

DULUTH--"The Devil's General," an intense dramatization of the Goring-Himmler struggle for control of the Luftwaffe in 1941, will be shown at 8 p.m. Wednesday April 15 in the UMD Science auditorium.

Written by Carl Zuckmayer, the film centers about the life of General Ernst Udet, ace **pilot** of the Luftwaffe who hated the Nazi regime.

The decadent society of Hitler's Berlin, replete with officers' rivalries and Gestapo spying, is portrayed through the experience of General Harras, who acts out the Udet role.

Directed by Helmut Kautner, the film features Curt Jurgens and Marianne Cook, whose Hollywood careers resulted from the internationally acclaimed film.

"The Devil's General" is third in a series of nine films being shown in conjunction with the course, "The Art of the Theater," taught by William R. Morgan. The films are shown each week at the same time.
