

DULUTH. . . The area's first conference on heart disease in industry will get underway Wednesday morning (Jan. 11) in Hotel Duluth.

About 150 representatives in industry in the Tri-State area are expected to attend, according to Lewis J. Rickert, Duluth, general chairman.

A. Myron Lidberg, Duluth Heart Council president, will give the address of welcome at 9:25 a.m. in the hotel's Moorish Room. Dr. John Moyer, Duluth, president-elect of the Minnesota Heart Association, will address the gathering at 9:30 a.m. on "Trends in the Prevention of Heart Disease" and at 10:45 a.m. on "What the Heart Can Do."

"The Executive and His Heart" is the subject of a luncheon talk to be given by Dr. Arthur C. Kerkhof, Minneapolis, Minnesota Heart Association president.

Rickert, associate professor of Physical Education and Health at UMD, will moderate the afternoon program which includes a panel discussion, "The Cardiac in Industry Today."

All sessions will be geared toward showing how victims of heart disease can be returned to employment following heart attacks.
