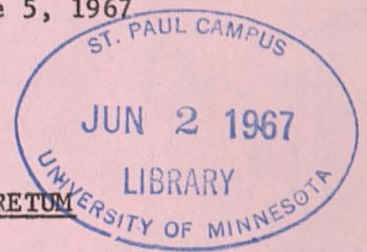
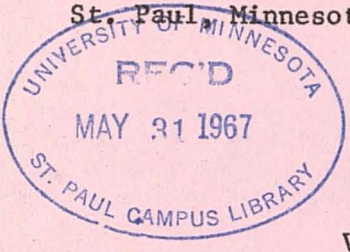

## VISIT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA LANDSCAPE ARBORETUM



A visit to the University of Minnesota Landscape Arboretum is an adventure in education. It gives the home owner a chance to see plant materials he might want to use in his landscape.

\* \* \* \*

The University has well over 2500 species and cultivars of plant materials growing in the arboretum. In addition, the arboretum has native plants growing in their native habitat.

\* \* \* \*

One of the highlights of a June trip to the arboretum will be the rose gardens where old-fashioned and hybrid roses will be on display.

\* \* \* \*

June is also a good month to visit the azalea and rhododendron collection. The azalea collection contains several thousand plants and over 100 species of cultivars and hybrid groups. The azaleas continue to bloom into July.

\* \* \* \*

Families wishing to select a shade tree can visit the shade tree collections and decide on the specific qualities that they might like for a planting. This is true for both evergreen and deciduous type plant materials.

A free tour guide available at the arboretum office will be helpful in guiding you through the arboretum and helping you find the various collections.

\* \* \* \*

The arboretum should be considered a living library of plant materials for study and observation. You will want to revisit the arboretum several times a year.
