DULUTH--Loy Kay Clemmons, Duluth, Victor Breemeersch, Proctor, and Gerald Snyder, Duluth, will be featured soloists in UMD's winter University Orchestra concert at 8:15 p.m. Tuesday (March 7) in Kirby Student Center ballroom.

Professor James Smith will conduct Mozart's "Concerto No.2 for Horn and Orchestra" with Miss Clemmons as French horn soloist. Dr. Robert House will direct the remainder of the program consisting of works by Cimarosa, Britten, Vaughan Williams, deFalla and Smetana.

The concert will open with the overture to Cimarosa's "Secret Marriage." The horn concerto to follow was the second of four such works composed by Mozart for his friend Ignaz Leitzgeb. Britten's "Matineis Musicales," the next work to be performed, is subtitled "Second Suite of five movements from Rossini."

The Vaughan Williams Bass tuba concerto with Mr. Snyder as soloist has been characterized as colorful with the solo part and orchestration unusually well integrated.

Mr. Breemeersch's piano solo takes place in deFall's "Ritual Fire Dance." The program will conclude with Smetana's "Moldau" for orchestra, part of a cycle of program works descriptive of Czechoslovakia.
