THE SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE OPENS MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, FOR THE BEGINNING OF ITS
FORTY-NINTH YEAR

Students of the School of Agriculture:

To you who are returning and to you who are coming to this School for the first time, I say, "Welcome"! We are looking forward to seeing you here on Monday of next week. I presume most of you are already busy packing your things and making your plans - but let the packing wait for just a little while as we sit down for a bit of a visit. It looks as though we are going to have a fine school here this fall with an increase in enrollment over last fall. The winter term is going to be even larger. There are many new students who have reserved rooms and the program of social activities and all is planned and well under way. You will see some new faces around the campus here - I presume that many of you know that Mr. Thompson will not be back in the gymnasium. That is also true of the courses in literature. The main reason you are coming to this School is to get as much out of the courses offered as is possible and the best way to do that is to devote your entire time to the business of going to school. However, if you cannot attend on that basis, we still have means of helping - through student work or through student loan funds. If you must have work and have not yet made application, I urge you to get in touch with Mr. Bassett right away. Also to you new students - if you play any musical instruments, be sure to bring them along with you. There is every opportunity here for making use of them. And - again to all of you - we are looking forward with real pleasure to seeing you here on Monday, September 27, and we will gather for our first meeting of the entire student body Tuesday noon, September 28, in the assembly. --- Registration Suggestions

1. Every student must report to the Health Service for an examination before starting registration.
2. After health examination:
All new students who have sent in application blanks, may report directly to the library room and proceed with registration. That also applies to old students as well.

All new students who have not sent in application blanks, must report first to the Superintendent's office, 205 Administration Bldg.
3. If you are eligible for State Aid and have no tuition certificate with you, make arrangements at Superintendent's Office before getting your fee statement. Students who have had State Aid and are still under twenty-one do not need to get another certificate - inform the registrar of that when getting fee statement.
4. Students wishing to make loans report to Mr. Johnson, 210 Old Dairy Hall before coming to the Superintendent's Office.
5. The dormitories will be open Sunday, September 26, ready for occupancy for anyone desiring to come down and get settled before registration day.

In Superintendent Christianson's office is the framed copy of the original charter granted the Young Women's Christian Association of the School of Agriculture on October 12, 1906. This is signed by Grace Dodge who was the president of the national organization and who became internationally known for her work in that field. This organization meeting is the result of a move on the part of the girls of the School for a more active Y.W.C.A. organization. All girls in the School of Agriculture are urged to be present in the dormitory parlors on Thursday evening at 6:15 for the re-organization of the School Y.W.C.A. and to participate in the planning of the work for the coming year.
