DULUTH--David Botter, assistant managing editor of Look magazine, will speak on the topic "Four Challenges and Four Opportunities" at commencement for 380 UMD students at 8 p.m. Friday (June 13) in the Physical Education building.

Largest in the history of the Duluth campus, the 1958 class also will hear Richard L. Griggs, Duluth member of the University of Minnesota board of regents, speaking in behalf of President J. L. Morrill and the board.

Admission will be by guest ticket only, according to Gerhard von Glahn, professor and head of political science and commencement committee chairman. Any available seating at 7:40 p.m. will be opened to those without tickets, he added.

In his present post since 1954, Mr. Botter has been with Cowles Magazines, Inc., publishers of Look, since 1950.

He holds the Master's degree in government from the University of Texas, where he taught government for a year.

He was awarded a Nieman fellowship at Harvard university in the mid-'40's for a series of political articles he wrote for the Dallas News.

In 1948, for his coverage of the Republican and Democratic national conventions, he received the Texas Associated Press Managing Editors' award for political reporting.

For two years he was secretary of the standing committee of correspondents, which regulates the Congressional press galleries in Washington. He held this position while in Washington representing the Dallas Morning News.

He is currently a vice president of the American Council on Education for Journalism, the accrediting agency for university schools and departments of journalism.
