Study of burgeoning enrollment problems and legislative efforts in behalf of higher education will occupy representatives attending a meeting of the Association of Minnesota Colleges on the UMD campus Saturday (Nov.9).

James Lewis Morrill, president, University of Minnesota, is scheduled to preside at the association session. UMD provost R. W. Darland will be the host member for the conference.

Among other matters coming before the group will be a report on Minnesota Centennial projects at Minnesota colleges, including the proposed Centennial conference on college teaching, election of an association vice president, the state-wide testing program and special reports on association studies.

Sessions will begin at 9 a.m. in Kirby Student center. Following a noon luncheon in the center cafeteria, the association will go into executive session.

In addition to four-year colleges and universities of the state, Minnesota junior colleges have been invited to send representatives to the conference, Provost Darland pointed out. He said a number of agenda items would be of special interest to the junior college personnel.
