DULUTH--A high school honor band clinic and an evening concert by the UMD band are the two-star attractions billed for February 10th at UMD's Kirby Student Center.

Bernard Fitzgerald, nationally known composer and conductor, will direct rehearsals of the honor band made up of specially selected northeastern Minnesota high school performers.

Fitzgerald, conductor of bands and head of the music department at the University of Kentucky, has composed more than 40 published works and is former editor of Carl Fischer band publications.

At the conclusion of the day-long clinic, the UMD concert band, under the direction of James R. Murphy, will present its winter concert at 8 p.m. at the Kirby ballroom. It will feature the Finale of Kalinnikov's First Symphony, Rimsky-Korsakov's Trombone Concerto and Theron Kirk's unpublished composition "Festival."

The Kalinnikov movement will make use of a brass choir from the high school honor band performing antiphonally with the UMD group.

The trombone concerto will feature Donald Bergman as soloist; David Cran, trumpeter, will perform in Clifton William's "Dramatic Essay for Trumpet and Band." Other works programmed are Padilla-Gould, Rossini, Calliet and Maurice Weed.

Under Mr. Fitzgerald's baton, the high school honor band will perform compositions by Clifton Williams, Strauss and Erickson, selections which will have been rehearsed during the daytime clinic.

There will be no admission charge for the concert which is open to the public.
