

DULUTH--UMD's new, more spacious teaching materials library, serving the university's Education Department, does not exist for the student teacher alone.

"We would like to acquaint educators and in-service teachers in the facilities we have," says librarian Mrs. Grace Morrison. "We invite them to use these facilities at any time."

Since winter quarter opened, the library has enjoyed bright, modern quarters on the second floor of the recently finished Education Building.

Originally called the curriculum laboratory in Old Main on the lower campus, the move has enabled Mrs. Morrison to increase the number of volumes from 3,750 to 5,000. This includes textbooks, manuals, workbooks from 34 different publishers, numerous training aids and newspapers.

Mrs. Morrison, in sole charge of facilities, has hours from 9 a.m. until noon and 1 p.m. until 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. "It's in the picture to extend the hours," she said.

"On the other campus we had wall shelves," said Mrs. Morrison. "Now we have open floor shelves and have three times as much space as before. But our floor space has only been increased by one third."

Also, there is room for more expansion. Future plans will increase the library to almost twice its present size. This includes an audio-visual and general workshop area and a TV center for the origination of live or taped showings, on closed circuit telecasts and educational telecasts.
