DULUTH--The third annual Parents' Day Sunday (Sept. 20) on the UMD campus will kick off a week of activity as students and their parents, staff and faculty join in events prior to the opening of the fall quarter Monday, Sept. 28.

Sponsored by the UMD Student Association, Parents' Day will be directed by Inez Laine, Floodwood, junior. Darrel Swanfeld, Duluth, senior, will supervise the program which is part of the student orientation schedule.

Parents' Day campus tours will begin at 1 p.m., conducted by upperclass students who also will serve as orientation group leaders for new students during the coming week.

At 2:30 p.m., Provost R. W. Darland will address the parents in Kirby Student center as will student association president Thomas Kraus, Duluth, senior. After their remarks, a coffee hour will be held for parents, UMD faculty and staff.

The week's schedule is as follows:

Monday, Sept. 21---Previously enrolled students who "pre-registered" last spring will complete registration by appointment mailed to them along with registration permits. Transfer students also will register and receive physical tests. Freshman orientation and registration will begin.

Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday---freshman orientation and registration will continue.

Friday---8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., registration will continue for new students who have not taken part in orientation, for previously registered students not "pre-registered" last spring and for stragglers.

Orientation camp for freshmen and new students at Camp Miller will be held Thursday through Saturday, Sept. 24-26. Classes will begin Monday, Sept. 28.

The "fun and fellowship" schedule for new students next week will include old time movies, square dancing and games on Monday night; a picnic Tuesday sponsored by the UMD religious council; a "rottzenfest" (root beer, pretzels and polka music) Wednesday sponsored by the Women's Recreation association; a club carnival Thursday to introduce new students to campus organizations; a theatre party for freshmen on Friday night; a football game (Gustavus, 7:30 p.m., Public Schools Stadium) Saturday followed by a post-game street dance behind Kirby Student center sponsored by the UMD International club; and a freshman talent show Sunday at which time a freshman princess will be crowned. All the activities except the picnic will be held in Kirby Student center.
