

DULUTH--Styles by master designers will be featured in a style show by the Duluth Junior League at 2 p.m. and at 3:30 p.m. Thursday (Dec. 4) in UMD's new Tweed Gallery.

Among fashion headliners represented in the show will be Maurice Rentner, Herbert Sondheim, Rudolph, Philip Hulitoc, Samuel Winston, Balenciaga, Givenchy and Mainbocher.

A number of "one-of-a-kind" gowns have been flown from New York to Duluth fashion houses for the show. Empire, bubble, bell and other styles in luxurious fabrics will be shown.

Marie E. Horton, Duluth bridal consultant, has arranged the dress styles. Mr. M. M. Cohen has arranged fur fashions also to be shown.

Admission will be nominal, according to Tweed curator Orazio Fumagalli. Proceeds will be used to purchase art works for the gallery and for other gallery projects.

The fashion show is a highlight of the current "Art in Our Lives" exhibition through Dec. 23.

Unique playstructures of fiberglass, sculptural cement and other materials designed by George Goundie and Howard Schroedter, University of Wisconsin at Madison, are a special holiday feature.

Other items are paintings by Schroedter, sculptures by Goundie, paintings by UMD graduate Richard Wold and illustrations from early religious manuscripts on loan from the Pierpont Morgan library and the University of Minnesota.
