DULUTH—More than 200 elementary and secondary teachers are expected on the UMD campus Saturday, January 30, for the Arrowhead Reading Council's winter meeting.

"The Challenge of Reading in the 60s" will be the theme of the day-long sessions at Kirby Student Center.

Featured speakers will be Dr. Helen A. Murphy, director of the reading clinic at Boston University, and Dr. Stanley B. Kegler, chairman of the language arts department in the college of education at the University of Minnesota at Minneapolis.

Author with Donald Durrell of the book, Building Word Power, Professor Murphy has written many published articles on reading. She took part in the five day UMD Reading Conference last June.

Dr. Kegler has taught in elementary and secondary grades in Minnesota and Florida, has contributed articles to many professional journals, conducted reading workshops in several states and served as an English consultant.

Dr. Murphy and Dr. Kegler will address the session at 10 that morning and lead discussion seminars in the afternoon.

The Arrowhead Reading Council is affiliated with the Minnesota Reading Association and the International Reading Association. The council is made up of professionals who are concerned with the teaching and improvement of reading, both developmental and remedial, for children and adults.
