DULUTH--Edvard Grieg, Claude Debussy and Johannes Brahms are represented on the program for a UMD ensemble recital at 8 p.m. Thursday (Feb.27) in Main auditorium, 2205 East Fifth street.

Six well-known Duluth musicians will appear in the presentation, open free to the public. Two husband-and-wife teams will be among the instrumentalists.

Robert W. House, associate professor and head of the music department, will play Grieg's Sonate in A minor, opus 6, accompanied by Mrs. House at the piano.

James E. Smith, associate professor of music, will be accompanied by Mrs. Lois Sturgeon in Debussy's Sonate for violin and piano.

A string quartet including Professors House and Smith, Mrs. Smith, violin, and Ralph Anderson, viola, will play Brahms' String Quartet, Opus 51, No.2.

Anderson, a music major at UMD, recently returned from Naples, Italy, where he was stationed in the U. S. navy. He played with a navy orchestra at Naples.

All members of the string quartet play in the Duluth Symphony orchestra. Professor and Mrs. Smith and Anderson play in the UMD Symphony orchestra, which Professor House directs.

Mrs. Sturgeon and Mrs. House are well known pianists in the Duluth area.
