Purdue), most points scored in a game (30 against Purdue) and most touchdowns in a season (11 in 1993).

"Douglas, like all our seniors, are going to be missed," Wacker said. "They gave us some excellent leadership. They are a special group of young men. I feel terrible that we could not get that last one at Iowa so they could leave as winners, but I know they will go forward and be successful in life."

Will Minnesota also gain success in the future? Wacker thinks so. "We made some great strides in 1993," he maintains. "We made a lot of improvement over 1992. We achieved a great deal, a lot more than the experts thought we would." (pre-season prognosticators had predicted that Minnesota would be the first team in history to finish 11th in the Big Ten).

Wacker was eluding to the fact that the Golden Gophers won four games, doubling their 1992 output. And they lost three games (all in the closing seconds) by a total of 12 points.

"Yes, we feel that we made some progress," Wacker said. "We aren't where we want to be, but we are getting there. And we have an excellent group of young people returning next year that we can build around. We feel good about our program and our future. We must learn from our mistakes, continue to believe in ourselves, continue to work hard and to improve. I am confident that is going to happen at the University of Minnesota."

A total of 17 U of M seniors made their final appearances as Golden Gophers at Iowa. They were **Dennis Cappella (DE, Miller Place, N.Y.)**, **Carter, Douglas, Neil Fredenburg (OC, Fargo, N.D.)**, **Rod Ganther (LS, Eau Claire, Wis.)**, **John Guentzel (FS, Lakeville, Minn.)**, **Russ Heath (LB, Aurora, Colo.)**, **Doug Hoefer (LB, Dubuque, Iowa)**, **Ron Holty (P, Spring Grove, Minn.)**, **Andy Kratochvil (DE, New Ulm, Minn.)**, **Robert Lewis (CB, Dubuque, Iowa)**, **Drinon Mays (CB, Brandenton, Fla.)**, **Robert Rogers (OG, St. Louis, Mo.)**, **Jeff Rosga (FS, Roseville, Minn.)**, **Andrew Veit (LB, Palm Harbor, Fla.)**, **William Wangerin (OT, Bloomington, Minn.)** and **Lance Wolkow (LB, Lakeville, Minn.)**.

GOLDEN GOPHERS PLAY KANSAS IN PRESEASON NIT SEMIFINALS WEDNESDAY

Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gopher basketball team will face Kansas in a Preseason NIT semifinal game at 6:00 p.m. (Central) Wednesday at Madison Square Garden in New York. The Golden Gophers defeated Rice 70-61 in the first round last Thursday, and then Georgia 91-71 in the quarterfinals Saturday. Both games were played at Williams Arena.

Broadcast Coverage: The Preseason NIT semifinals and finals will be broadcast on ESPN with John Saunders on the play-by-play and Dick Vitale as the analyst. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball with Ray Christensen calling the action.

Coach Haskins: Clem Haskins put the appropriate finishing touches on his seventh season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program by leading the Golden Gophers to the 1993 NIT title. After rebuilding the program in his first two seasons, he has now directed the Golden Gophers to post-season tournament action in four of the past five seasons. He has a record of 113-100 in eight seasons at Minnesota, and a 214-173 mark in 14 seasons overall. Haskins' success in post-season play is certainly no secret. He has an impressive 10-3 (5-2 NCAA; 5-1 NIT) record in post-season tournament action at Minnesota.

Kansas: In his sixth season at the helm, Head Coach Roy Williams has charted a 134-37 record with the Jayhawks. Despite losing four starters from last year's 29-7 team which advanced to the Final Four, the Jayhawks looked impressive once again in defeating Western Michigan 69-50 in a first round contest last Wednesday, and then California 73-56 in the quarterfinals Friday. Richard Scott, a 6-7 senior forward, led the team in scoring in both contests with 14 and 20 points, respectively, while Greg Ostertag, a 7-2 junior center, paced the team on the boards with seven and 12 rebounds, respectively.

Series Record: The series between Minnesota and Kansas is tied at 1-1. The Jayhawks defeated the Golden Gophers 32-11 at Minneapolis on Jan. 2, 1922. The Golden Gophers evened the series at one win apiece with a 62-51 victory at Kansas City, Mo., on Dec. 29, 1950.

Minnesota & The NIT: This is Minnesota's first appearance in the Preseason NIT. Minnesota has an overall record of 14-5 (12-5 Post-Season NIT; 2-0 Preseason NIT) in NIT action.

Looking To Be The First: The Golden Gophers capped their sixth appearance in the Postseason NIT by winning the tournament title last spring. No school has ever won the Postseason NIT and then the Preseason NIT in the same year. In fact, only one school has ever won titles in both tournaments. Indiana captured the 1979 Postseason NIT and then the 1992 Preseason NIT. North Carolina won the Postseason NIT in 1971 and will be seeking its first Preseason NIT crown as well.

Do You Remember?: The Golden Gophers ended the 1992-93 season in style by capturing the school's first-ever Postseason NIT title with a thrilling 62-61 victory over Georgetown in the championship game on March 31 at Madison Square Garden. Voshon Lenard scored 42 points in the two games in New York, and a total of 99 points overall in the five tournament games, en route to being honored as the NIT MVP. Backcourt mate Arriel McDonald, who scored a game-high 20 points in the victory over Georgetown, joined Lenard on the all-tournament team.

McDonald Breaks Assists Record: Arriel McDonald collected seven assists in Saturday's win over Georgia to up his career total to a school record 380. Marc Wilson (1982-86) was the previous career leader with 375.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have registered an impressive 63-17 record (.788) over the past six seasons in Williams Arena, which includes a perfect 2-0 mark this season.

GOLDEN GOPHERS INCREASE UNBEATEN STREAK TO FOUR GAMES; TRAVEL TO DETROIT FOR WCHA/CCHA CHALLENGE

The Golden Gopher ice hockey team will take a break from WCHA action to play in the WCHA/CCHA Challenge, Friday and Saturday, November 25-26, at the Palace in Auburn Hills, Mich. Both Minnesota games are slated for 4:00 p.m. (CDT). The Maroon and Gold will play Michigan on Friday and Michigan State on Saturday with both games live on KSTP-AM radio and MSC Television. Wisconsin will join the Golden Gophers in Detroit and play the later game each night, taking on Michigan State on Friday and Michigan on Saturday.

First Win In Mariucci Arena: The Golden Gophers notched the first win in history in the new building on Saturday when they defeated Denver 4-3 to gain three points in the series and their sixth point in the last eight possible. Friday night, the Golden Gopher started sluggishly, giving up three first period goals, two of them off of a defenseman. In the second and third periods the Maroon and Gold fired 40 shots at Denver goalie Sinuhe Wallinheimo but he held fast, stopping an additional two shots in overtime to gain the tie and steal a point from the Golden Gophers.

Nielsen on Fire: Senior All-WCHA candidate **Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, Minn.)** has really caught fire during the team's four-game unbeaten streak. He has four goals and an assist in the four games and leads the team in goals scored with six. A dominating player with his physical play and forechecking ability, he has great speed and is the best shooter on the team. If his play continues to improve, the Minnesota offense can only get better.

Magnusson Continues Streak: Forward **Steve Magnusson (Jr., Anoka, Minn.)** is leading the Golden Gophers in points with a goal and 10 assists for the season. The sly forward creates many scoring opportunities and draws a lot of penalties for the team. He has had a point in five straight games and has been a big boost to the Minnesota offense since sitting out the first series of the year. He doesn't possess great speed, but is very elusive and has a knack for setting up the nice plays.

Injury Update: Once again the injury bug hit in the Denver series when **Eric Means (Sr., Rochester, Minn.)** suffered a minor shoulder separation that will keep him out of the lineup this weekend. Sophomore **Bobby Dustin (Roseville, Minn.)** and freshman **Nick Checco (Bloomington, Minn.)** both suffered hip pointers, but are expected to be available for the WCHA/CCHA Challenge. Sophomore goalie **Jeff Moen (Roseville, Minn.)** returned from the minor concussion he suffered in the first game of the Northern Michigan series to gain his first career win on Saturday night stopping 34 of 37 Denver shots. **Joe Dzedzic (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.)**, who injured his left forearm at Colorado College and has been out since, started skating last week and is listed as possible for this weekend. Junior **Brandon Steege (Burnsville, Minn.)** is still out with reoccurring headaches from a head injury in the Hall of Fame game. His status is week-to-week. **Mike McAlpine's (So., South St. Paul, Minn.)** strained left knee is improving but he is doubtful for this weekend.

The Series: The Golden Gopher/Michigan series is a very storied one. Minnesota has played Michigan in hockey more times than any other team. The Golden Gophers hold a 108-97 advantage with 12 ties in the series. Michigan won both games the last time the two teams clashed in Ann Arbor in 1991 by 7-3, 7-6 scores. The Minnesota/Michigan State series stands at 89-39-6 in favor of the Maroon and Gold. The last time the two teams met was in the 1987-88 NCAA Tournament when the Golden Gophers defeated the Spartans 4-2, 4-3 at Mariucci Arena to advance to the Final Four.

The Woog Report: Coach Woog has an impressive list of credentials, including eight NCAA Tournament appearances. He has three WCHA Championships and has never finished lower than second place in the WCHA standings. Six of his eight teams have posted 30 or more wins. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program and he has one of the highest winning percentages of any collegiate coaches in the country. Woog has a 2-2 career record against Michigan with a pair of wins in the 1986-87 season at Mariucci Arena 11-2, 5-2. Michigan returned the favor in Ann Arbor in 1991. The "Wooger" has a 2-2 record vs. the Michigan State Spartans as well. He has a 10-8 career record vs. teams in the CCHA, but has not won in the last three games (Lk.Sup. St.-'92, Ferris St.-'93 and Ill-Chi.-'93).

McAlpine Attack: All-American candidate **Chris McAlpine (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** is a force on defense for the Golden Gophers. He is a dominant player in both ends of the rink. Last year, he was the second leading goal scorer from the blue line in the WCHA with 14 goals. If he equals his statistics of a year ago he will become the all-time leading goal-scoring defenseman at Minnesota as well as the leader in all-time penalty minutes. This year he has two goals and three assists in nine games.

Callinan And Moen Solid: Goaltenders **Jeff Moen (So., Roseville, Minn.)** and **Jeff Callinan (Jr., Mound, Minn.)** both put in solid performances over the weekend with Callinan extending his unbeaten streak to three games with the overtime tie on Friday night when he stopped some unbelievable point blank attempts. Moen, had a great night Saturday and put his name in the record books when he won the first game in the new arena. He stopped 34 of 37 shots as the Pioneers outshot the Golden Gophers 28 to six of the final two stanzas.

Golden Gophers on KSTP-AM 1500: The Golden Gophers signed a three-year contract with KSTP-AM 1500 over the summer that will greatly enhance the coverage of Minnesota hockey in the state. All games will be live on KSTP with former North Star broadcaster and NHL Hall of Famer, Al Shaver calling the action. He will be joined by former Golden Gopher coach Glen Sonmor. Three wrestlers from the University of Minnesota won championships Saturday at the annual Ryan Kaufman Open, held on the campus of the University of Nebraska-Omaha. There were two divisions in the unattached (no team points) format, an under-20 division, and an open division.

Capturing laurels for the Golden Gophers in the open division were redshirt freshman **Zac Taylor (Sandpoint, Idaho)** at 167 pounds and junior **Brett Colombini (Redwood Valley, Calif.)** at 177 pounds. Taylor breezed through four matches to improve his season record to 8-1, while adding to his third place finish last week at the Bison Open. The Idaho native defeated Steve Williams of Iowa Central 15-13 in the 167-pound championship match. 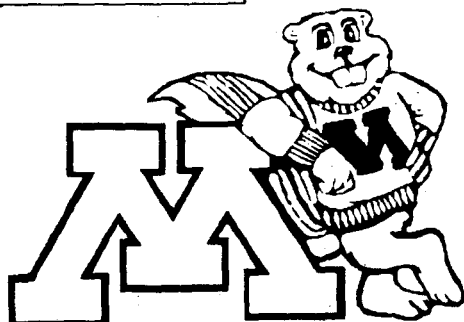

After finishing fourth in the prestigious Preseason NIT, Head Coach Clem Haskins' injury-riddled Golden Gopher basketball team (2-2) will play three games in five days this week. The Golden Gophers will host Mississippi Valley State at 7:00 p.m. Monday, and then the USA Verich Reps in an exhibition game at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, before playing at Middle Tennessee State at 7:30 p.m. Friday.

Coach Haskins: Clem Haskins put the appropriate finishing touches on his seventh season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program by leading the Golden Gophers to the 1993 NIT title. After rebuilding the program in his first two seasons, he has now directed the Golden Gophers to post-season tournament action in four of the past five seasons. He has a record of 113-102 in eight seasons at Minnesota, and a 214-175 mark in 14 seasons overall. Haskins' success in post-season play is certainly no secret. He has an impressive 10-3 (5-2 NCAA; 5-1 NIT) record in post-season tournament action at Minnesota.

Wednesday Time Change: The exhibition game against the USA Verich Reps on Wednesday at Williams Arena has been moved back to an 8:30 p.m. tip-off. The contest was originally set to begin at 7:00 p.m., but the change was necessary after the Golden Gopher women's volleyball team was selected to host Ball State in a first-round NCAA Tournament game at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday at Williams Arena.

Mississippi Valley State: In his 11th season at the helm, Head Coach Lafayette Stribling has charted a 141-157 record at Mississippi Valley State. Despite 17 points and 11 rebounds from 6-7 sophomore forward Dendrius Rucker, the Delta Devils lost their season opener 92-72 at Oral Roberts Saturday.

USA Verich Reps: Following a 96-73 loss at Vanderbilt on Nov. 24, the USA Verich Reps will enter Wednesday's exhibition game against the Golden Gophers with a 1-5 overall record. Head Coach Louie Cathcart's squad opened with a 124-110 defeat at Georgia Tech on Nov. 16, lost 104-61 at Missouri on Nov. 17, won 91-74 at Wake Forest on Nov. 18, lost 98-88 at UNLV on Nov. 20, and then lost 111-87 at Maryland on Nov. 23. Middle Tennessee State: Middle Tennessee State dropped a 70-56 decision to visiting North Carolina-Greensboro in its season opener last Saturday. Tim Gaither, a 6-1 sophomore guard, led the Blue Raiders with 15 points. In his third season at the helm, Head Coach David Farrar, a former assistant coach under Clem Haskins at Western Kentucky, enters Wednesday's home game against Oral Roberts with a 26-28 record.

Despite 16 points from Townsend Orr and 13 from Arriel McDonald, the Golden Gophers dropped a close 75-71 decision to Kansas in the semifinals last Wednesday at Madison Square Garden in New York. Lenard scored 21 points and sophomore **David Grim (Massillon, Ohio)** added 15 of his own, but it wasn't enough as top-ranked North Carolina came away with a 90-76 victory over the Golden Gophers in last Friday's third-place game.

Three-Point King: Voshon Lenard drained five three-pointers against North Carolina last Friday and is now the all-time school leader with 118 in his career. Kevin Lynch (1987-91) was the previous career leader with 117. Lenard also holds the school career record with 334 attempts.

McDonald Ups Assists Record: Arriel McDonald has collected 16 assists in four games this season to up his school career record total to 384. Marc Wilson (1982-86) was the previous career leader with 375.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have registered an impressive 63-17 record (.788) over the past six seasons in Williams Arena, which includes a perfect 2-0 mark this season.

GOLDEN GOPHERS HAVE WEEK OFF BEFORE HOSTING NORTH DAKOTA AT HOME

The University of Minnesota ice hockey team will take a week off for final exams before entertaining the North Dakota Fighting Sioux on December 11 and 12 at Mariucci Arena. The Golden Gophers are coming off a split at the College Hockey Showcase in Detroit where they suffered a disappointing 6-0 loss to the top-ranked Michigan Wolverines, before bouncing back to notch a 6-5 victory over the 10th-ranked Michigan State Spartans on Saturday. The Maroon and Gold (3-6-3, 2-5-3), showed great resolve in the game against Michigan State when they battled back from a 2-0 deficit and exceeded their highest output of the season by two goals.

Balanced Scoring: The Golden Gophers had their finest offensive night of the year and they did it with balance. Three of the four lines had points and the third line, which did not have a point played the most consistent all weekend. **Dave Larson** (So., So. St. Paul, Minn.) and **Jesse Bertogliat** (So., Esko, Minn.) each had their first goal of the year, while **Justin McHugh** (Jr., Minnetonka, Minn.), **Jeff Nielsen** (Sr., Grand Rapids, Minn.), **Steve Magnusson** (Jr., Anoka, Minn.) and **Jed Fiebelkorn** (Jr., Osseo, Minn.) all added goals.

Nielsen on Fire: Senior All-WCHA candidate Jeff Nielsen has really caught fire during the team's last six games. He has five goals and two assists in the six games and leads the team in goals scored with seven. A dominating player with his physical play and fore checking ability. He has great speed and is the best shooter on the team. He is the type of player who can lead the Minnesota offense and get the team back into the title race.

Magnusson Continues Streak: Forward **Steve Magnusson** (Jr., Anoka, Minn.) is leading the Golden Gophers in points with 12 behind two goals and 10 assists. The elusive forward creates many scoring opportunities and draws a lot of penalties for the team. He has had a point in six of the last seven games and has been a big boost to the Minnesota offense since sitting out the first series of the year. He doesn't possess great speed, but is very slippery and has a knack for setting up the nice plays.

Moen Notches Win Number Two: Sophomore **Jeff Moen** (Roseville, Minn) notched his second career win as a Golden Gopher in the 6-5 win over the Spartans. He stopped 24 of 29 shots and limited the potent Michigan State power play to one goal in four attempts. He has now won his last two starts after missing the Duluth series with a fracture in his neck.

CCHA Sweeps First Day, WCHA Takes Two the Final Day: The CCHA won both games the first day of the College Hockey Showcase when the Golden Gophers lost to Michigan 6-0 and Michigan State beat Wisconsin 4-2. On day two the WCHA responded by winning both games. The Maroon and Gold gave the Spartans their first loss in two weeks and the Badgers beat top-ranked and unbeaten Michigan 5-3.

Injury Update: The Golden Gophers are gradually getting healthy after a series of early series injuries struck the team. The

extra week off will help the team heal its wounds and be ready for a resurgent North Dakota team. **Eric Means** (Sr., Rochester, Minn.) suffered a minor shoulder injury against Denver but is probable for the North Dakota series. **Joe Dzedzic** (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.), who injured his left forearm at Colorado College and has been out since, started skating two weeks ago week and is listed as possible for the Sioux series. Junior **Brandon Steege** (Jr., Burnsville, Minn.) is still out with reoccurring headaches from a head injury in the Hall of Fame game. His status is improving and he began skating last week but is listed as week-to-week. **Mike McAlpine's** (So., South St. Paul, Minn.) strained left knee is improving and he is listed as possible for the North Dakota series.

The Series: The Golden Gopher/North Dakota series is rich in tradition. The two teams have been a big part of the WCHA's success over the years. Minnesota holds 113-91 advantage with 4 ties in the series. Last year, the Golden Gophers and Sioux split their regular season games with each team winning one at home and one on the road. The Golden Gophers won a pair of WCHA first round playoff games at Mariucci Arena 6-4 and 5-4 in overtime in the final games ever played in the old Mariucci Arena. Head Coach Doug Woog has an impressive 27-11-1 record against the Sioux and a 17-4 record at home against the Green and White. Last year, the Golden Gophers were 3-1 against the Sioux at Mariucci Arena, with the loss coming on the opening day of the season 8-4.

The Woog Report: Coach Woog has an impressive list of credentials, including eight consecutive NCAA Tournament berths. He has three WCHA Championships and has never finished lower than second place in the WCHA standings. Six of his eight teams have posted 30 or more wins. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program and he has one of the highest winning percentages of any collegiate coaches in the country.

McAlpine Attack: All-American candidate **Chris McAlpine** (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) is a force on defense for the Golden Gophers. He is a dominant player in both ends of the rink. Last year, he was the second leading goal scorer from the blue line in the WCHA with 14 goals. If he equals his statistics of a year ago he will become the all-time leading goal-scoring defenseman at Minnesota as well as the leader in all-time penalty minutes. This year he has two goals and three assists in 11 games.

Golden Gophers on KSTP-AM 1500: The Golden Gophers signed a three-year contract with KSTP-AM 1500 over the summer that will greatly enhance the coverage of Minnesota hockey in the state. All games will be live on KSTP with former North Star broadcaster and NHL Hall of Famer, Al Shaver calling the action. He will be joined by former Golden Gopher coach Glen Sonmor. KSTP's Rob Leer and former North Star Bobby Smith will also add to the coverage with special assignments.

Golden Gophers on MSC: The Golden Gophers inked another three-year deal this summer with Midwest Sports Channel that will have the Maroon and Gold on television a record 28 times, plus the playoffs. Frank Mazzocco and Tom Reid will call all the action on MSC.

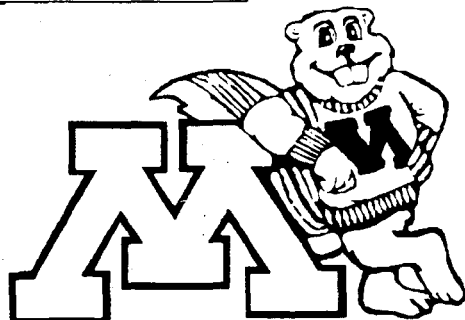

After finishing fourth in the prestigious Preseason NIT, Head Coach Clem Haskins' injury-riddled Golden Gopher basketball team (2-2) will play three games in five days this week. The Golden Gophers will host Mississippi Valley State at 7:00 p.m. Monday, and then the USA Verich Reps in an exhibition game at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, before playing at Middle Tennessee State at 7:30 p.m. Friday.

Broadcast Coverage: The Mississippi Valley State game on Monday and the Middle Tennessee State game on Friday will both be broadcast on the Midwest Sports Channel (MSC) with Dick Bremer on the play-by-play and Jim Dutcher as the analyst. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball with Ray Christensen calling the action.

Coach Haskins: Clem Haskins put the appropriate finishing touches on his seventh season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program by leading the Golden Gophers to the 1993 NIT title. After rebuilding the program in his first two seasons, he has now directed the Golden Gophers to post-season tournament action in four of the past five seasons. He has a record of 113-102 in eight seasons at Minnesota, and a 214-175 mark in 14 seasons overall. Haskins' success in post-season play is certainly no secret. He has an impressive 10-3 (5-2 NCAA; 5-1 NIT) record in post-season tournament action at Minnesota.

Wednesday Time Change: The exhibition game against the USA Verich Reps on Wednesday at Williams Arena has been moved back to an 8:30 p.m. tip-off. The contest was originally set to begin at 7:00 p.m., but the change was necessary after the Golden Gopher women's volleyball team was selected to host Ball State in a first-round NCAA Tournament game at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday at Williams Arena.

Mississippi Valley State: In his 11th season at the helm, Head Coach Lafayette Stribling has charted a 141-157 record at Mississippi Valley State. Despite 17 points and 11 rebounds from 6-7 sophomore forward Dendrius Rucker, the Delta Devils lost their season opener 92-72 at Oral Roberts Saturday.

USA Verich Reps: Following a 96-73 loss at Vanderbilt on Nov. 24, the USA Verich Reps will enter Wednesday's exhibition game against the Golden Gophers with a 1-5 overall record. Head Coach Louie Cathcart's squad opened with a 124-110 defeat at Georgia Tech on Nov. 16, lost 104-61 at Missouri on Nov. 17, won 91-74 at Wake Forest on Nov. 18, lost 98-88 at UNLV on Nov. 20, and then lost 111-87 at Maryland on Nov. 23. The team is made up of former college standouts.

Middle Tennessee State: Middle Tennessee State dropped a 70-56 decision to visiting North Carolina-Greensboro in its season opener last Saturday. Tim Gaither, a 6-1 sophomore guard, led the Blue Raiders with 15 points. In his third season at the helm, Head Coach David Farrar, a former assistant coach under Clem Haskins at Western Kentucky, enters Wednesday's home game against Oral Roberts with a 26-28 record.

Injury Bug Hits Again: The Golden Gophers have already had their share of injuries this season. Junior **Jayson Walton** (Dallas, Texas), who is expected to undergo arthroscopic surgery on his right knee early next week, is out indefinitely. Redshirt freshman **Trevor Winter** (Slayton, Minn.), a seven-foot, 250-pound center, suffered a broken bone in his left wrist during practice Nov. 13 and is expected to be out of action for up to six more weeks. He had surgery on Nov. 17. Three other Golden Gophers are playing with nagging injuries. Junior **Townsend Orr** (Dolton, Ill.) has a dislocated index finger on his right hand, Voshon Lenard a lingering toe injury on his left foot, and Chad Kolander has a sprained left foot.

Preseason NIT Recap: A total of four Golden Gophers scored in double figures, led by Voshon Lenard's 18 points, in the team's 70-61 Preseason NIT first-round victory over Rice at Williams Arena on Nov. 18. Led by Randy Carter's 20 points, the Golden Gophers shot a blistering 58 percent (37 of 64) from the field en route to a 91-71 win over Georgia in the quarterfinals at Williams Arena on Nov. 20. Despite 16 points from Townsend Orr and 13 from Arriel McDonald, the Golden Gophers dropped a close 75-71 decision to Kansas in the semifinals last Wednesday at Madison Square Garden in New York. Lenard scored 21 points and sophomore **David Grim** (Massillon, Ohio) added 15 of his own, but it wasn't enough as top-ranked North Carolina came away with a 90-76 victory over the Golden Gophers in last Friday's third-place game.

Three-Point King: Voshon Lenard drained five three-pointers against North Carolina last Friday and is now the all-time school leader with 118 in his career. Kevin Lynch (1987-91) was the previous career leader with 117. Lenard also holds the school career record with 334 attempts.

McDonald Ups Assists Record: Arriel McDonald has collected 16 assists in four games this season to up his school career record total to 384. Marc Wilson (1982-86) was the previous career leader with 375.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have registered an impressive 63-17 record (.788) over the past six seasons in Williams Arena, which includes a perfect 2-0 mark this season.

GOLDEN GOPHERS HAVE WEEK OFF BEFORE HOSTING NORTH DAKOTA AT HOME

The University of Minnesota ice hockey team will take a week off for final exams before entertaining the North Dakota Fighting Sioux on December 11 and 12 at Mariucci Arena. The Golden Gophers are coming off a split at the College Hockey Showcase in Detroit where they suffered a disappointing 6-0 loss to the top-ranked Michigan Wolverines, before bouncing back to notch a 6-5 victory over the 10th-ranked Michigan State Spartans on Saturday. The Maroon and Gold (3-6-3, 2-5-3), showed great resolve in the game against Michigan State when they battled back from a 2-0 deficit and exceeded their highest output of the season by two goals.

Balanced Scoring: The Golden Gophers had their finest offensive night of the year and they did it with balance. Three of the four lines had points and the third line, which did not have a point played the most consistent all weekend. **Dave Larson (So., So. St. Paul, Minn.)** and **Jesse Bertogliat (So., Esko, Minn.)** each had their first goal of the year, while **Justin McHugh (Jr., Minnetonka, Minn.)**, **Jeff Nielsen (Sr., Grand Rapids, Minn.)**, **Steve Magnusson (Jr., Anoka, Minn.)** and **Jed Fiebelkorn (Jr., Osseo, Minn.)** all added goals.

Nielsen on Fire: Senior All-WCHA candidate Jeff Nielsen has really caught fire during the team's last six games. He has five goals and two assists in the six games and leads the team in goals scored with seven. A dominating player with his physical play and fore checking ability. He has great speed and is the best shooter on the team. He is the type of player who can lead the Minnesota offense and get the team back into the title race.

Magnusson Continues Streak: Forward **Steve Magnusson (Jr., Anoka, Minn.)** is leading the Golden Gophers in points with 12 behind two goals and 10 assists. The elusive forward creates many scoring opportunities and draws a lot of penalties for the team. He has had a point in six of the last seven games and has been a big boost to the Minnesota offense since sitting out the first series of the year. He doesn't possess great speed, but is very slippery and has a knack for setting up the nice plays.

Moen Notches Win Number Two: Sophomore **Jeff Moen (Roseville, Minn.)** notched his second career win as a Golden Gopher in the 6-5 win over the Spartans. He stopped 24 of 29 shots and limited the potent Michigan State power play to one goal in four attempts. He has now won his last two starts after missing the Duluth series with a fracture in his neck.

CCHA Sweeps First Day, WCHA Takes Two the Final Day: The CCHA won both games the first day of the College Hockey Showcase when the Golden Gophers lost to Michigan 6-0 and Michigan State beat Wisconsin 4-2. On day two the WCHA responded by winning both games. The Maroon and Gold gave the Spartans their first loss in two weeks and the Badgers beat top-ranked and unbeaten Michigan 5-3.

Injury Update: The Golden Gophers are gradually getting healthy after a series of early series injuries struck the team. The

extra week off will help the team heal its wounds and be ready for a resurgent North Dakota team. **Eric Means (Sr., Rochester, Minn.)** suffered a minor shoulder injury against Denver but is probable for the North Dakota series. **Joe Dziedzic (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.)**, who injured his left forearm at Colorado College and has been out since, started skating two weeks ago week and is listed as possible for the Sioux series. Junior **Brandon Steege (Jr., Burnsville, Minn.)** is still out with reoccurring headaches from a head injury in the Hall of Fame game. His status is improving and he began skating last week but is listed as week-to-week. **Mike McAlpine's (So., South St. Paul, Minn.)** strained left knee is improving and he is listed as possible for the North Dakota series.

The Series: The Golden Gopher/North Dakota series is rich in tradition. The two teams have been a big part of the WCHA's success over the years. Minnesota holds 113-91 advantage with 4 ties in the series. Last year, the Golden Gophers and Sioux split their regular season games with each team winning one at home and one on the road. The Golden Gophers won a pair of WCHA first round playoff games at Mariucci Arena 6-4 and 5-4 in overtime in the final games ever played in the old Mariucci Arena. Head Coach Doug Woog has an impressive 27-11-1 record against the Sioux and a 17-4 record at home against the Green and White. Last year, the Golden Gophers were 3-1 against the Sioux at Mariucci Arena, with the loss coming on the opening day of the season 8-4.

The Woog Report: Coach Woog has an impressive list of credentials, including eight consecutive NCAA Tournament berths. He has three WCHA Championships and has never finished lower than second place in the WCHA standings. Six of his eight teams have posted 30 or more wins. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program and he has one of the highest winning percentages of any collegiate coaches in the country.

McAlpine Attack: All-American candidate **Chris McAlpine (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** is a force on defense for the Golden Gophers. He is a dominant player in both ends of the rink. Last year, he was the second leading goal scorer from the blue line in the WCHA with 14 goals. If he equals his statistics of a year ago he will become the all-time leading goal-scoring defenseman at Minnesota as well as the leader in all-time penalty minutes. This year he has two goals and three assists in 11 games.

Golden Gophers on KSTP-AM 1500: The Golden Gophers signed a three-year contract with KSTP-AM 1500 over the summer that will greatly enhance the coverage of Minnesota hockey in the state. All games will be live on KSTP with former North Star broadcaster and NHL Hall of Famer, Al Shaver calling the action. He will be joined by former Golden Gopher coach Glen Sonmor. KSTP's Rob Leer and former North Star Bobby Smith will also add to the coverage with special assignments.

Golden Gophers on MSC: The Golden Gophers inked another three-year deal this summer with Midwest Sports Channel that will have the Maroon and Gold on television a record 28 times, plus the playoffs. Frank Mazzocco and Tom Reid will call all the action on MSC.

Also placing for the Golden Gophers this weekend were: freshman **Brandon Paulson (Anoka, Minn.)**, third at 118 pounds; senior **Chris Berglin (West Bend, Wis.)**, fourth at 134 pounds; senior **Joe Block (LeCenter, Minn.)**, fifth at 134 pounds; senior **Damon Johnson (Mustang, Okla.)**, third at 142 pounds; and sophomore **Billy Pierce (Minneapolis, Minn.)**, third at heavyweight.

The Maroon and Gold will open their 1993-94 dual meet schedule on Sunday, Dec. 12, when they travel to Fresno, Calif., to compete in the California Duals. Other participating schools in the event are California-Davis, San Francisco State, and host Fresno State.

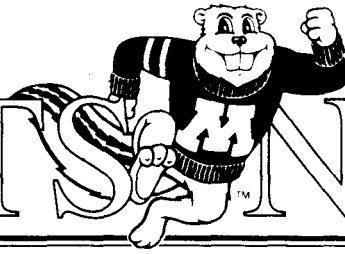

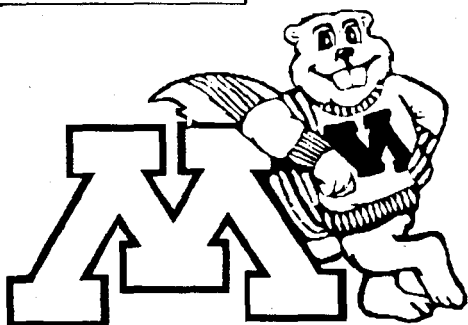

CARTER LEADS GOLDEN GOPHERS TO PERFECT WEEK; HOST TEAM MEXICO DEC. 12

Head Coach Clem Haskins' nationally-ranked (No. 15 AP/No. 14 *USA Today*) Golden Gopher basketball team capped a perfect week by defeating Middle Tennessee State 90-76 on the road last Friday to up the team's record to 4-2 on the season. On Monday, the Golden Gophers routed Mississippi Valley State 107-63 at Williams Arena, and then followed that with a 98-60 shellacking of the USA Verich Reps in an exhibition contest at home Wednesday.

Team Mexico: After taking a break for final exams week, the Golden Gophers will play host to Team Mexico in an exhibition game on Sunday, Dec. 12, at 1:00 p.m. at Williams Arena.

Broadcast Coverage: There will be no broadcast coverage of the exhibition game against Team Mexico.

Coach Haskins: Clem Haskins put the appropriate finishing touches on his seventh season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program by leading the Golden Gophers to the 1993 NIT title. After rebuilding the program in his first two seasons, he has now directed the Golden Gophers to post-season tournament action in four of the past five seasons. He has a record of 115-102 in eight seasons at Minnesota, and a 216-175 mark in 14 seasons overall. Haskins' success in post-season play is certainly no secret. He has an impressive 10-3 (5-2 NCAA; 5-1 NIT) record in post-season tournament action at Minnesota.

Leader of the Pack: Randy Carter paced the Golden Gophers with a pair of outstanding games last week. Carter and Voshon Lenard scored 16 points apiece to lead a total of six Golden Gophers in double figures in Monday's win over Mississippi Valley State. With his family and friends in the stands after making the journey to Murfreesboro, Tenn., from his hometown of Memphis, Carter scored a game-high 27 points on a perfect nine-of-nine shooting performance from the field. He also connected on nine-of-10 free throws in the game and tied his career-high with four assists.

Records Fall: The Golden Gophers set two new school records in last Monday's win over Mississippi Valley State. The team recorded 31 assists in the victory, erasing the previous mark of 30 set against Youngstown State on Dec. 2, 1991. Senior **Townsend Orr** (Dolton, Ill.) led the way with nine in the contest. The Golden Gophers also set a new school record with 13 three-pointers, shattering the old mark of nine set in three different games. The team came back with 10 three-pointers in last Friday's victory at Middle Tennessee State and has now made 23 of its last 40 attempts (.575) from beyond the arc.

Injury Bug Hits Again: The Golden Gophers have already had their share of injuries this season. Junior **Jayson Walton** (Dallas, Texas), who is expected to undergo arthroscopic surgery on his right knee this week, is out indefinitely. Redshirt freshman **Trevor Winter** (Slayton, Minn.), a seven-foot, 250-pound center, suffered a broken bone in his left wrist during practice Nov. 13 and is expected to be out of action for up to five more weeks. He had surgery on Nov. 17. Three other Golden Gophers are playing with nagging injuries. Townsend Orr has a dislocated index finger on his right hand, Voshon Lenard a lingering toe injury on his left foot, and Chad Kolander has a sprained left foot.

Grim Honored: Sophomore forward **David Grim** (Massillon, Ohio) was honored on the Preseason NIT All-Tournament Team. In the four tournament games, he averaged 10.5 points a game and shot 53.3 percent (16 of 30) from the field, including 46.2 percent (6 of 13) from three-point range. After having back surgery and redshirting the entire 1991-92 season, Grim showed some of the rustiness that goes along with such a long layoff, and as a result, he played in only 16 of the team's 32 games last year. After six games this season, he is ranked fourth on the team in scoring at 10.5 points a game, while shooting 52.2 percent (24 of 46) from the field and 50 percent (10 of 20) from three-point land. He has provided a big spark off the bench for the Golden Gophers.

Impressive Debut: With Jayson Walton sidelined, Kevin Baker made the first start of his collegiate career in the win over Mississippi Valley State last Monday. He made the most of the opportunity, scoring 10 points and hauling down seven rebounds in 19 minutes of action...all career-highs.

Three-Point King: Voshon Lenard drained four three-pointers against Middle Tennessee State last Friday to up his school career record total to 126. Kevin Lynch (1987-91) was the previous career leader with 117. Lenard also holds the school career record with 345 attempts. In Big Ten games only, he is already the career leader with 61 successful three-pointers and 187 attempts.

McDonald Ups Assists Record: Arriel McDonald has collected 23 assists in six games this season to up his school career record total to 391. Marc Wilson (1982-86) was the previous career leader with 375.

1,000 Point Club: Voshon Lenard has moved into 23rd-place on the all-time school scoring list with 1,033 points. Eric Hill (1968-71) is 22nd with 1,057 points and Eric Magdanz (1960-63) is 21st with 1,070 points. Arriel McDonald (985) and Randy Carter (870) are also closing in on the coveted 1,000 career point mark.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have registered an impressive 64-17 record (.790) over the past six seasons in Williams Arena, which includes a perfect 3-0 mark this season.

GOLDEN GOPHERS HOST NORTH DAKOTA

The University of Minnesota ice hockey team will entertain the North Dakota Fighting Sioux on December 11 and 12 at Mariucci Arena after having this weekend off. The Golden Gophers are coming off a split at the College Hockey Showcase in Detroit where they suffered a disappointing 6-0 loss to the top-ranked Michigan Wolverines, before bouncing back to notch a 6-5 victory over the 10th-ranked Michigan State Spartans on Saturday. The Maroon and Gold (3-6-3, 2-5-3) bounced back in grand fashion against Michigan State when they rallied from a 2-0 deficit and exceeded their highest output of the season by two goals.

Balanced Scoring: The Golden Gophers had their finest offensive night of the year vs. Michigan State and they did it with balance. Three of the four lines had points and the third line, which did not have a point, was the most consistent of the four all weekend. **Dave Larson (So., So. St. Paul, Minn.)** and **Jesse Bertogliat (So., Esko, Minn.)** each had their first goal of the year, while **Justin McHugh (Jr., Minnetonka, Minn.)**, **Jeff Nielsen (Sr., Grand Rapids, Minn.)**, **Steve Magnusson (Jr., Anoka, Minn.)** and **Jed Fiebelkorn (Jr., Osseo, Minn.)** all added goals.

Next Up: The Golden Gopher/North Dakota series is rich in tradition. The two teams have been a big part of the WCHA's success over the years. Minnesota holds a 113-91-4 advantage in the series. Last year, the Golden Gophers and Sioux split their regular season games with each team winning one at home and one on the road. The Golden Gophers won a pair of WCHA first round playoff games at Mariucci Arena, 6-4 and 5-4 in overtime, in the final games ever played in the old Mariucci Arena. Head Coach Doug Woog has an impressive 27-11-1 record against the Sioux and a 17-4 record at home against the Green and White. Last year, the Golden Gophers were 3-1 against the Sioux at Mariucci Arena, with the loss (8-4) coming on the opening day of the season.

Nielsen on Fire: Senior All-WCHA candidate Jeff Nielsen has really caught fire during the team's last six games. He has five goals and two assists in the six games, and leads the team in goals scored overall with seven. A dominating player with his physical play and forechecking ability, he has great speed and is the best shooter on the team. He is the type of player who can lead the Minnesota offense and get the team back into the title race.

Magnusson Continues Streak: Forward Steve Magnusson is leading the Golden Gophers in points with 12 behind two goals and 10 assists. The elusive forward creates many scoring opportunities and draws a lot of penalties for the team. He has had a point in six of the last seven games, and has been a big boost to the Minnesota offense since sitting out the first series of the year. He doesn't possess great speed, but is very slippery and has a knack for setting up the nice plays.

Moen Notches Win Number Two: Sophomore **Jeff Moen (Roseville, Minn.)** notched his second career win as a Golden Gopher in the 6-5 win over the Spartans. He stopped 24 of 29

shots and limited the potent Michigan State power play to one goal in four attempts. He has now won his last two starts after missing the Duluth series with a fracture in his neck.

CCHA Sweeps First Day, WCHA Takes Two the Final Day: The CCHA won both games during the first day of the College Hockey Showcase when the Golden Gophers lost to Michigan 6-0 and Michigan State beat Wisconsin 4-2. On day two, the WCHA responded by winning both games. The Maroon and Gold gave the Spartans their first loss in two weeks and the Badgers beat top-ranked and unbeaten Michigan 5-3.

Injury Update: The Golden Gophers are gradually getting healthy after a series of early injuries struck the team. The week off helped the team heal its wounds and get ready for a resurgent North Dakota team. **Eric Means (Sr., Rochester, Minn.)** suffered a minor shoulder injury against Denver, but is probable for the North Dakota series. **Joe Dzedzic (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.)**, who injured his left forearm at Colorado College and has been out since, started skating two weeks ago and is listed as possible for the Sioux series. Junior **Brandon Steege (Jr., Burnsville, Minn.)** is still out with reoccurring headaches from a head injury in the Hall of Fame game. He began skating last week and his status is improving, but he is still listed as week-to-week. **Mike McAlpine's (So., South St. Paul, Minn.)** strained left knee is improving and he is listed as possible for the North Dakota series.

The Woog Report: Coach Woog has an impressive list of credentials, including eight consecutive NCAA Tournament berths. He has three WCHA Championships and has never finished lower than second place in the WCHA standings. Six of his eight teams have posted 30 or more wins. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program and he has one of the highest winning percentages of any collegiate coaches in the country.

McAlpine Attack: All-American candidate **Chris McAlpine (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** is a force on defense for the Golden Gophers. He is a dominant player at both ends of the rink. Last year, he was the second leading goal scorer from the blue line in the WCHA with 14 goals. If he equals his statistics of a year ago, he will become the all-time leading goal-scoring defenseman at Minnesota as well as the leader in all-time penalty minutes. This year he has two goals and three assists in 11 games.

Golden Gophers on KSTP-AM 1500: The Golden Gophers signed a three-year contract with KSTP-AM 1500 over the summer that will greatly enhance the coverage of Minnesota hockey in the state. All games will be live on KSTP with former North Star broadcaster and NHL Hall of Famer, Al Shaver, calling the action. He will be joined by former Golden Gopher coach Glen Sonmor. KSTP's Rob Leer and former North Star Bobby Smith will also add to the coverage with special assignments.

Golden Gophers on MSC: The Golden Gophers inked another three-year deal this summer with Midwest Sports Channel that will have the Maroon and Gold on television a record 28 times, plus the playoffs. Frank Mazzocco and Tom Reid will call all the action on MSC.



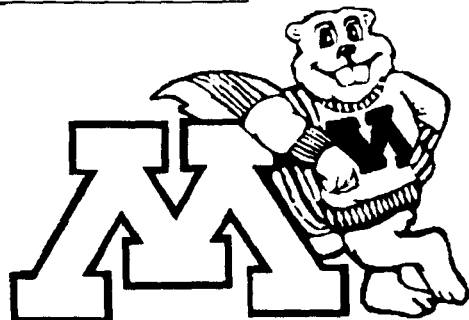

Head Coach Clem Haskins' nationally-ranked Golden Gopher basketball team (4-2) will entertain Clemson (3-0) at 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, and then Western Carolina (2-2) at 1:00 p.m. Sunday, in non-conference action at Williams Arena.

Broadcast Coverage: Both games this week will be broadcast on the Midwest Sports Channel (MSC) with Dick Bremer on the play-by-play and Jim Dutcher as the analyst. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball with Ray Christensen calling the action.

Coach Haskins: Clem Haskins put the appropriate finishing touches on his seventh season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program by leading the Golden Gophers to the 1993 NIT title. After rebuilding the program in his first two seasons, he has now directed the Golden Gophers to post-season tournament action in four of the past five seasons. He has a record of 115-102 in eight seasons at Minnesota, and a 216-175 mark in 14 seasons overall. Haskins' success in post-season play is certainly no secret. He has an impressive 10-3 (5-2 NCAA; 5-1 NIT) record in post-season tournament action at Minnesota.

Back In Action: After a nine-day layoff due to final exams, the Golden Gophers defeated Team Mexico 87-76 before 13,109 fans at Williams Arena Sunday. Voshon Lenard led the way with 20 points.

Clemson: A strong frontcourt, led by 6-11 center Sharone Wright and 6-6 power forward Devin Gray, will lead the undefeated Clemson Tigers into Williams Arena Wednesday. The Tigers have defeated Texas-Arlington (86-55) and Furman (85-70) at home, and Charleston Southern (120-103) on the road. In his 10th season at Clemson, Head Coach Cliff Ellis has compiled a 162-112 record. He is 333-196 in his 19th season overall.

Western Carolina: Benny Dees left a high-profile program at the University of Wyoming where he had won 104 games in six seasons, to take over a Western Carolina program that has not produced a winning record in its last nine seasons. The Catamounts are 2-2 on the season heading into this week's action. They have defeated Erskine (82-61) and Coker (67-59), and lost to Georgia Tech (77-55) and Georgia (100-64). Prior to Friday's game at Tennessee, Dees has registered a 173-116 record in his 11th season overall.

Series Records: In the only previous meeting between Minnesota and Clemson, the Golden Gophers defeated the Tigers 66-52 in the championship game of the Pillsbury Classic on Dec. 28, 1974, at the Met Center in Bloomington. Sunday will be the

first-ever meeting between Minnesota and Western Carolina.

Leader of the Pack: Randy Carter paced the Golden Gophers with a pair of outstanding games in the team's 90-76 win at Middle Tennessee State on Dec. 3, and the 107-63 rout of Mississippi Valley State at Williams Arena on Nov. 29. Carter and Voshon Lenard scored 16 points apiece to lead a total of six Golden Gophers in double figures in the win over Mississippi Valley State. With his family and friends in the stands after making the journey to Murfreesboro, Tenn., from his hometown of Memphis, Carter scored a game-high 27 points on a perfect nine-of-nine shooting performance from the field in the victory at Middle Tennessee State. He also connected on nine-of-10 free throws in the game and tied his career-high with four assists.

Records Fall: The Golden Gophers set two new school records in the win over Mississippi Valley State. The team recorded 31 assists in the victory, erasing the previous mark of 30 set against Youngstown State on Dec. 2, 1991. Junior **Townsend Orr (Dolton, Ill.)** led the way with nine in the contest. The Golden Gophers also set a new school record with 13 three-pointers, shattering the old mark of nine set in three different games. The team came back with 10 three-pointers in the victory at Middle Tennessee State, and have now made 23 of its last 40 attempts (.575) from beyond the arc.

Injury Blues: The Golden Gophers have already had their share of injuries this season. Junior **Jayson Walton (Dallas, Texas)** underwent arthroscopic surgery on his right knee last Tuesday and is expected to be out of the lineup for two to three weeks. Redshirt freshman **Trevor Winter (Slayton, Minn.)**, a seven-foot, 250-pound center, suffered a broken bone in his left wrist during practice Nov. 13 and is expected to be out of action three to four more weeks. He had surgery on Nov. 17. In addition, Townsend Orr is playing with a dislocated index finger on his right hand.

Three-Point King: Voshon Lenard drained four three-pointers against Middle Tennessee State to up his school career record total to 126. Kevin Lynch (1987-91) was the previous career leader with 117. Lenard also holds the school career record with 345 attempts. In Big Ten games only, he is already the career leader with 61 successful three-pointers and 187 attempts.

McDonald Ups Assists Record: Arriel McDonald has collected 23 assists in six games this season to up his school career record total to 391. Marc Wilson (1982-86) was the previous career leader with 375.

1,000 Point Club: Voshon Lenard has moved into 23rd-place on the all-time school scoring list with 1,033 points. Eric Hill (1968-71) is 22nd with 1,057 points and Eric Magdanz (1960-63) is 21st with 1,070 points. Arriel McDonald (985) and Randy Carter (870) are also closing in on the coveted 1,000 point mark.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have registered an impressive 64-17 record (.790) over the past six seasons in Williams Arena, which includes a perfect 3-0 mark this season.

**GOLDEN GOPHERS SWEEP NORTH DAKOTA;
TRAVEL TO ALASKA-ANCHORAGE THIS WEEKEND**

The University of Minnesota ice hockey team posted the first sweep in the new Mariucci Arena when they won a pair of games this past weekend from the North Dakota Fighting Sioux 6-5, 3-0. The Golden Gophers (5-6-3, 4-5-30), will travel to Alaska-Anchorage for a key WCHA series this Friday and Saturday night at 10:00 p.m. CDT. The Golden Gophers have a six-game WCHA unbeaten streak with a 3-0-3 mark in those games. The four points in the sweep vaulted the Golden Gophers out of last place in the WCHA for the first time this season and put them in eighth place, eight points out of first place with two games in hand on the teams ahead of them.

McHugh/Bonin Shine: Justin McHugh (Jr., Minnetonka, Minn.) and Brian Bonin (So., White Bear Lake, Minn.) both had outstanding weekends for the Golden Gophers as each had a pair of goals and McHugh added an assist. Bonin's goal was the game-winner Sunday and he has three goals in his last three games. He is second in team scoring with six goals and six assists. McHugh was the team's MVP of the College Hockey Showcase and posted another strong weekend with his two-goal game on Saturday night and strong play on Sunday. McHugh is fourth on the team in scoring with four goals and five assists.

Mac On the Attack: All-American candidate Chris McAlpine (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) had a typical outstanding weekend with a goal and three assists and standout defensive play. He is a force on defense for the Golden Gophers and a dominant player at the other end of the rink. Last year, he was the second leading goal scorer from the blue line in the WCHA with 14 goals. If he equals his statistics of a year ago, he will become the all-time leading goal-scoring defenseman at Minnesota as well as the leader in all-time penalty minutes. This year he has three goals and six assists in 13 games which puts him fifth in team scoring.

Moen Notches Third Straight: Sophomore goaltender Jeff Moen (Roseville, Minn.) notched his third consecutive win with his 3-0 shutout of the Sioux. During that span he has given up eight goals lowering his GAA to 3.10 and raising his save percentage to .894%. The stand-out goaltender is really starting to come into his own and coupled with the solid play of Jeff Callinan (Jr., Minnetonka, Minn.), gives the Golden Gophers a solid duo in the nets.

Next Up: The Golden Gophers will play the Alaska-Anchorage Seawolves in a WCHA contest for the first time next weekend. The series stands at 6-1-1 in favor of the Golden Gophers. Last year, the Maroon and Gold posted a 7-0 win and a 3-3 overtime tie at Anchorage in a non-conference series. Jeff Moen was in goal for the tie while Tom Newman had the win. The only Minnesota loss in the series was a 4-3 overtime setback at Mariucci Arena on Feb 3, 1990.

Nielsen on Fire: Senior All-WCHA candidate Jeff Nielsen (Sr., Grand Rapids, Minn.) has really caught fire during his last seven games. He has five goals and three assists in the seven games, and leads the team in goals scored overall with seven. A dominating player with his physical play and forechecking abili-

ty, he has great speed and is the best shooter on the team. He is the type of player who can lead the Minnesota offense and get the team back into the title race.

Magnusson Continues Streak: Forward Steve Magnusson is leading the Golden Gophers in points with 13 behind two goals and 11 assists. The elusive forward creates many scoring opportunities and draws a lot of penalties for the team. He has had a point in seven of the last nine games, and has been a big boost to the Minnesota offense since sitting out the first series of the year. He doesn't possess great speed, but is very slippery and has a knack for setting up the nice plays.

Injury Update: The Golden Gophers are gradually getting healthy after a series of early injuries struck the team. The week off before the North Dakota series helped the team heal its wounds. Joe Dzedzic (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.), who injured his left forearm at Colorado College and has been out since, started skating four weeks ago and is listed as probable for the Seawolves series. Junior Brandon Steege (Jr., Burnsville, Minn.) is still out with reoccurring headaches from a head injury in the Hall of Fame game. He began skating a couple of weeks ago and his status is improving, but he is still listed as week-to-week. Mike McAlpine's (So., South St. Paul, Minn.) strained left knee is improving and he is listed as probable for the Alaska series. Chris McAlpine strained his knee in Sunday's game with North Dakota and is listed as possible for the Alaska series.

The Woog Report: Coach Woog has an impressive list of credentials, including eight consecutive NCAA Tournament berths. He has three WCHA Championships and has never finished lower than second place in the WCHA standings. Six of his eight teams have posted 30 or more wins. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program and he has one of the highest winning percentages of any collegiate coaches in the country.

Golden Gophers on KSTP-AM 1500: The Golden Gophers signed a three-year contract with KSTP-AM 1500 over the summer that will greatly enhance the coverage of Minnesota hockey in the state. All games will be live on KSTP with former North Star broadcaster and NHL Hall of Famer, Al Shaver, calling the action. He will be joined by former Golden Gopher coach Glen Sonmor. KSTP's Rob Leer and former North Star Bobby Smith will also add to the coverage with special assignments.

Golden Gophers on MSC: The Golden Gophers inked another three-year deal this summer with Midwest Sports Channel that will have the Maroon and Gold on television a record 28 times, plus the playoffs. Frank Mazzocco and Tom Reid will call all the action on MSC. This weekend there will be no television coverage from Anchorage.

GOLDEN GOPHERS WIN TWO ON WEST COAST; DROP CLOSE DECISION TO #12 FRESNO STATE

The Golden Gopher wrestling squad traveled to California over the weekend to open the 1993-94 dual meet portion of their season by participating in the California Duals. The day-long event featured San Francisco State University, the University of California-Davis, and was hosted by Fresno State University. Head Coach J Robinson's fourth-ranked Golden Gophers racked up impressive victories over California-Davis (48-0) and San Francisco State (36-9), before losing a tough, hard-fought battle to 12th-ranked Fresno State University by the count of 18-17.

The Maroon and Gold concluded their hectic day in the Sunshine State by traveling to Bakersfield in the evening to tangle with California State-Bakersfield. The results of this meet were not known at the time of this release.

The Golden Gophers (2-1) will be idle until after the Christmas holiday, resuming their dual meet schedule by taking part in the Oregon Classic on Wednesday, December 29, in Portland, Ore.

Team Maintains Number Four Ranking: The latest National Wrestling Coaches Association/Amateur Wrestling News poll released on Wednesday of last week showed the University of Minnesota holding steady at fourth in the nation. The Maroon and Gold were ranked fourth in the pre-season poll, as well. Oklahoma State received 19 first place votes to grasp a strangle hold on the top spot, followed by Oregon State at number two, and Big Ten rival Iowa coming in at number three. Minnesota will get a chance to see Oregon State up close and personal in two weeks at the Oregon Classic.

Pierce Ranked Number One: Sophomore heavyweight Billy Pierce (Minneapolis, Minn.) remains ranked number one in the country in his weight class. Other Golden Gophers ranked in the top ten were: Tim Harris (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.), No. 4 at 126 pounds; Willy Short (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), No. 3 at 158 pounds; and Brett Colombini (Jr., Redwood Valley, Calif.), No. 10 at 177 pounds.

Gibson Returns To Action: Senior returning All-American Brad Gibson (Chokio, Minn.) got a taste of his first action in the 1993-94 campaign, dropping a 15-5 decision to Jason Geris of Fresno State in the California Duals. Gibson, who had been ranked No. 2 in the country at 177 pounds in the pre-season indi-

vidual poll, missed a great deal of action in the unattached meet schedule due to the passing away of his mother following a long battle with cancer. The Chokio-Alberta alum placed sixth in the NCAA tournament last season, and is expected to be a solidifying force in the Golden Gopher lineup again this season.



THREE GRIDDERS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN STATUS

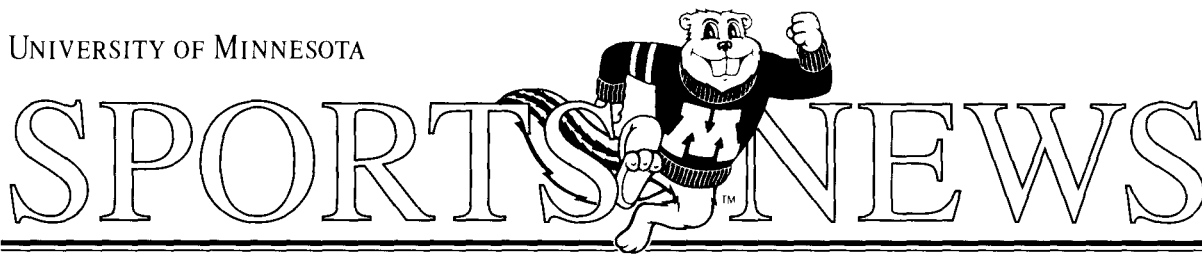
It was announced Wednesday that seniors Omar Douglas and Jeff Rosga along with junior Justin Conzemius of the Golden Gopher football team have been honored as GTE Academic All-America second team selections.

Douglas, a senior slot back hailing from New Orleans, La., set the Golden Gopher receiving record for most career receptions this past season with 130 and also shattered the record for most career yardage with 1,675. He also led the Big Ten in pass receptions and most receiving yards this past season. The economics/Afro American Studies major carries a 3.20 GPA, and was named an Academic All-Big 10 this year for the third season in a row.

Rosga, a senior free safety from nearby Roseville, Minn., tied for the team lead with four interceptions during the 1993 campaign, returning two for touchdowns, recovering three fumbles, and contributing 37 tackles and 30 assists. A business administration major with a 3.60 GPA, Rosga was named to the GTE Academic All-District V team for the third consecutive time this year, and was honored on the GTE Academic All-Big Ten team for the fourth straight time.

Conzemius, a sophomore strong safety from Fargo, N.D., was a key contributor to the big play Minnesota defense this past season. He returned an interception 55 yards for a touchdown in the Golden Gophers' incredible 59-56 victory over Purdue, while finishing third on the team with 68 tackles (37 solo, 31 assists). The business administration major totes a lofty 3.69 GPA, and was named to the GTE Academic All-Big Ten team this year for the second consecutive time.



Marc Ryan has been named Director of Media Relations in the men's intercollegiate athletics department at the University of Minnesota, pending final approval of the U of M's Board of Regents.
