

DULUTH--Sixty outstanding news photos of 1958 will be shown in UMD's Kirby Student center lounge April 10 through 18.

A traveling exhibit of 16 by 20-inch reproductions of the 15th annual "News Pictures of the Year" photo competition will be shown.

Hours will be 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily.

The competition is conducted by the National Press Photographers association, the University of Missouri school of journalism and the Encyclopedia Britannica.

Largest contest of its kind in the world, the competition involves 14 categories. Each category will be represented in the display.

Among prominent exhibits will be those of Earl Seubert, Minneapolis Star-Tribune photographer, named Newspaper Photographer of the Year for the second time, and Lisa Larsen, Life magazine, first woman named Magazine Photographer of the Year.

The display has become a regularly scheduled event at scores of U.S. and Canadian institutions. In addition to casual viewing, it is extensively used in journalism teaching.

An estimated 2,000,000 persons will see the display this year on its tour of 200 cities, including colleges, universities, public libraries, and museums.

Coordinating the UMD showing are Marj Papke and Edwin O. Siggelkow, staff members of the office of student personnel services.
