DULUTH--English works from both the 17th and 20th centuries will be featured when UMD's Chamber Chorus presents a concert at 8:15 p.m. March 1 at Recital Hall.

It will be the group's initial appearance under the direction of Velda Stonecypher, assistant professor of music.

Works by Thomas Morley, John of Fornsete, Vulpius and Michael Praetorius will represent early choral literature on the program. "Hymn to St. Cecelia" by Britten-and-Auden will reflect present-day style. The Motet "Jesus, My Great Pleasure" by Bach will conclude the program.
