Cadet Pease, flight commander, drill flight, received the Air Force Association Air Force Silver Medal from Miss Sandra Johnson, Duluth, freshman and 1960 Sweetheart of the Corps. The medal is given for high proficiency in the field of military leadership, high academic average and social contribution.

He also was awarded the American Legion, David Wisted Post Medal for exceptional aptitude in the practical application of the principles of troop leadership.
